MESSAGE FROM MATT

As we flick over the calendar to a new racing season, and reflect back on the most difficult period of time the industry will know, it is evident to me that one of the casualties from those recent disruptions relates to the line of communication between GRSA and industry. There are some fairly logical reasons why communication suffers during such a period, not least of which being the genuine difficulty of trying to provide (honest) reassurance to our people when the issues that we are dealing with are inherently uncertain and involve elements that are beyond our direct control.

I suspect that the amount of information that GRSA was able to provide as recent events unfolded was not so much our greatest challenge as was our ability, at times, to identify what it all actually meant for everyday participants and what the future of racing might look like, both here and interstate. Additionally, the priorities during such a period change and the allocation of our resources necessarily becomes more skewed towards the defence of the industry and matters external to the core business of racing. That is not a bad or a good thing, it just reflects the fact that different times call for different approaches. Our processes and framework have been strengthened during that period, as has our relationship with key stakeholders in the Government and media who could see the evidence that self-regulation of the local greyhound industry is working effectively.

Going forward, we are gradually returning to 'business as usual' noting – as we will continue to do – our industry's fundamental requirement to act with compliance and to support the rehoming objectives that GRSA has committed to publicly. Our first priorities now lie with finalising the negotiations relating to Murray Bridge (aiming to get a shovel in the ground in the first half of this year), with ensuring that our racing opportunities align with the needs of the industry for all standards of greyhounds, and with talking to breeders (in particular) about the support that GRSA may be able to provide around breeding and rearing challenges in SA. We are planning to conduct a series of roadshows in the coming months and would encourage participants to attend those in healthy numbers.

On a final note regarding communication, I would encourage all users of the industry closed Facebook site to understand the value that can be extracted from having such a platform and encourage that posts remain respectful and constructive at all times. My expectation of GRSA staff, equally, is that they will be honest, timely and professional in their attendance to the matters that are raised. My own door will remain open to all participants and I would encourage you to seek out my time if you don't feel that you can resolve a particular matter through the normal channels.

I hope that, having overcome some difficult challenges, we don't quickly forget the value of cohesion and solidarity.

In front of a big Christmas crowd at Angle Park on December 22nd Mrs Bubbles, for trainer Matthew Payne, added another feature race win to her stellar career by winning the Christmas Sprint.

A small but exclusive field greeted the starter for the feature with Mrs Bubbles gaining the jump on her rivals from box 8 and racing to the front. From there the daughter of El Grand Senor and Kiowa Angel raced away from her rivals winning by 51/2 lengths in a slick 29.76. She defeated Dyna Keitaro who continued his good form and High Eden Snow who impressed with his first start in open grade. Mrs Bubbles is bred locally by Ben Murphy and continues the success of the SA Bred greyhounds in feature races. She is owned by John Cunningham and Alex Peden and has been a super greyhound for connections now having won 36 races from her 83 starts with 26 placings and prizemoney of almost \$110,000.

Basic Steel Supplies SA Sprint Championship heats

The \$4,590 heats of the **Basic Steel Supplies SA** Sprint Championship are conducted tonight with some of the best local sprinters in the state gathered together.

In the first heat Group 1 National Sprint Champion Worm Burner will be looking to bounce back into the winners list and has drawn perfectly in box 8. He will be challenged by the super competitive Mrs Bubbles along with Allinga Val, Caustic Bale and Crisis Bale. In the second heat it looks

a match race between Aston Kody off the red and Marlow Brown from the pink however the likes of experienced campaigners Texas Titan and Coorong Kid cannot be left out along with the improving Run The Jewels and Dyna Keitaro who is now in the care of the flying Lisa Rasmussen team.

The first four from each heat will progress through to next week's final run on Thursday 19th January worth \$22,000.

The Box Draw will be conducted oncourse tonight after the running of Race 8.

John Gray heats Thursday, 19th January

The time honoured John Grav series will kick off next Thursday night with \$3,190 heats run on Thursday 19th January and the \$8,565 final on Thursday 26th January. The series is for Grade 5 greyhounds over the 515m journey.

Nominations close on Monday 16th January 2016 at 9.00am with GRSA.

Butcher 'on fire' in the month of December

Greyhound of the Month for December was the Cameron Butcher trained On Fire who showed his potential with a dominant performance in the Group 3 Brian Johnstone Final.

The son of Bekim Bale and Alana Blues started the month off with a bang when he proved far too strong for a quality line up in the Brian Johnstone Final. He ran a sizzling 29.52 in winning by almost 10 lengths in a dominant display. He then backed up in a Juvenile event at headquarters when he was far from disgraced in running second behind High Eden Snow when his own personal time was a flying 29.57. On Fire then took on the Victorians in their backyard when he competed in the Group 1 Silver Chief



heats at the end of the month. He had no luck at The Meadows running a handy 4th but showed he is a greyhound on the way up.

At the end of the month On Fire had won 9 races from his 16 lifetime starts, with 4 placings and prizemoney over \$35,000.

On Fire produces sizzling win

The Run of the Month for December was On Fire for trainer Cameron Butcher after his sizzling win in the Group 3 Brian Johnstone Final at Angle Park on Thursday 1st December.

On Fire began nicely from box 3 to pounce on the early lead. From there he was never headed going on to record a brilliant win in 29.52 and winning by almost 10 lengths.

