CEO'S UPDATE

Where Are We Now

The commencement of racing at Murray Bridges signals what might be described as the culmination of our major capital works strategy and, it goes without saying, our most expensive span of years in that regard. The foundation has now been established in each of our key regions for participation within the context of safe, comfortable and compliant conditions. For clarity, however, this moment doesn't signal the end of our investment in more targeted infrastructure projects – future works are contemplated at Angle Park (track) and around ongoing kennelhouse (and related infrastructure) for a start.

Looking forward from this point, there are a number of urgent priorities around improved viability for trainers and breeders, and maximising returns to the industry. More specifically, discussions have commenced in relation to the direction that stakeholder growth needs to take in the coming weeks as budgets are finalised, and there is a separate/broader need for us to continue to work with the new Liberal Government to impress the need and value of funding support for future growth. The racing industry is a vital contributor to South Australia in terms of economic impact, employment outcomes and the importance that it has in terms of social fabric and inclusion. Within that broader scope, greyhound racing itself accounts for almost a quarter of all wagering activity on SA product and it is only right that any future funding support reflects that fact. We continue to have highly positive dialogue with Government, and constructive dealings with the Racing Minister Corey Wingard, and there is at least an evident appetite within this Government to explore the opportunities that could be realised from greater investment in our sport.

On a related note – but turning to things that are more closely in our control – we are excited about Tabcorp's plans for the future and are confident that our wagering public will begin to see some really positive changes in the months and years ahead. It's vitally important that we support that business and that we see them as a genuine 'partner' of industry. Those changes will span across the retail network, the on-course environment and their digital platforms.

In closing, the issue of field sizes is something that we are also looking at closely. This is a complex problem and one that needs to be worked through carefully. However we end up responding to this over time, it's important that we take all reasonable steps to preserve the progress that has been made in recent years and the need for balanced racing opportunities in our key regions.

The end of the Murray Bridge project just signals the beginning of a new period of challenges and opportunities for our sport in South Australia.

Shima Breeze takes home monthly awards



Greyhound of the Month award for January went to the Tony Rasmussen trained Shima Breeze who only needed one start for the month to take out the award but what a win it was in the 2019 SA Sprint Championship Final.

Shima Breeze was all set to compete in the heats of the SA Sprint Championship however due to mechanical failure with the lure system at Angle Park this race was abandoned. As per the rules of racing she was balloted into the final from her heat. After drawing perfectly in box 1 she started a raging hot favourite for the time honoured event and after showing brilliant speed to lead she ran away from her rivals in a blistering 29.30.

At the end of the month Shima Breeze's record stood at 29 starts with 14 wins and 11 placings and earnings around \$77,000.

The Run of the Month for January was Shima Breeze for trainer Tony Rasmussen for her brilliant win in the SA Sprint Championship final at Angle Park on Thursday 17th January.

She led her rivals a merry dance stopping the clock in a brilliant 29.30 for the 515m journey after she led throughout and won by over 7.25 lengths with splits of 4.30 and 16.55.

St Leger Heats tonight

Three outstanding heats have been drawn tonight for the 2019 SA St Leger series at Angle Park.

Whilst there are only 6 runners in each heat all greyhounds have strong chances in qualifying for next weeks \$10,710 final on Thursday, 21st February.

The first heat is race 4 due to start at 7.40pm SA time and features the exciting Red Rock from the Kirin Corby kennel. He is only lightly raced with 4 starts but he has won his last 3 in impressive fashion, particularly last run when he sizzled home in a 12.46 for his last section. He takes on the likes of high class sprinter Alicante Bouchet for trainer Ben Rawlings and the impressive Shima Mart from the Tony Rasmussen kennel who ran a sizzling 29.83 last start when leading throughout.

Race 5 is heat 2 and features speedster Victa Ashley for trainer Mike Giniotis who has drawn perfectly in box 1, up against Free For All performer, Shimando for Tony Rasmussen and exciting prospect Premier Double for trainer Troy Murray.

Race 6 caps off all three heats and is probably the most open heat with the likes of Group 3 Brian Johnstone winner Jack Get Back for Ken Trowbridge up against strong performer Love Made Me for Troy Murray and the lightly raced Eedee Keepsake for Kirin Corby.

The first two from each heat and the two fastest thirds will qualify for next week's final with the box draw to be conducted oncourse after the running of race 7 tonight.

2019 Gawler Produce – Second payment due tomorrow (Friday, 15th February)

After nominations were finalised for the 2019 Gawler Produce Stakes GRSA has guaranteed final stakemoney of \$22,000 with an estimate for the total series prizemoney around \$40,000. The series is for greyhounds whelped in 2017.

The racing dates for this series will be heats on Friday, 21st June 2019, semi-finals on Friday, 28th June 2019 and the final on Sunday, 7th July 2019.

GRSA administers the event for the Gawler Club, so all payments are to be made to GRSA. If you have already made the one off payment then there is nothing more to do, however, if you only made the first payment, the second lot of payments are due tomorrow (15th February, 2019) with paperwork already sent out. The third and final payment is due on Friday, 5th April 2019.

Grade 6 conditions to change due to Monday night 388m - from 10th February 2019

For meetings graded from 10th February, 2019 (first meeting affected will be Monday, 18th February) all greyhounds will use their City B grade and not APD Wednesday grade.

There will be no retrospective grading for meetings graded from 10th February, 2019. So what grade your greyhound is at that time is what it will be going forward. Prizemoney will be short course City B money and winning greyhounds will take a penalty to be consistent with other meetings.

With 388m now considered on a Monday night (City B) the grading guidelines will also be changed (see below) to have consistency with our tracks. The main change is City A Thursday stands alone with winning only one Grade 6 event and also if you win a Grade 5 event you lose all Grade 6's everywhere which has been in for some time. City B Monday night will now be considered for meetings graded from 10th February, 2019 like Gawler where you could win two Grade 6's as part of your 4 (Non SA Bred) or 12 (SA Bred). This means, on a Monday greyhounds can win a 388m and then a 515m or a 600m and 515m. Please contact the Grader for further clarification if required.

GRADE 6

All Grade 6 greyhounds remain eligible to complete their future engagements.

For greyhounds that have not won a Grade 5 or above at the track at the time of nomination. However a greyhound will be ineligible for Grade 6 events if it has won an APK Grade 5 or above event over 515m. (SNP races in SA are exempt).

