Windmill Haze makes it a golden night for Ken

What a great night for trainer Ken Gill at the Gawler on November 5th as he claimed the 2017 Bargain Steel Centre Gawler Gold Cup with Windmill Haze.

Gill not only claimed the Group 3 final but he also took home the Consolation Cup with Stitch 'Em Up and Ruff State also had a good win on the night.

In front of a good crowd who were braving the windy and wet weather, Windmill Haze began well from box 1, getting to the front by the first turn before leading all the way to secure the Cup from the Ben Rawlings trained Topology and High Eden Frost for Jan Jones in third place.

The son of Barcia Bale and Contrary Mary has been a consistent performer for Gill winning across 515m and 600m at Angle Park and over 531m at Gawler amassing prizemoney of \$53,000 with a record of 16 wins from 40 starts.

Well done to Ken and all connections on a great performance.

As mentioned the event was well attended despite the gloomy weather and special thanks to sponsors Bargain Steel Centre for their support of the night.

Lonely Cowboy wins inaugural Leigh Rogers final

Lonely Cowboy trained by Carole Scott became the inaugural winner of the Leigh Rogers Grade 6 Feature Final at Angle Park on November 9th in front of a strong crowd after an exciting run to the finish line.

After 6 terrific heats the previous Thursday night, the final was one of the most even races conducted at Angle Park in recent months with plenty of winning chances. Lonely Cowboy began very well from box 3 to take up the early lead closely followed by Rhynstone Teddy for Stuart Ellis and Highbury Hustle for John Mundy. As the field raced down the back straight Lonely Cowboy had pinched a small break on his rivals and set sail for the finish line however both Rhystone Teddy and Highbury Hustle began to close as they raced off the back straight. Turning for home it was clear it was going to be a battle to the finish line with Lonely Cowboy trying to hold on and Rhystone Teddy charging to the line with Highbury Hustle having to be content with third. As they hit the line the large crowd gasped as it was a desperately close finish with the judge giving Lonely Cowboy the decision by a head to the cheers of his connections after he showed unbelievable determination to get to the line first. He won in a solid 30.13 over the 515m journey with Rhystone Teddy brave in defeat.

Lonely Cowboy's record now stands at 8 wins and 10 placings from 24 starts and career prizemoney just over \$15,000.

With around 70 family, friends and work colleagues on track in support of Leigh Rogers, it was fitting that Lonely Cowboy showed such fight and determination in his great win, as Leigh displayed these qualities during his brave battle against the rare form

of cancer which sadly took his life late last year.

It was an emotional presentation dais with Leigh's wife Rachel on hand along with Leigh's stepson Jayden and his three young daughters, Emily, Chloe and Madison. Emily presented Carole with the trophy who spoke extremely well in winning the race named in Leigh's honour and also highlighted the battle's that she and connections have had with Lonely Cowboy in getting him back to the track after adversity along the way.

Bogie Bekim takes out third monthly award

Greyhound of the month for October was the Ben Rawlings trained Bogie Bekim who took his monthly awards to three after a great month of racing, winning three of his four starts.

The son of Bekim Bale and Bogie Skye started the month of with an unfortunate fall at Gawler which could have seen the star stayer off the scene for a number of months however he recovered well and was trained to the minute when he stepped out in the Premier's Cup on Adelaide Cup final night. He won in a sizzling 43.07 by over 12 lengths and everything looked to be back on target for another Interstate campaign. He won again at headquarters the following week by 11 lengths in a slick 43.18 before heading across to Victory for the Group 2 Topgun Stayers at The Meadows in late October. Taking on one of the hottest fields seen at the venue in recent history, Bogie Bekim disregarded his \$20.00 quota to run home powerfully and chase down Fanta Bale in the home straight to win in strong fashion by 1 length in 42.62.

At the end of the month Bogie Bekim's record stands at 59 starts with 22 wins and 17 placings with earnings around \$272,000 and now has to be one of the favourites for this year's Greyhound of the Year.



Hukanui's great run of form continues at Angle Park

The Run of the Month for October was Hukanui for his performance at Angle Park on Thursday 19th October where he sizzled home to score an impressive victory.

In Open company the son of Kelsos Fusileer and Daddy's Muffin began



surprisingly well from box 2 to be up vying for the front early until he pushed through on the first turn to gain the early lead. From there it was all about times and margins as he strode away from his contenders to win by more than 8 lengths in a blistering 29.53 for the 515m journey.

