Jack Get Back claims Group 3 Brian Johnstone

Jack Get Back for trainer Ken Trowbridge caused a minor upset in the Group 3 Brian Johnstone Final at Angle Park on 29th November when he was able to gun down Victa Ashley for Mike Giniotis in the shadows of the post and claim victory.

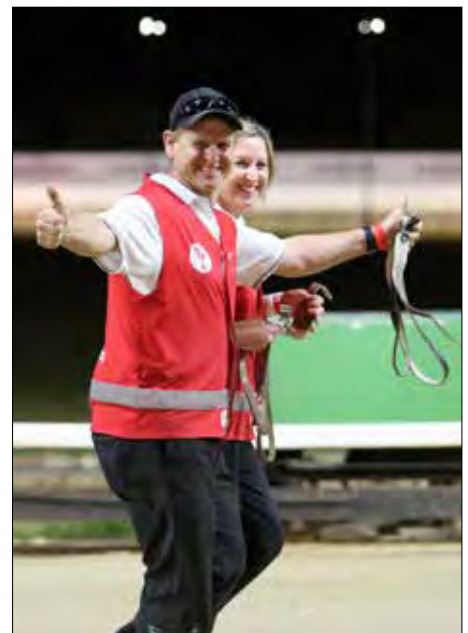
Jack Get Back was sent out at \$23.00 in the Group 3 classic based around the depth of high quality young SA Bred chasers engaged who were all looking to claim the \$26,000 first prize.

Jack Get Back began well from box 3 in an even dispatch and was able to find the early lead sitting just off the fence however this allowed a run for Victa Ashley to rail hard to take up the front running. Into the back straight and Victa Ashley kicked clear flying down the back straight and opening up a handy margin from his rivals. Jack Get Back was being challenged by Time's Right for Cameron Butcher for second however off the back straight he kicked clear of Time's Right and set out after the tear away leader as the remainder of the field packed up in behind. Turning for home Jack Get Back well and truly had Victa Ashley in his sights and he charged past him in the shadows of the post to score a memorable victory for the Trowbridge kennel. Victa Ashley ran a bold race for second 1¼ lengths away while Axel Footluce also for Ken Trowbridge flashed home late on the inside for third, another 4 lengths away.

Jack Get Back is by Kinloch Brae and Footluce Diva with Ken Trowbridge training 3 of the 8 finalists all from the same litter. He ran a solid 30.01 for the 515m journey and has now won 6 races from 17 starts and 8 minor placings and prizemoney around \$36,000.

Jack Get Back is locally bred by Melissa Trowbridge and is owned by both Melissa and Ken.

This event was introduced in recognition of former Adelaide Greyhound Racing Club Chairman, Brian Johnstone who passed away 10 years ago. Brian was a true ambassador and great administrator for SA greyhound racing. He was involved with Angle Park from the early days and served many, many years on the Adelaide Greyhound Racing Club Committee.



Fabwik fabulous in Doug Payne Final

The 2018 SA Bred Doug Payne Feature was run on 6th December at Angle Park in warm conditions in front of a large crowd and they would have seen Kirin Corby win her third Doug Payne Feature when her star sprinter Fabwik won in easy fashion.

Kirin previously won the prestigious event in 2003 with superstar Lion Hearted and then in 2008 with Cool Keepsake and last night she had a two pronged attack for the feature SA bred race.

In the small but quality field of five Fabwik was sent out a well-supported favourite just ahead of kennel mate Tauwitchere which was aiming to keep her unbeaten record in tact after a perfect 5 from 5 beginning to her racing career. As the starting boxes flew open Fabwik came out running from the inside box early but was challenged by Amity Marlow for Tony Milligan and then Alicante Bouchet for Ben Rawlings who was driving hard towards the fence. Leaving the winning post on the first occasion Fabwik accelerated away from her rivals with Tauwitchere whipping around the outside to move to second while Alicante Bouchet dropped back and was challenged by Highbury Hustle for John Mundy along the inside. Down the back straight Fabwik was flying in the lead however Tauwitchere was running a bold race and keeping in touch with her more experienced kennel mate. Alicante Bouchet moved to a clear third but was giving the Corby duo a big start. Off the back straight Fabwik had opened up a race winning lead out by 6 or 7 lengths while both Tauwitchere and Alicante Bouchet tried hard to make ground. Down to the finish line and Fabwik was in no danger going on to record a brilliant win in a sizzling 29.51 for the 515m journey with splits of 4.46 & 16.72. She won by just over 5 lengths from Tauwitchere which kept coming in the run and lost no admirers with Alicante Bouchet a further 4 lengths away in third.