Non-SA Bred Greyhounds:

For City A (APK only) track, Non SA Bred greyhounds are eligible to win one (1) Grade 6 (2 with a 'Beat the Grader' win) at that track. Non-SA Bred Greyhounds are eligible to win two (2) Grade 6 (3 with a 'Beat the Grader' win) at all other tracks in South Australia over different distances. There will be no retrospective grading for meetings graded from 10th February 2019. Once a greyhound wins its fourth Grade 6 (5 with a 'Beat the Grader' win/s), at any tracks where it is still eligible for Grade 6 grade, it will revert to a Grade 5.

SA Bred Greyhound

For City A (APK only) track, SA Bred greyhounds are eligible to win one (1) Grade 6 (2 with a 'Beat the Grader' win) at that track. At City B & Provincial Tracks (APM, APD, Gawler, Murray Bridge & Mount Gambier) SA Bred greyhounds can win one (1) Grade 6 (2 with a 'Beat the Grader' win) over 2 different distances at that track. There will be no retrospective grading for meetings graded from 10th February 2019. At Country Tracks, SA Bred greyhounds can win one (1) Grade 6 (2 with a 'Beat the Grader' win) over each distance at that track. Once a greyhound wins at total of 12 races at any tracks where it is still eligible for Grade 6 grade, it will revert to a Grade 5.

Important change to nomination process and race meeting composition

(To take effect from February 11)

GRSA has a fundamental responsibility to manage weekly nominations and the scheduling of meetings in a manner which is responsive to the environment in which we operate and that best serves the interests of our local participants.

In noting the frequency with which nominations for race meetings are being extended – particularly during the summer months – and having regard for current supply pressures, the Racing Department will be adopting a new approach to race meeting composition from Monday, February 11.

For all meetings, other than for extraordinary circumstances, each timeslot will be afforded ONE extension of nominations period only. The table below summarises the current standard closing times for meeting nominations and the final closing time that will

apply from February 11. In the event that the standard nominations closing time changes (due to Public Holiday, for example) the Racing Department will notify of that change via text and Industry Facebook.

Additionally, the priority for the Racing Department in constructing a race meeting will be to prioritise the number of races conducted over average field size. To the extent that some smaller field sizes need to be drawn – noting that a standard minimum of six runners will apply – to meet that objective, that is the approach that will be adopted. Exceptions to the minimum field size may apply in some instances such as for Thursday night staying events, match races, mixed higher grade events, time grading or to accommodate specific feature race requirements.

Oakvale Magic owned locally by Nathan Wilson and is also SA Bred being bred by his wife Kerri. While star local chasers which have been sent to Vic for these feature races Fabwik and Sennachie who owned and bred by Kirin Corby have also made the list.

Good luck to all connections for Saturday week.

The final of the Australian Cup will take place on March 2, with the winner taking home \$250,000.

2019 Murray Bridge Cup series in early March

The Murray Bridge Cup series will be run in early March, with the 2019 Daish Irrigation & Fodder Murray Bridge Cup Final to be run on Sunday, 17th March over the 455m. The Cup is a listed event and will carry \$22,000 in total prizemoney with \$15,000 to the winner.

On Friday, 8th March (Day meeting) the Club will conduct the Daish Irrigation & Fodder Murray Bridge Cup Heats worth \$2,500 with a strong line up of contenders expected.

On Final night the Club will not only feature the \$22,000 Daish Irrigation & Fodder Murray Bridge Cup Final it will also feature a \$3,500 Consolation of the Cup which trainers will need to renominate for, a \$4,000 Special Event over the 530m, a \$3,500 Special Event over the 395m. There will also be Grade 6 Heats over the 455m for a Final on Sunday, 24th March.

2019 Mount Gambier Cup series in March

The Mount Gambier Cup carnival will be run over two weeks this year, highlighted by the 2019 Fairthorne Forestry Mount Gambier Cup Final on Sunday, March 31. The Cup is a listed event and will carry \$22,000 in total prizemoney with \$15,000 to the winner.

On Sunday, 24th March the Club will conduct the Fairthorne Forestry Mount Gambier Cup Heats with 8 terrific Heats anticipated. The Club will also be running Heats of The Produce Store Feature Maiden over 512m and Heats of the Formula 400 Open over 400m.

On Sunday, 31st March the Club will not only feature the \$22,000 Fairthorne Forestry Mount Gambier Cup Final it will also feature a \$3,500 Consolation of the Cup which trainers will need to renominate for, the \$2,500 The Produce Store Maiden Final, the \$2,500 Formula 400 Final, a \$2,500 The Tankman 600 Open Feature over 600m along with a \$1,500 Back to Distance Racing stayers event over the 732m.

It looks to be a superb two weeks of racing in the South East of the State.

Murray Bridge Cup and Mount Gambier Cups big bonuses

It will be a big month of racing in March particularly for the Murray Bridge Club and Mount Gambier Clubs when they will conduct their Cup meetings.

GRSA has introduced a couple of bonuses to link both events which will include a \$5,000 bonus if the same dog can win both the Murray Bridge Cup and Mount Gambier Cup and a \$5,000 trainer bonus if the same trainer can win both Cups [SA or Interstate or different dogs].

Launching Pad SA series begins on 11th March

Again this year the Sandown GRC offered sweepstakes tickets into the rich Launching Pad Series.

There are special conditions on the race being for greyhounds that have won between 1 and 6 races and have not had more than 30 starts at close of their nominations.

The Heats will be run at Sandown over the 515m on Thursday, 4th April with the Semi-Finals on Thursday, 11th April and the \$150,000 to the winner Final run on Thursday, 18th April. Greyhound Racing SA was able to secure a ticket and will give one greyhound the opportunity to compete in this lucrative series. We will run a Heat and Final series to determine who will make the Launching Pad Heats on 4th April.

Our Heats will be run on Monday, 11th March over the 515m at Angle Park for greyhounds that have won 1-4 races and no more than 28 starts. The Heats will be worth \$1,540 and will be Non Penalty events. The Final will be run at Angle Park on Thursday, 21st March over the 515m with prizemoney of \$4,820 and will also be Non Penalty.

The winner of the Final will take their spot in the Launching Pad Heats two weeks later, however, if the winner for whatever reason cannot take their spot then the next qualified greyhound will be given that spot.

GRSA has restricted the series to 1-4 wins and 28 starts incase a greyhound wins both the heat and final so this will still keep them eligible. We have also made our final two weeks before the Launching Pad Heats at Sandown to give the trainer an opportunity to get across the border and trial for the big race.

