Industry Director Election

Raw Ability wins Group 1 Adelaide Cup

Friday the 13th is normally unlucky for some but for Anthony Azzopardi it will go down as one of his luckiest days after his up and coming chaser Raw Ability stamped himself as a star of the future when he took out the Group 1 UBET Adelaide Cup final.

Earlier in the week the son of Barcia Bale and Bugatti Flyer was at double figure odds to take home the \$75,000 first prize however he was strongly supported to start on the fourth line of betting at \$6.50.

In one of the best Adelaide Cup line ups in recent history Raw Ability began well from box 4 to challenge for the early lead along with strong local hope High Eden Frost for Jan Jones who made full use of his inside box. Race favourite Bewildering for Seona Thompson began well and moved up stylishly from his wide box. Locally owned cult hero Worm Burner was slow out along with Zara's Entity both finding themselves at the tail of the field. Leaving the front straight both High Eden Frost and Raw Ability matched

their motors with Aston Dee Bee for Seona Thompson pushing up behind the leaders before running wide and shoving his kennel mate Bewildering wider. Striker Light moved to third along the inside chasing out after the leaders. Down the back straight and Raw Ability made his move racing to the front of the back straight with High Eden Frost battling on strongly and Aston Dee Bee striding into third. Turning for home Raw Ability was in full flight and raced down to the finish line a convincing winner by 3 lengths in a blistering 29.50 for the 515m journey. Aston Dee Bee claimed a gallant High Eden Frost in the shadows of the post to run second with only a neck separating them. Highlighting the evenness and

quality of the field there was just over 6 lengths between first and last with the likes of Bewildering, Zara's Entity and Worm Burner all excellent performances but had no luck in running.

Raw Ability is owned by Anthony's partner Kylee Osborne and everyone in the presentation area could tell it was an emotional victory for the family. Friday night's victory took Raw Ability's career earnings to over \$125,000 with a record of 13 wins and 5 placings from just 24 starts.

As part of SA's Breeders Super Bonus Scheme Worm Burner's breeder, Alan McCulloch will receive \$1,000 for making the Group 1 Adelaide Cup.

There were 1,200 patrons oncourse for the meeting which was up on last year's 950. Chaser's Restaurant was totally booked out over a week before the Cup with around 500 people enjoying the famous Chaser's Buffet and 100 children who enjoyed the "Spooky" treasure hunt, face painters and family areas provided on the night. The parade of greyhounds from pups to Greyhound Adoption dogs was a big hit along with the Cash Grab which saw plenty of patron involvement.

Our total UBET tote turnover on the meeting was \$231,013 compared to the \$241,235 from last years Adelaide Cup. The Jackpot provided by UBET performed well for the Cup with having a First 4 Jackpot of \$10,000 the pool reached \$52,596 compared to \$51,512 with the same jackpot last year.

The Local turnover was \$101,291 which was good compared to last years \$104,269 while the oncourse tote at Angle Park was \$71,371 up on last year's \$62,700.

With only one Bookmaker this year his figures were \$8,956 compared to \$10,012 and \$14,456 the year before with two bookmakers.

The Adelaide Cup Consolation was won by High Eden Snow for Jan Jones while the Premiers Cup was won by Bogie Bekim for Ben Rawlings. The SA Country Cup was won by Stick Figure for Tony Rasmussen representing the Strathalbyn GRC.

The Oaks a winning affair for Britton

The Group 3 Coffex Coffee SA Oaks at Angle Park on the 21st September was another exciting race with this year dominated by the greyhounds from the Garden State.

Jeff Britton from Victoria had 3 runners engaged while his partner Angela Langton had Hoo Gur Affair engaged with Osakalaka for Jessica Sharp nicely positioned out of box 1.

As the boxes flew open Hoo Gur Affair pounced on the early lead from box 4 and opened up a handy break. Osakalaka and Libby Raider for local Paula Hearnden showed early speed while the classy Paradiso Lass began slowly and was back in the pack.

As the Oaks field charged down the back straight Hoo Gur Affair



was low flying and in full control while Osakalaka ran to second and Paradiso Lass began to get motoring from midfield. As they turned for home Hoo Gur Affair was in no danger and went on to record a strong victory. She ran sizzling time with splits of 4.49, 16.97 and an overall of 29.86. She won by 3½

lengths from Paradiso Lass who flew home to grab second just ahead of Osakalaka ½ a length back in third.

The \$25,000 first prize took Hoo Gur Affair's prizemoney to just under \$38,000 and the impressive record of 5 wins and 3 placings from her 9 lifetime starts.

Derby Final produces quinella for WA trainer

The BGC SA Derby final again showcased some of the best young male chasers in the land with a hot field lining up for the Group 3 feature at Angle Park on September 21.

All the rage was the Jeff Britton trained Mepunga Blazer who was sent out a very short priced favourite on the back of his brilliant 29.25 heat win last week. The star chaser began fairly from box 7 to be mid field at the winning post on the first occasion while kennel mates Black Bombshell and Bundles Galore for Enzo Crudeli used their inside boxes to grab forward positions. With tight racing to the first turn there was interference with Queensland visitor Maurice Minor for Tom Tzouvelis finding severe trouble and was retired from the event but fortunately sustained only a minor injury.