Classic performance from Pete

Long Gully Pete took out the 2017 Classic Prelude (2) at Angle Park on the 26th October for owner and trainer Paula Hearnden.

The fawn son of Kc And All and Long Gully Libby jumped well finding the lead by the first turn and cruised to a 7 length win in a personal best time of 29.87 over the 515m.

His career record now stands at 9 wins from 22 starts with prize-money of over \$16,000.

2018 Gawler Produce Stakes – Nominations close tomorrow

The 2018 Gawler Produce Stakes will be run by GRSA in conjunction with the Gawler Greyhound Racing Club. Once again we will offer guaranteed Final Stakemoney, which will be \$22,000. The estimate for the total series prizemoney is \$40,000, based on this years series. The series is for greyhounds whelped in 2016.

In 2018 we will again be offering additional incentives for trainers to nominate. A bonus will be offered to any greyhound which can win both the Produce Stake and the Gawler Gold Cup.

The jackpot has increased from \$5,000 to \$6,000 as Dream A Little missed out on winning the Gawler Cup this year.

The SA Bred bonus will also be continued; should the winner of the Final be SA bred, there will be a SA Bred bonus of \$1,000 to the owner and \$500 to the breeder.

The dates for this series will be Heats on Sunday 24th June 2018, Semi Finals on Sunday 1st July 2018 and the Final & \$2,700 Consolation on Sunday 8th July 2018.

GRSA administers the event for the Club, so all payments are to be made to GRSA. The fees are, with the one-off payment option \$121.00 or the sustaining option at \$33 (first), \$55 (second) and \$88 (Final).

Nomination Forms are available, along with the full list of conditions and the payment schedule.

* Nominations for the 2018 Gawler Produce will close tomorrow (Friday 17th November) with GRSA.

Bogie Bekim headlines a big night of racing at Sandown

In addition to eight TAB Melbourne Cup heats at Sandown on Friday 17th November, there will be four heats of the group 1 Bold Trease for the stayers.

Topgun Stayers winner Bogie Bekim for SA trainer Ben Rawlings leads the acceptors along with six time group 1 winner Fanta Bale who is attempting to become the third greyhound to pass one million dollars in prize money behind Fernando Bale and Dyna Double One. Other stars include last start group 1 Hume Cup winner Rockoon and veteran Australian and now New Zealand stayer Ring The Bell.

The Melbounrne Cup heats feature the likes of defending champion Ando's Mac, group 1 Topgun winner Up Hill Jill, dual group 1 winner Lightning Frank, National Sprint Champion Jury, Adelaide Cup winner Raw Ability and last start Vic Peters winner Crash Bandicoot.

Robert Britton is aiming to break his TAB Melbourne Cup hoodoo with seven starters, while Seona Thompson will prepare a team of six.

Widely regarded as the finest night of chasing on the calendar, the 96 greyhounds drawn into the 12 group 1 heats have combined to win 1267 races and over \$10.6m in prize money.

Brian Johnstone Heats

At Angle Park on Wednesday 15th November we saw the running of three heats of the 2017 Brian Johnstone (Group 3) series. We had 23 final nominations with the fastest qualifier being the Robyn Mackellar trained Emerley Nolen running a solid 30.42 in wet conditions at headquarters.

2017 \$14,285 Daish Irrigation and Fodder Strathalbyn Cup heats

The Southern Greyhound Raceway will run heats of the 2017 Daish Irrigation & Fodder Strathalbyn Cup on Sunday November 19th.

The Club received 40 nominations for the Cup and as a result will run 5 heats. The heats will feature many chances all vying for a spot in the final led by the Troy Murray kennel with 5 runners including last years winner Aston Kody in heat 5.

Other notable chances appear to be Jay's Ace and Molly Be Nimble from the Cameron Butcher kennel, Hukanui and Barton Bale from the Tony Rasmussen team, Brick Lane for Lauren Harris and Zipping Zane from the kennels of Ashley Furner.

The winner from each heat and the three fastest second placegetters will qualify for the final with the next two second placegetters declared reserves.

Good luck to all connections.