Mount Gambier Cup Carnival starts on Friday 24th February

The Mount Gambier Cup carnival will be run over two weeks and three meetings this year, highlighted by the \$10,000 ClassicBet Mount Gambier Cup Final on Sunday March 5.

On Friday 24th February the club will run heats of The Produce Store Feature Maiden over 512m, heats of the Grade 5 over 600m and heats of the Formula 400 Open over 400m. On Sunday 26th February the Club will conduct the ClassicBet Mount Gambier Cup Heats. The Club will be running up to 12 races on each day of the carnival.

The final day of the carnival will not only feature the \$10,000 Mount Gambier Cup Final it will also feature The Produce Store Maiden Final, the Grade 5 600m Final as well as the Formula 400 Open Final over the 400m.



The Launching Pad at Sandown

Again this year the Sandown GRC offered sweepstakes tickets into the Launching Pad Series. There are 80 entry forms available with the series worth \$410,000 in prizemoney.

There are special conditions on the race being greyhounds that have won between 1 and 6 races and have not had more than 30 starts at close of nominations. The heats will be run at Sandown over the 515m on Thursday 30th March, the semi finals on Thursday 6th April with the \$210,000 final run on Thursday 13th April.

Greyhound Racing SA was able to secure a ticket and will give one greyhound the opportunity to compete in this lucrative series. We will run a heat and final series to determine who will make the Launching Pad heats on 30th March.

Our heats will be run on Wednesday 8th March over the 515m at Angle Park for greyhounds that have won 1-4 races and no more than 28 starts. The heats will be worth \$1,130 and will be Non Penalty events. The final will be run at Angle Park on Thursday 16th March over the 515m with prizemoney of \$4,540 and will also be Non Penalty.

The winner of the final will take their spot in the Launching Pad heats two weeks later however if the winner for whatever reason cannot take their spot then the next qualified greyhound will be given that spot.

It's a terrific concept by the Sandown GRC and gives an opportunity for those less experienced greyhounds a chance to race for big prizemoney.

GRSA has restricted the series to 1-4 wins and 28 starts incase a greyhound wins both the heat and final so this will still keep them eligible. We have also made our final two weeks before the Launching Pad heats at Sandown giving the trainer an opportunity to get across the border and trial for the big race.

2017 Gawler Produce – second payments due on 27th January

With 94 greyhounds paid up for at the first payment stage back in November the 2017 Gawler Produce series is looking like an exciting series.

The second sustaining payment is due by Friday 27th January with notifications sent out last week with the final payment due on Friday 7th April 2017 if you haven't already paid up for the whole series.

Mark Aiston to fill in when Ray Fewings on leave in January

Our long time MC at Angle Park Ray Fewings will be taking some leave this month and we are fortunate to have radio and TV personality Mark Aiston available to fill in while Ray is away.

Mark has supported and followed greyhound racing for many years and it is terrific to have him on board. Mark will be hosting the 12th, 19th and 26th January along with the 2nd February while Ray is away.

Please note grading updates

The Grading Review Panel met on Friday 11th November to discuss grading in South Australia from an Agenda provided by submissions and industry consultation during the past few months.

Following is the main points introduced from 1st December 2016:

- The panel advised to be consistent that Grade 6
 greyhounds should remain in the drawn fields so long
 as they were eligible at time of nomination. This
 would be a change for the 4 win Non SA Bred Grade
 6 greyhounds and APK/APM Grade 5 wins who
 would have normally been withdrawn free of penalty.
 The panel were supportive of these greyhounds
 remaining eligible.
- Pathway winners should be included on the Order of Preference. Regardless of the winners time the performance will be considered as a Country win (like Pt Augusta) and thus will sit on the Order of Preference at 13 if a last start Pathway winner.
- The table below is in regard to a Time Standard for Masters Events at different tracks over different distances. The panel agreed to the table and advised that the same conditions for Thursday night be implemented for other meetings when a greyhound equals or breaks the Time Standard being ineligible for a Masters Event at that distance and track. Whilst they do not take a grade they have to have two unplaced runs before being considered for a Masters event.

This refers to the Grade 5 Masters events Only.

 The panel agreed to change the condition of eligibility from 3 months to 6 months for how long prior to a greyhound racing. This comes into line with the 6 month satisfactory trial policy.

Please note that the GRP were supportive of trainers putting as much information in the comments section of their nomination to assist the Grader in the grading process. Please give him as many options as possible however if trainers write nothing the grader will grade accordingly. If trainers nominate for a specific race advertised in the All tracks calendar and it doesn't go ahead it is recommended trainers give the Grader another option on their nomination. If trainers do not want their greyhounds to be mixed then they need to be clear on their nomination advising "leaving the greyhound out" and understand that the races will be graded accordingly and if you were going to be in a mixed event under normal grading guidelines then the greyhound will be left out

Handling greyhounds at the trials while lure in motion

A reminder to participants that when on course for any trial meetings that the lure could be in motion at anytime. Please be mindful of your surroundings and also with your greyhounds ensuring you have full control at all times.



Saturday morning trials procedure

With some recent issues in regard to the Saturday morning trials at Angle Park, trial staff have advised that to make it simpler and clearer for participants and employees, there will be one block per distance where FOL, Catching Pen, Handlsips etc will be booked rather than having this separated. Trainers will get their number as normal for that distance and no one else will have the same number over that distance to stop any confusion.