Gawler Classic 2018 re-programmed to March 1 and 10

In December the Gawler Classic 2018 series was postponed due to a lack of nominations.

GRSA has reprogrammed the series to be run in March with heats on Friday, 1st March and the final on Sunday, 10th March. This series is for greyhounds whelped between 1st July, 2016 and 31st December, 2016 and eligible for Classic 2018. Prizemoney will be determined based on nominations received.

Port Augusta moved from 23rd March to 16th March

GRSA has approved a swap of meetings after the Port Augusta GRC requested they race on Saturday, 16th March instead of Saturday, 23rd March for their Non TAB Twilight meeting.

GRSA has approved an application from the Port Augusta GRC to cancel the Port Augusta meeting programmed for Saturday, 2nd March due to the clubs staffing availability.

Port Augusta trainers travelling guarantee

For future meetings there will be a Trainers Travelling Guarantee to Trainers who support our meetings. The guarantee will be \$100 per Trainer.

This payment is to offset travelling costs for those trainers whose greyhounds do not earn any prizemoney. It will be paid to those trainers whose greyhounds do not earn any prizemoney collectively.

For example: Trainer "A" nominates 4 greyhounds and none of them run a place he will be paid the travelling guarantee. Trainer "B" nominates 3 greyhounds and one of those runs a place he will not be eligible for the payment.

All Trainers regardless of the number of runners will be eligible for the Guarantee. It will be paid directly to the Trainer before leaving the track on the day of the meeting.

Local match race series "The SA Easter" in April

The SA Local Match Race series coined "The SA Easter" will be held on Thursday night, 18th April (Easter) at Angle Park.

Eligibility for South Australia local greyhounds will be based around the Nationals conditions. They will need to be trained in SA 76 days out of the last 150 prior to the close of nominations.

Selection for this series will only be based around winning times at Angle Park. For greyhounds that have run over the 515m at Angle Park on any meeting since 1st December, 2018 their fastest winning time will be recognised and put them on the list for selection.

The head to head matches will be decided based on the final listing and nominations. Match 1 will be 1 v 4, Match 2 will be 2 v 3, Match 3 will be 5 v 8 and Match 4 will be 6 v 7. There will be no manual selection from the Grader. The top 4 seeded greyhounds will be rewarded with more prizemoney.

The overall winner of the local Match Race series will be guaranteed a spot in the State of Origin Match race series [SA V Vic] in September so long as it is nominated and eligible to represent SA.

Winners of match races –

Match 1 – 1 v 4 \$4,500, Match 2 – 2 v 3 \$4,000, Match 3 – 5 v 8 \$3,500, Match 4 – 6 v 7 \$3,000

There will be no unplaced money. Overall SA Easter winner [based on overall times] - \$5,000, second \$2,500, third \$1,000.

This will assist both participants and staff alike. The number of nominations required for a meeting to proceed for Port Augusta is 40 and for GOTBA Coursing it is 30.

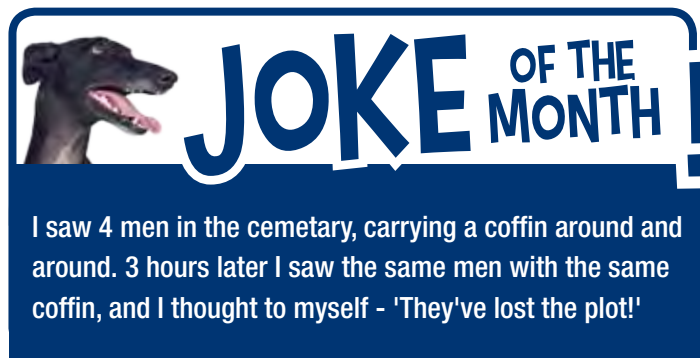

NOTES OF INDUSTRY CONSULTATIVE GROUP (ICG) MEETING

HELD IN THE BOARDROOM OF GREYHOUND RACING SA LIMITED, 55 CARDIGAN STREET, ANGLE PARK ON FRIDAY 30 NOVEMBER 2018 AT 10.00AM

The meeting commenced at 10.03am.

1 APOLOGIES

Shaun Mathieson, Michael Fabbro and Paul Preiss were noted as apologies.

2 NOTES FROM PREVIOUS MEETING

3 BUSINESS ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MEETING

3.1 Syndication

The CEO provided an update on meeting held between himself, Shaun Mathieson, Sean Donnelly and Gavin Harris. He noted that ASIC currently requires syndication to be treated as managed investment schemes and that the compliance requirements would be sufficiently onerous, under most circumstances, to render syndication unfeasible.

Notwithstanding, he advised that Sandown is currently working through the problem with a chosen syndicator [Spolly's Syndications] with the aim of identifying an approach which minimises the impact of those ASIC requirements. Rather than seeking exemption from that framework, the proposed approach would streamline the reporting process through one or a few service providers.

Panel members asked what the timeline for developing a syndication model should be. It was agreed that Management would continue to work with members of the ICG to develop a model prior to the March meeting of the ICG. General discussion ensued regarding the elements that might apply to a South Australian syndication model. The group agreed that clear criteria would need to be established for future syndicate trainers. There was also support for the fact that syndicates would need to have as much 'scale' as possible so as to dilute the cost of compliance and for the idea of having multiple dogs comprising the one syndicate [in preference to dogs being syndicated individually].

Panel members suggested that it might be beneficial to have some industry members experienced in buying greyhounds become involved in syndication as a purchasing advisor and that syndicates should comprise both pups and ready-to-race dogs. It was also suggested that an up-front payment model to cover the life of the greyhound would represent the ideal approach [including provision for re-homing expense].

Action: For the RM and SEO to continue to develop the model for syndication in conjunction with members of the ICG and stakeholders from Sandown/GRV in readiness for a final version to be presented to the next meeting of the ICG in March.

3.2 Sky Racing Schedule

The CEO noted that there had been a lack of response to the request for comment, on which basis he was assuming the trial schedule to have industry support. Panel members indicated that they would like to see a night trial session at Gawler, particularly in the summer months, and potentially following on from a race meeting. The CEO asked the group whether this would reflect a common view.

Panel members suggested that Wednesday night trial numbers had diminished and that the demand may not be there for a Gawler night session. Management suggested that numbers at individual trial sessions should reduce due to the overall increase in the total number of sessions. It was also suggested that trialing after race meetings is being considered noting, however, that additional kenneling capacity would be required.