Fabwik is by Fabregas and out of Wikenia and is Owned, Bred and Trained by Kirin Corby. The \$7,495 first prize took Fabwik's prizemoney to just under \$50,000 with a career record of 18 wins from 33 starts including 9 placings.

Doug Payne is one of only three South Australian's inducted into the GCA Hall of Fame and is recognized as an icon of SA greyhound racing. He was a true ambassador for the industry winning the first three Adelaide Cups in 1972, 73 and 74 in addition to winning 14 training premierships.

Kate's A Scandal Xmas Sprint on Thursday 20th December

On Thursday, 20th December the feature at Angle Park will be the \$7,000 Kate's A Scandal Xmas Sprint Free For All (N/P) over the 515m.

Nominations close with GRSA at 9.00am on Monday, 17th December.

SA Bred Futurity payments – due Friday, 14th December

The next batch of futurity payments are due Friday, 14th December and there are three series' for which payments need to be made.

Forms have been sent out for those eligible greyhounds.

The payments due are:

Breeders 2019 – Final Payment - Pups Born Jan 17 to June 17

This payment is for greyhounds for which the first two Sustaining Payments have been made. The Final Payment is \$121 per greyhound.

Classic 2019 – Second Payment - Pups Born July 17 to Dec 17

This payment is for greyhounds for which the first Sustaining Payment was made last June.

The Second Sustaining Payment is \$55 per pup or a Final Payment of \$121 can be made at this stage.

Breeders 2020 – First Payment - Pups Born Jan 18 to June 18

The First Payment is due for Breeders 2020. All SA Bred greyhounds born in the above period are eligible to make this payment.

The First Payment is \$27.50 per pup or a "one-off" Final payment of \$121 can be made at this stage.

Honcho Monelli takes out top award for October

Greyhound of the Month award for November went to the Tony Rasmussen trained Honcho Monelli who took out his fourth monthly award for the year and is now considered the red hot favourite for Greyhound of the Year honours.

Honcho Monelli's month was highlighted by his outstanding performance in the Group 3 Gawler Gold Cup in early November. After being brilliant in his heat and drawing box 1 in the final he started very short in the market and his supporters were not disappointed. He led a high quality field a merry dance winning in sensational fashion and claiming the Northern venue's premier race. He then ran second at headquarters in FFA company before jumping across the border to Sandown for another placing towards the end of the month.

At the end of the month Honcho Monelli's record stood at 105 starts with 31 wins and 45 placings and earnings around \$195,000.



Sennachie makes huge impression with maiden win

The Run of the Month for November was in a Maiden event by a greyhound having its first start in a race. Sennachie for Kirin Corby created a massive impression on debut when the son of Fernando Bale and Rhonda Rocks blistered around the Angle Park loam in a sizzling 29.52 for the 515m journey on Monday 22nd November.

He won by almost 19 lengths and recorded a time for a Maiden that very few Maidens have replicated over the years.



National Greyhound Draft this Sunday with Ben Rawlings & Ray Borda leading the way for SA

The first National Greyhound Draft will be conducted this Sunday, 16th December. It's an initiative aimed at introducing new owners to the sport.

Port Augusta trainers travelling guarantee

As from the meeting on 29/12/18 the Port Augusta Club will be offering a Trainers travelling guarantee to Trainers who support their meetings.

The guarantee will be \$100 per trainer. This payment is to offset travelling costs for those trainers whose greyhounds do not earn any prizemoney. It will be paid to those trainers whose greyhounds do not earn any prizemoney collectively.

e.g. Trainer A nominates 4 greyhounds and none of them run a place he will be paid the travelling guarantee. Trainer B nominates 3 greyhounds and one of those runs a place he will not be eligible for the payment.

All Trainers regardless of the number of runners will be eligible for the guarantee. It will be paid directly to the Trainer, ideally before leaving the track on the day of the meeting.

