ZIPPING NEUTRON CLAIMS BAYROAD QUEEN

ZIPPING Neutron has taken out the 2023 Bayroad Queen Stayers final after producing a powerful display in the feature event at Angle Park on Thursday, 29 June.

After wet weather forced its postponement the week prior, there were no issues with the delay for Zipping Neutron who jumped well from box eight before winning by nine lengths in 42.85.

The win was the fourth consecutive win for the Tim Aloisi trained runner who is continuing to emerge as a rising star in the distance ranks across the state.

Speaking in the post-race presentation, Aloisi said it was nice for Zipping Neutron to put together a complete performance after drawing well in box eight.

"Box draws in these big races are the key really," Aloisi said.

"He likes it out wide and he drew out wide and that's the way it panned out. All the dogs are good dogs and we finally had some luck with the box draw."

Zipping Neutron has won four of its five starts since coming over from interstate with his best performance coming in the Bayroad Queen final which was a nice reward for Aloisi and his team.

"One of the owners wanted a staying dog, so we had a look around and liked him so we chased him down and bought him," Aloisi said.

"It is hard work but I have a pretty good support group around me."

"We love it, my family love it and we love racing. We love South Australian racing and that's why we support the club and the industry."



COULD BE KING REIGNS IN GAWLER PRODUCE

in a terrific month of racing at Gawler, the highlight was the final of the Gawler Produce series for 2023.

After heats were run on Friday June 9 and semi-finals on Sunday June 18, the final was run on Sunday June 25 with a healthy crowd on course for the final featuring some of the state's best chasers.

It was the Ben Rawlings trained Could Be King who took out the race with a strong performance to claim one of the feature events on the Gawler racing calendar.

From box seven, he was last away early but a bit of fortune on the first turn allowed him to balance up in third as they went down the back straight.

After finding himself just a few lengths off Coorong Cam down the back, he looked incredibly ominous and took over around the home turn, before running away in 30.81.

Coorong Cam for Tim Richards held on for second, ahead of Victa Monty for Tony Rasmussen who rounded out the placings.

It was only in January that Could Be King took out the Gawler Maiden feature and he's now continuing that terrific early success.

Rawlings also had another two winners which gave him a treble for the night, with a couple of homebred chasers in the form of Help Me Rhonda and Agent Four both winning impressively, which capped off a stellar night for the Rawlings team.

ADDITIONAL TUESDAY NIGHT MEETING AT ANGLE PARK

After consultation and support by Sky Racing, GRSA has programmed an extra race meeting on the weekly schedule for the new season, with Tuesday night at Angle Park now on the calendar. This extra meeting will be shown on Sky 2 and will be for Category 3 prizemoney. It will also be for short course greyhounds (342m) exclusively to not affect 530m+ at Angle Park meetings on Monday (Category 2) and Thursday (Category 1). GRSA may initially have to utilise more dog fields to spread out our numbers across the weekly schedule, however, this will only be determined at the time. These meetings will be graded events and as we haven't run this category with greyhounds taking a grade (Saturday mornings are Non Penalty) it will be like a new venue with most grades being Maiden, Grade 6 and Grade 5 to start with.

Nominations will close on the Friday before, the same time as Gawler Wednesday. This does avoid Angle Park Monday and Murray Bridge Tuesday which close on the Thursday.

Trials at Angle Park will move from Tuesday night to Wednesday night and be run the same time as the Murray Bridge trials.

The implementation date is scheduled for 1st August, 2023.

LOW GRADE RACE FOR THURSDAYS AT ANGLE PARK

In an effort to ensure we are programming 12 races each Thursday night at Angle Park, GRSA has introduced a low grade race for some Thursday nights. These races are for Grade 5 greyhounds over 530m that have a low WPS (Weighted Points Score). Prizemoney will be slightly less than a normal Grade 5, however, these races will be non-penalty. There will be no guarding, no reserves and only one 8 greyhound race. This should provide encouragement for those trainers who have 500m+ greyhounds but feel they cannot compete on a normal Thursday night due to current form. We are hoping to draw from a different pool of greyhounds and GRSA would encourage trainers to nominate.

\$3,505 Special event Grade 5 (worst to best) – 530m (One 8 dog field will be graded from the Weighted Points Score table of Grade 5 pool of greyhounds worst to best grading. No guarding and no reserves. Trainers cannot nominate for this event specifically. Non Penalty)

The next programmed event is on Thursday, 3rd August.

• Nominations close Monday, 31st July with GRSA at 9.00am

GRSA has also continued with the 1 – 4 win Time Graded Heats on a Saturday morning over 530m into a Thursday night Final, however, with the introduction of the race on Thursday nights, the 5+ 530m Time Graded events will only be run if insufficient nominations for the meeting (there will be no Heats for this pool of greyhounds unless specifically programmed).

GRSA will also continue running Heats at Murray Bridge, Angle Park Monday and Gawler into a Thursday night Final where the program allows to draw from a different pool of greyhounds over 500m.

VACCINATION RULE FOR RACING IN SA

Trainers are reminded that Rule 25 (Minimum Vaccination Requirements) took effect Monday, 1st May. Vaccination Certificates must be received by GRSA prior to close of nominations for affected greyhounds to be considered eligible.

MURRAY BRIDGE STAT TRIALS

Please be advised Satisfactory Trials at Murray Bridge on Wednesday nights will be conducted on a fortnightly basis due to staffing issues. The next fortnightly opportunity will be Wednesday, 2nd August.

2023 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS IN VICTORIA

The GCA National Championships are just around the corner. The National Finals this year will be held at The Meadows in Victoria and are to be conducted on Saturday, 26th August.

Both the National Sprint and National Distance Finals are at Group 1 level.

The State series' for SA will be held at Angle Park on Thursday, 3rd August for the Sprint Heats over 530m with the State Final of the Sprint and one-off Final over 730m of the Distance on the 10th August. In an effort to support this series ALL States will be conducting their Finals on the same night to be run within a two hour period.