After some further brief discussion, the CEO committed to having Management revisit the trial schedule in late February so that proposed changes [if required] could be taken to the ICG meeting in March.

Action: For the RM and SPM to review the trial schedule prior to the end of February with a view to progressing any suggested changes to the March ICG meeting.

The Chairman left the meeting at 10.48am.

3.3 Puppy Racing at 14 Months of Age

Management advised that this had been raised at the recent national integrity committee meeting and advised that – in contrast to this proposition – there was general support for a proposed national Rule which would increase the minimum racing age to 18 months.

The CEO queried whether the proposed Rule genuinely contemplated the difference between full field racing and straight track coursing. He expressed the view that a significant difference exists and indicated that he couldn't see how the risk of coursing at 14 months was any different to some standard trialing practices at the same age [other than that it may be safer]. He asked the group whether it might be inclined to support the 14 months proposal – in relation to coursing only – despite the feedback at the national level.

After some discussion, it was agreed that Management would propose a local Rule to the Board to retain a minimum age for coursing of 16 months in the event that a national Rule is ultimately introduced which establishes a minimum general racing age of 18 months.

Action: For Management to propose a local Rule to the Board which establishes a minimum age for coursing greyhounds of 16 months in the event that a national Rule is introduced which sets a minimum racing age of 18 months

3.4 Stayer's Cup

The CEO requested the thoughts of the group in relation to holding the Stayers' Cup in May. Panel members noted the Victorian carnival for stayers in May, on which basis they felt that timing could result in an unnecessary clash. The CEO then asked what alternative timing would be more optimal. The feedback from the panel reflected a view that Management should be looking to program a greater number of opportunities for stayers across the year, both in terms of features and standard graded events. It was agreed that a draft proposal would come back to this group at its next meeting.

The panel suggested that a couple of additional strategies warranted consideration, including allowing up to three dogs to trial [with appearance fees] during Thursday night race meetings as preparation for competing interstate, and for the minimum field size required for a staying race to be reduced to four runners. The CEO advised that these two suggestions would be given priority consideration.

Action: For the Racing Manager to propose an annual schedule of staying events to the March ICG meeting

Action: For Management to explore the proposals to reduce the minimum number required for a Thursday night staying event to

four runners and to provide paid trialing opportunities for stayers wherein three or less have nominated for a Thursday night.

3.5 Wet Weather Jackets

A sample jacket was provided to the group to view and feel. The group supported the design and it was noted that jackets would also be made available for sale to individual trainers in addition to the general stocks that will be available at any given race meeting.

3.6 ICG Panel Members

It was noted that two applications had been received to fill the position vacated by the departure of Melissa Trowbridge – they had come from Christine Costa and Ben Rawlings. The group noted that a final decision on any appointment would rest with the Members of Company [ie the Clubs].

4 AGENDA ITEMS

4.1 Murray Bridge

An update on the Murray Bridge project was provided by Scott Wuchatsch who noted that trialing had just commenced at the venue earlier that week. He advised that the focus in the first three months would be on the management of environmental factors – heat, water and wind – in addition to a progressive program of venue refinements which would be undertaken in response to patron and participant feedback.

Scott then spoke about the plan in relation to straight-track racing. He noted that more work needs to be done in relation to the lure and the manner in which it will be pulled-up after each race. Panel members noted that Box 8 (350m start) is slightly obscured by the inside boxes of the 300m start.

Scott Wuchatsch noted that the lights on the inside track have been installed and are scheduled to be commissioned by mid-December. He also advised that Council had approved directional signage and were expected to sign-off on promotional signage prior to the first race meeting. Panel members questioned whether any prizemoney would be allocated to the picnic meeting on December 12. The CEO indicated that there would need to be an incentive for people to participate, however there are no plans to offer normal stakemoney levels. Both the Chairman and the CEO expressed their view that Scott Wuchatsch and his team were to be congratulated for their outstanding efforts.

4.2 Definition of SA Owned

Panel members noted that not all dogs coming back to South Australia were SA owned. He discussed the discrepancies relating to the grading of imported chasers and the concessions afforded to SA owners bringing in dogs from interstate. The CEO suggested the removal of SA owned races, but the group expressed a desire to retain that programming. It was agreed that an approach should be developed with the support of the GRP, based on Victorian upgrading Rules, and which would be run past the Integrity Manager and panel members prior to being published.

Action: For the Racing Manager to retain SA Owned programming, but to develop an approach in consultation with the GRP which reflects Victorian upgrading Rules – a final draft to be reviewed by panel members

4.3 Stakemoney Strategy

The CEO requested the group's thoughts on stakemoney increases, noting the desire of the Board to push forward with increases over the coming two years. It was pointed out to the group that the commencement of racing at Murray Bridge establishes a third weekly Category 2 meeting. It was also flagged that a 'freeze' remains on short-course racing to ensure that trainers are motivated to pursue racing at distances beyond 450m. Panel members

expressed support for that approach and put the view that the sport has a pressing need to encourage the longer forms of racing.

It was suggested that Thursday night stakemoney levels are currently a weakness of the SA framework. The CEO agreed and noted an internal objective of remaining at or above 50% of interstate metropolitan stakemoney levels. On a related note, the group supported the idea of closing the gap between grade 6 and grade 5 racing on a Thursday night. Scott Wuchatsch identified that Management has been working to an internal objective of ensuring that Thursday stakemoney equates to at least 50% of the Victorian metropolitan offering.

The CEO queried whether the stakemoney strategy should seek to align in some way with the industry auction format. Panel members spoke briefly to the Ipswich auction model wherein they have a cap on commissions, multiple auction races with strong stakemoney levels (\$15,000-\$30,000), and approximately \$70,000 in stakemoney on offer for the main industry race. Panel members were critical of capping commission and suggested prizemoney was a more attractive incentive.

The CEO suggested that the stakemoney attached to the main auction race may need to sit around the \$75,000 mark. Panel members suggested that additional stakemoney could be allocated to races across the weekly schedule in the form of ongoing bonuses for dogs which had been bought at auction. Panel members advised that the AGRC had bought a domain for an auction website and suggested that any dog sold through the site might attract bonuses.

Panel members suggested that there was some risk in continuing to put money into unplaced payments. They expressed the view that Pathway racing requires more diligent stewarding to ensure that people aren't abusing the system by entering dogs that have no hope of being competitive. A greater allocation of stakemoney to time-based pathways and lower grade races was not seen as a priority.

Action: For the RM and SPM to incorporate the feedback from this discussion into its submission of a future stakemoney strategy to the February Board Meeting.