Unfortunately with only 1 nomination for the 2018 Gawler Classic Heats the series will be reprogrammed to February next year with heats on Friday, 1st February and a \$5,000 final on Friday, 8th February.

Basic Steel Supplies SA Sprint Championship in January

Owners and Trainers are reminded of the domiciliary clause on the Basic Steel Supplies SA Sprint Championship coming up in January.

To be eligible a greyhound must have been domiciled in SA for a period of not less than 76 days out of the 150 days immediately prior to the time fixed for the finalising of nominations and drawing of fields. [Nationals policy adopted]

This date going back 76 days is 24th October as nominations close on Monday, 7th January 2019.

The \$4,820 heats are scheduled to be run on Thursday, 10th January, with the Final to be run on Thursday, 17th January. Total prizemoney for the listed final will be \$22,000, with the winner's share of \$15,000.

Projects Update

Murray Bridge

They are off and racing at Murray Bridge, (albeit a picnic meeting) with the 'test' meeting successfully conducted yesterday, Wednesday 12th December. The first 'official' nationally broadcast meeting will occur next week on Wednesday 19th December.

From that point, the Murray Bridge GRC will conduct a weekly Sunday twilight meeting and a fortnightly Wednesday afternoon meeting.

Whilst racing has commenced, the team still has a long list of tasks to complete over the coming weeks and months. As such, participants will see changes occurring on a weekly basis as the facility starts to evolve. We ask for some patience as these tasks are undertaken.

Much of the infrastructure is a work in progress, and GRSA has already identified some issues that impact the movement of participants and greyhounds around the site during racing and trials. Contractors will be rectifying these issues, hopefully prior to the first official race meeting.

GRSA is also welcoming feedback on improvements to the facility that will assist logistics, participant, patron and greyhound comfort. This feedback can be made via the MBGRC committee or directly to GRSA via the normal communication channels.

Darren Pearce (formerly Angle Park and Gawler) will lead a three person maintenance team which will have responsibility for the venue. Joining him will be the 'Peters' - locals Peter Duthie and Peter Lee, both formerly of the Murray Bridge Racing Club (thoroughbreds).

This team will be responsible for the upkeep of the facility, but most importantly the preparation of a consistent and safe racing surface on both tracks (1-turn and straight track).

I would like to take this opportunity to thank both Terry Winder and Darren for an unbelievable effort over the past 2-3 months getting the Murray Bridge facility ready. It would also be remiss of me not to mention the rest of the team back at Angle Park and Gawler, who have



worked extremely hard (and often under resourced) during this period, so well done and thanks to Brad Beckett, Dave Rundle, Michael Edwards, Dale Gray and Steve Muldoon.

In regards to the straight track, GRSA hopes to commence trials in late January, with the view of racing in mid February. At this stage the team will

concentrate on 1-turn track racing and the challenges of preparing two racing tracks simultaneously.

GRSA will also discuss with the MBGRC what opportunities exist to allow free galloping on the straight track surface on a weekly basis. This option is seen as an important training opportunity for local participants.

Angle Park Lighting System

GRSA has received the hardware to facilitate stage 2 of the Angle Park lighting system upgrade. The challenge is to identify the best opportunity to install the new lights.

The maintenance team will work with the contractor over the coming weeks to identify the best schedule for installation, noting that this is likely to occur in the latter part of January. An update will be provided in the next edition of Kennel Capers.

Mount Gambier Kennel House

GRSA is currently investigating the possibility of an upgrade of the Mount Gambier kennels.

This project has been on GRSA's radar for some time, however with impending completion of the Murray Bridge facility, investigations can commence with a view to completing the project in 2019.

The upgrade will look to remove the old brick and concrete kennels and replace them with more traditional steel equivalents that are used at most tracks across the country.

Angle Park Lure System

It was extremely unfortunate to have a meeting abandoned at Angle Park in the past month, due the failure of the lure system and the subsequent damage caused. After being assessed on the night of the meeting, there was simply not enough time to facilitate a repair.

Whilst the lure system is thoroughly checked on a weekly basis by system specialist Brad Beckett, the failure of welds on the rail itself are difficult to predict and preventative maintenance can not always guarantee failures won't occur.

The age of the system is an ongoing challenge for the team, and at some stage in the near future a refurbishment of the system will be required. With Murray Bridge coming online, this will give GRSA an opportunity to undertake these works.