As per normal after every 10 trials there will be a track grade and they then move to the next distance (likely starting with 515m). GRSA will trial this for a period of time and I ask that participants please be patient with their fellow industry members and GRSA staff.

Booking of Tuesday night trials at Angle Park

Please be advised to encourage participants to use the online booking facility for Tuesday night trials we have opened up bookings for online users an hour earlier than phone bookings.

You will therefore, be able to book online from 11.30am on the Monday prior to Tuesday night trials. Being mindful that when booking online you can only book a maximum of 6 trials and then will have to ring the office from 12.30pm to book the remainder. Our GRSA staff is available to provide support and training for those participants who require it, please contact GRSA to organise.

This came into effect from Tuesday 22nd November trial session.

For participants who wish to continue to book via the telephone please ensure you follow the below directions:

- DO NOT phone prior to 12.30pm as NO calls will be placed on hold and your call will not be answered prior to 12.30pm. By calling prior to 12.30pm you are actually inconveniencing yourself as you may be disconnected or directed to another area as the telephone system will not let you que for a long
- Ensure you know exactly what type and number of trial/s you require.
- No other gueries will be answered to ensure a timely manner of answering the calls that are in que for booking trials.
- Please understand that our staff provides you with the best possible and earliest time available so they will not enter into a debate about the reasons why.
- DO NOT book more trials than required. GRSA will be monitoring this situation and if required action may be taken against offenders.

Hot Weather Policy

A reminder to trainers with the hot weather coming to make sure they are aware of the conditions relating to the Hot Weather Policy. Read the policy on page 18 and it is also available on the GRSA website and at the track.

Super bonus for SA Bred in 2016/2017

The super bonus scheme is premised upon a 100% dividend to breeders for SA Bred greyhounds. The following is a summary of the bonus by race:

RACE SUPER-BONUS

Adelaide Cup (515m) - G1 \$12,500 Adelaide Cup finalist \$1,000 BGC SA Derby (515m) - G3 \$3,500 Coffex Coffee SA Oaks(515m) - G3 \$3,500 Gawler Gold Cup (531m) - G3 \$3,500 GROUP 1 victory (interstate) \$7,500 GROUP 2 victory (interstate) \$3,500 GROUP 3 victory (interstate) \$1,750

The super-bonuses for interstate events will only be applied for series/events that are open entry. Events that are restricted by age or gender are eligible for the bonus. Events that are exclusively open to SA Bred runners or incorporate other restrictions, such as 'sweepstake' events, puppy/auction Classics and Maiden series are not eligible for the super-bonus.

Breeders Support Programme Changes from April 2016

In response to recent inquiries about the changes to the Breeders Support Program taking affect in April 2016 Greyhound Racing SA advises the changes below. These changes are in support of breeder viability and continues increased spending on animal welfare and integrity initiatives.

Breeder Support Program

The following changes to the Breeder Support Programme have been implemented:

- 1. Combined claim limit of \$800 for all veterinary and transport expenses
- 2. Removal of the advanced application process for the breeders rebate now that both sires and breeding females must be registered
- 3. Removal of the cap on litters in anticipation of national (tiered) breeder licensing

SA Bred Maiden Payment

The SA bred maiden payment rewards participants that get a greyhound to the track to win a race. GRSA has committed to dramatically increase this payment from \$175 to \$1,000 (\$500 breeder/\$500 owner) on 1st July, 2017. This will result in all greyhounds that are whelped in 2016 being eligible for this support.

Additional racing for Mount Gambier

The Friday/Sunday race meeting once a month has continued into the new season. The extra meetings will aim to cater for lower class and maiden greyhounds as well as generally supporting the opportunity for trainers to gain a start which may otherwise have been denied to them under current scheduling.

Racing on the Friday and Sunday of these weeks will provide that extra opportunity once a month for those greyhounds unable to gain a start.

These meetings will be graded under

these conditions -

- Those greyhounds who gain a start in one meeting will be considered at the end for the other meeting allowing for greater participation.
- There will be an opportunity for greyhounds to "Beat The Grader" allowing for the chance to win two races for only one grade.
- The Mount Gambier GRC will programme additional Heat and Finals to accommodate this pool of greyhounds.

Voluntary payment for GAP SA on prizemoney forms

Owners can direct prizemoney to GAP on the Prizemoney Reimbursement forms. GRSA has made this change on the forms where Owners can direct a percentage of prizemoney to GAP. These forms are available on the website and from GRSA.

Online trial bookings for Tuesday nights at Angle Park

The Online Trial Booker has been introduced for Angle Park on Tuesday nights. We have included a FAQ sheet in regard to the process of booking trials on page 38. To book trials visit grsa.com.au, hover over 'Industry' in the menu and click on 'Online Trial Booker' and follow the instructions to register.

Registration for Trainers – Trainers will register to book online trials via a link on the GRSA website. This will be available from 11.30pm the day prior to the trials as per normal. GRSA will still accept trial bookings over the phone from 12:30pm however trainers will be encouraged to do this via online.

