CEO'S UPDATE

Victoria SA Feature Race Links

Noting the impact that the Million Dollar Chase has on the racing calendar across the Adelaide Cup period, GRSA has been working with GRV to implement some changes involving the linking a number of feature races around that time.

With effect from this year, the following will be put in place across the 2 states across that period:

- a) The highest placed Victorian in the September Speed Star at Sandown gains automatic entry (if they accept) into the SA State Of Origin Race at Angle Park.
- b) The winner of the SA State of Origin Race at Angle Park gains automatic entry (if they accept) into the Shootout at Sandown.
- c) The winner of the SA State of Origin (SA OR VIC greyhound) at Angle Park will be guaranteed a spot into the Group 1 Adelaide Cup final 2 weeks later (bypassing the Heats).
- d) The winner of the Group 1 Adelaide Cup gains automatic entry (if they accept) into the Group 1 Topgun at the Meadows.

We are immensely grateful to GRV for collaborating with South Australia in such a meaningful way. We believe these changes will positively impact the calendar at that time of year.

G-SIX Racing

We have been grateful for the feedback we have received for the upcoming G-SIX Racing trial, in particular the participants who were involved in the recent Q&A session will continue to make sure that the racing schedule before and after the trial lines up with the needs of the respected regions. We are confident that this format of racing is capable of driving numerous benefits back to the trainers, breeders and owners.

Media Coverage

It is our intention to more heavily utilise the industry Facebook page as a media hub of sorts, to ensure our participants are up to date with what is happening locally and nationally across greyhound racing and the wider racing industry. In noting that racing in South Australia has been in the limelight recently, I expect there will be a number in announcements in the months ahead. Given the context of some trying times, we are confident that the steps that GRSA are taking will serve to strengthen our position as a racing code for the longer term.

The race was won by Cawbourne Swade trained by Lisa Rasmussen who made it 4 wins in a row with a dominate display of power and speed. The son of Dyna Double One and Cawbourne Abbi began nicely to sit just off the speed as Shimando for husband Tony and kennel mate Diamond Heart ran to the front.

They would end up filling the placings however Cawbourne Swade got motoring down the back straight and quickly went past Diamond Heart and then railed past Shimando who was running a bold race in the lead. Turning for home he was in full flight going down to the line to win by almost 5 lengths in a slick 29.50. Shimando ran well again for second while Diamond Heart held on well for third. No doubt there were some hard luck stories back in the pack however Cawbourne Swade made his own luck and was a deserved winner.

With both Tony and Lisa taking a well-deserved holiday interstate the race night duties were left to their band of helpers led by their daughter Tara who was gracious on the presentation dais in accepting the Anniversary Cup sponsored by Bargain Steel Centre.





Dyna Quota proves too good in Distance final

In one of the most open SA Distance Championship finals in recent years the Nicole Stanley trained Dyna Quota proved too good in the run home for her Victorian counterpart Billy's Bake for trainer Gerry O'Keeffe in what developed into an exciting finish.

In the charge to the first turn Dyna Quota began well from the inside and was quickly challenged by Stitch Em' Rosey for Shelley Trengove and Rajasthan for Robert Camilleri however they all came together leaving the back straight with Stitch 'Em Rosey and Rajasthan being checked out of business along with More Rum Batemen for Kevin Murnane who copped the back wash. Dyna Quota balanced up again and moved forward however Billy's Bake was able to take a run to her inside and assume the lead into the front straight on the first occasion. Out of the front straight and into the back and Billy's Bake was doing it well with Dyna Quota in second giving chase with Nations moving strongly into third. On the apex of the bend prior to turning for home Dyna Quota moved up stylishly to run to the front from Billy's Bake who was battling on strongly with Nations still in third. As the field of stayers came down to the finish line Dyna Quota was doing just a little bit the better of Billy's Bake and went onto win by 3/4 length in a solid 43.60 with Nations getting home well into third 3/4 lengths away.





Galactic Athena claims awards in amazing month

Greyhound of the Month award for March went to the Steve Bartholomew trained Galactic Athena whose highlight for the month was winning the Mount Gambier Cup final on her home track at only her 6th lifetime start

The daughter of Paddy Whacker and Galactic Rumball started the month off with a surprising defeat at Murray Bridge as a short priced favourite when running second after she came up from the South East with high expectations. She confirmed the boom on her with a scintillating win in her heat of the Mount Gambier Cup when she came up against highly seasoned sprinters and won well in a slick 29.58 to progress through to the final. In the final she drew box 2 and raced just off the pace but she knuckled down in the final straight to win in fine style, in a flying 29.43 and giving her trainer and connections one of their biggest thrills in racing.