• Nominations will close at the normal time with GRSA which will be at 9am on Monday, 31st July

A reminder to all trainers of the clause which requires a greyhound to have been domiciled in South Australia for a period of not less than 76 days out of the 150 days immediately prior to the nomination closing date to be eligible to represent SA, which going back is on Wednesday, 17th May 2023. If unsure of a greyhound's status, please contact the GRSA grading staff.

NATIONAL STRAIGHT TRACK CHAMPIONSHIP AT HEALESVILLE

The National Straight Track Championship this year will be held at Healesville on Saturday morning, 26th August – so all the National Finals will be held on the same day.

This year SA will have two SA dogs represent the State in the series with QLD, NSW, VIC and SA challenging for the title.

So the Straight Track series aligns with the circle and the other States, our Heats will be held at Murray Bridge on Tuesday, 1st August with our Final on Tuesday, 8th August. Prizemoney for the SA Straight track Final will be \$10,000 to the winner aligned with the other three States.

It is important that trainers are aware that these series' for the circle and straight track are run at the same time so please be mindful of this when nominating and the qualifying criteria.

• Nominations close with GRSA at 9am on Thursday, 27th July

A reminder to all trainers of the clause which requires a greyhound to have been domiciled in South Australia for a period of not less than 76 days out of the 150 days immediately prior to the nomination closing date to be eligible to represent SA, which going back is on Saturday, 13th May 2023. If unsure of a greyhound's status, please contact the GRSA grading staff.

2023 GAWLER CLASSIC HEATS ON AUGUST 2

The Gawler Classic for 2023 over 400m will have \$1,600 Heats on Wednesday, 2nd August with the \$3,300 Final on Wednesday, 9th August for greyhounds paid up for Classic 2023.

• **Nominations for Heats close with GRSA at 9am on Friday, 28th July.**

LOW GRADE SERIES AT ANGLE PARK

The next Low Grade Feature Series at Angle Park will be a Maiden Series over the 530m with \$2,650 Heats on Thursday, 17th August and the \$5,535 Final on Thursday, 24th August.

KINGS AND QUEENS FEATURE HEATS IN AUGUST

Again, this year GRSA will conduct the Kings and Queens Feature series with \$5,535 Heats on Thursday, 24th August and a \$7,500 Final on Thursday, 31st August in continued support of any greyhound affected by the change to the GCA Age Restricted Classics change quite a number of years ago. The eligibility for this series is for dogs and bitches whelped between 1st March 2021 and 31st May 2021. Performed Maidens are eligible [raced or quality trialed]. It will be dependent upon nominations, however, we would like to run a dogs Heat and a bitches Heat separately with greyhounds qualifying into the Final. If there are not sufficient nominations for either sex then these Heats may be mixed into a couple of mixed Heats. Special conditions apply, however, these races will be non-penalty.

• **Nominations close Monday, 21st August at 9.00am with GRSA.**

HEATS CLASSIC 2023 PRELUDE (1) AT ANGLE PARK

The \$3,700 Heats of Classic 2023 Prelude (1) will be run on Thursday, 24th August with the \$4,500 Final on Thursday, 31st August over the 530m. For SA Bred greyhounds whelped July 21 to December 21 and paid up for Classic 2023.

* **Nominations for the Heats close Monday, 21st August with GRSA at 9.00am.**

OAKS AND DERBY ELIGIBILITY IN 2023

The Group 3 SA Oaks and SA Derby to be run in September this year will be for greyhounds whelped on or after 1st June, 2021 [27 months]. The Heats of the Oaks will be run on the same night as the Derby again this year with Heats on Thursday, 7th September and the Group 3 Finals on Thursday, 14th September.

• **Nominations for the Heats close Monday, 4th September at 9.00am.**

ANGLE PARK AND TOWNSVILLE TO SWAP MEETINGS AGAIN THIS YEAR

Greyhound Racing SA have liaised with Racing Queensland about swapping a Saturday morning meeting in December for our Festival of Fire meeting allowing Angle Park to run on Saturday, 16th December and Saturday, 23rd December with Townsville racing on Saturday, 2nd and Saturday, 9th December.

We have also swapped our Saturday, April 27th, 2024, to assist Queensland with Saturday, 30th December. This will mean we will be racing four Saturdays in a row towards the end of December on 16th, 23rd, 30th December and 6th January all during school holidays.

Racing Queensland liaised with GRSA to swap a Saturday meeting in August to free up the day after their Townsville Cup meeting on Friday, 25th August. This will mean Angle Park will race on Saturday, 19th August and Saturday, 26th August with Queensland racing on Saturday, 2nd September and Saturday, 9th September.

Please be mindful of these changes in the All tracks calendar and our racing dates.

The Angle Park trials will remain on Sundays when we race on the Saturday, however, when we don't race on the Saturday the trials will be on the Saturday morning as normal.

NO ANGLE PARK TUESDAY 5TH DECEMBER

Please note that due to SKY Racing 2 being closed in the night period of Tuesday, 5th December 2023 for night two of the 2023 Harness Inter Dominion, GRSA will not have a Tuesday night meeting at Angle Park.

GOTBA COURSING DATES

Below are the GOTBA at Virginia Coursing dates until the end of the season. GRSA will continue to grade a mix of 4 and 8 dog events as the season progresses.

RACING AND TRIALLING FREQUENCY – STARTED 1ST FEBRUARY

GRSA has adopted a new local rule in regard to frequency of racing and trialling which took effect on Wednesday, 1st February 2023. The update local rule is below –

69A Racing and trialling frequency

[1] In this rule:

Race has the same meaning given to this term in R9 of the GAR.

Trial means a satisfactory trial, or a qualifying trial as defined in R9 of the GAR.

[2] A greyhound will only be permitted to start in –

[a] No more than a combined total of 2 race and trial starts in any 7-day period; and,

[b] No more than a combined total of 7 race and trial starts in any 28-day period.

[3] This sub-rule commences on a date to be fixed by Stewards' Notice.

The intent of this rule is to monitor and regulate the frequency of races and official trials of greyhounds, to ensure adequate rest time is given between events. The rule is similar to one in effect in Western Australia. We have automated the OzChase Racing system to be able to monitor this rule. The rule is self-explanatory. A greyhound must not start more than 2 times (races or trials combined) in any 7-day period. Further, a greyhound must not start more than 7-times (races or trials combined) in any 28-day period.