Sunday's race meeting is a Sky Racing 2 TAB Twilight fixture with racing commencing at 4.34pm with the last of 11 races due to jump at 8.06pm. The Cup heats are races 4, 5, 6, 7 & 8 on the programme. As an added bonus for the oncourse patrons the GRSA Stewards will conduct the box draw after the heats have been completed, this could be

Nomination limits on Port Augusta and GOTBA Coursing

At the most recent GRSA Board meeting it was determined to provide limits of nominations for both the NON-TAB Port Augusta meetings and GOTBA Coursing events to provide some form of indication on the likely scenario of the meeting proceeding or being cancelled.

This will assist both participants and staff alike. The number of nominations required for a meeting to proceed for Port Augusta is 40 and for GOTBA Coursing it is 30. As always GRSA will extend nominations if this number is below these cut offs however if it is significantly lower, then GRSA will liaise with the clubs in regard to cancelling the meeting straight away if agreed.

Online and phone bookings of trials for Angle Park and Gawler from 11.30am

GRSA received feedback in regard to the Online Trial booking process for both Gawler Wednesday and Angle Park Tuesday and Saturday trial sessions. This process of online bookings is fully supported by the ICG and GRSA Board and will continue to grow over time.

• To encourage the move from 100% phone bookings to online GRSA made the decision to separate the booking times from 12.30pm to 11.30am for online and 12.30pm for phone. This has worked successfully and reduced the number of phone calls dramatically. This encourages participants to manage their own bookings. However GRSA believes that the separation is now no longer required so both online and phone bookings will now be at 11.30am for trial sessions. It was decided to go to 11.30am due to the commitment participants have made to the online process and worked their schedule around this time being at home or near their device to book.

Whilst having the bookings at the same time the trial booking phone line will still be 08 8243 7172. No trials will be accepted on any other phone line; participants will be queued as normal and will not be taken before 11.30am. Our staff member will attempt to book your phone trials in a timely manner bearing in mind participants will be booking online at the same time. I would encourage all participants to move to the online process as this is quicker, easier and they can have the flexibility to manage the process themselves.

• It is important for all participants to realise that at any point from 11.30am when the trials open to around 3.30pm the day of the trial session (or day before for Saturday) they can log on or ring up and manage their bookings. They may be able to move earlier or later if there has been a cancellation etc, it really does provide an option if their time is unsuitable.

Some other issues have presented themselves and we will be seriously considering these options in the coming months if there is no change –

As GRSA can log all the bookings we are finding the 25 minute slots are filling up extremely quickly. In the space of 30 seconds of them opening up we are already up to 9pm. What is disappointing we then find that many of these bookings are deleted prior to the trial session. In some case up to 12 bookings have been received from a trainer but only 4 greyhound's trialled. This denies trainers the opportunity to book into a reasonable time slot and then leaves significant gap's on the night. Our staff have been directed not to move participants up due to the booking process so this is causing an issue and not allowing for an efficient process.

To address these issues GRSA will -

• Change the number of bookings per trainer/per

timeslot from 4 down to 3 or even 2 (this will mean that trainers will not be taking up almost half the slots in each 25 minute gap allowing for more trainers to spread their bookings)

- If you book a trial you pay regardless if the booking is withdrawn. This could be rescinded with sufficient explanation. (This would make participants think about booking their trials required rather than a scatter gun approach)
- To assist the above point we would invoice trainers for trialling rather than accepting money at the boxes. GRSA would know who is trialling based on documentation and will remove the loose change element on track. (This would ensure that all trainers pay for their trials and removes extra workload for hospitality staff and race day staff. This would create more processing of invoices for GRSA finance however the benefits would outweigh the negatives)

GRSA would also consider starting the night trial sessions earlier (maybe 6pm or 6.30pm) due to how late they are currently being completed. Previously there were issues with trainers getting back from a race meeting (bookings now take care of that) and staff having a sufficient break before starting another shift. However with the warmer weather coming GRSA would be hesitant with starting earlier and would be hopeful that if any of the above changes are implemented it would tighten the night up.



Breeders Support Updates

In September last year in response to inquiries about the changes to the Breeders Support Program taking effect in April 2016 Greyhound Racing SA advised the changes below. These changes are in support of breeder viability and continues increased spending on animal welfare and integrity initiatives.