At the end of the month, Galactic Athena's record stood at only 6 starts for 4 wins and 2 placings and earnings around \$18,000 and certainly looks to have a bright future ahead.

The Run of the Month for February was Victa Ashley for trainer Mike Giniotis for his exceptional win in a heat of the SA St Leger at Angle Park on Thursday, 14th February.

He was brilliant in leading throughout and defeating a quality line up in a sizzling 29.55 for the 515m journey.

He won by 3½ lengths with splits of 4.41 and 16.65.

G-SIX mixing of grades during trial period

During the trial period of G-SIX the mixing of grades will have to slightly change.

For example, normally if we have three Grade 4's and 10 Grade 5's [total 13 dogs] the Grader will grade an 8 dog Grade 5 and a 5 dog mixed 4/5. Under G-SIX conditions the Grader will grade a six dog Grade 5 and a six dog mixed 4/5 with one common reserve.

2017 AGRC/Greyhound Racing SA Greyhound Auction – racing dates

In a lead up to the main series there will be a heat and final run at Angle Park over the 388m in May.

Murray Bridge Straight Track Picnic meeting Wednesday 8th May 2019

In preparation for the Straight Track at Murray Bridge to commence racing on Wednesday, 15th May, GRSA will host a picnic meeting on Wednesday, 8th May.

This will be a day meeting starting at 11.15am with only named and cleared greyhounds invited to be drawn into half fields conducted every 15 - 20 minutes.

Kennelling will be from 10.15am to 10.45am.

Greyhounds will be graded into events as if they had not raced at the venue based on normal grading guidelines. Distances will be 300m and 350m.

Nominations close at 9am on Friday, 26th April and can be done via the ozchase online process or by fax.

Fields will be drawn on Friday, 3rd May with all nominated greyhounds being selected.

GRSA will pay \$60 per trainer and \$20 for unplaced greyhounds.

For 4 or 3 dog fields GRSA will pay \$175 for first and \$50 for second after scratchings. For 2 or less GRSA will pay \$125 for first only after scratchings.

New red wet weather jackets to replace old blue jackets

After consultation through the ICG panel, GRSA has purchased new Red Jackets for winter to be available as a replacement for the Blue Drizeabone Jackets which are now no longer available.

These jackets are at the tracks and are available for purchase at Angle Park for a cost of \$50 for your own use at the track.

Claiming race conditions in a different format

Unfortunately there has been a lack of support for Claiming Races over the last 12 months, however, at the last ICG meeting it was proposed that greyhounds engaged in a race meeting may be considered to be claimed.

Connections will need to advise under similar conditions of the Claiming events but rather than a race for these greyhounds there will be list in the race book highlighting which greyhounds are up for sale.

The appropriate paperwork is available at GRSA and on the website. Connections will now have this option available to them for their greyhound to be claimed with it listed in the race book. Please ensure all forms are completed.

This will assist both participants and staff alike. The number of nominations required for a meeting to proceed for Port Augusta is 40 and for GOTBA Coursing it is 30.



Changes to trial information

GRSA has reviewed the policy for trialling prior to race meetings. These changes will be effective as of 2 May 2019 (in line with G-Six racing) so please take the time to read the new policy to ensure you do not get caught out.

The updated policy follows these pages and will be published monthly.

Microchip collection

GRSA reminds breeders to organise the collection of microchips from Angle Park office prior to booking in times with microchipping officials.

Microchips can be collected from Angle Park office Monday - Friday 8:30am - 4:30pm. GRSA is able to send envelopes to race meetings with Stewards if enough notice is given. The responsibility is on breeders - not the microchipping officials - to collect microchips.

Clarification around the updating of Breeding Females information to ensure she remains active

Breeders are reminded to ensure their breeding females have ACTIVE pink cards prior to service/insemination.

Licensed Breeders with an e-mail address registered with GRSA will receive an automated generic reminder e-mail from Ozchase when vaccinations or breeding exemptions expire and/or are required.