Any attempt to nominate a greyhound outside these parameters will be flagged by the OzChase system. If a greyhound gains a start from reserve deeming it ineligible under this rule for its next engagement or it competes in another State prior to racing back in SA, then the greyhound will come out.

****Racing Administration staff will scratch these greyhounds acting under this rule without notification. (the responsibility rests with the trainer to ensure they do not contravene this rule)**

****For clarity if a greyhound races on Sunday, Wednesday then Sunday it will be eligible. The first day counts as day 1 and therefore resets on the Saturday.**

CURRENT MASTERS TIMES AND POLICY

• For greyhounds 3¾ years and older. 4yo and older will get preference. City A, City B and Prov 1 meetings are done by form for 4yo and older and then greyhounds will only get in from under 4yo to 3¾ yo in age from oldest to youngest. Prov 2 meetings are all done on age from oldest to youngest regardless of form for all ages.

• Dates are exact so going back 4yo and 3¾ from the date of race. ie date of race run on 20/11/22 – 4yo would be 20/11/18 whelping.

• Time restrictions if a greyhound wins a Grade 5 Masters race in a faster time than published and it will have to have 2 runs (placed or unplaced) in normal company at that class of meeting before being eligible at that class of meeting.

• The Grader will look to grade a Grade 5 Masters event on every program over a distance if enough dogs are nominated

regardless if it is advertised in the All Tracks calendar.

- All races Non Penalty.

If a Mixed Masters is programmed the Grade 5 dogs will be mixed if there is Grade 4 and Grade 3 dogs linking together like normal grading. If there are Grade 2 and 3 dogs and then Grade 5 dogs only a Grade 5 Masters will be conducted under normal conditions as these cannot be linked. If there is enough to run a high grade Mixed Masters (ie Grade 2/3 & 4) we will do that and not include Grade 5 unless they nominate specifically for this programmed event.

305m Masters Policy for Mt Gambier – With Mt Gambier GRC conducting one 305m Grade 5 Masters race each meeting where possible, the Grading Department determined conditions for these races using some of the conditions of normal Grade 5 Masters events, however, factoring in the restricted nature of the 305m distance. There will still be a Time Standard applied based on the published table being 17.75. If a dog wins and runs faster than 17.75, it can still remain eligible for the next week, if the dog then wins and runs faster than 17.75 again it will be ineligible for the race and distance the following week. The dog will either run over another distance or will miss that week's race. The following week it will then be eligible. If there is no 305m Masters race the greyhound has to miss the next time that race is conducted. This only refers to the greyhounds that win.

GRADING REVIEW PANEL MEETING OUTCOMES – MAIN POINTS

• GRSA will allow one extra Grade 6 over another distance for City A Thursday meetings bringing this into line with all tracks in SA. No retrospectivity regarding this change.

• GRSA has removed the condition where once a greyhound has won a Grade 5 or higher event on a City A meeting that the greyhound will lose all Grade 6 events at all other tracks. This means a greyhound could be a Grade 4 or Grade 3 over 530m on a Thursday City A meeting and will still be able to win Grade 6 events at other tracks. No retrospectivity regarding this change.

• GRSA will now allow a greyhound after winning a Grade 5 Masters event in faster time than the time standard to get back Into Masters with 2 runs in a Grade 5 at the track and distance, it doesn't matter if they are placed or unplaced just so long as there are two starts out of Masters. This has been changed from being just unplaced to get back.

INDUSTRY CONSULTATIVE GROUP PANEL MEETING OUTCOMES – MAIN POINTS

- There will only be one provisional breeders license being provided to multiple participants residing at the same residence. All other applications would be dealt with on a case by case basis. For implementation ASAP.
- 2 in 7 starts and 7 in 28 starts rule. The ICG agreed that a 10 day stand down period would be an appropriate penalty for those that knowingly nominated greyhounds that would be ineligible due to the rule. It was suggested any further infringements could attract a monetary penalty. To clarify any penalty would only apply once the dog had gone around, not in instances with late scratchings etc. It is the trainer's responsibility to be aware of this rule and their implications. For implementation ASAP.
- The ICG panel confirmed and supported a \$100 fine for any late Pink Card applications. For implementation ASAP.
- The ICG panel supported all trialling to be booked through the Trial Booker process to ensure specific criteria is met. Management to investigate amending trial booker into group categories to achieve greater efficiency at the session. For implementation ASAP.

COMMENTS ON NOMINATIONS MARKED "ONLY"

A few years ago the Grading Review Panel agreed that some trainers were using the comments box to influence the grading of fields in particular Grade 5 Only for all their greyhounds.

The panel previously resolved that "Only" would be disregarded over all distances and the grading left to the Grader. [Masters Only or Juvenile Only will be accepted as this is for a specific type of race]

If trainers put "Only or no start or leave me out" then the grader will grade as normal and if a greyhound would be graded into a mixed event based on race wins then he will leave them out based on the trainers request. The more information provided to the Grader allows for him to accommodate those requests.

WINNING GRADE 6 RACES IN ORDER

GRSA reminds trainers to win their grade 6 events in order at a specific venue.

For the venues that allow two Grade 6 wins trainers need to win a Grade 6 over one distance and then a Grade 6 over the other distance. If a greyhound wins a Grade 6 and then a Grade 5 then they will lose their Grade 6 over the other distance at that venue.

RE-GRADING FOR ALL TRACKS AND DISTANCES

Re-grading will occur for all tracks and distances for Grade 3 or higher greyhounds.

A trainer can apply for a re-grade after two unsuccessful nominations over the corresponding distance. If having met this criteria the responsibility is on the trainer to apply for a re-grade prior to the close of nominations. Only one distance will be considered for a re-grade per meeting.

CANCELLING TRIALS

If Trainers have booked trials for a session and decide not to come with all of their booked greyhounds, it would be appreciated if they could notify GRSA so amendments can be made.

If this is at short notice then there is not much that could be done, however, if trainers know their confirmed numbers during normal business hours then please advise GRSA.



