MESSAGE FROM MATT

One of the real positives to come out of the South Australian industry in the past few years is its acceptance of change. There are very few things in our (racing) world which resemble how they looked 20, 10 or even 5 years ago in many cases. I'm sure that any announcement on this page of an end to all change might be welcomed in some quarters but, alas, it wouldn't realistically reflect our circumstances or the challenge that lies ahead.

It may be some consolation, however, that change isn't always a bad thing. If the South Australian industry wants to stake its claim at the forefront of the national industry, it can only get there [and stay there] by continuing to evolve in response to the real threats and opportunities that present. For that to be the case, and for people to be more accepting of change, I think one of the most important boxes to tick is the need for people to understand why it's happening in the first place. Along those lines, I offer the following context in support of some imminent changes which are referenced in the pages that follow.

In 2015, there were genuine issues with the length of time that it was taking for the outcomes of DNA testing to come back from the laboratory and breeders were still getting into the general rhythm of Pink Card applications. More than two years on, it is timely for the introduction of a Pink Card policy which reflects, amongst other things, that things have moved on since then. From April 1, the result of the DNA testing must have been received by the Controlling Body before approval will be given for the proposed mating or insemination to proceed. The DNA testing process now reliably takes about 2 weeks, whereas that wait could have been up to 8 weeks back in 2015. This only requires some reasonable preparation on the part of breeders and we can see that the overwhelming majority, who are managing the Pink Card process effectively, will not be impacted in any way by the new policy. On a closely related note, it's really encouraging for the future of our local industry to observe the quality that is evident in recent mating selections.

Whilst our integrity and welfare team has continued to reinforce the message of responsible ownership with industry, GRSA has resisted the introduction of a Local Rule which compels the testing of greyhounds through GAP until it could be confident that the program had the capacity to match the needs of industry. Further to some fairly significant changes over the past year, and supported by the introduction of a second prison partnership, GAP has started to make solid progress in recent weeks and months. Most noticeably, the waiting list to get into the program has reduced drastically – to just over a month – and the number of first point assessment opportunities has sharply increased. We're committed to ensuring that the fear of delay around getting into the program presents no practical obstacle for participants going forward. Further to some final tweaks within GAP, a Local Rule will shortly be announced to industry which compels participants to put retired greyhounds through first point assessment other than those which are placed privately with third parties.

Our Racing Manager, Shaun Mathieson, has been consulting with the ICG and the Grading Review Panel about the need for GRSA to be ready to introduce some short-course racing within the Monday night meeting. For the sake of clarity, I would love to see Monday night remain a 500m (or higher) meeting only. That said, we have an industry obligation to Sky Racing to provide content, and one part of that commitment relates to our specific efforts around ensuring minimum field sizes and minimum race numbers per meeting. The show must go on if we're not going to get sufficient nominations for the



longer events. In recognition of our need to be 'ready', the discussion with those industry groups has been focussed on the way in which 388m racing may be introduced into the Monday night timeslot in a manner which stops short of opening the floodgates. It has been agreed that a final from Wednesday heats or an Open event is the best way for these short course races to be considered. I'm happy to comment, here, that under any foreseeable circumstances, GRSA will remain committed to prioritising the scheduling of 515m – 731m racing on Monday night ahead of any short-course events whenever the nominations support that goal.

People may not, as a general rule, be terribly enthusiastic about change, but I think that the resilience of our local participants to change over recent years has helped to drive a model which bats well above its weight within the national theatre. Hopefully this update helps our people to understand and accept the need for these initiatives. Their introduction only serves to strengthen the industry and help all of us move towards a more sustainable and flourishing future. Victa Louise joins the St Leger honour roll

It was the 40th running of the prestigious SA St Leger at Angle Park on the 15th February which has a very distinguished honour roll and now includes exciting prospect Victa Louise trained by Robyn Mackellar.

With the likes of Festival Sal, Head Honcho, Lion Hearted, Worm Burner and last years winner On Fire, some of the biggest names in greyhound racing on the list, Victa Louise's performance suggests she is also going to make a big impression in the future.