Stewarding, Animal Welfare and Licensing

Greyhounds to be in the care of a licensed person

Stewards wish to draw attention to GAR 101(2) which refers to unlicensed persons. Greyhounds must be in the care of a licensed person at all times.

This includes any breaking in, pre-training, or education of a greyhound. Before handing your greyhound over to another person, you should ensure that they are licensed and clarification can be sought through GRSA.

The relevant Rule is below:

R101 Unlicensed person

[2] An owner or trainer shall not permit an unlicensed person to-

[a] train, at any place; or

[b] handle on any racecourse, a greyhound owned by or pursuant to the control of the owner or trainer.

"train" or "training" shall mean the preparation, education or exercise of a greyhound to race or trial.

Cool vests for sale

Participants are reminded that cool vests for greyhounds are available to purchase for \$80 at reception.

This is the same price GRSA purchases them for.

Owners to ensure they are transferring dogs in DACO

The Dog and Cat Management Board (DCMB) has recently asked GRSA to remind owners to ensure they are accepting 'transfers' on DACO (the online council registration system) when their greyhound has left a trainer's property.

This will assist the previous trainer free up dog spaces on the system to allow trainer's to update new dogs onto their property.

Any questions can be directed to your local council.

Hot weather information

Participants are reminded to ensure they are aware of the GRSA Hot Weather Policy. This can be found on the website.

The main points to remember from the Hot Weather Policy are:

- GRSA works off the Bureau of Meteorology temperature forecasts
- Trainers may scratch all runners engaged without penalty when the temperature is forecast to be 38°C at official scratching time
- When the temperature is forecast to be 32°C or above, the kennel house will be opened 30 minutes earlier than advertised, unless the meeting has been moved to the morning

- Barking muzzles are not permitted to be used at SA race tracks when the forecast temperature is to be 32°C or above

The quickest way to get updates about changes to kennelling times or race meetings affected by hot weather is through the industry txt message service. If you are not currently on the list, please contact the office to be included.

Inquiries and notifications

Mr. Trevor Jessup – Stewards inquiry 08/11/18 – GAR 86(o) – Found guilty in relation to using words to intimidate the Integrity Manager, which in the opinion of the Stewards constituted misconduct. Mr. Jessup was disqualified for six (6) months and fined \$2,000; with \$1,000 and the disqualification to be suspended for 12 months on the basis that he does not reoffend under this Rule. It was also a condition that he furnished a written apology and undertaking not to undertake this behaviour in future.

Ms. Dita Mitchell – Stewards inquiry 26/11/18 – Circumstances of greyhounds being cared for by an unregistered person at her registered kennel address whilst she was away from that property. Stewards were satisfied with the arrangements in place with the supervision by a licensed person and that training activities had not taken place.

Mr. Tracie Price – Stewards inquiry 06/12/18 – GAR 101(2)(a) – Had engaged an unregistered person Mr. C. Campbell to undertake activities that fell under the definition of training greyhounds. Mr. Price pleaded guilty and was fined \$1,000; wholly suspended for 24 months on the condition he does not reoffend.

Reminder lodgement of paperwork before Christmas



The Golden Rules

Since the introduction of cobalt and arsenic thresholds, all participants should be reminded – in their own best interests – that there are a number of Golden Rules that can help them to avoid making any such breaches (for prohibited substances generally) and which should be adhered to as principles of best practice:

- Always consult your vet to seek guidance in relation to any of the products that you are using, any associated risks and other relevant context
- Review the range of any feeds or supplements that you typically purchase and, wherever it is reasonable to do so, replace products containing substances that could contribute to a threshold breach under the rules (eg. cobalt) with alternative products
- Observe the instructions on any products that you use and adhere strictly to those directions (having regard for prescribed amounts, frequency of administration/ application, methodology for administering/applying)
- Ensure a greyhound is never administered any treatment on race day other than as relates to its feeding and drinking requirements [GAR83(A)](1) treats this as a specific offence]
- Refrain from the use of injectable treatments (eg. Vitamin B12) to any extent that is practical, including ensuring a greyhound is not administered any injectables the day before an event

Our registered participants have the responsibility to ensure that greyhounds are presented to the track free of any prohibited substances. This information is offered as advice in good faith and should not be relied on as a defence in the event of a breach occurring.