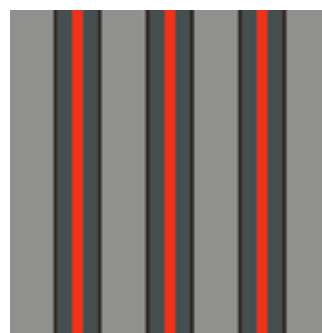

STERILISATION CONTRIBUTION SCHEME POLICY

BACKGROUND

On 1st May 2022, the Greyhounds Australasia Rules (GAR) made effective the following rule 24 -

24 Mandatory sterilisation of greyhounds retired as pets

(1) Unless a greyhound is being accepted by an adoption agency approved by a Controlling Body that undertakes sterilisation, the owner or person responsible for the greyhound at the time of such retirement as a pet must ensure that the greyhound has been surgically sterilised by a veterinarian before allowing the greyhound to leave their care and custody, except where a veterinarian certifies after examining that greyhound, to the satisfaction of a Controlling Body, that being surgically sterilised would be detrimental to its welfare.

(2) In submitting the required notification prescribed by rule 22(1) [a], a certificate of sterilisation by a veterinarian must be supplied for any retired greyhound to which this rule applies.

This rule effectively shifts the onus of sterilising a retiring greyhound from the person taking possession of the greyhound [per section 12, Dog and Cat Management Regulations 2017] to the owner or person responsible for the greyhound at the time of their retirement.

POLICY

GRSA will commit to a financial contribution ("the Sterilisation Contribution Scheme (SCS)") to either the owner or the person responsible for the greyhound ("the Applicant") for the cost of the sterilisation procedure where -

[a] The greyhound is being retired as a pet and not being accepted by an adoption agency approved by a Controlling Body that undertakes sterilisation ("a recognised adoption agency"); or,

[b] The greyhound is a named greyhound; and,

[c] The sterilisation procedure is performed by a veterinary surgeon; and,

[d] The Applicant is the owner or the person responsible for the greyhound that incurred the financial burden of the sterilisation procedure.

Recognised adoption agencies

The following entities are recognised adoption agencies for the purposes of the sub-rule [and retiring greyhounds to these agencies does not require sterilisation beforehand] -

[a] Greyhounds as Pets SA [formally Greyhound Adoption Program SA] ("GAP SA")

[b] Any greyhound adoption program under the auspices of any other Controlling Body for greyhound racing in Australia or New Zealand;

[c] An Australasian Veterinary Boards Council Accredited Veterinary School;

[d] An approved veterinary school of an Australian Vocational Education and Training (VET) school.

ACCESSING THE SCHEME

Accessing the SCS requires -

[a] The greyhound be a named greyhound; or,

[b] The greyhound is correctly retired per R22 and R34, Greyhounds Australasia Rules; and L130 130, Local Rules. Where a greyhound is retired [or attempted to be retired] in circumstances that breach L130[1A], Local Rules, no rebate will be paid or, if already paid, GRSA will seek recovery of the payment by order of the Integrity Hearings Panel.

When the Applicant arranges to retire the greyhound to a person or entity that is not a recognised adoption agency, the Applicant must - before retiring the greyhound - ensure the greyhound is sterilised.

Upon sterilisation of the greyhound, the Applicant should receive a certificate of sterilisation and paid tax invoice [addressed to the Applicant] for the cost of the procedure. That paid tax invoice must contain an item that is the sterilisation procedure, with the cost of that procedure.

Within 10 days of the sterilisation procedure being performed, the owner or person responsible for the greyhound at the relevant time may make a claim under the SCS by lodging the sterilisation certificate [with the paid tax invoice].

Regardless of when the sterilisation procedure is performed, the owner or person responsible for the greyhound at the time of retirement must notify GRSA of the retirement, together with a copy of the sterilisation certificate. This is done on the prescribed Form GAR106R [with a copy of the sterilisation certificate].

Only one SCS claim be made for each greyhound.

FINANCIAL CONTRIBUTION

GRSA will contribute to the cost of the procedure, up to a maximum of \$375.00. If the procedure is over \$375.00, the Applicant will be out of pocket for the gap fee. Sterilisation is an elective procedure, and GRSA recommends that Applicants find out the cost of the procedure beforehand with the proposed veterinary clinic, to be fully aware of what the gap will be. The tax invoice for the procedure must be paid to the veterinary clinic before the contribution can be claimed. GRSA does not pay the veterinary clinic directly and only pays the person named on the paid tax invoice.

GRSA will contribute via electronic funds transfer to the account of the Applicant on file with GRSA. [Make sure the Applicant updates their account details with GRSA, should there be a change; or, supply their account details if not held by GRSA].

What GRSA will not contribute

GRSA will not contribute to -

[i] An unpaid tax invoice;

[ii] A paid tax invoice that is not from a veterinary surgeon or clinic;

[iii] Any item on the paid tax invoice that does not relate to the sterilisation procedure;

[iv] A tax invoice from an entity, not being a veterinary surgeon or clinic, for an 'adoption fee' [or similarly worded fee], regardless of whether that fee is for, or in part for, a proposed sterilisation procedure;

[v] Any contribution of the procedure that is over \$375.00;

[vi] Any other charges that arise in after care, or further care [acute or otherwise], of the greyhound, that relate to the sterilisation procedure.

LODGING WITH GRSA

To properly claim the contribution, the following must be lodged -

[1] The sterilisation certificate [sterilisation of named greyhound]

or GARI06R [sterilisation of retiring greyhound, per the retirement form];

[2] Sterilisation certificate; and,

[3] Paid tax invoice in the accepted form under this policy, made out to the Applicant

HARDSHIP

GRSA may, in special circumstances if the Applicant is unable to pay for sterilisation upfront, make certain arrangements to pay the veterinary surgeon's tax invoice directly, up to the SCS maximum and only for the sterilisation procedure itemised on the tax invoice. The Applicant must still pay any gap fee to the veterinary surgeon, as well as any other item fee not covered by the SCS.