There are specific time slots for Trainers to book .Tuesday night trials will start at 7.00pm and there will be 25 minute slots (ie 7.00pm to 7.25pm/7.25pm to 7.50pm etc) with 10 trials conducted allowing for a track grade inbetween as per normal.

Trainers can book any type of trial over any distance within the time slot if available. This means that an FOL, Catching Pen, 731m and 274m can all be conducted within the one time slot. This will allow greater flexibility for trainers who work and also means they are not here for an extended period waiting to trial.

- Fields will be selected worst form to best form in the opinion of the Grader. The Order of Preference is not be used for Pathway Racing
- Grade 6 and Grade 5 Pathway races will carry no penalty however where Grade 6 greyhounds compete in Grade 5 events and are successful they will become a Grade 5 at the track and ineligible for Grade 6 events at the track. (Normal rules apply for Maiden events)
- Races will be graded on race wins where possible
- Guarding will occur where possible

Pathway Racing to be run at Angle Park Wednesday meetings and Gawler Sunday meetings along with Mount Gambier.

- The conditions to be altered allowing for a maximum of 2 dogs per trainer per race with the conditions purely about worst to best form.
- The Grader to consider all eligible greyhounds for Pathway unless stated "No Pathway"
- Only one Pathway Race per grade (Maiden, Grade 6, Grade 5) to accommodate those greyhounds that need it the most. However this will be dependent upon nominations and at the discretion of the Grader.
- Pathway Races run every Wednesday due to a 12 race program.
- Pathway to continue on Gawler Sundays and Mt Gambier as programmed
- For a trial period GRSA will run one Angle Park Wednesday meeting per month under "Worst to Best" form. No High Grade (Grade 4 or higher will not be considered), only grades available will be Maiden, Grade 6 and Grade 5 over any distance. Races will be Non Penalty with Pathway Prizemoney. Races will be Timed Graded going from Maidens to Grade 5's. IE: If 12 maidens then the worst 8 timed graded maidens in one race and then the next 4 maidens mixed with the worst timed graded Grade 6's etc. However for Grade 6's the best performed will only be mixed with the best performed Grade 5's as required. There will be No Reserves for this meeting. There will be No Guarding for this meeting as this would compromise the intent of grouping the same greyhounds together. For this meeting a policy will be developed to determine the current Time Grade of a greyhound which will be released to the participants prior to implementation.
- The Grader will change the way he considers Pathway form when grading race meetings. He will consider the Order of Preference for all normal form and then once he gets off the Order of Preference he will consider Pathway race form along with all other form.

Time Based Grading

As part of GRSA's commitment to long term animal welfare solutions, the Racing Department is continuing to investigate options to provide ongoing racing opportunities for greyhounds of all abilities. This commitment has seen the introduction of Pathway Racing to the SA racing schedule over the past year, an initiative that continues to evolve.

The next logical step in the evolution of the grading system is to provide a framework that analysis a greyhound's true ability (speed or time) and places them accordingly. The recent visit by leading Irish trainer Dolores Ruth provided an insight into the benefits of time based grading (which is used in Ireland and the UK) and how it can be used successfully in Australia.

On Wednesday 19th October, GRSA will conduct its first ever meeting graded based on times. The following document explains the conditions of that meeting and the methodology to be used by the Racing Department in grading the meeting.

Conditions of Entry

- To be eligible greyhounds must be Maiden, Grade 6 or Grade 5 for the meeting
- Greyhounds must have had a minimum of 3 race starts
- All races will be Non-Penalty

How will it work?

All greyhounds nominated for the meeting will receive a 'Time Rating' figure which will be based on an average of their actual run time over the past few starts (based on the following table).

STARTS	TIME RATING CALCULATION
6 or more starts	Average of 4 fastest runs of last 6 starts
5 starts	Average of 4 fastest runs of all 5 starts
4 starts	Average of 3 fastest runs of all 4 starts
3 starts	Average of 2 fastest runs of all 3 starts
0-2 starts	NOT ELIGIBLE

The Time Rating allocated to each individual start will be based on the 'SA Time Bands' table included at the bottom of this document. Greyhounds with Port Augusta or Interstate performances in their recent form will be assessed on an individual basis and a Time Rating figure will be allocated accordingly to each of those starts.

The following provides examples of how the Time Rating would be calculated for an individual greyhound:

Once every greyhound has been allocated a Time Rating, the meeting will then be graded according to the following rules:

- Fields will consist of Maiden, Grade 6 and Grade 5 events, there will be no mixing of Grades
- Greyhound will be selected for the meeting from worst Time Rating to the best
- In the event greyhounds have the same Time
 Rating, the greyhound with the least amount of
 starts will be selected to compete at the meeting

- Greyhounds will be grouped together in races based on their Time Rating (of similar ability)
- In the event greyhounds have the same Time Rating, the greyhound with the most prizemoney will be moved into the 'faster' race
- There will be no guarding of trainers or owners for the meeting
- Reserves will be determined by the Grader, taking into account the suitability of remaining greyhounds for the fields drawn. This is likely to result in many fields having no reserves
- Graders discretion will remain at all times

From the Stewards

Conduct of licensed persons

Notice has been provided previously in Kennel Capers regarding Stewards concerns with conduct at race meetings and trials by licensed persons.