Changes listed below:

Breeder Support Program

The following changes to the Breeder Support Program have been implemented:

- 1. Combined claim limit of \$800 for all veterinary and transport expenses
- 2. Removal of the advanced application process for the breeders rebate now that both sires and breeding females must be registered
- 3. Removal of the cap on litters in anticipation of national (tiered) breeder licensing

SA Bred Maiden Payment - \$1,000 if whelped in 2016

The SA bred maiden payment rewards participants that get a greyhound to the track to win a race. GRSA has committed to dramatically increase this payment from \$175 to \$1,000 (\$500 breeder/\$500 owner) on 1st July, 2017. This will result in all greyhounds that are whelped in 2016 being eligible for this support.

MyOzChase live

Earlier this year GRSA went Live with MyOzChase which provides an easy way for participants in the Greyhound Racing Industry to perform transactions online that previously had to be completed manually via paper-based Forms.

The portal available on the GRSA website will also improve communications between participants and Greyhound Racing Controlling Bodies.

MyOzChase initially offers the following functionality to users who register, obtain a log-in and complete a once-off identity verification prior to transacting online with their Controlling Body:

- · Online updates of personal details
- · View all their associated greyhounds (as an Owner, Trainer, Custodian, etc.)
- \cdot $\;$ Submit Notifications of Retirement for greyhounds
- Submit Trainership and/or Kennel changes for greyhounds (replacing the current Kennel Notification or Notice of Training / Removal Form) *Please note should you wish to transfer a previous Victorian trained greyhound into your kennel you will need to do this via the Online Nomination portal.
- · Link through to the Online Nominations website (for Trainers only)

Further enhancements will be made over time.

Notification of training amendment and clearance of greyhounds

Trainers are reminded of their obligation to notify GRSA within 3 working days of a greyhound coming into or leaving their kennel (Rule 105(4)(i)).

This is a requirement for all greyhounds regardless of where bred. We have had a number of trainers recently put in training amendments late the night prior to nominations closing at 9am the following day, this practice can lead to your nomination not being accepted or being unable to nominate online should any issues arise the following morning.

Trainers are also leaving it to the night before nominations close to have greyhounds "checked off". This practice can also lead to your nomination not being accepted or being unable to nominate online should any issues arise.

It is therefore in the trainer's best interest to have lodged with GRSA the training amendment and clearance of the greyhound a number of days prior to wishing to nominate the greyhound. It is not GRSA's responsibility to ensure that the paperwork is processed within ½ hour, which is the amount of time available to have it processed before nominations close at 9am.

Completion of paperwork

Participants are reminded of their obligation to ensure that when lodging paperwork that it is fully completed and payment is made at the time of lodgement.

New Notification of Retirement Forms

GRSA has released new forms for Notification of Retirement for greyhounds.

The forms are now separated for reporting retirement and euthanasia. It is a national requirement for the Controlling Body to be notified in writing by the last registered owner of the greyhound within ten working days for retirement and within two working days if humanely euthanased by a veterinarian.

The new forms have been supplied to all Clubs and local veterinary clinics who service greyhound clients.

Old forms will be accepted until December 1. Please familiarise yourself with the new forms and contact the Animal Welfare department with any questions.

Booking of practicals for licences

A reminder all practicals for Owner Attendants and Tier 3 Trainers licences MUST be booked through Renee Colquhoun on 82437113, following the full lodgement of paperwork and payment.

Stewards at trials and/or race meetings are unable to take bookings for practicals.

Lodgement of paperwork for licensing and breeding

Please ensure all paperwork, particularly applications for female breeding applications (pink cards), is lodged in a timely manner coming into the Christmas period.

Drone inspections

GRSA uses drone technology to take vision during some kennel inspections, particularly larger, rural properties where it is difficult to inspect the entire property on foot.

The GRSA drone operator is licensed by CASA and will operate the drone from a public road verge or the edge of the property. He is an authorised officer under the Rules of Racing and therefore has the same powers as Officers conducting premise inspections. If he operates from the road verge, signage will be set up stating a drone inspection is being undertaken for GRSA.

Once the drone is up, it will be only taking vision over GRSA registered premises.

Betting to lose

There are strict Rules around connections of greyhounds being able to place/lay bets on greyhounds.

The relevant Rules are below:

R87 Betting to lose

- (1) For the purposes of this Rule "lay" means the offering or placing of a bet on a greyhound:
 - (a) to lose an Event; or
 - (b) to be beaten by any other runner or runners in an Event other than a bet of a type which will generate a dividend if the greyhound places first in the Event and the other elements of that bet type required to be successful are satisfied; or
 - (c) to be beaten by any margin or range of margins in an Event; or
 - (d) that a greyhound will not be placed in any one of the first four finishing positions in an Event in accordance with the provisions of Rule 61.