After the trouble on the first turn Black Bombshell sped away down the back straight with Bundles Galore in hot pursuit. The Jeff Britton threesome of Mepunga Tycoon, Alpha Aion and Mepunga Blazer were all battling for third and chasing hard. In the run to the line the WA kennel mates fought out a

strong drive to the winning post with Black Bombshell holding on for a well-deserved victory. He won by ¾ lengths in a very slick 29.79 with splits of 4.41, 16.74 in defeating Bundles Galore. Race favourite Mepunga Blazer did a good job to run third with nothing going his way during the run.

Cairnlea Kenny claims quinella in monthly awards



Greyhound of the month for September was the Petar Jovanovic trained Cairnlea Kenny who had a terrific month of racing winning two races and a second from 4 starts.

He started the month of with a 5th in the Kings and Queens final at Angle Park before bouncing back in a big way with a 9 length win in a sizzling 29.47 win at headquarters against a high quality field on the pathway to the Adelaide Cup. He then had no luck in running second behind Group 1 winner Ando's Mac before topping the month of and

his Adelaide Cup campaign with a brilliant come from behind victory at Angle Park in a slick 29.81.

At the end of the month Cairnlea Kenny's record stands at 27 starts with 10 wins and 12 placings with earnings around \$27,000.

The Run of the Month for September was Cairnlea Kenny for trainer Petar Jovanovic for his performance at Angle Park on Thursday 14th September where he was brilliant in winning against FFA company.

The son of Premier Fantasy and Cairnlea Ollie began well from box 1 to punch-through and lead early.

From there he ran sensational time out in front with splits of 4.47, 16.76 and an overall of 29.47 in winning by over 9 lengths.

2018 Gawler Produce Stakes

The 2018 Gawler Produce Stakes will be run by GRSA in conjunction with the Gawler Greyhound Racing Club. Once again we will offer guaranteed Final Stake money, which will be \$22,000. The estimate for the total series prizemoney is \$40,000, based on this year's series. The series is for greyhounds whelped in 2016.

In 2018 we will again be offering additional incentives for trainers to nominate. A bonus will be offered to any greyhound which can win both the Produce Stake and the Gawler Gold Cup.

The jackpot will increase from \$5,000 to \$6,000 if the Gawler Cup this year is not won by Dream A Little.

The SA Bred bonus will also be continued; should the winner of the Final be SA bred, there will be a bonus of \$1,000 to the owner and \$500 to the breeder.

The dates for this series will be Heats on Sunday 24th June 2018, Semi Finals on Sunday 1st July 2018 and the Final on Sunday 8th July 2018 with a \$2,700 consolation event.

GRSA administers the event for the Club, so all payments are to be made to GRSA. The fees are, one-off payment option \$121.00 or the sustaining option at \$33 (first), \$55 (second) and \$88 (Final).

Nomination Forms are available, along with the full list of conditions and the payment schedule. Forms have been posted to those with eligible greyhounds.

Booking of trials for Angle Park and Gawler

Recently GRSA has received feedback in regard to the Online Trial booking process for both Gawler Wednesday and Angle Park Tuesday and Saturday trial sessions.

This process of online bookings is full supported by the ICG and GRSA Board and will continue to grow however there have been some issue identified as needing to be addressed.

- To encourage the move from 100% phone bookings to online GRSA made the decision to separate the booking times from 12.30pm, to 11.30am for online and 12.30pm for phone. This has worked successfully and reduced the number of phone calls dramatically. This encourages participants to manage their own bookings.

However, GRSA believes that the separation is now no longer required, so both online and phone bookings will now start at 11.30am for trial sessions from 30th October 2017.

It was decided to go to 11.30am due to the commitment participants have made to the online process and worked their schedule around this time being at home or near their device to book.

Whilst having the bookings at the same time the trial booking phone line will still be 08 8243 7172. No trials will be accepted on any other phone line; participants will be queued as normal and will not be taken before 11.30am. Our staff member will attempt to book your phone trials in a timely manner bearing in mind participants will be booking online at the same time. I would encourage all participants to move to the online process as this is quicker, easier and you have the flexibility to manage the process yourselves.

- It is important for all participants to realise that at any point from 11.30am when the trials open to around 3.30pm the day of the trial session (or day before for Saturday) they can log on or ring up and manage their bookings. They may be able to move earlier or later if there has been a cancellation etc, it really does provide an option if their time is unsuitable.

Some other issues have presented themselves and we will be seriously considering these options in the coming months if there is no change –

As GRSA can log all the bookings we are finding the 25 minute slots are filling up extremely quickly. In the space of 30 seconds of them opening up we are already up to 9pm. What is disappointing we then find that many of these bookings are deleted prior to the trial session. In some case up to 12 bookings have been received from a trainer but only

4 greyhounds trialled. This denies trainers the opportunity to book into a reasonable time slot and then leaves significant gaps on the night. Our trial night staff have been directed not to move participants up due to the booking process so this is causing an issue and not allowing for an efficient process.

To address these issues GRSA will –

- Change the number of bookings per trainer/per timeslot from 4 down to 3 or even 2 (this will mean that trainers will not be taking up almost half the slots in each 25 minute gap allowing for more trainers to spread their bookings)
- If you book a trial you pay regardless if the booking is withdrawn. (This would make participants think about booking their trials required rather than a scatter gun approach).
- To assist the above point we would invoice trainers for trialling rather than accepting money on the night/day. GRSA would know who is trialling based on documentation and will remove the loose change element on track. (This would ensure that all trainers pay for their trials and removes extra workload for hospitality staff and race day staff. This would create more processing of invoices for GRSA finance however the benefits would outweigh the negatives)

GRSA would also consider starting the night trial sessions earlier (maybe 6pm or 6.30pm) due to how late they are currently being completed. Previously there were issues with trainers getting back from a race meeting (bookings now take care of that) and staff having a sufficient break before starting another shift. However, with the warmer weather coming GRSA would be hesitant with starting earlier and would be hopeful that if any of the above changes are implemented it would tighten the night up.