All participants and officials are entitled to work in a safe environment. Participants are reminded that race day is a professional environment and bad behaviour and/or language will not be tolerated in front of other participants, owners and the general public.

Participants are also reminded that their conduct is under scrutiny when dealing with any GRSA staff regardless of whether they are officials or administration staff.

Pink Card for breeding females

There have been several instances recently where applications for breeding females have been lodged incorrectly or only when the female is in season.

Rules surrounding pink cards for breeding females have been in place for many months now. No allowances will be permitted for Breeders who have not complied with the Rules.

Please ensure you read the form and ensure all paperwork is lodged in a timely manner. Any queries can be directed to Renee on (08) 8243 7113.

Changes to swabbing

Trainers should note that Stewards intend to increase and change their swabbing routines.

Stewards note that these changes my result in such outcomes as multiple runners from one trainer being swabbed on a single day, short-priced favourites being tested or out-of-competition testing being undertaken on a regular basis.

Greyhound workshops

The schedule of greyhound workshops for all current licensed trainers finishes at the end of February.

Attendance at one of the workshops constitutes a mandatory component of licence renewal. Book now to ensure your spot.

Notifying Stewards of factors affecting performance

It is a requirement under the Greyhound Australasia Rules of Racing to notify Stewards of any factors that may have affected a greyhound's performance. The relevant Rules are noted below:

R75 Matter affecting performance to be reported

(1) The trainer or authorised person of a greyhound shall report to the Stewards as soon as practicable anything that might have affected the running of a greyhound in an Event which was not noted by Stewards during or immediately after the Event.

(2) Should anything that might have a bearing on the past or future running of a greyhound come to the notice of the trainer or authorised person after the greyhound has left the course, it shall be reported to the Stewards as soon as practicable.

Reminder about social media

All licensed persons are reminded about their obligations when using social media including the GRSA Registered Participants Facebook. Lately a number of participants have been contacted by GRSA Officials in relation to borderline or inappropriate comments on Facebook. Stewards will take action against participants who are not following the guidelines as stated at the top of the previous column..

Track Injury Surgery Rebate Scheme

Greyhound Racing South Australia (GRSA) is committed to ensuring that animal welfare remains the central consideration in all of its decision making. As part of that commitment, the Track Injury Surgery Rebate Scheme has been introduced in South Australia to financially assist participants in relation to the veterinary repair of major race track injuries.

From 7th November 2016, GRSA will provide reimbursement for 80% of surgery costs for the repair of major injuries sustained in the running of the approximately 3,800 races conducted annually around the state (up to a maximum of \$1,200 plus GST).

Major injuries eligible for the scheme are defined in the official policy, with the oncourse veterinarian making the final determination on the eligibility for the rebate on a case-by-case basis. The Steward in charge of the meeting will manage this process by ensuring adherance to GRSA's official policy and procedures.

In addition to the financial reimbursement, greyhounds taking part in the scheme will be granted priority entry into the Greyhound Adoption Program (GAP), after a mandatory rehabilitation period with the owner or trainer.



It is hoped that the scheme provides participants with greater certainty when deciding the future of a greyhound injured at the races. Whilst the incidence of greyhounds suffering major injuries on South Australian tracks is rare, GRSA continues to seek strategies to (a) minimise the number of major injuries, and (b) provide an ethically responsible outcome whenever these injuries do occur.

Reminder to participants

Just a reminder to all participants, that the recently implemented scheme for race track injuries currently applies to race day injuries and not trial injuries.

Inquiries and notifications

Mr. Robert Halliday – Notice of positive swab – greyhound REDDA was found to have COBALT over the threshold in a urine sample following an event at Mount Gambier on 14 October 2016. Inquiry to be held 30 January 2017.

Hot Weather Policy

Version number: 2.0 – 2016
Board approval: Dec 2016

Greyhound Racing South Australia (GRSA) is committed to animal welfare. Like all animals, greyhounds can be affected by hot weather. The main form of cooling for canines is through panting. In an attempt to limit the effect of heat on greyhounds, GRSA has implemented this policy to ensure greyhounds are properly cared for during hot weather.

CANCELLATION OF MEETINGS:

GRSA will always attempt to move race meetings to a more suitable timeslot.

TABMEETINGS - Forecast 40°C or above

Day and Twilight meetings will be abandoned if the predicted temperature is forecast to be 40 °C or above at 8:00am on the morning of the scheduled event. Day and Twilight meetings are race meetings scheduled to start before 5:00pm.

Night meetings on days for which the predicted temperature is forecast to be 40°C or above at 8:00am will continue as scheduled but may still be called off, delayed, cancelled or abandoned at the discretion of the Stewards and the on-course Veterinarian.

If a Day or Twilight meeting proceeds in accordance with this policy, but the actual temperature reaches 40° C or above, a decision about the cancellation or abandonment of the meeting will be made at the discretion of the Stewards and the on-course Veterinarian.

NON-TAB MEETINGS - Forecast 40°C or above

Where the predicted temperature is forecast to be 40°C or above at 5:00pm on the Friday preceding the affected event, it will automatically be cancelled at that time. On the basis of an extreme hot weather forecast, a decision may be made prior to that time to cancel at the absolute discretion of Stewards.