(amended - 01.01.15)

- (2) Any person directly involved, or employed in the nomination, training or care of a greyhound or a person who has provided a service connected to a greyhound, within the preceding 21 days of the greyhound starting in an Event, shall not lay the greyhound in the Event.
- (3) In circumstances where it is an offence for a person to lay a greyhound pursuant to this Rule it shall also be an offence for that person to-
 - (a) have a greyhound laid on his behalf; or
 - (b) receive any money or other valuable consideration in any way connected with the laying of a greyhound by another person.
- (4) It shall be an offence for any person to offer an inducement to a participant in greyhound racing with the intention of profiting from a greyhound not participating in an Event to the best of its ability.

The Golden Rules

Avoidance of Prohibited Substance Breaches In noting that we have seen recent Cobalt and Arsenic threshold breaches, it serves as a timely opportunity for GRSA to remind participants – in their own best interests – that there are a number of Golden Rules that can help them to avoid making any such breaches (for prohibited substances generally) and which should be adhered to as principles of best practice:

- Always consult your vet to seek guidance in relation to any of the products that you are using, any associated risks and other relevant context
- Review the range of any feeds or supplements that you typically purchase and, wherever it is reasonable to do so, replace products containing substances that could contribute to a threshold breach under the rules (eg. cobalt) with alternative products
- Observe the instructions on any products that you use and adhere strictly to those directions (having regard for prescribed amounts, frequency of administration/ application, methodology for administering/applying)
- Refrain from the use of injectable treatments (eg. Vitamin B12) to any extent that is practical
- Refrain from any treatment of a greyhound on raceday other than as relates to its feeding and drinking requirements (GAR83(a)(1) treats this as a specific offence)

Our registered participants have the ultimate responsibility to ensure that greyhounds are presented free of prohibited substances. This information is offered as advice in good faith only and should not be relied upon as a defence in the event of a breach being recorded.

These Golden Rules will appear in the Integrity section of future Kennel Capers editions on an ongoing basis as a reminder for participants of this responsibility.

Hot Weather Policy

Greyhound Racing South Australia (GRSA) is committed to animal welfare. Like all animals, greyhounds can be affected by hot weather. The main form of cooling for canines is through panting. In an attempt to limit the effect of heat on greyhounds, GRSA has implemented this policy to ensure greyhounds are properly cared for during hot weather.

CANCELLATION OF MEETINGS:

GRSA will always attempt to move race meetings to a more suitable timeslot.

TABMEETINGS - Forecast 40°C or above

Day and Twilight meetings will be abandoned if the predicted temperature is forecast to be 40 °C or above at 8:00am on the morning of the scheduled event. Day and Twilight meetings are race meetings scheduled to start before 5:00pm.

Night meetings on days for which the predicted temperature is forecast to be 40°C or above at 8:00am will continue as scheduled but may still be called off, delayed, cancelled or abandoned at the discretion of the Stewards and the on-course Veterinarian.

If a Day or Twilight meeting proceeds in accordance with this policy, but the actual temperature reaches 40° C or above, a decision about the cancellation or abandonment of the meeting will be made at the discretion of the Stewards and the on-course Veterinarian.

NON-TAB MEETINGS - Forecast 40°C or above

Where the predicted temperature is forecast to be 40°C or above at 5:00pm on the Friday preceding the affected event, it will automatically be cancelled at that time. On the basis of an extreme hot weather forecast, a decision may be made prior to that time to cancel at the absolute discretion of Stewards.

COURSING MEETINGS - Forecast 30°C or above

In noting that Coursing involves multiple runs on the same day, when the predicted temperature is forecast to be 30°C or above at 5:00pm on the Friday preceding the affected event, it will automatically be cancelled at that time. On the basis of an extreme hot weather forecast, a decision may be made prior to that time to cancel at the absolute discretion of the Stewards.