Victa Louise raced through the series undefeated winning her heat and semi-final in easy fashion, however, against a quality field she had to be at her best. Shooting for six wins in a row she began brilliantly from box 6 to easily lead to the first turn running a sizzling 4.38 first split. Fabwick for Kirin Corby, Nirimba Pirate for Lisa Rasmussen and Long Gully Gus for Paula Hearnden all moved into forward positions early to chase out after Victa Louise. Down the back straight the daughter of Fabregas and Victa Brooke was low flying in the lead with a second split of 16.84 while her competitors gave chase. Turning for home she was in no danger and went onto win by just over 2 lengths in a flying 29.80 for the 515m journey. Long Gully Gus never gave in running a solid second while Fabwick edged out Nirimba Pirate for third.

Victa Louise is locally bred by Joan Shadow and owned in partnership by Joan and





husband Ron. There was plenty of joy and excitement on the winner's dais for the presentation with family members all sharing in Victa Louise's success. It was a terrific training performance by Robyn Mackellar with Victa Louise still only very young being a June 16 whelping and no one could begrudge success to owners

Ron and Joan Schadow who are some of the nicest people you could meet.

Victa Louise has continued on her winning way with her record now sitting at 8 wins from her 13 starts and 1 placing with career prizemoney around \$17,000 and she looks to have a very bright future ahead.

Mount Gambier Cup carnival kicks of tomorrow

The Mount Gambier Cup carnival is run over two weeks and three meetings this year, highlighted by the Mount Gambier Cup Final on Sunday, March 18. The Cup has been elevated to "Listed" status and will carry \$22,000 in total prizemoney with \$15,000 to the winner.

Tomorrow [Friday, March 9] the Club will have two Heats of The Produce Store Feature Maiden over 512m, two Heats of a Grade 5 over 600m and two Heats of the Formula 400 Open over 400m. On Sunday [March 11] the Club has five outstanding Heats of the Mount Gambier Cup worth \$1,500 each. With the likes of high quality

Also on Easter Sunday will be the Gawler Easter Sprint for Grade 4 and Grade 5 greyhounds over the 531m worth \$3,000. It's going to be a terrific night of racing on the Sunday over the Easter long weekend.

Locally bred, the daughter of Fabregas and Victa Brooke started the month off with a sizzling 29.93 win in the semi-finals of the St Leger. She was then a warm favourite in the Final, even after drawing wide on the track, but she showed brilliant early speed to lead throughout for a great win. She ran a flying 29.80 before heading off to Gawler and winning in impressive fashion over the 531m in 31.02.

At the end of the month Victa Louise's record stood at 13 starts with 10 wins and 1 placing and earnings just over \$17,000.

The Run of the Month for February was Ashom Monelli for trainer Tony Rasmussen for his performance at Angle Park on Monday, 5th February in a mixed 4/5 600m event.

After his John Gray Feature Final win he was stepped up to 600m for the first time in SA with much anticipation. He jumped well from box 2 to find the front early and from there he powered away from his rivals to win by 8 lengths in a flying 34.60. Splits were 8.85 and 21.50.

Prior to the event, new owners can buy the greyhound before it starts with any prizemoney won being retained by the old owners and then the new owners take the greyhound after the race.

These races provide an opportunity to sell and buy greyhounds that are currently competing. The first race is scheduled for Angle Park on Wednesday, 14th March over 388m.



2018 Gawler Produce – final payment due on 6th April

Angle Park Tuesday trials now starting at 6pm

From the most recent Industry Consultative Group meeting it was determined to start the Angle Park Tuesday night trials from 6pm for a 3 month trial period, this started last Tuesday, 6th March.

It was believed this would assist with the lateness of bookings and would also provide more flexibility for participants.

Trainers can book as normal online and by phone. GRSA however will support Satisfactory trials, Qualifying trials, Unproven & Proven trials and marking off of greyhounds with a block of 25 minutes around the same time as normal. [Trainers cannot nominate into this timeslot]

Therefore there will be two blocks of trials from 6pm to 6.50pm allowing for 20 greyhounds to trial, after this staff will then conduct the Satisfactory Trials, Qualifying Trials and mark off greyhounds from 6.50pm to 7.15pm. This also provides an opportunity for GRSA to move the Unproven and Proven greyhound trials earlier in the night, which always used to be the case, where trainers can book into these either online or by phone. Then normal bookings will again commence from 7.15pm.