COURSING MEETINGS - Forecast 30 °C or above

In noting that Coursing involves multiple runs on the same day, when the predicted temperature is forecast to be 30 °C or above at 5:00pm on the Friday preceding the affected event, it will automatically be cancelled at that time. On the basis of an extreme hot weather forecast, a decision may be made prior to that time to cancel at the absolute discretion of the Stewards.

SCRATCHING WITHOUT PENALTY

Trainers who have greyhounds engaged for racing on projected hot weather days – especially if they do not have air-conditioned transport facilities – may apply to scratch their runners **without penalty**. The following conditions apply:

- The predicted temperature is forecast for the venue's regional centre must be 38°C or above at the time of scratching
- Applications to scratch greyhounds under this policy must be made prior to the official scratching time. If a greyhound is withdrawn after that time the normal 10 day penalty will apply.
- Trainers cannot scratch their greyhounds selectively all runners for that trainer must be withdrawn
- The temperature will be sourced from Weatherzone <u>www.weatherzone.com.au</u> and will link venues to regional centres in accordance with the following:

NOTE: GRSA will maintain and monitor records of greyhounds which are scratched due to hot weather.

Selected greyhounds nominated by the one trainer to be scratched from meeting:

GRSA will maintain a Heat Stress Register which records greyhounds which are particularly vulnerable to heat stress. To be included in the register, a veterinary certificate confirming that the greyhound suffers from heat stress when racing or trialling in hot weather must be provided by the greyhound's trainer. That documentation must be received by GRSA in advance of the close of nominations for a given meeting for it to be eligible for selective scratching from that or any subsequent meetings due to hot weather.

Any greyhound on the register which is nominated for a meeting in relation to which the predicted temperature is forecast to be 38 °C degrees or higher for the corresponding regional centre as at the official scratching time will automatically be scratched from the meeting by GRSA. Under such circumstances, no penalty will be applied to the greyhound as a result of that scratching.

This policy will be applied regardless of whether the meeting in question is a Day, Twilight or Night meeting. It will also be considered a breach of this policy for a greyhound listed on the register to trial when the forecasted temperature is 38°C degrees or higher for the corresponding regional centre on that day other than for morning trial sessions.

COMMUNICATION OF CANCELLATION OF RACE MEETING OR TRIAL SESSION

GRSA will make every endeavour to announce any rescheduling of a race meeting by 8:00am that morning via the industry text service and any other vehicles that it deems appropriate. Radio TAB will be advised of any relevant information.

Trials may be cancelled at any time up until 4 hours prior to the scheduled commencement of the trial session. As with race meetings, the cancellation of a trial session will be notified by industry text and any other appropriate vehicles.

RACING OPERATIONAL GUIDELINES - HOT WEATHER

- 1) In hot weather conditions when the predicted temperature is forecast to be 35°C or above, GRSA will ensure that the kennel house is opened 30 minutes earlier at all venues
- 2) Greyhounds to spend minimum time outside kennels
- 3) Previews are to be conducted in a shaded area
- 4) Greyhounds to parade directly to starting boxes
- 5) Greyhounds to remain in kennel house for at least 30 minutes after their event

- 6) Club to provide adequate drinking facilities for greyhounds
- 7) Club to provide adequate cooling foot-baths
- 8) Club to provide bottled water to participants when temperature is 35 °C or above.
- 9) Ice vests can be used during parading and after the event but must be removed prior to placing greyhounds into their allotted kennel
- 10) GRSA Racing Department (where possible) to program Distance events during the coolest part of the meeting (Day meetings early races, Night Meetings later races)
- 11) In hot weather conditions when the predicted temperature is forecast to be 35°C or above, barking muzzles will not to be permitted to be used at any time at SA race tracks

GRSA reserves the right to alter this policy at any time.

It was a full 12 event race program at Gawler greyhounds on Sunday the 8th January with only one trainer able score a double which resulted in victories spread across a wide number of trainers. Windsor Gardens trainer Michael Taylor was one of those trainers who shared that success.

Michael's runner in the Grade 6 event over the 531m journey was Rhynstone Joey. Out of box 4, Rhynstone Joey was able to the lead as they passed the post the first time around, from Any Hoo (1) and Colonel Parker (8). Rhynstone Joey established a handy four length break over the rest of the field and although that lead was reduced at the finish, Rhynstone Joey never looked in danger of defeat. The final margin was 2½ lengths over Colonel Parker for Michael Stewart and Velocity Lilly (6) for Kim Johnstone.

Michael trains and races Rhynstone Joey in partnership with Liam Thompson, a long time owner with Michael. The black dog came into Michael's care in March last year, as he had a vacancy at the time. Describing him as a nice dog to have around, Michael has been trying to run him over longer distances where the fields spread out a little more. That was the secret to this win, as the field didn't bunch up and he was allowed a clear run. He is impressed with "Joey" and as a result he has purchased two pups from the next litter.

Being based in the suburbs, Michael can only have a small team, so he really appreciates a win. He enjoys the sport

After the successful completion of the track upgrade work at Gawler, trainer Judi Hurley was glad to get racing back there again and score a double there on the 11th of December.

Judi had three runners engaged for the night, with the first being Raven Sky, in a Grade 6 event over the 531m journey. Starting from box 6, Raven Sky was able to lead for the majority of the race to win by just over 2 lengths, from Long Gully Indi (8). In the following event, also over the same distance, Judi's

runner Rattle'em (4) put in a good effort to take second placing behind Barossa Kid (1), which had proved to be too strong in running.