Once a breeding female is vaccinated and/or a fit and healthy assessment is completed by a Veterinarian, the relevant paperwork must be lodged to GRSA to ensure her breeding status is re-activated. Only breeding females that are going to be served/inseminated require an active status so if your breeding female is already in pup when you receive an e-mail reminder she does not need an active status to whelp.

GRSA is mindful that most veterinarians do not recommend for pregnant breeding females to be vaccinated and breeders do not need to be concerned that breeding females need to be vaccinated at this time. Once the pups are old enough breeders may choose to have the breeding female vaccinated when the pups receive their C5, however, once breeders consider breeding another litter, they must ensure she has a current C5 vaccination.

When breeders decide that a breeding female will not be used for any future breeding, a 106 retirement notification must be lodged within 10 days and her breeding female pink card must be returned to GRSA. Once the retirement status has been updated you will no longer receive the automated e-mails from Ozchase.

If in doubt, Breeders can verify the breeding female status by contacting GRSA office and speaking with Renee Colquhoun during office hours or refer to your Breeders Information Pack that was issued in 2018.

Drone inspections

All registered kennel addresses are subject to drone inspections as stated in GAR 18. Drone inspections are planned with utmost care to ensure the drone remains in the boundaries of the specific property wherein footage is being taken. GRSA's Drone Operator is also a GRSA Steward, holds a licence with the Civil Aviation Safety Authority [CASA] and is highly experienced in his field.

Hardy bedding options

As per The South Australian Greyhound Industry Animal Welfare Policy all greyhounds (including pups of any age) require a raised bed to insulate them from the floor (whether or not they choose to use it) and warm, clean, vermin resistant bedding. We understand that sometimes greyhounds will destroy bedding however it is a requirement to ensure that at all times they have a raised bed and bedding available to them.

GRSA has made a 'how to' guide on how to build a very hardy bed that has been used successfully in several kennels with active greyhounds. Attached is a photograph of the suggested bed.

Please contact Animal Welfare if you have any queries about bed/bedding options, including to organise free carpet for kennels or for a copy of the guide to build the bed.



Notification of retired/ euthanased greyhounds forms (106 forms)

A reminder that the Animal Welfare department no longer accepts retirement and euthanasia forms lodged without the signature of the last registered owner - regardless of where that owner resides.

Mrs. Karen Price – Stewards inquiry 03/04/19 – GAR 86[p] – Disobeyed an order given by a GRSA Steward in relation to the post-race kennelling of a greyhound. Mrs. Price pleaded guilty and was fined \$200; wholly suspended for 12 months on the condition she does not reoffend under the same Rule.

SPRING CUERVO – Review of Stewards Decision 21/03/19 – greyhound SPRING CUERVO reported for failing to pursue during an event at Angle Park on 7/03/19. An application was lodged for a review. Review of decision found the Review Panel was unanimous in their view that in the back straight SPRING CUERVO had failed to pursue. Application for review was dismissed and the penalty stands.

The Golden Rules

Since the introduction of cobalt and arsenic thresholds, all participants should be reminded – in their own best interests – that there are a number of Golden Rules that can help them to avoid making any such breaches (for prohibited substances generally) and which should be adhered to as principles of best practice:

- Always consult your vet to seek guidance in relation to any of the products that you are using, any associated risks and other relevant context
- Review the range of any feeds or supplements that you typically purchase and, wherever it is reasonable to do so, replace products containing substances that could contribute to a threshold breach under the rules [eg. cobalt] with alternative products
- Observe the instructions on any products that you use and adhere strictly to those directions (having regard for prescribed amounts, frequency of administration/application, methodology for administering/applying)
- Ensure a greyhound is never administered any treatment on race day other than as relates to its feeding and drinking requirements [GAR83[A][1] treats this as a specific offence]
- Refrain from the use of injectable treatments (eg. Vitamin B12) to any extent that is practical, including ensuring a greyhound is not administered any injectables the day before an event

Our registered participants have the responsibility to ensure that greyhounds are presented to the track free of any prohibited substances. This information is offered as advice in good faith and should not be relied on as a defence in the event of a breach occurring.

Policy Background

This policy is to detail the procedure for trainers seeking greyhounds to trial before race meetings. This policy is effective from 2 May 2019.

Race Meeting Trial Policy

This policy is in place for the following race meetings:

Angle Park Monday, Gawler Tuesday and Friday, Murray Bridge Wednesday and Sunday.