Consultation about changes to National Rules

GRSA recently advised the intended implementation date for Greyhounds Australasia Rules of Racing amendments will be pushed back until at least 1 April 2018. This has happened nationwide to allow industry to be consulted on the changes.

If participants wish to provide feedback on the proposed changes, they are asked to put their submissions in writing to Lisa Michalanney at lisa.michlanney@grsa.com.au or by post/hand-delivery.

The full release of the proposed amendments can be found on the GRSA website or in race day offices on track. A document covering frequently asked questions will follow these pages.

Further updates following the consultation period will be provided in due course.

Pink Card Policy

As mentioned earlier in this edition, a formalised policy about how to apply for a Pink Card for a breeding female will be in place from 1 April 2018.

The large majority of breeders are complying already so essentially nothing is changing for them. We would always encourage breeders to be proactive and ensure applications are lodged prior to a breeding female coming on season. A copy of the policy will follow these pages.

Interpretation of FTP and marring first offence

GRSA Stewards draw all participants attention to sub-section [2] of both GAR 69 and 69A, in relation to failing to pursue and marring which reads:

The period of suspension imposed to sub-rule [1] shall be-

a. In the case of a first offence, at the track where the offence occurred, 28 days and until the completion of a satisfactory trial.

Stewards note the purpose of the Rule was to encourage the trainer to allow the greyhound to have a period of time away from the track where the offence occurred and for an opportunity of work to be undertaken in relation to the greyhound's racing manners.

It has been common practice historically in SA to allow a greyhound with this offence to trial at the same track and be cleared prior to the 28 days.

Effective immediately, GRSA Stewards will interpret the above Rule as - a greyhound which has had a 28-day suspension placed on it for a first offence for failing to pursue or marring, will not be allowed to undertake a satisfactory trial at the track where the offence occurred, until that period of suspension has expired. Greyhounds will be permitted to undertake a satisfactory trial at another track if they wish to continue to race or wait out the 28 days to requalify at the track where the offence occurred.

Any greyhound with a current 28-day suspension for a first offence for failing to pursue or marring will be obliged to requalify under the new conditions.

This change to the previous management of this Rule will bring GRSA into line with the other greyhound jurisdictions.

Please contact Chief Steward Des Jonas for any clarification of the above Rule.

Angle Park slipping track

All participants using the slipping track at Angle Park are reminded to ensure they are picking up after their greyhounds when using the track.

Cameras are monitoring those persons accessing the track so please make sure you are doing the right thing.

Inquiries and notifications

Mr. Brian Clarke – Notice of positive sample – greyhound HARD LIKE ROCK was found to have COBALT in a urine sample following an event at Gawler on 24 December 2017. Inquiry to be scheduled at a date to be fixed.

Mr. Don Foster – Stewards inquiry 26/02/18 and 28/02/18 – GAR 83 [2] – Failed to present the greyhound MCLAREN MISSILE free of any prohibited substance [ATENOLOL] for an event at Angle Park on 9 October 2017. Mr. Foster pleaded guilty. He was suspended for a period of two [2] months and fined \$500. MCLAREN MISSILE was disqualified from the event.

Mr. Ben Rawlings / Mr. Tony Rasmussen – Stewards inquiry 09/02/18 – Misconduct in they both engaged in an exchange with each other where both made offensive and unnecessary comments at the Greyhound of the Year Awards at Gawler on 02/02/18. Mr. Rawlings pleaded guilty and was fined \$1,000; with \$500 wholly suspended for 12 months on the condition he does not reoffend. Mr. Rasmussen pleaded guilty and was fined \$2,000; with \$1,000 wholly suspended for 12 months on the condition he does not reoffend. Mr. Rawlings has lodged an appeal against penalty with the RAT.

With the removal of fees for breeding documentation I remind participants of the due date for lodgement of documentation under the Rules of Greyhound Racing.

It is imperative that these documents are still lodged on time so GRSA can plan for the future regarding greyhound population.