Judi's final runner was Emerley Sprite, which jumped from box 8 and went around the field in the straight as they entered the back turn. Emerley Sprite maintained its strong run and was able to win by 2 lengths over Dante's Spirit (3).

Judi is a firm believer that greyhounds benefit from a change of scenery during their racing, otherwise some can become a bit stale at just one track, so she was very appreciative of having options again.

Jester continues to confound Clayfield

Ask Glenroy trainer Richard Clayfield the secret to Glenville Jester's amazing turnaround in form over the past two months and, really, he's not sure.

But Team Clayfield (Richard and brother Kevin) are certainly not complaining. Bred by Richard Clayfield among the grapevines on the outskirts of the Coonawarra, Glenville Jester is by Vapour Whirl out of Glenville Maggie, a bitch who won the 2011 Anniversary Cup for the team at Tara Raceway.

Clayfield believes it could've been a Pathway race over 512 metres back on November 9th that could have turned the black dog's fortunes around.

"Maybe it was less pressure, I don't know, but on that day he won by eight lengths in a pretty handy 30.21 seconds – way under the Pathway time standard," Clayfield said.

A fortnight later Glenville Jester won the time-honoured Newman McDonnell Memorial and by the end of the year he had also defeated the 2016 Mount

Gambier Greyhound of the Year Old Jock to win the Christmas Cup.

So in the space of seven weeks leading up to the end of the year the born-again greyhound had been around seven times for six wins and a second.

The form has now continued on into the new year with a second to Old Jock before a dashing win over Marcling in last Friday's Rock's Retreat Mixed Stake.

Marcling, was looking good to make it two wins in a row after opening up a big break over Glenville Jester down the back straight in last week's 512 metre event. But the Jester found plenty in the home straight, finishing too strongly for a half-length win in a personal best 29.96 seconds, despite being undecided at one stage whether to take the inside or outside running.

Clayfield's one of those "one week at a time" blokes although he's well aware that the Mount Gambier Cup is fast approaching.

"I'll just keep racing him on a weekly basis and hope that he's still performing well at the end of February for the cup heats."

Successful years for many local trainers

MOUNT GAMBIER

While Tracie Price, of Compton, scored a comfortable win in the 2016 Mount Gambier Leading Trainer award, it was also a good year for several other trainers who finished in the top 10.

In what was another outstanding year, Price led in 78 winners which included seven doubles, 10 trebles and two bags of four winners – Real Moment his star performer with 11 wins prior to being retired in October.

Portland trainer Nicole Stanley, off to a flying start at Tara Raceway in 2017 with six wins after only two meetings, was runner-up to Price after a best-ever year saw her lead in 66 winners with Old Jock contributing 10 of those and picking up the 2016 Greyhound of the Year.

Dean Fennell, of Glencoe, involved at the Lake Terrace East track since its opening back in 1997, also enjoyed his best year with 28 winners, as did Glenroy trainer Richard Clayfield – whose involvement goes back even further.

Clayfield's 31 winners included 13 by Glenville Jester, the track's most successful dog during 2016 from a win point of view.





ANGLE PARK QUALIFYING TRIALS – NOW WEEKLY

Angle Park Qualifying Trials will now be run weekly on Tuesday night, for the corresponding Monday APM meeting and the Wednesday APD meeting. Trainers must be specific on their nominations about which day they are trialling for and what distance. (ie Wed 388m, Mon 515, Mon 600m etc). Tuesday Angle Park Qualifying dates are:

January 17th (for APM meeting on 23rd January – for APD Wednesday on 25th January)

January 24th (for APM meeting on 30th January – for APD Wednesday on 1st February)

January 31st (No Qualys for APM meeting on 6th February – for APD Wednesday on 8th February)

February 7th (for APM meeting on 13th February – for APD Wednesday on 15th February)

February 14th (for APM meeting on 20th February – No Qualys for APD Wednesday on 22nd February)

Nominations close with GRSA at 12.30pm on the Tuesday of the meeting.

NOMINATING ONLINE FOR QUALIFYING TRIALS

For Angle Park, Gawler and Strathalbyn qualifying trials the nominations must be lodged with GRSA by 12.30pm on the day of the meeting. To nominate online however you can only do this up until 11.59pm the day before. Due to a system security policy you cannot nominate on the day for these trials online. Please contact our staff if you have any issues with these nominations prior to them closing.

SINGLE TRIALS

A reminder to trainers that single trials can be booked with two greyhounds however you need to advise when booking of your intention to do this. If you wish to put three or more into this trial then a field trial will have to be booked.

BOOKING NUMBER FOR TRIALS

Participants wishing to book trials are required to ring 8243 7172, this phone line will only be used for trial bookings and will queue participants. By having this one number with participants queuing makes this process to be a more efficient way of booking trials.

There will be NO trials accepted through the normal administration number. To be fair to everyone GRSA will only accept bookings using the new number.