SCRATCHING WITHOUT PENALTY

Trainers who have greyhounds engaged for racing on projected hot weather days – especially if they do not have air-conditioned transport facilities – may apply to scratch their runners **without penalty**. The following conditions apply:

- The predicted temperature is forecast for the venue's regional centre must be 38 °C or above at the time of scratching
- Applications to scratch greyhounds under this policy must be made prior to the official scratching time. If a greyhound is withdrawn after that time the normal 10 day penalty will apply.
- Trainers cannot scratch their greyhounds selectively all runners for that trainer must be withdrawn
- The temperature will be sourced from Weatherzone <u>www.weatherzone.com.au</u> and will link venues to regional centres in accordance with the following:

GRSA Venue	Corresponding Regional Centre
Angle Park	Metropolitan
Gawler	Roseworthy
Strathalbyn	Strathalbyn
Mount Gambier	Mount Gambier
Port Augusta	Port Augusta
Virginia	Elizabeth

NOTE: GRSA will maintain and monitor records of greyhounds which are scratched due to hot weather.

Selected greyhounds nominated by the one trainer to be scratched from meeting:

GRSA will maintain a Heat Stress Register which records greyhounds which are particularly vulnerable to heat stress. To be included in the register, a veterinary certificate confirming that the greyhound suffers from heat stress when racing or trialling in hot weather must be provided by the greyhound's trainer. That documentation must be received by GRSA in advance of the close of nominations for a given meeting for it to be eligible for selective scratching from that or any subsequent meetings due to hot weather.

Any greyhound on the register which is nominated for a meeting in relation to which the predicted temperature is forecast to be 38 °C degrees or higher for the corresponding regional centre as at the official scratching time will automatically be scratched from the meeting by GRSA. Under such circumstances, no penalty will be applied to the greyhound as a result of that scratching.

This policy will be applied regardless of whether the meeting in question is a Day, Twilight or Night meeting. It will also be considered a breach of this policy for a greyhound listed on the register to trial when the forecasted temperature is 38°C degrees or higher for the corresponding regional centre on that day other than for morning trial sessions.

COMMUNICATION OF CANCELLATION OF RACE MEETING OR TRIAL SESSION

GRSA will make every endeavour to announce any rescheduling of a race meeting by 8:00am that morning via the industry text service and any other vehicles that it deems appropriate. Radio TAB will be advised of any relevant information.

Trials may be cancelled at any time up until 4 hours prior to the scheduled commencement of the trial session. As with race meetings, the cancellation of a trial session will be notified by industry text and any other appropriate vehicles.

RACING OPERATIONAL GUIDELINES - HOT WEATHER

- 1) In hot weather conditions when the predicted temperature is forecast to be 35°C or above, GRSA will ensure that the kennel house is opened 30 minutes earlier at all venues
- 2) Greyhounds to spend minimum time outside kennels
- 3) Previews are to be conducted in a shaded area
- 4) Greyhounds to parade directly to starting boxes
- 5) Greyhounds to remain in kennel house for at least 30 minutes after their event

- 6) Club to provide adequate drinking facilities for greyhounds
- 7) Club to provide adequate cooling foot-baths
- 8) Club to provide bottled water to participants when temperature is 35 °C or above.
- 9) Ice vests can be used during parading and after the event but must be removed prior to placing greyhounds into their allotted kennel
- 10) GRSA Racing Department (where possible) to program Distance events during the coolest part of the meeting (Day meetings early races, Night Meetings later races)
- 11) In hot weather conditions when the predicted temperature is forecast to be 35°C or above, barking muzzles will not to be permitted to be used at any time at SA race tracks

GRSA reserves the right to alter this policy at any time.

Owners can direct prizemoney to GAP on the Prizemoney Reimbursement forms. GRSA has made this change on the forms where Owners can direct a percentage of prizemoney to GAP.

PROJECTS UPDATE

Murray Bridge works progressing

Construction on the new Murray Bridge greyhound racing facility commenced in early September and works have been progressing well.

Most of the work to date has centred around the footings for the patron facility, kennel house and main judges tower. These buildings will take shape first, with the majority of work on the two race tracks being completed early next year.

The project has progressed fairly smoothly to date, with both budget and schedule matching expectations.









Mobilong Prison completed

Construction of the Mobilong Prison kennel house has finally been completed and the building is ready to receive its first uptake of greyhounds seeking new homes.

The project has been a collaboration between GRSA, the Department of Correctional Services and the Mobilong Prison, which has required many hours of planning and organisation.


The 16 greyhound kennel house will serve to assist GAP in educating retired races to the particulars of a residential type environment and increase the overall capacity of the program.