Grahame Marshall left meeting at 11.56am.

4.4 Registry of Mentors

The group liked the idea of a registry of mentors and agreed that applications would require some scrutiny from the Integrity department, subject to which GRSA could act as a conduit between mentors and potential participants.

Action: For a registry of mentors to be established and maintained which allows GRSA to act as a conduit between those trainers and would-be participants, subject to [discreet] internal scrutiny of mentor credentials

4.5 Claiming Races – Alternative Strategy

Panel members indicated their support for the proposal. It was agreed that a listing of greyhounds for sale in the racebook at a given race meeting should be trialed subject to the ability to obtain vet checks and incorporating a [brief] cooling off period.

Action: For Kennel Capers to promote the alternative strategy to claiming races for a period of three months with provision for vet checking and cooling off.

The Chairman returned to the meeting at 12.08pm.

4.6 Science of Track Preparation

Panel members noted a requirement for consistency [to the greatest extent possible] across Australia in relation to track preparation standards and techniques, and provided a copy of the AFGBOTA submission to GA on this topic.

5. OTHER BUSINESS

Panel members questioned the group around track preparation and conveyed their understanding that a Committee of trainers had been contemplated at one point to provide feedback in this area. The CEO identified that, whilst such a Committee had been discussed, a number of issues had been identified with selecting such a group and implementing its feedback in a practical manner.

Panel members also queried why a serious metatarsal injury was not eligible for rebate under the TIRS. After some general discussion, the group supported a suggestion by the CEO for him to make a submission to the Board which would allow trainers to apply for the TIRS for circumstances wherein the injury sits outside the designated framework of the program, where surgical intervention is required, and the cost of surgery exceeds a minimum threshold which reflects the seriousness of the injury. It was suggested that, for such applications, a fixed contribution or reimbursement only might apply.

The CEO requested feedback on the Million Dollar Chase (MDC) and whether GRSA should accept the clash with the Adelaide Cup. Panel members suggested running the Adelaide Cup in conjunction with the Derby to avoid the clash. Panel members questioned the financial impact of the clash, in response to which the CEO noted that the Adelaide Cup had actually performed relatively better by clashing with the penultimate week of the MDC series. Panel members noted that they were content with the clash and indicated that they would not support running the Adelaide Cup in conjunction with the Derby (adding that the Derby winner should have the chance of taking out both titles).

Other panel members indicated that the clash did not bother them. Panel members suggested that the MDC concept may not last on which basis SA would run the risk of re-scheduling to avoid the clash only to lose its current prime spot in the calendar. Panel members felt that any decision to move the Cup in response to the MDC shouldn't be taken lightly. The Chairman observed that the current scheduling of the Adelaide Cup also leverages the opportunity for greater attendance based on it coinciding with the last Friday of school holidays.

On a separate note, the CEO spoke to the mandatory delay that currently applies between the timing of a licence being granted for an Owner-Attendant and that person then being able to upgrade to an Owner-Trainer licence (currently 6 months). He noted that the same period in other states is typically 12 months. The CEO asked the group for their views on this policy. Panel members suggested that exemptions should be made where warranted and that GRSA should not unduly prevent otherwise competent people from participating. Panel members suggested that recognition should be available in some instances for the applicant's previous experience. It was generally agreed that the approach should allow for some flexibility in a minority of cases.

Peter Damarell left the meeting at 12.30pm.

Panel members raised concern with the number of GAP dogs in kennels that could still be racing. They questioned the practical merit of the retirement rule and queried whether dogs could be assessed and then still continue to race. The CEO suggested that allowing this would slow down the process due to additional testing but did, however, note current plans to launch a campaign aimed at recruiting more foster carers to help manage the waiting list. He suggested that a higher level of foster care recruitment still remains the optimal solution to the issue of managing this aspect of the sport.

Panel members raised an issue on behalf of Graham Smith regarding the national Rule which prevents pannus from being treated. Management advised that they had looked in to this issue and spoken to industry vet Steve Karamatic regarding the national position. It was noted that GRSA wouldn't have an appetite for listing the treatment as an exempted substance, however the

panel also were advised that Management had become aware of a 'swabable' alternative in subsequent discussions with Chris Doyle and Greg Moore. Management indicated that the alternative is more expensive. The CEO suggested that GRSA would be open to subsidising the difference in cost, however it could not be supportive of affected dogs being allowed to breed (noting that the condition is congenital).

Panel members questioned whether there are any plans to reinstate the 300m boxes at Gawler. Scott Wuchatsch advised that there is room and [potentially] available starting boxes. He committed to looking at that issue within the coming 3-4 months. Panel members also suggested that 300m boxes at Port Augusta might positively impact nomination numbers. The CEO suggested that the Board would have some difficulty rationalising investment in a new start at Port Augusta under current circumstances.

Panel members questioned if there was scope to change to the dress code policy to allow the wearing of shorts in summer months. The CEO committed to looking options of allowing black dress shorts at the next meeting.

Lisa Rasmussen left the meeting at 12.52pm.

Panel members requested a GRSA organisational chart to be distributed to member Clubs.

Panel members questioned whether the racing schedule was considered within the context of the timing of premise inspections, noting that they present an unwelcome challenge on racedays. Management explained that this practice was common across all states and that this timing should always be available to the integrity team. Management noted that participants don't have the option to refuse entry to integrity staff however it was accepted that staff should be particularly mindful and respectful of the needs of participants in such instances.

Action: For the CEO to submit a proposal to the Board relating to a potential subsidy in relation to serious injuries which fall outside the scope of the TIRS, require surgical intervention and incur significant cost (in accordance with an agreed standard)

Action: For Management to remain conscious of the potential need for amendment of the retirement rule for greyhounds in the event that the waiting list cannot ultimately be reduced to an 'acceptable' level

Action: For Management to advise industry of its position in relation to the subsidisation of the alternative [swabable] treatment for pannus and the merits of prohibiting breeding with affected dogs

Action: For the SPM to explore the option of 300m boxes being re-commissioned at Gawler

Action: For Management to consider the introduction of black dress shorts for trainers on raceday during the summer months

Action: For Sheriden Milam to distribute a copy of the current organisational chart to the Member Clubs (noting that same would not be intended for broader distribution)

The meeting closed at 1.11pm.

Spare kennels at race meetings

Stewards will always consider acceding to requests from participants to allow them to kennel an extra greyhound on course during the course of a race meeting.