GRSA may ask the Applicant to provide evidence to support the Applicant's claim for special circumstances, including current financial circumstances and proposals, acceptable to the veterinary surgeon, to satisfy payment of the tax invoice in full [e.g., the gap fee]. Any documents the Applicant provides should be dated within 6 weeks of supplying them.

Any application, consideration or grant of a claim for special circumstances does not change the requirement to sterilise under the local rule. The greyhound cannot be retired [if not through a recognised adoption agency listed in this policy] unless it is sterilised.

To apply for special circumstances, contact GRSA Animal Welfare well before the intended retirement.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: I want to sterilise my named greyhound that is still racing and continue to race. Can I do this?

A: Yes. After you have your named greyhound sterilised, lodge the sterilisation certificate, together with the paid tax invoice to claim. [Please ensure the sterilisation certificate has enough detail for GRSA to identify the named greyhound].

Q: When my sterilised, racing greyhound is retired, what paperwork do I need?

A: Lodge the retirement form GARI06R and sterilisation certificate. [You cannot claim twice for sterilisation].

Q: I am retiring my unsterilised greyhound to GAP SA. Do I need to sterilise my greyhound?

A: No. GAP SA arranges sterilisation at GRSA's expense. You do not, however, receive any rebate.

Q: I was retiring my unsterilised greyhound to GAP SA, but my greyhound did not pass its 'First Point Assessment'. What do I do now?

A: Wait. GAP SA and/or GRSA Officers will provide you with guidance on the next steps, as a part of the feedback process on the assessment. You remain eligible for the contribution even if you later need to sterilise your greyhound per the sub-rule [and you paid for the procedure].

Q: I am retiring my unsterilised greyhound for breeding. After breeding ends, do I need to sterilise them?

A: Yes. You need to sterilise the greyhound if you are not retiring to a recognised adoption agency, and you need to lodge a new Form GARI06R with the sterilisation certificate. You can apply for the contribution then.

Q: I want to retire my unsterilised greyhound as a pet to myself. Do I need to sterilise them?

A: Yes. You need to lodge the Form GARI06R with your sterilisation certificate. You can also apply for the contribution then.

Q: I am a trainer, and I am arranging the retirement of an unsterilised greyhound. Do I have to sterilise the greyhound?

A: Yes. If you are arranging retirement, and you are getting the greyhound sterilised, you must supply the sterilisation certificate for the Form GARI06R. If you paid for the sterilisation procedure, supply a paid tax invoice in your name and you can apply for the contribution.

Q: I am a trainer, and the owner is arranging and paying for sterilisation. Can I apply for the contribution?

A: No. The owner [or the person in whose name the paid tax invoice is made] can apply for the contribution. The person who incurs the expense is the person who claims.

Q: I am the trainer and paid for the sterilisation, but the owner is lodging the form. How do I get a rebate?

A: Ensure that you supply a copy of the paid tax invoice [addressed to you] and sterilisation certificate for the owner to lodge with the form. GRSA will pay the person named on the paid tax invoice only. If you do not receive the payment in a reasonable time, confirm with the owner that they lodged the form and contact GRSA Animal Welfare for assistance.

Q: I want to retire my unsterilised greyhound to an adoption agency that is not GAP SA [or the GAP of another Controlling Body]. Do I need to sterilise my greyhound?

A: Yes. You need to lodge the Form GARI06R with your sterilisation certificate. You can also apply for the contribution then.

Q: I want to sterilise my greyhound [either as a named greyhound or retiring greyhound] but I cannot afford it at the moment. Do I need to still sterilise my greyhound?

A: Yes. Enquire with your veterinary surgeon about the cost of the procedure. Contact GRSA Animal Welfare well before you intend to retire your greyhound to discuss your financial position and options to comply. Remember, you cannot retire your greyhound in breach of the local rule.

Q: I want to retire my unsterilised greyhound but do not want to sterilise it or retire it to GAP SA [or the GAP of another Controlling Body]. Will I breach the rules if I do so, without sterilising it?

A: Yes. GRSA monitors retired greyhound movements by a number of data matching and investigative methods. Breaches of the Greyhounds Australasia Rules or Local Regulatory Rules, including associated policies, may be further investigated under Inquiry, with the matter referred to Stewards or the Integrity Hearings Panel.

TRAINER: ASHLEE GRIFFITHS

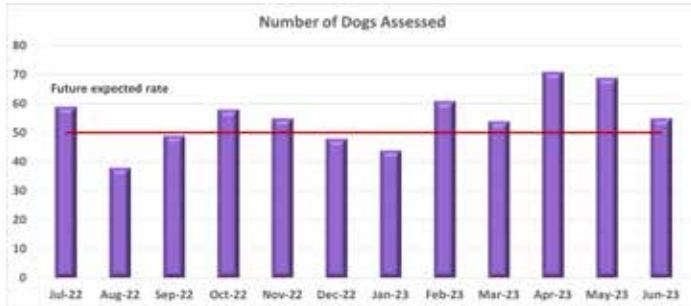

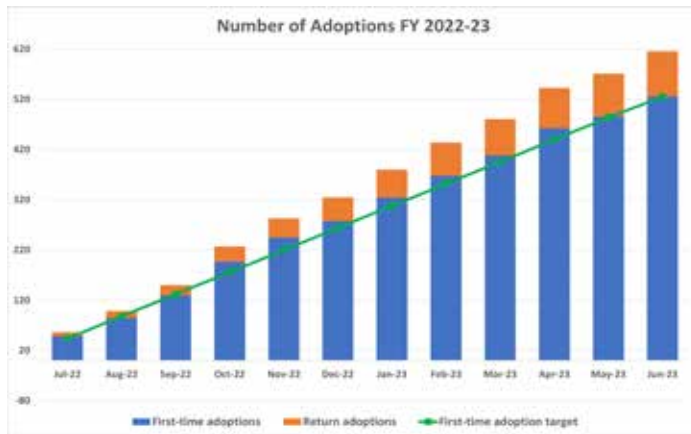
Latest updates from GAP

If you have not submitted the placement form within six months after the assessment, your greyhound will have to be re-assessed by GAP.