The Golden Rules


Avoidance of Prohibited Substance Breaches

In noting that we have seen recent Cobalt and Arsenic threshold breaches, it serves as a timely opportunity for GRSA to remind participants – in their own best interests – that there are a number of Golden Rules that can help them to avoid making any such breaches (for prohibited substances generally) and which should be adhered to as principles of best practice:

- Always consult your vet to seek guidance in relation to any of the products that you are using, any associated risks and other relevant context
- Review the range of any feeds or supplements that you typically purchase and, wherever it is reasonable to do so, replace products containing substances that could contribute to a threshold breach under the rules (eg. cobalt) with alternative products
- Observe the instructions on any products that you use and adhere strictly to those directions (having regard for prescribed amounts, frequency of administration/ application, methodology for administering/applying)
- Refrain from the use of injectable treatments (eg. Vitamin B12) to any extent that is practical
- Refrain from any treatment of a greyhound on raceday other than as relates to its feeding and drinking requirements [GAR83[a][1] treats this as a specific offence]

Our registered participants have the ultimate responsibility to ensure that greyhounds are presented free of prohibited substances. This information is offered as advice in good faith only and should not be relied upon as a defence in the event of a breach being recorded.

These Golden Rules will appear in the Integrity section of future Kennel Capers editions on an ongoing basis as a reminder for participants of this responsibility.







Frequently Asked Questions

Greyhounds Australasia (GA) Proposed Rule Changes (March 1 2018)

Q: Do the proposed rules apply to me from 1 March 2018?

A: The rules issued by GA, known as national rules, do not have any effect in each State until they are approved by the Controlling Body. Controlling Bodies will undertake their own consultation processes on the proposed rule changes and, subject to consideration of that feedback, consider whether or not they should be introduced in their State.

Q: How can I give feedback on the proposed GA Rules before they are considered by the Controlling Bodies?

A: Check with your own Controlling body how to make submissions on the proposed amendments.

Specific questions seeking clarification about any of the proposed rule changes or their meaning should be emailed to Greyhounds Australasia admin@galtd.org.au.

Q: Why should the definition of "prohibited substance" be changed?

A: The basic underlying principle is that we should have "drug-free racing" so that punters can be confident that greyhounds run on their merits and their performance is not influenced in any way by any sort of drug or other substance. This means that when they are presented to race, greyhounds must not have anything falling within the definition of **prohibited substances** in their system (as defined in GAR 1). The definition essentially includes any substance that can have an effect on any body system in the greyhound. Many of these compounds can be used in the routine practice of training greyhounds, they just need to be out of the dog's system on raceday.

Regulatory bodies are not, and have never been, concerned with applying the rule unreasonably so as to capture the provision of food (or the vitamins/electrolytes that are present in normal foodstuffs) and water. To do so is clearly not in the interests of the sport or the regulation of it.

There has at times been confusion as to whether a substance was prohibited because it may not have been an example listed within the drug classes. This is particularly the case if the substance category/class is not listed in the rule, but was administered with the intent of having an effect on one of the body systems mentioned in the racing rules, or the substance is listed within the Commonwealth Poisons Standard, and therefore met the definition of prohibited substance within the rules.

The definition of prohibited substance has not been updated in over 20 years. Upon review of the rule, as conducted by GA's Vets and Analysts Committee, it was proposed to amend the rule from an out-dated, inconsistent short definition to a more specific list of those substances that are prohibited in order to provide more clarity to participants.

The proposed lists of mammalian body systems and drug categories are identical to those used in horse racing under AR178B of the Australian Rules of Racing, which uses the same drug testing laboratories as the greyhound racing Controlling Bodies. All of the categories listed in the proposed rule are considered to already be an example of a prohibited substance under the current definition.

Q: What's the difference between prohibited substance and banned substance?

A: There is group of prohibited substances that are so concerning from a welfare or integrity point of view that they are deemed to have <u>no place in the sport at all</u> – these are called **permanently banned prohibited substances**. It is these substances that not only cannot be in the greyhound's system on raceday but also cannot be present in an out-of-competition sample. Because these substances are so concerning for the integrity of the sport, participants are also not permitted to possess, acquire, attempt to acquire, administer or attempt to administer any of these substances at any time from birth to retirement of a greyhound (GAR 79A).

So, all permanently banned prohibited substances are also prohibited substances but not all (in fact relatively very few) prohibited substances are permanently banned prohibited substances.

Q: The list of prohibited substances includes things like vitamins – does that mean I can't give vitamins to my racing greyhound?