Parvo Virus

Vaccinate your greyhounds! - PARVO

A new strain of the highly contagious canine parvovirus has been discovered in Australia. In 2017, researchers at the University of Adelaide have now confirmed cases in South Australia and Victoria, and suspect that more exist in Queensland and the Northern Territory.

Over the last two years vets around Australia noticed dogs presenting classic parvo symptoms, but returning negative results in tests.

WHAT IS CANINE PARVOVIRUS (CPV)?

Canine Parvovirus, commonly known as Parvo is a viral illness that causes vomiting, bloody diarrhoea and weight loss in dogs. It is especially dangerous in puppies aged between six weeks and six months where it can be fatal. Early vaccination has been effective at reducing death rates.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS OF PARVO?

If any of these symptoms below are identified in your dog, it is highly recommended that the dog be isolated as soon as possible and receive immediate veterinary care

- Extreme vomiting and diarrhoea
- Loss of appetite
- Weight loss
- Lethargy and/or depression
- Fever

HOW IS PARVO TRANSMITTED?

Parvo in dogs can be transmitted by anything or anyone that comes in contact with infected feces or vomit. Feces is often carried on a dog's hair or paws and can easily be transferred to humans via clothing or shoes. If a dog sniffs or licks any contaminated surface or item like clothing, carpet, food/water bowls, bedding or kennels, they will likely become infected.

Parvo virus survives by being extremely resilient to its host and also in the environment. It can hang around the environment for many months and only requires a relatively small number of viral particles to infect a dog.

PREVENTION - VACCINATE!!

The most important thing that all dog owners can do is to vaccinate your puppies.

*It can take seven to ten days before the vaccine becomes effective!!!

KILL THE VIRUS IN THE ENVIRONMENT

If you do have an outbreak of parvo, it is very important to isolate the dog ASAP, seek immediate Veterinary care and properly disinfect contaminated areas

- Cleaning food bowls
- Water bowls
- Beds
- Blankets
- Anything and everything that has come into contact with an infected animal

Bleach is said to be the most effective disinfectant to kill parvo when used correctly. Always read safety labels, ensure the bleach has a contact time of at least 10- 15 minutes to effectively kill the virus.

Prepare for this summer

Summer in Australia can be very harsh, as well as keeping ourselves cool and hydrated we MUST make sure you are doing the same for your greyhounds.

If you don't have access to an air conditioner in your kennel areas or minimal shade in your outdoor areas, here are some simple and cost-effective ways that you can keep your dogs well hydrated and cool and comfortable this summer.

GRSA HOT WEATHER POLICY

Please familiarise yourself with Greyhound Racing SA hot weather policy, you can find this in the GRSA website www.sa.thedogs.com.au/ - Integrity – Rules and Policies – Hot Weather Policy, alternatively we can supply hard copies at GRSA.

SHADE

It is very important that your greyhound has access to a cool shady area if left outside, we would always encourage to supply your dogs with air-conditioning if possible.

Alternatively, shade cloth is an easy way to provide your dogs with much needed shade during extreme weather conditions.



PADDLING POOLS

Greyhounds are more susceptible to the hot weather than other dogs, to avoid any serious heat related issues a wading pool is a great idea to keep your dog's cool in the hotter months. Greyhounds LOVE water! You can purchase these pools from Bunnings or Kmart for around \$20



ICE BLOCKS / ICE IN WATER BOWLS

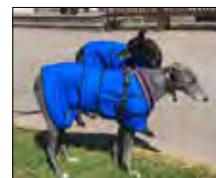
Ice in water bowls and ice blocks are another great idea to keep dogs cool. You can add a bit of food to your ice blocks, they are very easy to make and very effective.

FANS AND MISTERS AND MIST FANS

A fan should be an absolute must when it comes to summer in indoor kennel areas. Better yet, why not make it a mist fan! Although these can be on the more expensive side these are a perfect idea for your indoor kennels

COOLING VESTS AND WET TOWELS

Ice vests are another great way to keep your dog cool in both indoor and outdoor situations and also when travelling around.



ALWAYS REMEMBER – If it's too hot for you, it is too hot for your greyhounds!