Nomination limits on Port Augusta and GOTBA Coursing

At the most recent GRSA Board meeting it was determined to provide limits of nominations for both the NON TAB Port Augusta meetings and GOTBA Coursing events to provide some form of indication on the likely scenario of the meeting proceeding or being cancelled, this will assist both participants and staff alike.

The number of nominations required for a meeting to proceed for Port Augusta is 40 and for GOTBA Coursing it is 30. As always GRSA will extend nominations if this number is below these cut offs however if it is significantly lower, then GRSA will liaise with the Clubs in regard to cancelling the meeting straight away if agreed.

2017 Group 3 Gawler Gold Cup Final on November 5th

The Gawler Gold Cup carnival will be run over three meetings. The carnival will kick off on Sunday 29th October with heats of the Gawler Sprint Classic for open 400m greyhounds.

There will be heats of the Gawler Stayers Cup for open 643m greyhounds. Both finals worth \$7,855 will be run on Gawler Gold Cup night (Sunday 5th November).

On Tuesday 31st October the \$2,500 heats for the Group 3 Gawler Gold Cup will be run over the 531m. The meeting will be run as a day meeting with normal Tuesday times.

The Group 3 final will be run on Sunday night 5th November worth \$36,000 in prizemoney with the winner to receive

\$25,000. Including the Gawler Sprint Classic and Gawler Stayers Cup there will be a Consolation for the Gawler Gold Cup worth \$4,000.

GOTBA Coursing Awards night on 2nd November

GOTBA will present their Annual Awards at Angle Park on Thursday 2nd November. To be presented will be the SA Coursing Greyhound of the Year and the Coursing Trainer of the Year.

Also featuring on the night will be a Free For All event for greyhounds which competed at Virginia during 2017. This race will be graded on circle form. The race is supported by GOTBA and carries prizemoney of \$4,590.

Nominations close with GRSA at 9.00am on Monday 30th October.

\$14,285 Strathalbyn Cup on November 19 and 26

The Daish Irrigation & Fodder Strathalbyn Cup series begins with heats on Sunday 19th November.

The Cup has been increased and is worth \$14,285 with the final run on Sunday 26th November along with a \$2,000 Consolation.

Nominations for the heats close with GRSA at 9.00am on Tuesday 14th November.

Leigh Rogers Grade 6 Feature

The Leigh Rogers Grade 6 feature will be run over the 515m journey with \$2,445 Heats on Thursday 2nd November and the \$9,920 Final on Thursday 9th November.

Nominations for the heats close with GRSA at 9.00am on Monday 30th October.

GRSA introduced this new race onto the feature race calendar in recognition of former long time Food & Beverage Manager Leigh Rogers who lost his battle with a rare form of cancer late last year. Leigh is the husband of Rachael and father of three young girls and it will be great to see family members, current & former staff and participants alike recognise him on the night.

Brian Johnstone Heats

Following both the Classic 2017 Preludes, attention swings to the rich Brian Johnstone Series. The Group 3 series is the main event of the Classic 2017 Futurity.

The Heats for the Brian Johnstone will be run on Wednesday 15th November at Angle Park. They will be followed by Semi-Finals on Thursday 23rd November and the \$37,500 Final on Thursday 30th November.

Group 1 victory (interstate) \$7,500

Group 2 victory (interstate) \$3,500

Group 3 victory (interstate) \$1,750

The super-bonuses for interstate events will only be applied for series/events that are open entry. Events that are restricted by age or gender are eligible for the bonus. Events that are exclusively open to SA Bred runners or incorporate other restrictions, such as 'sweepstake' events, puppy/ auction Classics and maiden series are not eligible for the super-bonus.

- The main race series Heats and Final are scheduled for June 2019. One month before (May) there will be a Wednesday 388m series with Heats and Final for pups sold at the Auction. There will also be a Wednesday heats 515m and Final Thursday night 515m held in July the month after the main race series.