A: Most substances that might already be administered by injection already meet the current definition of a prohibited substance as they are being administered to cause some effect on a body system. If that were not the intention, then would be no purpose for administering the substance.

However, many of these injections may contain substances not readily detectable by a laboratory or that are indistinguishable from naturally occurring substances. In those that occur naturally, specific research would need to be done to prove that a substance has been administered too close to racing and a threshold developed, as was done with cobalt.

The list of prohibited substances in Part B therefore only refers to vitamins that can administered by injection if required, but which cannot be injected within one clear day of racing (see clarification below in relation to treatment prior to racing).

Q: Why should the definition of "exempted substance" be changed?

A: The definition of exempted substance is proposed to be amended to <u>add</u> norethisterone (when administered in the prescribed way) as a treatment for the purpose of regulating or preventing oestrus in female greyhounds. Owners and trainers in consultation with their prescribing veterinarian will now have more flexibility in choosing the best form of oestrus control treatment (if any) for that greyhound, instead of the only current option of ethyloestrenol, which many have reported does not suit all females.

Norethisterone is readily available as a human pharmaceutical and is currently used in racing greyhounds in the United Kingdom and New Zealand.

Q: Why should the restrictions on treatment prior to racing be changed?

A: The current definition of "race day treatment" has been identified as causing confusion with some participants.

The proposed change is intended to make it clear that no treatment can be given to a greyhound on the day the greyhound is nominated to compete in an Event. That is, no 'treatment' can be administered on the calendar day of racing, from 12:01am until the dog is removed from the racecourse after the completion of that Event with the permission of the Stewards pursuant to Rule 42(2), or is scratched with the permission of the Stewards.

This position is already in place for other racing codes and as is the case in the other codes, these rules focus on what is considered an acceptable <u>practice</u> on raceday (rather than on the substance itself – which is the ambit of raceday sampling and subsequent analysis).

Q: My State already has a rule that doesn't allow me to race a greyhound in races over consecutive days. Why is the rule being proposed?

A: Western Australia, Tasmania, South Australia and Victoria already have this as part of their Local Rules. If adopted, this rule will harmonise the national rules and establish a national standard.

Q: Why should requirements about treatment records be changed?

A: The rule change proposed is intended to ensure that participants keep timely and accurate records of treatments administered to greyhounds. When treatment records are not kept on the day the treatment is given, they can be forgotten about or recorded inaccurately.

While most participants already adopt an approach which records treatments as soon as they are given, there are instances where these records are not available when requested by an authorised person or steward.



Registration of Breeding Females – Pink Card Policy

Version number: 1.0 – 2018
Board approval: Apr 2018
Last review: Feb 2018
Next review: Jan 2020

Pink cards for breeding females came into effect on 1 July 2015. All female greyhounds in South Australia are required to be registered for breeding prior to being served under GAR 127(6). That Rule reads:

R127 Registration of sire and breeding female (brood bitch)

(6) A bitch shall not be used for breeding purposes unless registered as a 'breeding female'.

APPLICATION FOR PINK CARD:

A GRSA registered breeder must ensure a female greyhound meets the following requirements to be eligible to apply for registration as a breeding female:

- · Be named;
- Be microchipped;
- Have undergone DNA fingerprinting and the results returned (kits are available through Greyhounds Australasia);
- Have a C5 vaccination administered within the last 12 months and a copy of the vaccination certificate submitted to GRSA (clearly identifying greyhound racing name, microchip, date administered, and Veterinary Surgeon signature. Certificates must have the vaccination vial stickers attached);
- Have completed and submitted a GRSA-issued application form

You will also be required to return the greyhound's racing identification card dependent on the racing and/or retirement status of the greyhound.

DNA RESULTS:

If you intend to have your breeding female served, GRSA recommends applying for your DNA kit as early as possible to allow sufficient time for the DNA results to be returned. This takes approximately 10-14 working days.

GRSA will not process a pink card until the DNA results have been confirmed by Greyhounds Australasia.

AGE RESTRICTION EXEMPTION:

As soon as your female greyhound turns eight (8) years of age, her registration as a breeding female will become inactive. She will not be able to be bred again unless the criteria below are met:

- Veterinary certificate of health and fitness is received by GRSA
- GRSA issues verbal or written approval to the Breeder

The Veterinary Certificate for approval lasts for 120 days from the date of examination.