If your greyhound returned to racing or trialed after a successful assessment, it will have to be re-assessed after a 10-day downtime again. Thank you!

Distribution between Trainers and Owners

GRSA would like to remind all participants who receive a WAP that the payment is the equivalent of prizemoney. If you are currently responsible for distributing prizemoney to another party (e.g. owners) then the same approach applies to WAP payments.

From GRSA's perspective, the position in relation to third parties is reflective of OzChase records and is as follows:

- If GRSA have been notified of an ownership split [which is recorded in OzChase] then you **DO NOT** need to make a payment to owners for the WAP because GRSA will do this automatically, however;
- If you ordinarily forward on payments to owners of your own accord, then you **DO** need to do the same for the WAP. Each remittance will include the name of the dog for which the WAP is being made.

TRIALS

QUALIFYING AND SATISFACTORY TRIALS

Angle Park qualifying and satisfactory trials are held every Tuesday night between 6.50pm and 7.15pm. Qualifying will be for the following Monday meeting (drawn Thursday). Nominations close at 12.30pm on the Tuesday (for online nominations 11.59pm Monday).

Gawler qualifying and satisfactory trials are held every Thursday morning from 7am. Qualifying will be for the following Friday/Sunday meeting (drawn the following week). Nominations close at 12.30pm Wednesday the day prior.

Murray Bridge qualifying and satisfactory trials are held fortnightly on a Wednesday night (between the end of the straight track trials and the beginning of the one turn track trials). Normal trials start at 4:00pm during non-daylight savings and 5:30pm during daylight savings. Qualifying will be for the following Friday/Sunday meeting (drawn the following week). Nominations close at 12.30pm on Wednesday (for online nominations 11.50pm Tuesday).

ANGLE PARK

SINGLE TRIALS

A reminder to trainers that single trials can be booked with two greyhounds however you need to advise when booking of your intention to do this. If you wish to put three or more into this trial then a field trial will have to be booked.

BOOKING NUMBER FOR TRIALS

Participants wishing to book trials are required to ring 8243 7172, this phone line will only be used for trial bookings and will queue participants. By having this one number with participants queuing makes this process to be a more efficient way of booking trials.

There will be NO trials accepted through the normal administration number. To be fair to everyone GRSA will only accept bookings using the new number or alternatively logon to trialbooker.com, create an account and book your own trials.

POLICY FOR TRIALLING AT ANGLE PARK, GAWLER AND MURRAY BRIDGE BEFORE THE RACE MEETING

Policy Background

This policy is to detail the procedure for trainers seeking greyhounds to trial before race meetings. This policy is effective from 2 May 2019.

Race Meeting Trial Policy

This policy is in place for the following race meetings:

Angle Park Monday, Gawler Wednesday and Sunday, Murray Bridge Tuesday, Friday, and Sunday.

Two fields from the boxes with a maximum of four (4) greyhounds. Trials may be conducted at any time during the race meeting from immediately after kenneling until after the last race, at Stewards' discretion.

The following lists the order in which greyhounds will be selected in the event if more than eight (8) greyhounds are nominated:

1. Reserves at the meeting that do not obtain a start
2. Trainers that have greyhounds engaged and are located more than 100km in distance from the track
3. Satisfactory trials

Procedure/criteria

1. For Angle Park Monday night, the trainer is to contact GRSA between 9am and 10am on Monday to nominate. Should the Monday be a public holiday bookings are to be made between 8am and 9am on the scratching number.
2. For Murray Bridge Tuesday & Friday, the trainer is to contact GRSA between 3pm and 4pm the day before. Should any of these times fall on a public holiday bookings are to be made during scratching times. For Murray Bridge Sunday, the trainer is to contact the scratching number on Sunday between 8am and 9am.
3. For Gawler Wednesday, the trainer is to contact GRSA between 3pm and 4pm the day before. Should any of these times fall on a public holiday bookings are to be made during scratching times. For Gawler Sunday, the trainer is to contact the scratching number on Sunday between 8am and 9am.
4. Other than reserve greyhounds, trainers will be restricted to trialling one (1) greyhound unless nominations determine otherwise.
5. Stewards will allocate the box for the greyhound.
6. Trials will be 515m, 530m & 531m in distance as first preference. Other distances considered depending on nominations.
7. Greyhounds currently under suspension are ineligible to trial unless they are undertaking a satisfactory trial to be cleared.
8. Greyhound registration cards must be produced at kennelling time.
9. Trainers with other greyhounds engaged can utilise the extra kennel space until such time they are ready to leave. Trainers with no other greyhounds engaged will be permitted to leave with Stewards permission.
10. At Murray Bridge, trials will only be available on the track that is prepared to race that day i.e. Friday meeting on the u-shaped track, trials will be on the u-shaped track only.

Please note: If there are 12 races at Angle Park, Gawler or Murray Bridge there will be NO trials.

The Angle Park Vet Clinic and/or swab kennels cannot be used to accommodate any additional greyhounds due to operational requirements of the Clinic and Stewards.

It is vital that trainers nominate to trial at these race meetings. If you are unable to nominate at these times, please contact GRSA as soon as possible as permission may be given at GRSA's discretion to accept bookings outside these times.

Exceptions to this policy

Thursday nights are kept available for interstate greyhounds to solo trial in a lead-up to SA Group races as well as local greyhound's trialling for Group racing interstate.

Upon request, local greyhounds will be allowed to solo trial in a lead-up to a feature race and they will take one of the eight (8) kennels available for trialling greyhounds ahead of the policy and sit separate to the four (4) dog trials. Races considered to be a feature are: Adelaide Cup, Gawler Cup, Oaks, Derby, Howard Ashton, Brian Johnstone, SA Sprint, SA Distance Championship, SA Anniversary Cup, SA Country Cup, National Finals and any interstate Group race

Local greyhounds will be permitted to trial on a race night, where they are in preparation for a feature event, nominated for a meeting and the race does not stand up. This will include all distances and also take precedence over the policy. If a greyhound qualifies for a feature final and requires a trial in between, this will be conducted as a solo trial and will sit separately to the four (4) dog trials.