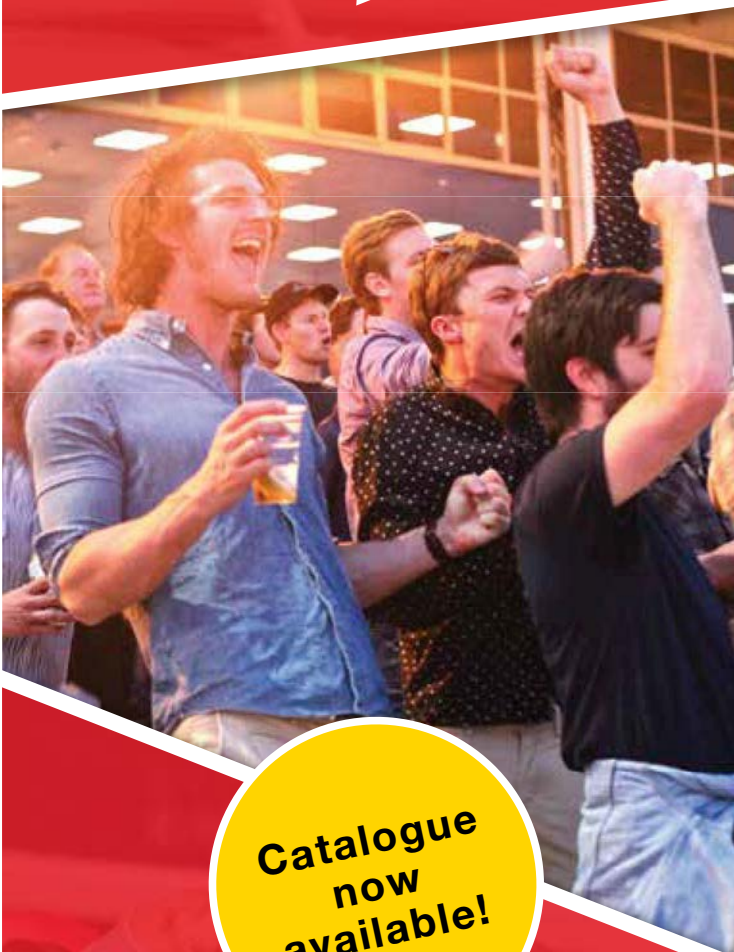
Chasers Buffet on Monday Nights

Breeders Support Updates

In September last year in response to inquiries about the changes to the Breeders Support Program taking effect in April 2016 Greyhound Racing SA advised the changes below.

These changes are in support of breeder viability and continues increased spending on animal welfare and integrity initiatives. Changes listed below:

Breeder Support Program

The following changes to the Breeder Support Program have been implemented:

1. Combined claim limit of \$800 for all veterinary and transport expenses
2. Removal of the advanced application process for the breeders rebate now that both sires and breeding females must be registered
3. Removal of the cap on litters in anticipation of national (tiered) breeder licensing

SA Bred Maiden Payment - \$1,000 if whelped in 2016

The SA bred maiden payment rewards participants that get a greyhound to the track to win a race. GRSA has committed to dramatically increase this payment from \$175 to \$1,000 (\$500 breeder/\$500 owner) on 1st July, 2017. This will result in all greyhounds that are whelped in 2016 being eligible for this support.

MyOzChase website live

Earlier this year GRSA went Live with MyOzChase which provides an easy way for participants in the Greyhound Racing Industry to perform transactions online that previously had to be completed manually via paper-based Forms.

The portal available on the GRSA website will also improve communications between participants and Greyhound Racing Controlling Bodies.

MyOzChase initially offers the following functionality to users who register, obtain a log-in and complete a once-off identity verification prior to transacting online with their Controlling Body:

- Online updates of personal details
- View all their associated greyhounds (as an Owner, Trainer, Custodian, etc.)
- Submit Notifications of Retirement for greyhounds
- Submit Trainership and/or Kennel changes for greyhounds (replacing the current Kennel Notification or Notice of Training / Removal Form)
* Please note should you wish to transfer a previous Victorian trained greyhound into your kennel you will need to do this via the Online Nomination portal.
- Link through to the Online Nominations website (for Trainers only)

Further enhancements will be made over time.

Mount Gambier 277m racing

Recently GRSA has had a couple of queries in regard to the reintroduction of 277m racing at Mt Gambier after they installed their 732m distance boxes.

When Mt Gambier transitioned from Non TAB to TAB Sky Racing the 400m boxes were installed and the 277m racing ceased. There is no intention from GRSA to move back to 277m racing. With the full support of the Mt Gambier GRC in regard to Time Grading, greyhounds of all abilities can race on Fridays over 400m, 512m, 600m so we feel at this time there is no need to separate the pool of greyhounds any further. Time Grading does allow greyhounds the opportunity to get into a race they can be competitive in, even if they can't run a quick 400m.

Having said that, like the potential to run 388m races on a Monday night, where we are today is quite different than two years ago and will likely be different in a further two years, therefore nothing would be ruled out as an option by GRSA.

Notification of Training Amendment and Clearance of Greyhounds

Trainers are reminded of their obligation to notify GRSA within 3 working days of a greyhound coming into or leaving their kennel (Rule 105(4)(i)).

This is a requirement for all greyhounds regardless of where bred. We have had a number of trainers recently put in training amendments late the night prior to nominations closing at 9am the following day, this practice can lead to your nomination not being accepted or being unable to nominate online should any issues arise the following morning.

Trainers are also leaving it to the night before nominations close to have greyhounds "checked off". This practice can also lead to your nomination not being accepted or being unable to nominate online should any issues arise.

It is therefore in the trainer's best interest to have lodged with GRSA the training amendment and clearance of the greyhound a number of days prior to wishing to nominate the greyhound. It is not GRSA's responsibility to ensure that the paperwork is processed within ½ hour, which is the amount of time available to have it processed before nominations close at 9am.

Completion of paperwork

Participants are reminded of their obligation to ensure that when lodging paperwork that it is fully completed and payment is made at the time of lodgement.

GRSA is here to assist should you be unsure of how to complete any paperwork however it is not our responsibility to arrange for its completion, nor is it our responsibility to ensure that it is lodged. Therefore, please ensure when lodging any paperwork eg, Transfer of Ownerships, Litter Registrations etc that they are fully completed and paid for and lodged within a timely manner.

Stewarding, Animal Welfare and Licensing

Race day vehicle and trailer inspections

GRSA officials will shortly undertake race day inspections of vehicles and trailers to ensure they are in a fit condition to transport greyhounds.

Now is a good opportunity to ensure vehicles and trailers are ready for the warmer months. Please contact the Animal Welfare department for any queries about the GRSA Transportation policy and/or transporting greyhounds in general.