Approval under this exemption will allow one (1) service/insemination only, irrespective of the result of said service/insemination.

THREE (3) LITTER MAXIMUM EXEMPTION:

Once your female greyhound whelps her third litter, her registration as a breeding female will become inactive. She will not be able to be bred again unless the criteria below are met:

- Veterinary certificate of health and fitness is received by GRSA
- GRSA issues verbal or written approval to the Breeder

The Veterinary Certificate for approval lasts for 120 days from date of examination.

Approval under this exemption will allow one (1) service/insemination only, irrespective of the result of said service/insemination.



Registration of Breeding Females – Pink Card Policy

Version number: 1.0 – 2018

LITTER FREQUENCY:

Breeding females are not permitted to whelp more than two (2) litters in any 18-month period.

BREEDING REVIEW PANEL:

Once the application has been lodged, it is considered by the GRSA Breeding Review Panel, consisting of relevant GRSA management. If required, an independent panel of industry representatives will be consulted to give advice in relation to the application. On occasion, more information may be required from the breeder in support of the application.

REGISTRATION AS A BREEDING FEMALE:

Once your greyhound is registered as a breeding female with GRSA, you will be issued with a breeding identification card for that greyhound. This card is known as the 'pink' card. From that time, you will be permitted, under the Rules of Racing, to have your breeding female served. Active racing greyhounds can be registered as breeding females and can continue to race using their pink card as identification.

ONGOING REGISTRATION AS A BREEDING FEMALE:

To continue the ongoing registration of your breeding female, you will be required to maintain her current C5 vaccination status. A copy of the C5 booster vaccination certificate must be provided to GRSA each year to ensure her breeding status remains active. Reminder notifications about vaccination boosters are automatically advised via email or by phone.

GRSA will always endeavor to process all applications in a timely manner. However, all Breeders are strongly encouraged to lodge all paperwork as early as possible to avoid disappointment.

RETIREMENT FROM BREEDING:

Once your breeding female is no longer breeding, her pink breeding identification card must be returned to GRSA along with a notification of retirement form updating her retirement status.

GRSA reserves the right to alter this policy at any time



In February the average wait was less than five weeks and whilst this time will fluctuate depending on the varying needs of greyhounds awaiting entry to the program, we continue to work to keep this to a minimum wherever possible.

Projects Update

Murray Bridge facility taking shape



The Murray Bridge facility is really starting to take shape after recent civil works on the 1-turn track and the continuation of the building construction.

The project remains on schedule and budget, with a likely handover of the facility in the latter half of 2018.

The steel frames of the three main buildings are up and the cladding and first fix electrical is about to commence. The subgrade of both tracks is almost complete and the concrete inner plinth of the circle track is expected to be poured this week. Following this, the lure system installation will commence.

The project has progressed relatively smoothly to this point, despite some early delays as a result of resourcing and the excavation of the significant amount of limestone on site.

Vet clinic refurb completed

The Angle Park Vet Clinic project is now complete after a complete refurbishment of the outdated facilities. Dr. Greg Moore will operating out of the clinic three days per week with the opportunity to expand as demand dictates.

The works on the clinic included removal and replacement of termite damaged walls, new flooring and paint, respraying of all the joinery, new kennel cages and air-conditioning for the kennel room. The project was funded in partnership between Dr. Greg Moore, GRSA and the Adelaide Greyhound Racing Club.



Angle Park track lighting modifications to take place

Tigerlight Australia will undertake modifications to the new LED lighting units on the evening of Wednesday 14th March.

These works will include changing of lenses which will better disperse the light and address the inconsistent light down the home straight.

GRSA is hopeful that the remaining lights can be replaced over the next 12 months, subject to affordability. This would then provide a consistent colour temperature and brightness around the entire circuit.

Local owners Kerry Hawker and Michael Robinson's good run at Tara Raceway continued on Sunday 4th March when they combined with the Tracie Price trained Penny La Moment who showed considerable improvement to win the Laser Electrical Maiden Stake (400m) in a quick 23.17 seconds.

Having her fourth start, the July 2016 daughter of Nolen x Penny La Plume led all the way from box five, eventually holding out kennelmate Andrew's Gift – looking close to his first win – to win by a half length.