EXERCISING AND TRAINING DOGS IN HOT WEATHER

In hot weather always be mindful of when you want to train or exercise your greyhounds. Avoid the hottest parts of the day, the best times are early morning and later on the evening.

ALWAYS check the ground/ pavement / asphalt temperature. If its too hot for you it will be too hot for your dog! Greyhounds foot pads are just like our feet and can be severely damaged if made to walk on a very hot ground.





Summer here we come!

As summer fast approaches the landscape will continue to dry out, growth from winter and spring rains will create an abundance of fuel for bushfires that may affect you and your dogs.

If you live in, travel through or visit bushfire risk areas it is critical that you recognise the need to have a plan and be prepared.

The risk is real and you should be prepared for the worst at all times. The consequences can be both devastating and terrifying, so why risk it?

Here are some points to be seriously considered when getting your property ready for summer and help greatly reduce the risk of being adversely affected by a bushfire:

- Clean out your gutters on sheds and buildings keeping them free from debris such as leaves and bark. Removing branches of trees that are overhanging any of your buildings is advised.
- Create a defensible space around your home by reducing vegetation
- Rake up leaves and removed excess rubbish and debris from around buildings and other structures
- Move flammable objects away from house
- Ensure you have a well-stocked emergency kit
- Place wire 'ember' mesh over wall vents
- Ensure your dogs and cats are identified and registered in case you become separated.

- Ensure your pets' vaccinations are up to date in case they need to be placed in kennels.
- Be sure you can adequately restrain or confine your pets as it may become frightened and distressed.
- Have an appropriate container, vehicle or equipment to transport your animal.

If you are planning to leave early in the event of a bushfire, consider what items you may need to include in your emergency kit for your pets, suggestions include:

- Plastic containers for water and food
- Small amounts of pet food
- Suitable bedding
- Pet medication
- Animal documentation such as identification and vaccination certificates
- Update your 5 Min Bushfire Plan – don't have one... make your own 5 Minute Plan today by visiting the CFS website and take all precautions necessary. Follow this link for more details:

Remember to also think of others in the community and alert them to potential hazards and check on them in the event a bushfire occurs.

Important points to remember on "High Risk Fire Days"

- If you have to leave your home during the day you will need to decide whether to take your animals to a safer place.
- Keep in mind that, if there is a fire, you may not be able to return to your home for some time.
- If you are home, keep your pets inside (where possible).
- Check you have the necessary pet items in your emergency kit if you plan to leave early.
- Have somewhere pre-arranged to accept your animals (if large number are being moved).
- When leaving your home keep all dogs on a lead and confine other animals in cages or suitable carrying devices.
- Cover cages with a woollen blanket to minimise distress and secure all pets in a car or vehicle that provides adequate protection for transportation.

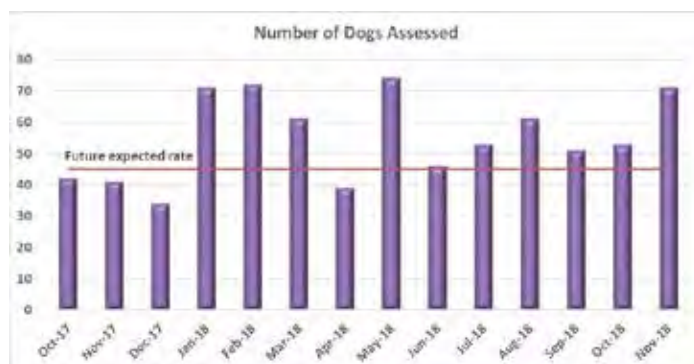

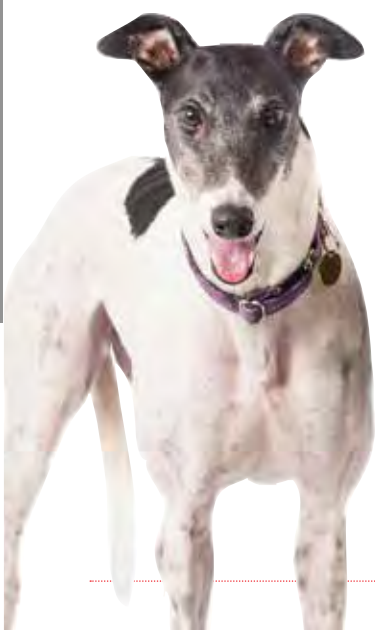
Latest updates from GAP

Hounds for Heroes

Greyhound Racing SA recently launched a significant fundraising initiative in partnership with the Little Heroes Foundation to raise much needed funds for essential equipment and services for children battling serious illness.