Participants should also be aware of the following Rules:

R84B Possession on course

(1) No person, unless he or she has obtained the permission of the Stewards, shall have in his or her possession, either on a racecourse or in any motor vehicle or trailer being used for the purpose of travelling to or from a racecourse, any prohibited substance or a syringe, needle or other instrument which could be used to administer a prohibited substance to a greyhound.

(2) The Stewards may impose terms and conditions when giving permission under sub rule (1).

(3) A person who fails to comply with sub rule (1) or with a term or condition imposed under sub rule (2) is guilty of an offence.

(4) For the purpose of sub rule (1) possession includes control of and right of access to the prohibited substance or syringe, needle or other instrument.

(added – 01.07.15)

Hot weather policy

With the weather heating up, Stewards remind all participants to read and understand the GRSA Hot Weather Policy.

The policy covers areas such as the movement of meetings to more suitable timeslots to avoid hot weather, scratchings and Club requirements when the forecast is 35°C or above. If you have updated your mobile phone number, please advise GRSA as a text message service is used to advise industry members of any changes.

The Hot Weather Policy follows these pages and is also available on the GRSA website.

Retiring greyhounds to GAP

Trainers and Owners are reminded when retiring a greyhound to GAP, it is still a requirement under the National Rules to submit a Notification of Retirement Form to GRSA within ten (10) days of the retirement.

Identification cards for SA-bred greyhounds

GRSA can replace greyhound identification cards for SA-bred greyhounds. Please alert Stewards on race day if cards have become worn or illegible and they will arrange for a new card to be re-issued.

Race day chats

GRSA has been conducting race day chats over the last few months.

Lisa Michalanney is available on these days to discuss Rules, Animal Welfare, Licensing and Stewarding matters. So feel free to say hello, ask a question or make a suggestion.

Inquiries and notifications

Mr. Scott Feltus – Stewards inquiry 18/09/17 – GAR 86(o) – Improper conduct in relation to aggressive, offensive and unnecessary comments towards another trainer at the Angle Park race meeting on 25/08/17. Mr. Feltus was found guilty and was suspended for a period of two (2) months; wholly suspended for 12 months on the condition he does not re-offend under the same Rule and was fined \$750.

Mr. Anthony Milligan – Stewards inquiry 16/10/17 – GAR 83(2) – Failed to present the greyhound AMITY MARLOW free of any prohibited substances (THEOBROMINE) for an event at Angle Park on 1 June 2017. Mr. Milligan pleaded guilty and was suspended for a period of four (4) months with three (3) months suspended for 24 months on the condition he does not re-offend under the same Rule and was fined \$500. Suspension to commence midnight 25/10/17. AMITY MARLOW was disqualified from the event.

The Golden Rules

Avoidance of Prohibited Substance Breaches

In noting that we have seen recent Cobalt and Arsenic threshold breaches, it serves as a timely opportunity for GRSA to remind participants – in their own best interests – that there are a number of Golden Rules that can help them to avoid making any such breaches (for prohibited substances generally) and which should be adhered to as principles of best practice:

- Always consult your vet to seek guidance in relation to any of the products that you are using, any associated risks and other relevant context
- Review the range of any feeds or supplements that you typically purchase and, wherever it is reasonable to do so, replace products containing substances that could contribute to a threshold breach under the rules (eg. cobalt) with alternative products
- Observe the instructions on any products that you use and adhere strictly to those directions (having regard for prescribed amounts, frequency of administration/application, methodology for administering/applying)
- Refrain from the use of injectable treatments (eg. Vitamin B12) to any extent that is practical
- Refrain from any treatment of a greyhound on raceday other than as relates to its feeding and drinking requirements (GAR83(a)(1) treats this as a specific offence)

Our registered participants have the ultimate responsibility to ensure that greyhounds are presented free of prohibited substances. This information is offered as advice in good faith only and should not be relied upon as a defence in the event of a breach being recorded.

These Golden Rules will appear in the Integrity section of future Kennel Capers editions on an ongoing basis as a reminder for participants of this responsibility.



Greyhound Racing South Australia (GRSA) is committed to animal welfare. Like all animals, greyhounds can be affected by hot weather. The main form of cooling for canines is through panting. In an attempt to limit the effect of heat on greyhounds, GRSA has implemented this policy to ensure greyhounds are properly cared for during hot weather.

CANCELLATION OF MEETINGS:

GRSA will always attempt to move race meetings to a more suitable timeslot.

TABMEETINGS – Forecast 40° C or above

Day and Twilight meetings will be abandoned if the predicted temperature is forecast to be 40° C or above at 8:00am on the morning of the scheduled event. Day and Twilight meetings are race meetings scheduled to start before 5:00pm.

Night meetings on days for which the predicted temperature is forecast to be 40° C or above at 8:00am will continue as scheduled but may still be called off, delayed, cancelled or abandoned at the discretion of the Stewards and the on-course Veterinarian.

If a Day or Twilight meeting proceeds in accordance with this policy, but the actual temperature reaches 40° C or above, a decision about the cancellation or abandonment of the meeting will be made at the discretion of the Stewards and the on-course Veterinarian.

NON-TAB MEETINGS – Forecast 40° C or above

Where the predicted temperature is forecast to be 40° C or above at 5:00pm on the Friday preceding the affected event, it will automatically be cancelled at that time. On the basis of an extreme hot weather forecast, a decision may be made prior to that time to cancel at the absolute discretion of Stewards.