Hawker was successful at the previous meeting with Banjo Queen, who she races with husband John, while Robinson, a former long-time Mount Gambier Greyhound Racing Club steward and life member, also owns last week's 600 metre winner Bekim Lucy's in partnership with Willie Vossen.

And the Price-trained Bekim Lucy's generated more interest into the staying ranks when running Cryer's Plugger to a neck in the Winmore Greyhound Kennels Stake [732m].

The win was Cryer's Plugger's first since October 8 when he won over 512 metres at Tara Raceway in a fast 29.64 seconds while his distance time of 43.64 seconds on Sunday was the quickest since Nellie Noodles' record run of 43.45 seconds in March 2011 and Bekim Lucy's 43.67 seconds is the third-fastest run at the track.

Penny La Moment kicked off another big day for the Comptonbased Price who ended the 12-race programme with yet another four winners and took his tally since January 1 to 25, after Swift Limes, Goldie's Run and Baz's Moment were also successful.

Swift Limes, who hadn't won over the 512 metre distance since last June, finished powerfully to defeat the promising Lektra Viki by a half length in the Trackside Meats Stake in a personal best time of 30.00 seconds.

Goldie's Run, a winner back in November, led all the way in the Williams Crane Hire Stake [600m], defeating Star Project, who showed considerable improvement for Garry Marshman on his first-up February 23 middle-distance effort.

Baz's Moment made short work of the South Eastern Hotel Open Stake (400m) when leading all the way to defeat Rumbling Moment by 31/4 lengths in 23.18 seconds.

Interestingly, 400 metre time honours for the day belonged to \$23 chance Dimora Bekim who ran 23.13 seconds when defeating his kennelmate Mr Perfect, also a \$23 chance, in the Rock's Retreat Stake – a result that threw plenty of value into the exotics.

A litter brother to Bekim Lucy's, Dimora Bekim is trained by Charlton-based Kevin Ashton, a Tara Raceway regular and also a regular when it comes to serving up longshots.

In Ashton's kennels since November, Dimora Bekim broke a long run of outs, the giveaway greyhound's last win in May last year.

The third winner came in race 7, a Grade 4/5 over the 400m journey. Victa Matt was headed at the start but quickly hit his straps to get to the front, never being headed from then on and running the best time of the trio of 22.75 secs, with a margin of three lengths. Second was Casino (8) for Rebecca McAuley-Fry and third was Allen Punter [7] for Lisa Rasmussen.

All three winners are trained by Michael for Ron and Joan Schadow of Victor Harbor, who race their greyhounds with the "Victa" prefix. Michael had been down to just one greyhound in his kennels and was looking for some extras. He approached Ron, who was on the lookout for a trainer for four older greyhounds, which included Victa Matt. It fitted in well with both and when Ron had then whelped two litters of nine pups in a close time, Michael took one of those litters. This litter, which included Victa Kylie and Victa Suzie, has now had three individual winners, with the other littermates yet to race. The other litter went to Lewiston trainer Robyn Mackellar, and includes the very well performed Victor Louise.

QUALIFYING TRIALS - NOW WEEKLY

Angle Park Qualifying Trials are run weekly on Tuesday night, for the corresponding Monday APM meeting and the Wednesday APD meeting. Trainers must be specific on their nominations about which day they are trialling for and what distance. (ie Wed 388m, Mon 515, Mon 600m etc)

Tuesday Angle Park Qualifying dates are:

March 13th (for APM Monday meeting on 19th March – for APD Wednesday meeting on 21st March)

March 20th (for APM Monday meeting on 26th March – no APD Wednesday meeting on 28th March due to Time Grading meeting)

March 27th (for APM Monday meeting on 2nd April – for APD Wednesday meeting on 4th April)

April 3rd (for APM Monday meeting on 9th April – for APD Wednesday meeting on 11th April)

April 10th (for APM Monday meeting on 16th April – for APD Wednesday meeting on 18th April)

April 17th (for APM Monday meeting on 23rd April – no APD Wednesday meeting on 25th April due to Time Grading meeting)

April 23rd (for APM Monday meeting on 30th April – for APD Wednesday meeting on 2nd May)

Nominations close with GRSA at 12.30pm on the Tuesday of the meeting.