MOUNT GAMBIER SATISFACTORY TRIALS

Mt Gambier hold trials on Wednesday and Saturday mornings with Satisfactory trials ONLY being conducted on Wednesdays and need to be booked with Barry Shephard from the Club on 0419 824 512 no later than 12pm the day before.

At Race meetings Satisfactory trials can be done when less than 12 races. When there are 12 races these can be considered, however, the trainer will not be able to kennel and must take their greyhounds home straight after the trial. These race day trials will also need to be booked through Barry at the Club. GRSA administration staff will NOT accept these bookings and trainers will be directed to contact Barry Shephard.

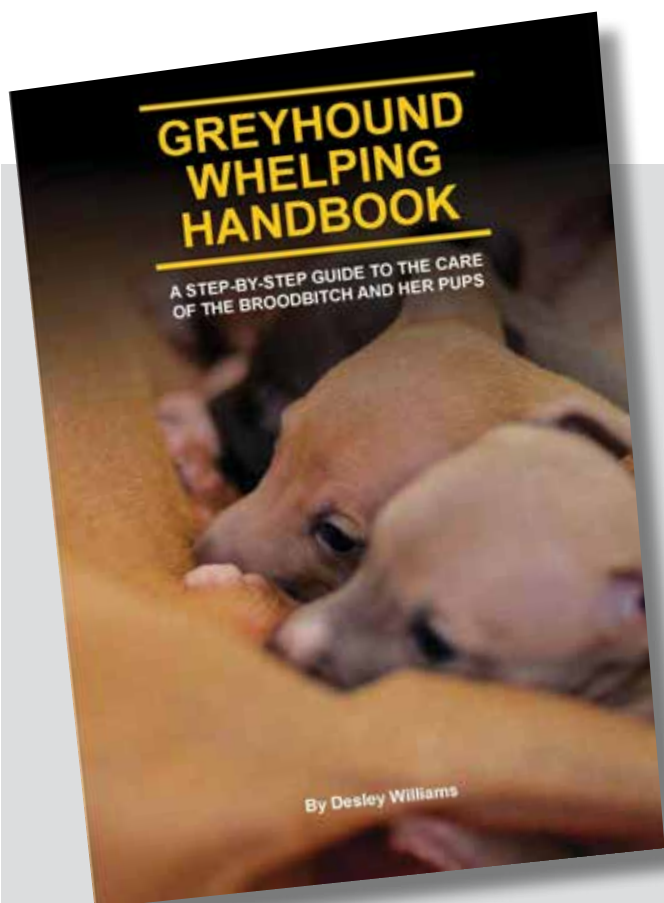

NOTES OF INDUSTRY CONSULTATIVE GROUP (ICG) MEETING

HELD IN THE BOARDROOM OF GRSA, 55 CARDIGAN STREET, ANGLE PARK

ON FRIDAY 19 MAY 2023 AT 10.00AM

The meeting commenced at 10.17am.

1 APOLOGIES

Adrian Battiston was a noted apology.

2 NOTES FROM PREVIOUS MEETING

The Minutes from the ICG Meeting held on Friday 20 January, 2023 were noted as a true and correct record.

3 BUSINESS ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MEETING

3.1 Sustainable Breeding Levels

The Group noted the update. The RM noted lower than expected breeding numbers which will be monitored. He further highlighted significant rebates provided, in particular sire rebates. It was recommended by the Group that the rebate for sires remain at \$775.

The Group supported only one provisional breeders licence being provided to multiple participants residing at the same residence. All other applications would be dealt with on a case by case basis.

3.2 Digital Transformation and Broadcast Enhancement (Isolynx)

The CEO provided an update. Members detailed their current involvement in the project noting intent to mock up a form guide with IsoLynx data which would include times for each dog at various marks averaged over last four starts. It was anticipated this information would be published prior to each meeting. The panel were appreciative of this assistance.

3.3 Mt Gambier Population

The Group noted the update. The CEO thanked the trainers and Club who contributed to the success of the session. Members noted the quality of the information provided and the benefit of this.

3.4 Trainers Car Park

The Group noted the update. Members suggested the drainage in carpark required repair, they also noted a number of other concerns regarding the proposal. The IFM advised of an alternate solution which would be tested. Members questioned the possibility of installation of power outlets in the Angle Park trainers car park to assist with running of trailer/vehicle air conditioners etc. Management committed to investigating this as well as installation of power outlets on light poles at Murray Bridge.

3.5 ICG Panel Members

The Group noted the update.

3.6 Murray Bridge Sand Issues

The COO provided an update advising of potential solution however noted the complexities and issues around this. Members suggested the track had improved. Members noted some adverse experience with straight track in recent weeks. It was suggested that these soft tissue injuries and issues may be attributed to the catching pen rather than the track itself. It was noted a longer transition to the catching pen would be beneficial. Members noted differing ideas around Murray Bridge track preparation.

3.7 Lure Noise

The Group requested an increase to the noise on lures including the use of louder "squeakers". Members noted their preference to what is used at Ipswich.

3.8 Pink Card Application/2 in 7 starts rule

The RM detailed the issue with 2 in 7 starts rule. Members suggested a penalty was a greater deterrent than a monetary fine. The Group agreed that a 10 day standown period would be appropriate for those that knowingly nominated greyhounds that would be ineligible due to the rule. It was suggested any further infringements could attract a monetary penalty. The RM clarified that any penalty would only apply once the dog had gone around, not in instances with late scratchings etc. The panel confirmed and supported a \$100 fine for any late Pink Card applications.

3.9 Minimum Bet Laws/Point of Consumption Tax

The COO provided an update in regard to minimum bet laws. The Group were appreciative of the work done and positive outcome.

Members on behalf of the industry, thanked Gavin Bosch [COO] for his contribution to GRSA.

The Chairman provided an update in regard to current discussion with Government regarding the Point of Consumption Tax. He advised that at this stage there would be no increase to the tax however the codes were requesting an increased share of returns.

3.10 Unauthorised Use of Drones

The RCM provided information in regard to use of drones. He suggested an increase of use of drones by activists and the like could be expected. He urged participants that experience instances of drone use to remain calm and provide all relevant information via the Know. Tell.Protect email address for this to be recorded.