Mt Gambier track changes

Keen viewers of the Mount Gambier greyhounds on the weekend may have noticed something a little different when watching the races.

The Club have just recently replaced the bulky white safety rail uprights with a more streamlined version, allowing for better viewing of greyhounds as they run from the 400m start to the 732m start.

The committee down in the south-east continue to be proactive in regards to club infrastructure upgrades and are constantly discussing their ideas to GRSA Management.







Gawler track works

GRSA recently engaged civil contractors to excavate the inside of the Gawler track, reduce the build up of sand underneath the rail and to perform a general track turnover.

A separate contractor was also engaged to install a safety/bump rail to the lure system. This rail was installed from the winning post, past the 400m start to he end of the back straight.

Budgetary constraints limited the safety rail installation to just 50% of the lure system, however it was felt the area completed presents the most risk, particularly for greyhounds exiting the 400m boxes.

Emerley Park upgrades

The GRSA Maintenance team continues to support the Emerley Park operation to ensure its availability as a training and trialing facility for industry participants.

100 tonne of sand was recently added to the straight track and the track was graded and levelled. The circle track was also turned over and levelled this week.

The track timing systems should be completed in the next month, following delays in equipment supply and resourcing issues.

Smaller projects relating to increased water supply, better electrical connections and more appropriate track preparation equipment are also being investigated.

McDonnell Memorial heat winners impress

Dominant wins by Greenback Boogie, Noosa Parade and Lektra Stomp in the heats of the Newman McDonnell Memorial has set the scene for a great final on November 19th.

Greenback Boogie, raced by the Parko's Syndicate, was having his first look at the track but quickly crossed from box six to lead the field out of the first turn.

After a brief challenge from Dream Edition, the black dog strode right away to eventually run out a five length winner over the early challenger – also through to the final – in a pretty tidy 30.15 seconds.

By Barcia Bale x Cosmic Aphrodite, Greenback Boogie is Ballarat trainer Trent Blacker's first winner at Tara Raceway.

Blacker, whose mother Carolyn formerly successfully trained thoroughbreds at Strathalbyn in SA, became involved in greyhound racing only two years ago after previously working for seven years with leading Victorian thoroughbred trainer Darren Weir.

Ecklin South trainer Peter Fulton continued his terrific run with Noosa Parade when the son of Collision and Miss Black Fern scored an impressive 61/4 length win in the second heat over fellow qualifiers Two Jobs and Cryer's Bob.

Owned by the Noosa Fishing Syndicate, Noosa Parade led all the way from box one to take his record at the local track to three wins and two seconds from six starts, with Fulton believing a couple of weeks freshen-up contributed to the dog's 29.94 seconds best of day time on Sunday.

Lektra Stomp found winning form again after five outs when leading all the way to defeat Signal Peak and Rising Girl - all three through to the final – by 5½ lengths and 1¾ lengths respectively in 29.95 seconds.

Jamie Quinlivian made the seven-hour trip from Merbein South with a team of four, Signal Peak backing up after a close fourth behind Windmill Haze in last Sunday's Group 3 Gawler Cup and having the misfortune to run into Lektra Stomp on one of his good days - which to be fair, are pretty good.

The Newman McDonnell Memorial, one of the longest-running feature events conducted at Tara Raceway, continues to be sponsored by his family in recognition of his efforts in the early years of greyhound racing in Mount Gambier.

Tara Raceway, the name also carried at the Glenburnie track, was derived from the prefix "Tara" that he used in the naming of many of his racing greyhounds.

QUALIFYING TRIALS – NOW WEEKLY

Angle Park Qualifying Trials are run weekly on Tuesday night, for the corresponding Monday APM meeting and the Wednesday APD meeting. Trainers must be specific on their nominations about which day they are trialling for and what distance. (ie Wed 388m, Mon 515, Mon 600m etc)

Tuesday Angle Park Qualifying dates are:

November 21st (for APM Monday meeting on 27th November – not for APD Wednesday meeting on 29th November due to Time Grading)

November 28th (for APM Monday meeting on 4th December – for APD Wednesday meeting on 6th December)

December 5th (for APM Monday meeting on 11th December – for APD Wednesday meeting on 13th December)

December 12th (for APM Monday meeting on 18th December – not for APD Wednesday meeting on 20th December due to Time Grading)

December 19th (no APM Monday meeting on 25th December – for APD Wednesday meeting on 27th December)

December 26th No Trials

Nominations close with GRSA at 12.30pm on the Tuesday of the meeting.