Two fields from the boxes with a maximum of four (4) greyhounds will be conducted immediately following the completion of the kennelling procedure for the race meeting.

The following lists the order in which greyhounds will be selected in the event if more than eight (8) greyhounds are nominated:

- 1. Reserves at the meeting that do not obtain a start
- Trainers that have greyhounds engaged and are located more than 100km in distance from the track
- 3. Satisfactory trials

Procedure/criteria

- For Angle Park Monday night, the trainer is to contact GRSA by midday on Monday to nominate. Should the Monday be a public holiday bookings are to be made between 8am and 9am on the scratching number.
- 2. For Gawler Tuesday & Friday, the trainer is to contact GRSA by 4.30pm the day before.
- For Murray Bridge Wednesday, the trainer is to contact GRSA by 4.30pm the day before. For Murray Bridge Sunday, the trainer is to contact the scratching number on Sunday between 8am and 9am.
- 4. Other than reserve greyhounds, trainers will be restricted to trialling one (1) greyhound unless nominations determine otherwise.
- 5. Stewards will allocate the box for the greyhound.
- 6. Trials will be 515m, 530m & 531m in distance as first preference. Other distances considered depending on nominations.
- 7. Greyhounds currently under suspension are ineligible to trial unless they are undertaking a satisfactory trial to be cleared.
- 8. Greyhound registration cards must be produced at kennelling time.
- Trainers with other greyhounds engaged can utilise the extra kennel space until such time they are ready to leave. Trainers with no other greyhounds engaged will be permitted to leave with Stewards permission.

Please note: If there are 12 races at Angle Park, Gawler or Murray Bridge there will be NO trials.

The Angle Park Vet Clinic and/or swab kennels cannot be used to accommodate any additional greyhounds due to operational requirements of the Clinic and Stewards.

It is vital that trainers nominate to trial at these race meetings. If you are unable to nominate at these times, please contact GRSA as soon as possible as permission may be given at GRSA's discretion to accept bookings outside these times.

Exceptions to this policy

Thursday nights are kept available for interstate greyhounds to solo trial in a lead-up to SA Group races as well as local greyhound's trialling for Group racing interstate.

Upon request, local greyhounds will be allowed to solo trial in a lead-up to a feature race and they will take one of the eight (8) kennels available for trialling greyhounds ahead of the policy and sit separate to the four (4) dog trials. Races considered to be a feature are: Adelaide Cup, Gawler Cup, Oaks, Derby, Howard Ashton, Brian Johnstone, SA Sprint, SA Distance Championship, SA Anniversary Cup, SA Country Cup, National Finals and any interstate Group race

Local greyhounds will be permitted to trial on a race night, where they are in preparation for a feature event, nominated for a meeting and the race does not stand up. This will include all distances and also take precedence over the policy. If a greyhound qualifies for a feature final and requires a trial in between, this will be conducted as a solo trial and will sit separately to the four (4) dog trials.

Mount Gambier

The Mount Gambier Greyhound Racing Club will conduct satisfactory trials under the criteria below:

- On race days only when there are less than 12 races scheduled
- 2. These trials must be booked with GRSA by 4.30pm the day before a mid-week meeting and 4pm on the Friday prior if a Sunday meeting.

GRSA reserves the right to alter or amend this policy at any time.

What is G-SIX Racing?

G-SIX racing is an exciting, innovative trial of 6-dog racing at selected South Australian tracks

How is G-SIX racing different to the current format?

The format of G-SIX racing only differs in that the standard field size reduces from 8 to 6 dogs.

How does the box draw work?

G-SIX racing will adopt a standard approach to drawing six dog fields with vacancies in the 3 and 6 boxes. The runners will still wear the rug colours which traditionally correlate to their box draw - ie 1, 2, 4, 5, 7 and 8. The reserves will carry the standard rug colours of 9 and 10.

Why G-Six?

It is important for racing and sport generally to explore innovative ways to present itself. As the controlling body, we need to look for new approaches to appeal to and engage with our wagering audience.

When does G-SIX start?

G-SIX will commence May 2 for a 3-month trial period.

Where will G-SIX run?

Angle Park, Gawler and Mount Gambier. The dual tracks at the new Murray Bridge venue will continue with the traditional 8 dog format.

What are the advantages of G-SIX?