Trainers should refer to the fields to ensure there are not 12 races scheduled for the relevant race meeting before contacting the Stewards department to arrange this.

Unfortunately, we are unable to assist if there are 12 races and trainers are not permitted for greyhounds to be left in trailers during the course of the race meeting.

Angle Park slipping track use

The Rules around the use of the Angle Park slipping track are being reviewed and an updated policy will be released shortly.

Users should note that GRSA will shortly be cancelling a number of inactive access keys. If you inadvertently happen to be inconvenienced by an access key that no longer works, please approach GRSA reception to arrange a replacement.

Revised satisfactory trial policy

Stewards have been revising the GRSA Satisfactory Trial policy to better accommodate trainers looking to get greyhounds back to racing.

Keep an eye on Kennel Capers in the next few editions for information.

Checking off of greyhounds

Following the recent changes to GRSA's racing and trialling schedule, Stewards are trialling a new system for checking off greyhounds.

Trainers should note that greyhounds may now be checked off during kennelling for their first race start. There is no requirement to have greyhounds checked off at trials prior to nominating to race.

Trainers are advised to satisfy themselves that ear brands and markings match prior to presentation to race. In the event of a mismatch of information a greyhound may be scratched from its engagement – however, provided Stewards are satisfied the correct greyhound has been presented it will be permitted to start.

Stewards will review the procedure in 6 months.

106 reminders

It is a requirement under the Rules, that Retirement and Euthanasia forms must have been signed by the last registered owner.

Participants should note that GRSA is no longer accepting incomplete forms and the onus is on the connections of the

greyhound to ensure the form is completed.

Trainers are also reminded they are required to submit a Veterinary Certificate of Euthanasia to GRSA if the greyhound was euthanased due to illness or injury.

Lastly, please be advised that removing a greyhound from your kennels is NOT Notification of a Retirement or Euthanasia of a greyhound. A kennel return still must be lodged to remove the greyhound from your kennel.

Removal of greyhound from kennel house after racing

GRSA policy states that greyhounds must be returned to their allotted kennel after racing and remain there for a minimum period of one race prior to being collected.

At race meetings when the temperature is forecast to reach or exceed 32 degrees GRSA Hot Weather Policy takes effect. Under this policy greyhounds must remain in the kennel house for at least 30 minutes after their event, including the final event.

Please note that the temperature at the time you wish to collect your greyhound is irrelevant. There is no provision in the current version of the Hot Weather Policy for Stewards to permit release of greyhounds inside this time period.

Hot Weather Policy guidelines will be reviewed prior to next summer in conjunction with the ICG.

Inquiries and notifications

Mr. Brian Clarke – Show cause hearing 22/01/19 – GAR 100 – Breached the Rules prescribed whilst serving a period of disqualification by purchasing, care for and training the greyhound DESTINI PESO. Mr. Clarke's disqualification of six [6] months was backdated to recommence from 21/12/18.

Mr. Tracie Price – Stewards inquiry 31/01/19 and 12/02/19 – GAR 83[2] – Failed to present CILLA BROWN free of any prohibited substance [COBALT] for an event at Mount Gambier on 19 August 2018. Mr. Price pleaded not guilty and was disqualified for a period of six [6] months to begin midnight 21/02/19. CILLA BROWN was disqualified from the event.

Incident at Mount Gambier trials - Stewards inquiry 06/02/19 – Alleged incident at trials on 06/11/18. Stewards took evidence from a number of witnesses. Whilst Stewards acknowledged a verbal confrontation took place between Nicole Stanley, Ralph Patzel and Scott Blacksell, Stewards did not believe there was sufficient evidence to lay charges on this occasion. All parties were put on notice in relation to their behaviour in future.

ANIMAL WELFARE ALERT – PINDONE RABBIT TREATMENT PROGRAM

GRSA is notifying participants of recent rabbit control program in the RURAL CITY OF MURRAY BRIDGE - SHOWGROUND/GREYHOUND RACING areas using PINDONE OATS.

It is strongly advised that all animal (dogs in particular) are not be permitted to wander off lead and to keep all animals away from any rabbit carcasses to prevent them from ingesting PINDONE poison.

Once the control program has finished best efforts are made to remove all affected carcasses however GRSA advises that all animals should be kept on leads and under visual supervision at all times.

Should your greyhound ingest PINDONE GRSA recommends contacting the closest veterinary practice immediately and provide the above information.

For any additional information regarding this control substance and program please contact Glenn Dean – Community Biosecurity Officer C/O Rural City of Murray Bridge.

The Golden Rules

Since the introduction of cobalt and arsenic thresholds, all participants should be reminded – in their own best interests – that there are a number of Golden Rules that can help them to avoid making any such breaches (for prohibited substances generally) and which should be adhered to as principles of best practice:

- Always consult your vet to seek guidance in relation to any of the products that you are using, any associated risks and other relevant context
- Review the range of any feeds or supplements that you typically purchase and, wherever it is reasonable to do so, replace products containing substances that could contribute to a threshold breach under the rules (eg. cobalt) with alternative products
- Observe the instructions on any products that you use and adhere strictly to those directions (having regard for prescribed amounts, frequency of administration/ application, methodology for administering/applying)
- Ensure a greyhound is never administered any treatment on race day other than as relates to its feeding and drinking requirements [GAR83(A)](1) treats this as a specific offence]
- Refrain from the use of injectable treatments (eg. Vitamin B12) to any extent that is practical, including ensuring a greyhound is not administered any injectables the day before an event

Our registered participants have the responsibility to ensure that greyhounds are presented to the track free of any prohibited substances. This information is offered as advice in good faith and should not be relied on as a defence in the event of a breach occurring.

Vaccinate your greyhounds! - PARVO

A new strain of the highly contagious canine parvovirus has been discovered in Australia. In 2017, researchers at the University of Adelaide have now confirmed cases in South Australia and Victoria, and suspect that more exist in Queensland and the Northern Territory.

Over the last two years vets around Australia noticed dogs presenting classic parvo symptoms, but returning negative results in tests.

WHAT IS CANINE PARVOVIRUS (CPV)?

Canine Parvovirus, commonly known as Parvo is a viral illness that causes vomiting, bloody diarrhoea and weight loss in dogs. It is especially dangerous in puppies aged between six weeks and six months where it can be fatal. Early vaccination has been effective at reducing death rates.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS OF PARVO?