The 12 month 'Hounds for Heroes' partnership will see members of the LHF community become foster carers to help former racing greyhounds make the transition to life as a domestic pet whilst raising money for the Foundation.

As part of the exciting collaboration, GRSA will donate \$500 to Little Heroes Foundation for every green collar achieved by a foster carer associated with this partnership. That amount will be doubled if the application to foster care is received prior to December 31, 2018. GRSA will also donate \$10,000 to LHF if its foster carers can achieve 50 green collars before December 31, 2019, and an additional \$25,000 if the LHF foster care network can achieve 100 green collars in the same period.

The program will encourage members of the Little Heroes community through their website, Facebook, and database to become foster-carers for recently retired greyhounds. In approximately 6 weeks, the foster carer will help the greyhound make the transition to a more domesticated setting and life as a pet. The goal is to achieve their green collar accreditation, meaning they are ready to be adopted out to their new forever home.

Jezz enjoys a change of scenery at Mt Gambier

After recently taking on some pretty fair fields at Angle Park, Lewiston trainer Don Turner reckoned it was time for a change of scenery for Dynamo Jezz, a greyhound that he had won eight races with at Angle Park, Gawler and Strathalbyn.

Down for a recent time-graded meeting, Turner returned on Sunday with the dog that he had purchased from Victoria earlier this year after wins at Shepparton, Warragul and Bendigo.

“To be honest, even though he was still racing well in Adelaide, Dynamo Jezz was on a tough mark so I was hoping that by bringing him down here he might encounter a drop in class although you never know what you might run into when nominating for Mount Gambier,” Turner said.

But if he was looking for a confidence-booster for his dog then that’s what he got. Away well from box eight in the Trackside Meats Stake (512 metres), Dynamo Jezz quickly crossed the grade five field, eventually running out an 8¾ length winner in a near best of the day 29.91 seconds.

By the iron dog Stagger – 137 starts for 64 wins – Dynamo Jezz is out of Tinted Power, a winner of 11 races including Sandown Park and The Meadows.

Sunday’s win was Turner’s first at Tara Raceway since February 3, 2017 when Wayne’s Error was successful although four years prior to that he had won the Mount Gambier Cup with Colville, trained for him locally by Allen Williams.

And the following year he reached the cup final with Stew’s Mistake and Poetic Mover, the former running third to Veetee Express.

Lucy Stardust [1] ran on well into second place for Liz Harley of Lewiston, with Revel a whisker away in third spot for Scott Feltus also of Lewiston.

Just Love is trained by Troy Murray at Lewiston for Billy Stockdale from Victoria. The white and black dog had got off to a great racing start in Victoria, winning his first two race starts at Sale. After another win and running many placings in Victoria, Billy decided there might be greater opportunities in SA. With Troy having trained previously for his cousin, it seemed to be a good place to try. The dog arrived in SA in July and has since chalked up 5 wins here, including the last two in succession, which has taken his career tally to eight wins and nine placings from 27 starts.

Billy reported that he and his family have been involved for a long time in the thoroughbred racing industry, as trainers and jockeys, but he has decided to transition to greyhounds, along with some other family members. Just Love was Billy's first venture into greyhound racing and he named the dog after a horse that his father had trained. Billy has become involved with greyhounds as he finds it a lot less physically demanding than handling thoroughbreds, and as a mark of his commitment has recently taken out a trainer's licence himself. It is still early days, but Billy is really enjoying the switch to greyhounds.

ANGLE PARK QUALIFYING TRIALS ON WEDNESDAY NIGHTS

Under the new schedule Angle Park Qualifying Trials will be run weekly on Wednesday night, for the corresponding Monday APM meeting (12 days later due to nominations). With 388m racing now available on Monday nights trainers can qualify for all distances.

Wednesday Angle Park Qualifying dates are:

December 19th (for APM Monday meeting on 31st December)

December 26th (NO Trials – Boxing Day)

January 2nd (for APM Monday meeting on 14th January)

January 9th (for APM Monday meeting on 21st January)

January 16th (for APM Monday meeting on 28th January)

Nominations close with GRSA at 12.30pm on the Wednesday of the meeting.