- More races run at more race meetings
- Cleaner racing with less interference
- Stakemoney increases to SA trainers and owners, worth more than \$1,000,000 annually
- The introduction of a new Thursday timeslot at Mount Gambier to enable consistent weekly scheduling at both Murray Bridge and Mount Gambier

How does G-SIX affect the current racing schedule?

The racing schedule will expand to accommodate two weekly meetings at each of its TAB venues. The introduction of G-SIX will signal the introduction of a consistent Thursday afternoon timeslot at Mount Gambier and enable racing at Murray Bridge each Wednesday. The commencement of G-SIX racing will coincide with the introduction of straighttrack racing at Murray Bridge.

How will G-SIX racing affect the 3rd place dividend for wagering?

No 3rd place dividend will apply to G-SIX racing as is the normal practice for 6-dog fields. It follows that place dividends for 1st and 2nd will be relatively inflated as a result.

Will all races at the selected venues run in G-SIX format?

Yes, with the exception of a handful of specified feature events held during the 3-month trial including:

- Breeders 2019 Prelude (2)
- Bayroad Queen Stayers Cup
- AGRC/GRSA Auction (388m)
- Howard Ashton
- Shane McQueen

- AGRC/GRSA Auction (515m)
- Champion Puppy
- Gawler Produce Stake

Murray Bridge Straight Track Racing

Straight track racing is set to commence at Murray Bridge next month, with some successful trials having already occurred this week.

Like anything new, there is always some trepidation at the start. Some queries have been raised about a few of the elements of the straight track, so I'll use this column to provide some clarity in regards to these elements.

Track Surface - GRSA chose a sand surface to ensure greater consistency, lower maintenance, harder wearing and an ability to be an all weather surface. The exposed location of the track has made preparation of the surface a challenge, however the maintenance team is confident of delivering a consistent and safe and consistent surface.

Track Camber - The track camber at Murray Bridge is identical to the popular Healesville track in Victoria. Camber is required to remove water off the surface of the track and to offset the gradient of entire length of the track.

Lure Type - At the start of the investigative process into the Murray Bridge facility, GRSA stated that all lure types would be considered. It was quickly established and communicated that a rail and arm system would be pursued (same as Healesville). Whilst GRSA recognises the benefits of a drag lure, the system is difficult to implement on a sand track given the requirement to have a permanent cable resting on the racing surface.

Remote/Battery Lure - Once GRSA had resolved to install a rail/arm system, how that was to function was the next consideration, with options being cable driven, bramich or some other new technology. GRSA has since been working with Steriline Racing to develop a battery powered, remote operated lure system. After months of testing, this technology is functioning well and in operation on the straight track.

Catching Pen - The Murray Bridge catching pen is loosely based on the Healesville catching pen. It is 70 metres in total length from the finish post, with the actual pen being around 30 metres long. These dimensions make the catching pen quite large in comparison to other straight track catching pens around the country.

300m Chute Start - Options for the shorter distance start included a crane on/off system (same as Healesville), or a chute off the track (same as Appin in NSW). It was decided to replicate the Appin setup. GRSA will monitor the performance of this configuration and has not ruled out installing a crane system if it is felt that the current setup is not working effectively.

350m Start Position - The 350m start is set off the rail slightly, approximately two metres, and there a couple of reasons for this. Firstly from a logistics perspective we need to have access by the tractor at the end of the track. Secondly it allows greyhound migration to the rail without crowding occurring at that point.

Lure Run Off - The lure run off is an important aspect to any straight track. It needs to effectively remove the lure from the track, provide a level of deception to the greyhounds and maintain absolute safety of greyhounds and staff. The final solution has worked well in trials and GRSA is confident that this system is as good as any in the country.

The Murray Bridge straight track is an exciting opportunity for the industry, with TAB/Sky racing for the first time in SA on this type of track. It is the last element to the state's track mix and management hopes trainers will support the new track with their feet.

Many participants have voiced their opinions/theories on how certain elements of the track will play out. It will be interesting to see if these theories prove correct, but we will only know once full field racing commences on May 15.

As stated many times before by management, GRSA is always willing to listen to participant feedback and make changes where necessary to ensure the absolute best outcomes. Industry participants can provide feedback directly at anytime via the normal channels.

The project involves enclosing the new area and properly cladding all the walls, new carpet flooring and then adding patron amenities such as bar, TAB and toilets. With new furniture and audio visual, the space will become an exciting overflow area for race meetings and other functions.