NOMINATING ONLINE FOR QUALIFYING TRIALS

For Angle Park, Gawler and Strathalbyn qualifying trials the nominations must be lodged with GRSA by 12.30pm on the day of the meeting. To nominate online however you can only do this up until 11.59pm the day before. Due to a system security policy you cannot nominate on the day for these trials online. Please contact our staff if you have any issues with these nominations prior to them closing.

SINGLE TRIALS

A reminder to trainers that single trials can be booked with two greyhounds however you need to advise when booking of your intention to do this. If you wish to put three or more into this trial then a field trial will have to be booked.

BOOKING NUMBER FOR TRIALS

Participants wishing to book trials are required to ring 8243 7172, this phone line will only be used for trial bookings and will queue participants. By having this one number with participants queuing makes this process to be a more efficient way of booking trials.

There will be NO trials accepted through the normal administration number. To be fair to everyone GRSA will only accept bookings using the new number.

POLICY FOR TRIALS IN PLACE

POLICY FOR TRIALLING AT ANGLE PARK AND GAWLER BEFORE THE RACE MEETING

RACE MEETING TRIAL POLICY

Angle Park Monday & Wednesday along with Gawler Tuesday, Friday and Sunday.

Two fields from the boxes with a maximum of four (4) greyhounds will be conducted immediately following the completion of the kennelling procedure for the Race Meeting.

The following lists the order in which greyhounds will be selected in the event if more than 8 greyhounds nominated.

- 1. Reserves at the Meeting that do not obtain starts.
- 2. Trainers that have greyhounds engaged and are located in an area affected by track closures.
- 3. Trainers that have greyhounds engaged.
- 4. Satisfactory trials.
- 5. Other greyhounds.

PROCEDURE/CRITERIA

- For Monday nights trainer to contact GRSA between 10.00am and 11.00am on the Monday to nominate. Should the Monday be a public holiday bookings are to be made between 8am and 9am on the scratching line.
- 2. For Angle Park Wednesday, Gawler Tuesday & Friday trainer to contact GRSA between 4.00pm and 4.30pm on the day before.
- 3. For Gawler Sunday trainer to contact GRSA between 8.00am and 9.00am on the scratching line to nominate.
- 4. Other than reserve greyhounds Trainers will be restricted to trialling one (1) greyhound unless nominations determine otherwise.
- 5. Stewards allot the Box for the Greyhound.
- 6. Trials will be 515m & 531m in distance as first preference. Other distances considered depending on nominations.
- 7. Greyhounds currently under suspension or not cleared to race are not eligible to be nominated (these trials are conducted as if they are at a race meeting so all greyhounds need to be eligible at nomination time).
- 8. Greyhound registration certificate or cards must be produced at kennelling time.
- Trainers with other greyhounds engaged can utilize the extra kennel space until such time they are ready to leave

OR trainers with no other greyhounds will be free to leave following their trial.

If there are 12 races at Angle Park or Gawler there will be NO trials.

The Vet Clinic at these meetings cannot be used to accommodate any greyhounds to allow for extra trialling greyhounds. This policy has been introduced so that participants book in under the policy. The Vet Clinic needs to be available for the Vet and Stewards at race meetings

EXCEPTIONS TO THIS POLICY-

- Thursday nights are kept available for the option for Interstate greyhounds to solo trial in a lead up to our Group races and also local greyhound's trialling for Group racing interstate.
- Local greyhounds will be allowed to solo trial in a lead up to a feature race upon request and they will take one of the eight kennels available for trialling ahead of the policy and sit separately to the 4 dog trials. Feature races are considered to be – Adelaide Cup, Gawler Cup, Oaks, Derby, Howard Ashton, Brian Johnstone, SA Sprint, SA Distance Championship, SA Anniversary Cup, SA Country Cup, National Finals & any Group race Interstate.
- Local greyhounds will be allowed to trial on a race night, where they are in preparation for a feature event and nominated for a meeting and the race does not stand up. This will include all distances and also take precedence over the policy.
- If a greyhound qualifies for a feature final and requires a trial in between this will be conducted as a solo trial and sit separately to the 2 four dog trials.

It is extremely important that trainers book in to trial at these race meetings. If unable to book in at these times then please contact GRSA where permission may be given to accept a booking outside of these times.