COURSING MEETINGS – Forecast 30° C or above

In noting that Coursing involves multiple runs on the same day, when the predicted temperature is forecast to be 30° C or above at 5:00pm on the Friday preceding the affected event, it will automatically be cancelled at that time. On the basis of an extreme hot weather forecast, a decision may be made prior to that time to cancel at the absolute discretion of the Stewards.

SCRATCHING WITHOUT PENALTY

Trainers who have greyhounds engaged for racing on projected hot weather days – especially if they do not have air-conditioned transport facilities – may apply to scratch their runners **without penalty**. The following conditions apply:

- The predicted temperature is forecast for the venue's regional centre must be 38° C or above at the time of scratching
- Applications to scratch greyhounds under this policy must be made prior to the official scratching time. If a greyhound is withdrawn after that time the normal 10 day penalty will apply.
- Trainers cannot scratch their greyhounds selectively – all runners for that trainer must be withdrawn
- The temperature will be sourced from Weatherzone – www.weatherzone.com.au – and will link venues to regional centres in accordance with the following:

GRSA Venue	Corresponding Regional Centre
Angle Park	Metropolitan
Gawler	Roseworthy
Strathalbyn	Strathalbyn
Mount Gambier	Mount Gambier
Port Augusta	Port Augusta
Virginia	Elizabeth

NOTE: GRSA will maintain and monitor records of greyhounds which are scratched due to hot weather.

Selected greyhounds nominated by the one trainer to be scratched from meeting:

GRSA will maintain a Heat Stress Register which records greyhounds which are particularly vulnerable to heat stress. To be included in the register, a veterinary certificate confirming that the greyhound suffers from heat stress when racing or trialling in hot weather must be provided by the greyhound's trainer. That documentation must be received by GRSA in advance of the close of nominations for a given meeting for it to be eligible for selective scratching from that or any subsequent meetings due to hot weather.

Any greyhound on the register which is nominated for a meeting in relation to which the predicted temperature is forecast to be 38 °C degrees or higher for the corresponding regional centre as at the official scratching time will automatically be scratched from the meeting by GRSA. Under such circumstances, no penalty will be applied to the greyhound as a result of that scratching.

This policy will be applied regardless of whether the meeting in question is a Day, Twilight or Night meeting. It will also be considered a breach of this policy for a greyhound listed on the register to trial when the forecasted temperature is 38°C degrees or higher for the corresponding regional centre on that day other than for morning trial sessions.

COMMUNICATION OF CANCELLATION OF RACE MEETING OR TRIAL SESSION

GRSA will make every endeavour to announce any rescheduling of a race meeting by 8:00am that morning via the industry text service and any other vehicles that it deems appropriate. Radio TAB will be advised of any relevant information.

Trials may be cancelled at any time up until 4 hours prior to the scheduled commencement of the trial session. As with race meetings, the cancellation of a trial session will be notified by industry text and any other appropriate vehicles.

RACING OPERATIONAL GUIDELINES – HOT WEATHER

- 1) In hot weather conditions when the predicted temperature is forecast to be 35° C or above, GRSA will ensure that the kennel house is opened 30 minutes earlier at all venues
- 2) Greyhounds to spend minimum time outside kennels
- 3) Previews are to be conducted in a shaded area
- 4) Greyhounds to parade directly to starting boxes
- 5) Greyhounds to remain in kennel house for at least 30 minutes after their event

- 6) Club to provide adequate drinking facilities for greyhounds
- 7) Club to provide adequate cooling foot-baths
- 8) Club to provide bottled water to participants when temperature is 35° C or above.
- 9) Ice vests can be used during parading and after the event but must be removed prior to placing greyhounds into their allotted kennel
- 10) GRSA Racing Department (where possible) to program Distance events during the coolest part of the meeting (Day meetings – early races, Night Meetings – later races)
- 11) In hot weather conditions when the predicted temperature is forecast to be 35° C or above, barking muzzles will not to be permitted to be used at any time at SA race tracks

GRSA reserves the right to alter this policy at any time.

Voluntary payment for GAP on prizemoney forms

Owners can direct prizemoney to GAP on the Prizemoney Reimbursement forms. GRSA has made this change on the forms where Owners can direct a percentage of prizemoney to GAP.

Approved Lure Policy

Version number:	1.0 – 2017
Board approval:	September 2017
Last review:	September 2017
Next review:	August 2019

The object of this policy is to detail the materials permitted to be used as an approved lure in connection with greyhound training, education or preparation to race, racing and trialling.

A “lure” as defined by the Greyhound Rules of racing means *any item, natural or man-made, that is used in any way, by any person with the intention or effect of encouraging or inciting a greyhound to pursue, attack or excite it by responding to such stimuli, and ‘quarry’ and ‘bait’ shall have a similar meaning.*

(amended 20.04.15)

Greyhound Racing SA approves the following types of lures:

- A lure made out of artificial and/or synthetic material
- A lure made of a tanned, professionally processed sheepskin

R86A Approved types of lures

A person shall only use or have in their possession at any place where greyhounds are, or are to be kept, trained or educated or prepared to race, or racing, a lure that is approved by the Controlling Body. (added – 20.04.15)

Examples of approved lures:



These lures are approved as they are made of professionally tanned sheepskin or artificial materials

Examples of unacceptable lures:



These lures are not acceptable because they are not made of approved materials.

Warning to Trainers - Arsenic threshold

Warning to trainers – Avoiding potential breaches of the arsenic threshold

On 1 July 2016, Greyhounds Australasia introduced a urinary threshold for arsenic of 800ng/mL within GAR 83 (11) as follows:

“Arsenic at or below a mass concentration of 800 nanograms per millilitre in a sample of urine taken from a greyhound will not breach the provisions of sub rule (1A) or (2) of this rule.”