NOMINATING ONLINE FOR QUALIFYING TRIALS

For Angle Park, Gawler and Strathalbyn qualifying trials the nominations must be lodged with GRSA by 12.30pm on the day of the meeting. To nominate online however you can only do this up until 11.59pm the day before. Due to a system security policy you cannot nominate on the day for these trials online. Please contact our staff if you have any issues with these nominations prior to them closing.

SINGLE TRIALS

A reminder to trainers that single trials can be booked with two greyhounds however you need to advise when booking of your intention to do this. If you wish to put three or more into this trial then a field trial will have to be booked.

BOOKING NUMBER FOR TRIALS

Participants wishing to book trials are required to ring 8243 7172, this phone line will only be used for trial bookings and will queue participants. By having this one number with participants queuing makes this process to be a more efficient way of booking trials.

There will be NO trials accepted through the normal administration number. To be fair to everyone GRSA will only accept bookings using the new number.

POLICY FOR TRIALS IN PLACE

POLICY FOR TRIALLING AT ANGLE PARK AND GAWLER BEFORE THE RACE MEETING

RACE MEETING TRIAL POLICY

Angle Park Monday & Wednesday along with Gawler Tuesday, Friday and Sunday.

Two fields from the boxes with a maximum of four (4) greyhounds will be conducted immediately following the completion of the kennelling procedure for the Race Meeting.

The following lists the order in which greyhounds will be selected in the event if more than 8 greyhounds nominated.

- 1. Reserves at the Meeting that do not obtain starts.
- 2. Trainers that have greyhounds engaged and are located in an area affected by track closures.
- 3. Trainers that have greyhounds engaged.
- 4. Satisfactory trials.
- 5. Other greyhounds.

PROCEDURE/CRITERIA

- 1. For Monday nights trainer to contact GRSA between 10.00am and 11.00am on the Monday to nominate. Should the Monday be a public holiday bookings are to be made between 8am and 9am on the scratching line.
- 2. For Angle Park Wednesday, Gawler Tuesday & Friday trainer to contact GRSA between 4.00pm and 4.30pm on the day before.
- 3. For Gawler Sunday trainer to contact GRSA between 8.00am and 9.00am on the scratching line to nominate.
- 4. Other than reserve greyhounds Trainers will be restricted to trialling one (1) greyhound unless nominations determine otherwise.
- 5. Stewards allot the Box for the Greyhound.
- 6. Trials will be 515m & 531m in distance as first preference. Other distances considered depending on nominations.
- 7. Greyhounds currently under suspension or not cleared to race are not eligible to be nominated (these trials are conducted as if they are at a race meeting so all greyhounds need to be eligible at nomination time).
- 8. Greyhound registration certificate or cards must be produced at kennelling time.
- 9. Trainers with other greyhounds engaged can utilize the extra kennel space until such time they are ready to leave

OR trainers with no other greyhounds will be free to leave following their trial.

If there are 12 races at Angle Park or Gawler there will be NO trials.

The Vet Clinic at these meetings cannot be used to accommodate any greyhounds to allow for extra trialling greyhounds. This policy has been introduced so that participants book in under the policy. The Vet Clinic needs to be available for the Vet and Stewards at race meetings

EXCEPTIONS TO THIS POLICY-

- Thursday nights are kept available for the option for Interstate greyhounds to solo trial in a lead up to our Group races and also local greyhound's trialling for Group racing interstate.
- Local greyhounds will be allowed to solo trial in a lead up to a feature race upon request and they will take one of the eight kennels available for trialling ahead of the policy and sit separately to the 4 dog trials. Feature races are considered to be – Adelaide Cup, Gawler Cup, Oaks, Derby, Howard Ashton, Brian Johnstone, SA Sprint, SA Distance Championship, SA Anniversary Cup, SA Country Cup, National Finals & any Group race Interstate.
- Local greyhounds will be allowed to trial on a race night, where they are in preparation for a feature event and nominated for a meeting and the race does not stand up. This will include all distances and also take precedence over the policy.
- If a greyhound qualifies for a feature final and requires a trial in between this will be conducted as a solo trial and sit separately to the 2 four dog trials.

It is extremely important that trainers book in to trial at these race meetings. If unable to book in at these times then please contact GRSA where permission may be given to accept a booking outside of these times.