The Gawler GRC is to be congratulated on continuing to invest club funds in important and valuable project that serves to improve their facilities.

Information regarding the booking and use of the boxes are as follows:

- ➤ In the OzChase online trial booking system, trials from the new boxes are to be booked as "300m Training Box"
- > Trials from the training box can only occur between the 731m boxes and the old catching pen access gate (refer map below)
- ➤ All trials from the training boxes must conclude at the winning post, either finishing on the lure or into the catching pen. Box to box trials or further will not be possible
- > The boxes cannot be setup on the inner half of the racing surface, with GRSA staff assisting trainers in the positioning of boxes.




Latest updates from GAP

An out of this world result for Galactic Athena

■ MOUNT GAMBIER

At 19 months of age, many greyhounds have yet to even race – let alone win.

Not so the local hope Galactic Athena who at start number six was lining up from box two in the Group Listed Fairthorne Forestry Mount Gambier Cup final [512 metres] at Tara Raceway on March 31st.

And while the Mount Gambier Greyhound Racing Club may not have attracted quite the crowd it would have hoped for, it did attract the dogs – this year's cup final surely one of the strongest ever in the 39 year history of the event.

There's no doubting Galactic Athena, a 31 kilogram daughter of Paddy Whacker and Galactic Rumball, deserved her place in the \$15,000-to-the-winner final after a quick 29.58 seconds heat win over Nirimba Pirate the previous week.

But seasoned Group race performer Slingshot Hammer – Lara connections Deborah Coleman and Rob Camilleri looking to further boost his considerable earnings of more than \$100,000 – did look the one to beat after his 29.45 seconds heat win.

He was short, though, at \$1.70. Pure White Evil, another heat winner, was tempting at \$4.80 and Galactic Athena even more so at \$7.

Colville, trained at Tarpeena by Allen Williams, had been the last local greyhound to win the Mount Gambier Cup and that was six years ago – Galactic Athena's breeder-owner Robert Chuck of Moorak and trainer Steve Bartholomew of Worrolong hoping to improve on last year's cup final effort when half-brother Galactic Panther ran third behind Xtreme Caution and Lektra Stomp.

The only bitch in the race and attempting to become the youngest-ever winner of the cup, Galactic Athena was only fairly away but by the time the field had made its way safely out of the first turn she had worked into second spot after railing through on Pure White Evil.

Giving them all something to chase, though, was Slingshot Hammer, away quickly from box one and mid-race travelling smoothly, Galactic Athena and Pure White Evil looking likely to fill the minor placings.

Slingshot Hammer, having his final run before heading to Sydney for the Golden Easter Egg, turned for home in front but was unable to withstand Galactic Athena's unbelievable finish which saw her score by a half length in a race record time of 29.43 seconds.

This was a win from an August 2017 whelping that would have attracted attention Australia-wide with both the runner-up and third placegetter Pure White Evil also eclipsing 2017 winner Fabregal's previous race record of 29.78 seconds.

For Bartholomew, a life member of the MGGRC, it was a win a long time coming. He handled the inaugural Mount Gambier Cup winner Tara Topar back in 1981 at Glenburnie and in the ensuing 39 years has reached the final with his own dogs on several occasions.

And Sunday's win, he said, was a real team effort.

"I really have to thank my wife Lee for all the work she puts in with the dogs. Also I need to acknowledge the efforts of Ken Gillespie who comes out and helps us and, of course, Chuckie for giving me Galactic Athena to train."

Bartholomew said they would now target the forthcoming Warrnambool Cup [450 m] with Galactic Athena.

"At this stage we're looking at giving her a run at "E Warrnambool prior to the cup to see how she handles the one-bend track and go from there," he said.

It was a winning embrace for Galactic Athena's owner Robert Chuck from trainer Steve Bartholomew.

Heats of the Group 2 event will be run on Wednesday, April 24 with the \$47,000-to-the-winner final on Wednesday, May 1.

ANGLE PARK QUALIFYING TRIALS ON WEDNESDAY NIGHTS

Under the new schedule Angle Park Qualifying Trials will be run weekly on Wednesday night, for the corresponding Monday APM meeting (12 days later due to nominations). With 388m racing now available on Monday nights trainers can qualify for all distances.

Nominations close with GRSA at 12.30pm on the Wednesday of the meeting.