If any of these symptoms below are identified in your dog, it is highly recommended that the dog be isolated as soon as possible and receive immediate veterinary care

- Extreme vomiting and diarrhoea
- Loss of appetite
- Weight loss
- Lethargy and/or depression
- Fever

HOW IS PARVO TRANSMITTED?

Parvo in dogs can be transmitted by anything or anyone that comes in contact with infected feces or vomit. Feces is often carried on a dog's hair or paws and can easily be transferred to humans via clothing or shoes. If a dog sniffs or licks any contaminated surface or item like clothing, carpet, food/water bowls, bedding or kennels, they will likely become infected.

Parvo virus survives by being extremely resilient to its host and also in the environment. It can hang around the environment for many months and only requires a relatively small number of viral particles to infect a dog.

PREVENTION - VACCINATE!!

The most important thing that all dog owners can do is to vaccinate your puppies. It can take seven to ten days before the vaccine becomes effective!!!

KILL THE VIRUS IN THE ENVIRONMENT

If you do have an outbreak of parvo, it is very important to isolate the dog ASAP, seek immediate Veterinary care and properly disinfect contaminated areas

- Cleaning food bowls • Water bowls • Beds • Blankets
- Anything and everything that has come into contact with an infected animal

Bleach is said to be the most effective disinfectant to kill parvo when used correctly. Always read safety labels, ensure the bleach has a contact time of at least 10- 15 minutes to effectively kill the virus.

NOTICE TO ALL PARTICIPANTS

All participants are reminded that:

- Liquor licensing laws prevent people from bringing alcohol onto club sites [including car parks] for race meetings [or at any other time]; and
- Only food purchased from the patron facility* can be brought into and/or consumed in the patron facility.

*The patron facility at the MBGRC is being operated by the Murray Bridge Club. Participants who are members of the MBGRC will be entitled to discounts on food and beverages from the patron facility and also at the Murray Bridge Club's venue on the river bank in town.

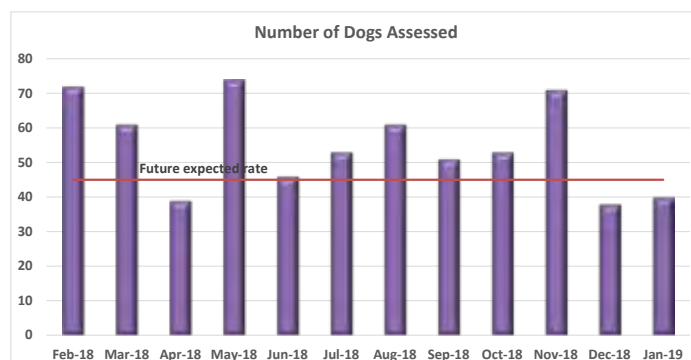

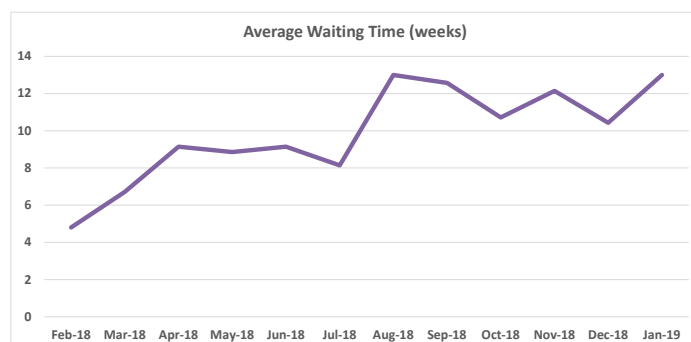
Latest updates from GAP

No bright lights, but still a satisfying win

■ MOUNT GAMBIER

Pinnaroo trainer Nathan Wilson and his father Bill snuck unobtrusively into Mount Gambier for Tara Raceway's fortnightly time-graded meeting, bringing with them only one greyhound – the beautifully bred Lose Your Blues.

According to Wilson, the daughter of High Earner and his former top race bitch and now proven producer, Oakvale Destiny [stake earnings of \$279,000] was down to try and derive some confidence from a 600 metre time-graded event.

"She had won two races at Angle Park over 515 metres but her last win had been back in July last year and it seemed as though she was lacking confidence," he said.

"I've always thought that she had a bit of ability so I was hoping that she might benefit from being able to get into a time-graded middle-distance race behind the finish-on-lure and, hopefully, in a small field."

Having her first look at Tara Raceway, Lose Your Blues, who jumped at \$1.28, settled in second spot behind It's Magic, taking over the front running in the back straight, eventually winning by five

lengths over the early leader in 35.68 seconds.

Now it's fair to say that the race meeting was a far cry from the bright lights of a few nights' earlier at NSW's premier track Wentworth Park where the National Derby [520 m] and National Futurity [520 m] were decided.

Wilson was at the track on the Saturday night specifically for the Group 1 Futurity final which included Lose Your Blues' litter sister Oakvale Magic who he races in partnership with his wife Kerri.

Trained by Jeff Britton at Anakie, Oakvale Magic ultimately ran third in the final, taking the 24 kilogram bitch's record to nine wins, two seconds and seven thirds from 29 starts for \$41,000 in stakemoney.

Wilson is also currently pre-training four unnamed youngsters by Kinloch Brae out of Oakvale Destiny's second litter. A third, by boom sire Fernando Bale, was whelped in September 2018.

Later on Saturday night, the Group 1 Derby turned out to be a triumph for Wilson's sister Melissa and her husband Ken Trowbridge when the Jeff Britton trained Axel Footluc gave the Park Holme pair their biggest success in greyhound racing.

The significance of the Derby win, from a

breeding point of view, wouldn't have been lost on Wilson, Axel Footluc, now a winner of \$113,000 in stakemoney, being by Kinloch Brae out of Footluc Diva, herself a winner of 17 races and \$61,000 and a litter sister to Oakvale Destiny.

And while there were no bright lights shining at Tara Raceway it's a fair bet that Nathan Wilson, as he made the 320 kilometre trip back to Pinnaroo, would have been well satisfied with Lose Your Blues' confidence-boosting effort.

Ken and Mel have been in the greyhound scene for about 10 years and have achieved considerable success during that time. It all started when Ken and Nathan Wilson, who is Mel's brother, decided to get into the sport, with Footluce their first runner. Footluce only had six runs for one win, but it was when Mel and Nathan decided that they saw enough in her to breed a litter, that their success took off. After a lot of research and taking a chance, they decided on a stud dog, with the resulting litter being everything they had wished. It produced some exceptional greyhounds, one of which, Footluce Diva, is the mother of Jazzy Footluce. From that same mating, Ken and Mel also race Axel Footluce, which just two weeks ago won the prestigious Group 1 National Derby in Sydney.