POLICY FOR TRIALS IN PLACE

Remember trials will only be taken from -

- * 12.30pm Monday for Angle Park Tuesday nights
- * 12.30pm Tuesday for Gawler Wednesday nights
- * 12.30pm Thursday for Strathalbyn Friday nights
- * 12.30pm Thursday for Angle Park Saturday morning (day earlier due to being morning trials)
- * For Public Holidays it will be the working day before ie if Monday is a Public Holiday then bookings taken on the Friday

POLICY FOR TRIALLING AT ANGLE PARK AND GAWLER BEFORE THE RACE MEETING

RACE MEETING TRIAL POLICY

Angle Park Monday & Wednesday along with Gawler Tuesday, Friday and Sunday.

Two fields from the boxes with a maximum of four (4) greyhounds will be conducted immediately following the completion of the kennelling procedure for the Race Meeting.

The following lists the order in which greyhounds will be selected in the event if more than 8 greyhounds nominated.

- 1. Reserves at the Meeting that do not obtain starts.
- 2. Trainers that have greyhounds engaged and are located in an area affected by track closures.
- 3. Trainers that have greyhounds engaged.
- 4. Satisfactory trials.
- 5. Other greyhounds.

PROCEDURE/CRITERIA

- 1. For Monday nights trainer to contact GRSA between 10.00am and 11.00am on the Monday to nominate. Should the Monday be a public holiday bookings are to be made between 8am and 9am on the scratching line.
- For Angle Park Wednesday, Gawler Tuesday & Friday trainer to contact GRSA between 4.00pm and 4.30pm on the day before.
- 3. For Gawler Sunday trainer to contact GRSA between 8.00am and 9.00am on the scratching line to nominate.
- Other than reserve greyhounds Trainers will be restricted to trialling one (1) greyhound unless nominations determine otherwise.
- 5. Stewards allot the Box for the Greyhound.
- 6. Trials will be 515m & 531m in distance as first preference. Other distances considered depending on nominations.
- 7. Greyhounds currently under suspension or not cleared to race are not eligible to be nominated (these trials are conducted as if they are at a race meeting so all greyhounds need to be eligible at nomination time).
- 8. Greyhound registration certificate or cards must be produced at kennelling time.

 Trainers with other greyhounds engaged can utilize the extra kennel space until such time they are ready to leave OR trainers with no other greyhounds will be free to leave following their trial.

If there are 12 races at Angle Park or Gawler there will be NO trials.

The Vet Clinic at these meetings cannot be used to accommodate any greyhounds to allow for extra trialling greyhounds. This policy has been introduced so that participants book in under the policy. The Vet Clinic needs to be available for the Vet and Stewards at race meetings

EXCEPTIONS TO THIS POLICY-

- Thursday nights are kept available for the option for Interstate greyhounds to solo trial in a lead up to our Group races and also local greyhound's trialling for Group racing interstate.
- Local greyhounds will be allowed to solo trial in a lead up to a feature race upon request and they will take one of the eight kennels available for trialling ahead of the policy and sit separately to the 4 dog trials. Feature races are considered to be – Adelaide Cup, Gawler Cup, Oaks, Derby, Howard Ashton, Brian Johnstone, SA Sprint, SA Distance Championship, SA Anniversary Cup, SA Country Cup, National Finals & any Group race Interstate.
- Local greyhounds will be allowed to trial on a race night, where they are in preparation for a feature event and nominated for a meeting and the race does not stand up. This will include all distances and also take precedence over the policy.
- If a greyhound qualifies for a feature final and requires a trial in between this will be conducted as a solo trial and sit separately to the 2 four dog trials.

How do I register an account to book public trials online?


Visit <u>www.trialbooker.com</u>, click on the "register an account" link and fill in the appropriate details.

How do I book a specific trial online?

To book 5 trials, click Book 5:



As soon as you have pressed the Book button, those trials are booked and yours to keep. You then customise the distance, number of dogs, and type for each trial, and confirm them.




To review your bookings, return to the Home page:



Field Trials

Existing field trials will appear in each block. To book a dog in an existing field trial simply click the Book 1/2/3 button.



If there are no available field trials of the distance and type you require then feel free to create one yourself. Simply book a slot as-per-normal and select Maiden Field or Performed Field, as shown below.



Note: booking a dog or several dogs in a field trial counts as 1 trial towards your 6 trial maximum.

When do trial bookings commence each week?

Bookings for the Tuesday session commence at 12:30 PM every Monday afternoon (henceforth known as "booking opening time").

Is there a limit to how many trials I can book online?

Yes: 6. If you wish to reserve more than 6 trials a session then you must phone the office as per normal. For example, in the screenshot below, it indicates that you can book 4 more trials using TrialBooker without phoning.



Why am I limited to 6 trials?

In short: to prevent abuse of the system. To book more phone the office after booking opening time.

Can I cancel a trial booking online?

Yes: Press the X button and confirm.



Will I receive a confirmation to confirm my online trial booking?

Your trials are reserved for you as soon as you press the "Book 5" button (or "Book 1" or whichever it may be). You must then confirm the details of those trials (distance, number of dogs etc.). There will be a summary of your bookings in each session on the Home page.

Can I book trials for other licensees?

No—under no circumstances may you book trials for anyone other than yourself using TrialBooker. Dogs must be brought in and paid for by the person whose name they were booked under. If you wish to share a non-field trial with another trainer you must book over the phone.

How can I book a trial if I don't have access to a computer?

You can still book trials by calling the office after booking opening time.