GRSA wishes to reiterate previously published warnings surrounding the arsenic threshold and advise of husbandry practices trainers should avoid to minimise their risk of breaching the threshold.

CCA (Copper Chrome Arsenate) treated timber

CCA is used for wood preservation and it protects wood from dry rot, fungi, mould, termites and other pests that can threaten the integrity of wood products. Wood that is freshly treated with CCA has a greenish tinge that fades over time.

It has been claimed in equine codes that breaches of their arsenic threshold may have been due to ingestion of CCA treated timber. In a research study involving horses fed CCA timber sawdust, some of the horses marginally exceeded their threshold.

Similarly, it has been suggested in greyhound cases that the ingestion via chewing of CCA treated timber may be capable of resulting in breaches of the 800 ng/mL canine urinary threshold. While this has not been proven scientifically, a reduction in urinary arsenic concentrations following removal from the affected kennels does point to this possibility.

Participants should therefore be mindful that chewing or licking of kennels / yards constructed with CCA treated timber may result in breaches of the threshold.

Stewards advise this information will not constitute a defence to a charge in the case of a positive sample being returned over the threshold levels.

Seaweed/Kelp based nutritional supplements

Some seaweed based animal nutritional supplements have been tested by GRV and found to have high concentrations of arsenic. It was established that feeding these products could breach the threshold. Participants that choose to administer these products do so at their own risk and should avoid feeding close to racing.

Injectable supplements containing arsenic

Avoid the use close to racing of injectable supplements that contain arsenic including: NV Ferrocyl Injection (Sodium Cacodylate 6.4 mg/mL), NV Jurocyl (Sodium Arsanilate 50 mg/mL), TROY Invigorate As Injection (Sodium Arsanilate 50 mg/mL) and Jurox ARCYL Solution For Injection (Sodium Arsanilate 50 mg/mL).

It is ultimately the responsibility of participants to carefully consider the use of any and all food and additives to make sure that all greyhounds are presented for racing free of any prohibited substance.

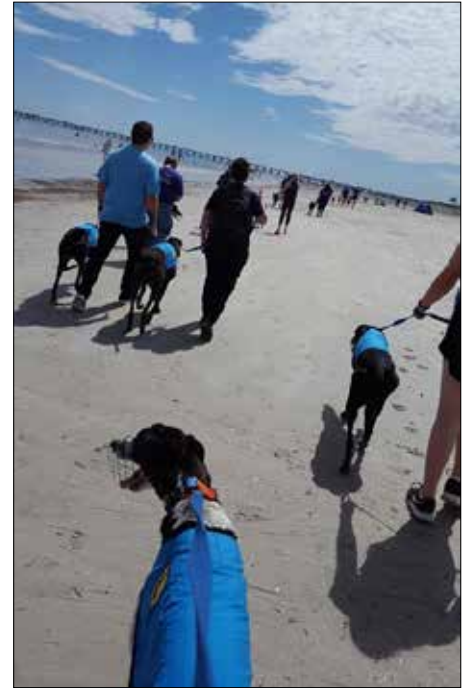
GAP walking group volunteers doing great

Wagga owner Matt Morris and Portland trainer Brian Weis combined for yet another win at Tara Raceway when Xtreme Move scored a good win in the Greg Martlew Autos Maiden Stake (512m) on Sunday 15th October.

The fawn bitch, having her first race start at Tara Raceway, looked to be in a bit of trouble early but gained a rails run down the back straight before taking the lead off the back and storming

home to score by 7¼ lengths in 30.75, although the time certainly didn't tell the story.

The win came on the back of success last Thursday night for the owner-trainer combination when litter brother Xtreme Carnage – runner-up to Solitary Lad in the recent Tara Raceway Winter Classic – scored at Warrnambool over 450m.

'Retired' greyhound bounces back with quick win

After a couple of recent disappointing efforts from Lucky Holly at Ballarat and Warrnambool, Garry Elliott of Southern Cross reckoned it was probably time to retire the black bitch.

Mind you, he'd been down that path before. At the end of last year Lucky Holly had come on season and subsequently led a life of leisure for the next eight months before Elliott decided on a return to the track which resulted in six minor placings.

But the latest "retirement" turned out to be short-lived.

"Ray (Mahony), who is also based at Southern Cross, was coming over to Tara Raceway last Sunday so I decided I would throw in a nomination and see what happened," said Elliott, one of greyhound racing's real gentlemen.

Lucky Holly, an August 2014 daughter of Fabregas x Mepunga Kirsty, went

into the Rock's Retreat Stake (400m) with one win – 15 months ago over 400m at Tara Raceway – from 32 starts.

And Elliott would probably have been questioning his decision to once again pull her out of retirement when she found herself with a bit of work to do early in the race, especially with the odds-on favourite Same Scenario bowling along in front.

But Lucky Holly railed through into second spot down the back, moving out and tackling the leader turning for home before finishing strongly for a 2¼ length win in a quick 23.16 seconds.

"I'm happy to be back," the delighted hobby owner-trainer said.

Elliott, who purchased Lucky Holly as a pup from Southern Cross breeder Peter Byrne, has high hopes for his next pup purchase from Dennington breeder Ray Drew – a five-month-old black bitch by Banjo Boy out of Maisy Mac.