SINGLE TRIALS

A reminder to trainers that single trials can be booked with two greyhounds however you need to advise when booking of your intention to do this. If you wish to put three or more into this trial then a field trial will have to be booked.

BOOKING NUMBER FOR TRIALS

Participants wishing to book trials are required to ring 8243 7172, this phone line will only be used for trial bookings and will queue participants. By having this one number with participants queuing makes this process to be a more efficient way of booking trials.

There will be NO trials accepted through the normal administration number. To be fair to everyone GRSA will only accept bookings using the new number or alternatively logon to trialbooker.com, create an account and book your own trials.

POLICY FOR TRIALLING AT ANGLE PARK AND GAWLER BEFORE THE RACE MEETING

Policy Background

This policy is to detail the procedure for trainers seeking greyhounds to trial before race meetings. This policy is effective from 2 May 2019.

Race Meeting Trial Policy

This policy is in place for the following race meetings:

Angle Park Monday, Gawler Tuesday and Friday, Murray Bridge Wednesday and Sunday.

Two fields from the boxes with a maximum of four (4) greyhounds will be conducted immediately following the completion of the kennelling procedure for the race meeting.

The following lists the order in which greyhounds will be selected in the event if more than eight (8) greyhounds are nominated:

- 1. Reserves at the meeting that do not obtain a start
- 2. Trainers that have greyhounds engaged and are located more than 100km in distance from the track
- 3. Satisfactory trials

Procedure/criteria

- 1. For Angle Park Monday night, the trainer is to contact GRSA by midday on Monday to nominate. Should the
 - Monday be a public holiday bookings are to be made between 8am and 9am on the scratching number.
- 2. For Gawler Tuesday & Friday, the trainer is to contact GRSA by 4.30pm the day before.
- 3. For Murray Bridge Wednesday, the trainer is to contact
 - GRSA by 4.30pm the day before. For Murray Bridge Sunday, the trainer is to contact the scratching number on Sunday between 8am and 9am.
- 4. Other than reserve greyhounds, trainers will be restricted to trialling one (1) greyhound unless nominations determine otherwise.
- 5. Stewards will allocate the box for the greyhound.
- Trials will be 515m, 530m & 531m in distance as first preference. Other distances considered depending on nominations.
- 7. Greyhounds currently under suspension are ineligible to trial unless they are undertaking a satisfactory trial to be cleared.
- 8. Greyhound registration cards must be produced at kennelling time.
- Trainers with other greyhounds engaged can utilise the extra kennel space until such time they are ready to leave
 - Trainers with no other greyhounds engaged will be permitted to leave with Stewards permission.

Please note: If there are 12 races at Angle Park, Gawler or Murray Bridge there will be NO trials.

The Angle Park Vet Clinic and/or swab kennels cannot be used to accommodate any additional greyhounds due to operational requirements of the Clinic and Stewards.

It is vital that trainers nominate to trial at these race meetings. If you are unable to nominate at these times, please contact GRSA as soon as possible as permission may be given at GRSA's discretion to accept bookings outside these times.

Exceptions to this policy

Thursday nights are kept available for interstate greyhounds to solo trial in a lead-up to SA Group races as well as local greyhound's trialling for Group racing interstate.

Upon request, local greyhounds will be allowed to solo trial in a lead-up to a feature race and they will take one of the eight (8) kennels available for trialling greyhounds ahead of the policy and sit separate to the four (4) dog trials. Races considered to be a feature are: Adelaide Cup, Gawler Cup, Oaks, Derby, Howard Ashton, Brian Johnstone, SA Sprint, SA Distance Championship, SA Anniversary Cup, SA Country Cup, National Finals and any interstate Group race

Local greyhounds will be permitted to trial on a race night, where they are in preparation for a feature event, nominated for a meeting and the race does not stand up. This will include all distances and also take precedence over the policy. If a greyhound qualifies for a feature final and requires a trial in between, this will be conducted as a solo trial and will sit separately to the four (4) dog trials.

MOUNT GAMBIER

The Mount Gambier Greyhound Racing Club will conduct satisfactory trials under the criteria below:

- On race days only when there are less than 12 races scheduled
- 2. These trials must be booked with GRSA by 4.30pm the day before a mid-week meeting and 4pm on the Friday prior if a Sunday meeting.

GRSA reserves the right to alter or amend this policy at any time.