While Jazzy Footluce has not reached those dizzy heights yet, the greyhound has recorded two consecutive wins at Gawler, taking her total to five wins and five placings from 17 starts, which is a handy performance. Mel just loves the dogs and enjoys the challenge of selecting and preparing them. She said that having the greyhounds was the only way she could ever get to have six dogs around the house, so it all fits together well.

A fantastic field was assembled for the 24th running of the John Gray Grade 5 feature final at Angle Park on Saturday 26th January which was run in beautiful conditions.

After the hot weather during that week the metropolitan meeting was moved to Saturday and we saw strong performances throughout the day in front of a small but enthusiastic crowd.

As the start was affected for our feature race Don't Quote Me for trainer Ben Rawlings made full use of box 2 to push through and lead on the first turn with Long Gully Gus quickly moving to second from box 5 for Paula Hearnden and with some tightening on the first turn Letra Theory railed hard from his inside box to move to third for trainer Tony Rasmussen.

As they raced down the back straight Don't Quote Me was in full flight but Long Gully Gus was trying hard to bridge the gap, while Lektra Theory started to make good



ground. As heads turned for home Don't Quote Me was quickly collared by Long Gully Gus who ran to the front with Lektra Theory giving chase. As they hit the finish line Long Gully Gus held on for a brave victory by a neck from Lektra Theory who flew late into second with Don't Quote Me a further length away in third.

Long Gully Gus ran a solid 30.03 for the 515m journey and has now won three races in a row including the heat and surprisingly went around at \$17.00 in the final. Long Gully Gus has now won a total

of 15 races from his 35 starts including 11 minor placings and prizemoney just over \$33,000.

ANGLE PARK QUALIFYING TRIALS ON WEDNESDAY NIGHTS

Under the new schedule Angle Park Qualifying Trials will be run weekly on Wednesday night, for the corresponding Monday APM meeting (12 days later due to nominations). With 388m racing now available on Monday nights trainers can qualify for all distances.

Wednesday Angle Park Qualifying dates are:

February 20th (for APM Monday meeting on 6th March)

February 27th (for APM Monday meeting on 13th March)

Nominations close with GRSA at 12.30pm on the Wednesday of the meeting.

SINGLE TRIALS

A reminder to trainers that single trials can be booked with two greyhounds however you need to advise when booking of your intention to do this. If you wish to put three or more into this trial then a field trial will have to be booked.

BOOKING NUMBER FOR TRIALS

Participants wishing to book trials are required to ring 8243 7172, this phone line will only be used for trial bookings and will queue participants. By having this one number with participants queuing makes this process to be a more efficient way of booking trials.

There will be NO trials accepted through the normal administration number. To be fair to everyone GRSA will only accept bookings using the new number or alternatively logon to trialbooker.com, create an account and book your own trials.

POLICY FOR TRIALLING AT ANGLE PARK AND GAWLER BEFORE THE RACE MEETING

RACE MEETING TRIAL POLICY

Angle Park Monday along with Gawler Tuesday and Friday.

Two fields from the boxes with a maximum of four (4) greyhounds will be conducted immediately following the completion of the kennelling procedure for the Race Meeting.

The following lists the order in which greyhounds will be selected in the event if more than 8 greyhounds nominated.

1. Reserves at the Meeting that do not obtain starts.
2. Trainers that have greyhounds engaged and are located in an area affected by track closures.
3. Trainers that have greyhounds engaged.

4. Satisfactory trials.
5. Other greyhounds.

PROCEDURE/CRITERIA

1. For Monday nights trainer to contact GRSA between 10.00am and 11.00am on the Monday to nominate. Should the Monday be a public holiday bookings are to be made between 8am and 9am on the scratching line.
2. For Gawler Tuesday & Friday trainer to contact GRSA between 4.00pm and 4.30pm on the day before.
3. Other than reserve greyhounds Trainers will be restricted to trialling one (1) greyhound unless nominations determine otherwise.
4. Stewards allot the Box for the Greyhound.
5. Trials will be 515m & 531m in distance as first preference. Other distances considered depending on nominations.
6. Greyhounds currently under suspension or not cleared to race are not eligible to be nominated (these trials are conducted as if they are at a race meeting so all greyhounds need to be eligible at nomination time).
7. Greyhound registration certificate or cards must be produced at kennelling time.
8. Trainers with other greyhounds engaged can utilize the extra kennel space until such time they are ready to leave OR trainers with no other greyhounds will be free to leave following their trial.

If there are 12 races at Angle Park or Gawler there will be NO trials.

The Vet Clinic at these meetings cannot be used to accommodate any greyhounds to allow for extra trialling greyhounds. This policy has been introduced so that participants book in under the policy. The Vet Clinic needs to be available for the Vet and Stewards at race meetings

EXCEPTIONS TO THIS POLICY-

- Thursday nights are kept available for the option for Interstate greyhounds to solo trial in a lead up to our Group races and also local greyhound's trialling for Group racing interstate.
- Local greyhounds will be allowed to solo trial in a lead up to a feature race upon request and they will take one of the eight kennels available for trialling ahead of the policy and sit separately to the 4 dog trials. Feature races are considered to be – Adelaide Cup, Gawler Cup, Oaks, Derby, Howard Ashton, Brian Johnstone, SA Sprint, SA Distance Championship, SA Anniversary Cup, SA Country Cup, National Finals & any Group race Interstate.
- Local greyhounds will be allowed to trial on a race night, where they are in preparation for a feature event and nominated for a meeting and the race does not stand up. This will include all distances and also take precedence over the policy.
- If a greyhound qualifies for a feature final and requires a trial in between this will be conducted as a solo trial and sit separately to the 2 four dog trials.

It is extremely important that trainers book in to trial at these race meetings. If unable to book in at these times then please contact GRSA where permission may be given to accept a booking outside of these times.

MOUNT GAMBIER

The Mt Gambier GRC committee advises that satisfactory trials can be run in the summer months under the criteria below.

1. On race days when there are less than 12 races.
2. On race days with 12 races when the temperature is 30 degrees or less trial can be run before the first race but greyhounds must leave the track straight after the trial to head back to their home kennel.
3. On a Saturday trial session when stewards are available.

These trials will have to be booked in with GRSA in consultation with the Mt Gambier GRC.