QUALIFYING TRIALS – NOW WEEKLY

Angle Park Qualifying Trials are run weekly on Tuesday night, for the corresponding Monday APM meeting and the Wednesday APD meeting. Trainers must be specific on their nominations about which day they are trialling for and what distance. (ie Wed 388m, Mon 515, Mon 600m etc)

Tuesday Angle Park Qualifying dates are:

October 24th (for APM Monday meeting on 30th October – for APD Wednesday meeting on 1st November)

October 31st (for APM Monday meeting on 6th November – for APD Wednesday meeting on 8th November)

November 7th (for APM Monday meeting on 13th November – for APD Wednesday meeting on 15th November)

November 14th (for APM Monday meeting on 20th November – for APD Wednesday meeting on 22nd November)

November 21st (for APM Monday meeting on 27th November – not for APD Wednesday meeting on 29th November due to Time Grading)

Nominations close with GRSA at 12.30pm on the Tuesday of the meeting.

NOMINATING ONLINE FOR QUALIFYING TRIALS

For Angle Park, Gawler and Strathalbyn qualifying trials the nominations must be lodged with GRSA by 12.30pm on the day of the meeting. To nominate online however you can only do this up until 11.59pm the day before. Due to a system security policy you cannot nominate on the day for these trials online. Please contact our staff if you have any issues with these nominations prior to them closing.

SINGLE TRIALS

A reminder to trainers that single trials can be booked with two greyhounds however you need to advise when booking of your intention to do this. If you wish to put three or more into this trial then a field trial will have to be booked.

BOOKING NUMBER FOR TRIALS

Participants wishing to book trials are required to ring 8243 7172, this phone line will only be used for trial bookings and will queue participants. By having this one number with participants queuing makes this process to be a more efficient way of booking trials.

There will be NO trials accepted through the normal administration number. To be fair to everyone GRSA will only accept bookings using the new number.

POLICY FOR TRIALS IN PLACE

Remember trials will only be taken from –

- * 12.30pm Monday for Angle Park Tuesday nights
- * 12.30pm Tuesday for Gawler Wednesday nights
- * 12.30pm Thursday for Angle Park Saturday morning (day earlier due to being morning trials)

* For Public Holidays it will be the working day before ie if Monday is a Public Holiday then bookings taken on the Friday

* trial days that are not booked in with GRSA remain the same process (ie Gawler Thursday)*

POLICY FOR TRIALLING AT ANGLE PARK AND GAWLER BEFORE THE RACE MEETING

RACE MEETING TRIAL POLICY

Angle Park Monday & Wednesday along with Gawler Tuesday, Friday and Sunday.

Two fields from the boxes with a maximum of four (4) greyhounds will be conducted immediately following the completion of the kennelling procedure for the Race Meeting.

The following lists the order in which greyhounds will be selected in the event if more than 8 greyhounds nominated.

1. Reserves at the Meeting that do not obtain starts.
2. Trainers that have greyhounds engaged and are located in an area affected by track closures.
3. Trainers that have greyhounds engaged.
4. Satisfactory trials.
5. Other greyhounds.

PROCEDURE/CRITERIA

1. For Monday nights trainer to contact GRSA between 10.00am and 11.00am on the Monday to nominate. Should the Monday be a public holiday bookings are to be made between 8am and 9am on the scratching line.
2. For Angle Park Wednesday, Gawler Tuesday & Friday trainer to contact GRSA between 4.00pm and 4.30pm on the day before.
3. For Gawler Sunday trainer to contact GRSA between 8.00am and 9.00am on the scratching line to nominate.
4. Other than reserve greyhounds Trainers will be restricted to trialling one (1) greyhound unless nominations determine otherwise.
5. Stewards allot the Box for the Greyhound.
6. Trials will be 515m & 531m in distance as first preference. Other distances considered depending on nominations.
7. Greyhounds currently under suspension or not cleared to race are not eligible to be nominated (these trials are conducted as if they are at a race meeting so all greyhounds need to be eligible at nomination time).
8. Greyhound registration certificate or cards must be produced at kennelling time.

9. Trainers with other greyhounds engaged can utilize the extra kennel space until such time they are ready to leave OR trainers with no other greyhounds will be free to leave following their trial.

If there are 12 races at Angle Park or Gawler there will be NO trials.

The Vet Clinic at these meetings cannot be used to accommodate any greyhounds to allow for extra trialling greyhounds. This policy has been introduced so that participants book in under the policy. The Vet Clinic needs to be available for the Vet and Stewards at race meetings

EXCEPTIONS TO THIS POLICY–

- Thursday nights are kept available for the option for Interstate greyhounds to solo trial in a lead up to our Group races and also local greyhound's trialling for Group racing interstate.
- Local greyhounds will be allowed to solo trial in a lead up to a feature race upon request and they will take one of the eight kennels available for trialling ahead of the policy and sit separately to the 4 dog trials. Feature races are considered to be – Adelaide Cup, Gawler Cup, Oaks, Derby, Howard Ashton, Brian Johnstone, SA Sprint, SA Distance Championship, SA Anniversary Cup, SA Country Cup, National Finals & any Group race Interstate.
- Local greyhounds will be allowed to trial on a race night, where they are in preparation for a feature event and nominated for a meeting and the race does not stand up. This will include all distances and also take precedence over the policy.
- If a greyhound qualifies for a feature final and requires a trial in between this will be conducted as a solo trial and sit separately to the 2 four dog trials.

It is extremely important that trainers book in to trial at these race meetings. If unable to book in at these times then please contact GRSA where permission may be given to accept a booking outside of these times. .