SINGLE TRIALS

A reminder to trainers that single trials can be booked with two greyhounds however you need to advise when booking of your intention to do this. If you wish to put three or more into this trial then a field trial will have to be booked.

BOOKING NUMBER FOR TRIALS

Participants wishing to book trials are required to ring 8243 7172, this phone line will only be used for trial bookings and will queue participants. By having this one number with participants queuing makes this process to be a more efficient way of booking trials.

There will be NO trials accepted through the normal administration number. To be fair to everyone GRSA will only accept bookings using the new number or alternatively logon to trialbooker.com, create an account and book your own trials.

POLICY FOR TRIALLING AT ANGLE PARK AND GAWLER BEFORE THE RACE MEETING

RACE MEETING TRIAL POLICY

Angle Park Monday along with Gawler Tuesday and Friday.

Two fields from the boxes with a maximum of four (4) greyhounds will be conducted immediately following the

completion of the kennelling procedure for the Race Meeting.

The following lists the order in which greyhounds will be selected in the event if more than 8 greyhounds nominated.

1. Reserves at the Meeting that do not obtain starts.
2. Trainers that have greyhounds engaged and are located in an area affected by track closures.
3. Trainers that have greyhounds engaged.
4. Satisfactory trials.
5. Other greyhounds.

PROCEDURE/CRITERIA

1. For Monday nights trainer to contact GRSA between 10.00am and 11.00am on the Monday to nominate. Should the Monday be a public holiday bookings are to be made between 8am and 9am on the scratching line.
2. For Gawler Tuesday & Friday trainer to contact GRSA between 4.00pm and 4.30pm on the day before.
3. Other than reserve greyhounds Trainers will be restricted to trialling one (1) greyhound unless nominations determine otherwise.
4. Stewards allot the Box for the Greyhound.
5. Trials will be 515m & 531m in distance as first preference. Other distances considered depending on nominations.
6. Greyhounds currently under suspension or not cleared to race are not eligible to be nominated (these trials are conducted as if they are at a race meeting so all greyhounds need to be eligible at nomination time).
7. Greyhound registration certificate or cards must be produced at kennelling time.
8. Trainers with other greyhounds engaged can utilize the extra kennel space until such time they are ready to leave OR trainers with no other greyhounds will be free to leave following their trial.

If there are 12 races at Angle Park or Gawler there will be NO trials.

The Vet Clinic at these meetings cannot be used to accommodate any greyhounds to allow for extra trialling greyhounds. This policy has been introduced so that participants book in under the policy. The Vet Clinic needs to be available for the Vet and Stewards at race meetings

EXCEPTIONS TO THIS POLICY–

- Thursday nights are kept available for the option for Interstate greyhounds to solo trial in a lead up to our Group races and also local greyhound's trialling for Group racing interstate.
- Local greyhounds will be allowed to solo trial in a lead up to a feature race upon request and they will take one of the eight kennels available for trialling ahead of the policy and sit separately to the 4 dog trials. Feature races are considered to be – Adelaide Cup, Gawler Cup, Oaks, Derby, Howard Ashton, Brian Johnstone, SA Sprint, SA Distance Championship, SA Anniversary Cup, SA Country Cup, National Finals & any Group race Interstate.

- Local greyhounds will be allowed to trial on a race night, where they are in preparation for a feature event and nominated for a meeting and the race does not stand up. This will include all distances and also take precedence over the policy.
- If a greyhound qualifies for a feature final and requires a trial in between this will be conducted as a solo trial and sit separately to the 2 four dog trials.

It is extremely important that trainers book in to trial at these race meetings. If unable to book in at these times then please contact GRSA where permission may be given to accept a booking outside of these times.

MOUNT GAMBIER

The Mt Gambier GRC committee advises that satisfactory trials can be run in the summer months under the criteria below.

1. On race days when there are less than 12 races.
2. On race days with 12 races when the temperature is 30 degrees or less trial can be run before the first race but greyhounds must leave the track straight after the trial to head back to their home kennel.
3. On a Saturday trial session when stewards are available.

These trials will have to be booked in with GRSA in consultation with the Mt Gambier GRC.