4 AGENDA ITEMS

4.1 Injury Data Update

The CEO noted injury data would remain a standing item on ICG agenda and will consistently be looked at by Management. She provided a brief update on current figures.

4.2 Work Health and Safety - Trials

The RCM noted the SafeWork SA investigation and resulting measures that are required to be implemented due to this. He referred to the draft policy presented. He requested feedback from the Group as to the content and terminology used. It was requested that any feedback be provided to himself within two weeks.

Members raised concern with processes around race nights in instances where on track injuries occur and participants attended to the greyhound on track. He suggested greater controls were required. The COS advised that Stewards are in control of any instances of injury or risk of injury to people or greyhounds through observation and commentary and will call the stop to lure and race if required.

4.3 Desexing of Racing Greyhounds

Members provided background to the proposal noting the positives and advising he was supportive of the change. The Group discussed how these changes would be implemented and were supportive of the changes should they be voluntary. Management will consider and amend all applicable rules of racing and GAP policies.

5. OTHER BUSINESS

5.1 Christine Costa Submission

- Management took on notice Christine's comments regarding completion of the safety rail at Gawler and Mt Gambier and committed to investigating.
- Management committed to investigating and rectifying where possible the issues Christine raised with the turf at the empty area of Murray Bridge.
- Management advised they will communicate to all trial staff regarding second GRSA lure at all tracks.
- Management noted that due to limited availability of staff catching pen trials at all trial sessions was not possible. Members suggested the possibility of training trainers or handlers to undertake these roles. The CEO highlighted the current shortage of staff and put the call out to the Group to put forward anyone interested in these roles. Management will consider amending trial booking system to group categories trials to achieve efficiencies. This would also be considered as part of the review of the trial policy.
- The Group agreed that education of breeders and implementation of breeding plans should be considered. Management will consider best practice from other jurisdictions and incorporate this into discussion.
- The Group discussed restricting the number of greyhounds by each owner allowed into GAP. Members suggested an understanding of the number of dogs that enter GAP that are unraced and from what trainers would be beneficial. Members suggested there were issues with interstate trainers moving dogs to SA. The CEO requested Management be advised of any known issues with this. Members suggested restricting non-SA owned greyhounds on entering GAP with potential for a "passport fee". Management took all comments and questions on notice and would provide further feedback once further statistics and information were obtained.
- Christine questioned whether the SA Bred rebate scheme could incorporate allowance for 12 month vaccination. Members noted the differing opinion of Dr Des Fegan at the recent industry seminar regarding recommended frequency of vaccinations compared to SA rule. Dr Greg Moore provided his opinion. Management noted the comments for consideration.

5.2 Vern Anderson Submission

It was advised that Murray Bridge track staff investigated Vern's perceived issues with feedback provided directly to him, however his submission was faithfully tabled to the Group for discussion. Members noted issues with speed at apex of turn and suggested change to camber would solve this problem. Members suggested issues may be with inexperienced dogs at the track. Management will continue to monitor and report back.

5.3 Jason Newman Submission

Jason Newman raised on behalf of Tony Hinrichsen disappointment with outcome in regard to the Filthy Phantom matter. The CEO noted GRSA's commitment to welfare which required the age and number of starts be taken into consideration. She noted management were working with the trainer on this matter. Management sought feedback from the Group as to their opinion of the appropriate maximum age to race. Dr Greg Moore suggested a cut off at 6 years was appropriate

5.4 Marketing

Members suggested greater interaction with industry was needed including podcasts and interviews. The CEO noted the appointment of Luke Marchioro to the position of Content Coordinator and what his role will entail. It was noted that he is excited to “find the stories” and industry should see a marked improvement in this area.

5.3 TIRS

The Group sought clarification in regard to the TIRS and payments made directly to vets by GRSA. Management noted the trainer was able to make application to GRSA in these circumstances.

5.4 Animal Welfare Unannounced Inspections

Members noted theirs and others concern with property inspections occurring whilst the participant is not present. The Chairman noted GRSA's expectation of mutual respect and advised that GRSA had the responsibility and obligation to ensure trainers were doing the right thing and this could be achieved by undertaking unannounced inspections and inspections where the participant was not present which rules and policy allowed for.

5.5 Reduced Time in Kennels

The Group raised concern with extended periods of time dogs were required to be in kennels and requested a later kennelling closing time or split kenneling. Management advised they were aware of the issue and committed to investigating a solution.

5.6 Bull Rings

The Chairman advised that a bullring will be constructed at both Murray Bridge and Mount Gambier as a matter of priority. He noted a review and audit of existing private facilities would be undertaken with the possibility of further controls implemented.

5.7 Finish on Lure

It was requested the item remain on agenda for discussion. The CEO took the Groups feedback on board but noted there was no intent to make any change.

5.8 Additional Tuesday Meeting

The Group requested consideration be given to Murray Bridge and Gawler having a dedicated night meeting each in preference to sharing the Sunday timeslot. The Chairman noted these comments and advised a review will be undertaken following the introduction of the new schedule. The RM highlighted the number of competing factors that needed to be taken into consideration with the schedule.

5.9 Increase to Thursday Fields

The RM requested suggestions and feedback from the Group as to ways to increase Thursday night fields.

5.10 Race Scheduling for Travelling Trainers

Members requested, where possible, travelling trainers be considered and accommodated in early races. The RM noted this was taken into consideration and he endeavors to accommodate travelling trainers where possible but noted there may be instances where this doesn't occur.

5.11 Grade 6 Race Scheduling

Lisa Rasmussen on behalf of Kirin Corby requested management consider scheduling low win grade 6 races earlier in the meeting noting these comprised of younger dogs not accustomed to being in kennels for long periods. The RM noted the comment and advised of balance of races that was required and again reiterated this was something that was taken into consideration however was not always achievable.

5.12 Kennett Road Property

The Chairman noted the purchase of Kennett Road property adjacent to the Murray Bridge track. He highlighted the tremendous strategic opportunities that came with the purchase and noted the significant planning that will occur over the next 12 months to maximise these opportunities.
