FROM THE CEO'S DESK

Industry Information and Engagement Sessions

It was really encouraging to see the numbers that attended sessions at Gawler, Mount Gambier and Murray Bridge across the period June 4-6. It's going to be a really important year ahead for the industry as we begin to observe the impacts of the Tabcorp-Tatts merger, develop our relationship with the new Liberal Government and, of course, start racing

down at Murray Bridge. A lot of effort goes into coordinating these 'roadshows', on which basis it was really encouraging to attract such strong attendance at each venue. The [pages of] feedback from those sessions will begin to filter through Board, Management and industry Committee processes and will help to shape and drive the game-plan for GRSA in the short to medium term.

This will be a very busy time for the business as we begin to bring together all of the 'loose ends' that go with setting up a new Club and venue, including elements of feedback from the Industry Sessions. I ask you for your patience during that time and, in return, am committed to making all reasonable endeavours to keep the industry up to speed with Murray Bridge and other developments as we move along the path. Hopefully by doing so, we'll be able to stay ahead of the industry's highly functional rumour mill! It's an exciting time for South Australia and the road ahead holds a greater balance of opportunity than has been the case at any point in my time since hopping over the border.

Industry Consultative Group

On a somewhat related note, a formal framework is permanently in place which is intended to represent the interests of industry and support the Board and Management with important context around issues affecting racing and participation – the Industry Consultative Group (ICG). The formation of an ICG forms an obligation of the company under its Constitution. The panel is constituted by the Member Clubs who seek out eligible candidates and also receive expressions of interest. This group is available to the industry and should, within reason, be open to receiving your feedback so that they can then act as a conduit for participants in those high level discussions. Participants also have the opportunity to email concerns to any Manager (or myself) seeking that matter to be heard within an ICG meeting (or separately the Grading Review Panel – for grading matters). Evidence suggests that many people are either unaware of that opportunity or, more likely, not conditioned to taking advantage of same.

Noting that the ICG meets quarterly, and will be due to convene a meeting in July/August, please be aware of the opportunity that exists for you to raise your concerns in either the ICG or some other relevant industry Committee.

The ICG panel currently comprises the following Members: Melissa Trowbridge, Ryan Tugwell, Gavin Harris, Lisa Rasmussen, Judy Hurley, Peter Damarell, Tony Hinrichsen and Sean Donnelly.

Waterloo Kate wins Group 3 Howard Ashton

Trainer Barry Stewart had a night to remember at Angle Park on the 31st of May when Waterloo Kate took out the Group 3 Howard Ashton final. Not only did he train the winner, Barry also trained third place Springvale Choix on a big night for connections!

In front of a large crowd the Group 3 feature for SA Bred greyhounds was one of the most open in recent history with all greyhounds given an each way chance.

As the start was affected Waterloo Kate made full use of her inside draw to push through and lead on the first turn after an average beginning. Breemelia Swift for Tony Hinrichsen also mustered quickly to be challenging for the early lead while Minacious for northern trainer Graham Brown was slow to begin but also railed hard from his inside drawn to move to third. As the field settled Waterloo Kate who normally runs home in her races found herself in front and proving very hard to catch. She was chased by Breemelia Swift, Minacious and kennel mate to the leader Springvale Choix who was beginning to make good ground.

Rounding the home turn however Waterloo Kate was full of running and went down to the finish line a big winner by 3½ lengths in a solid 30.33 with Minacious edging out Springvale Choix in a photo for second.

Waterloo Kate is by Fernando Bale out of Hope's Up and was bred by Cameron Butcher. She was purchased for \$9,000 in the 2016 AGRC/GRSA Auction and after winning \$25,000 tonight certainly has repaid her happy connections which include trainer Barry Stewart, Gavin Harris, Stuart Barber and Ray Fewings.

Jeebus Bird flies to win in Shane McQueen final

Another night at Angle Park and another feature race win for leading local trainer Tony Rasmussen after his versatile chaser Jeebus Bird landed the prestigious Shane McQueen feature in front of a huge crowd on June 7th

Jeebus Bird was made the first reserve for the final after finishing an unlucky third in his heat however after one of the race favourites and kennel mate Nations was scratched due to injury he gained the lucky start from box 8.

The son of Barcia Bale and Queen Bluebird was kept safe in the market behind favourites On Fire for Cameron Butcher and Cairnlea Jet for Petar Jovanovic. As the 600m boxes flew open the Ken Gill trained Windmill Haze showed his usual dash to find the front early with Pierce Bale for Gino Grgurovic and Spring Bloom for Greg Board also up there early. Jeebus Bird was a little slow to muster however made ground quickly early to be up near the lead leaving the front straight. Both favourite's On Fire and Cairnlea Jet found themselves back in the pack with plenty of work to do after slow starts. Racing down the back straight Windmill Haze was going nicely in the lead however Jeebus Bird had moved to second and looked a big threat, while Pierce Bale and Spring Bloom battled it out for third, with the rest of the field struggling to make ground. Rounding the bend and Jeebus Bird had made his move racing to the front and clearing out from his rivals to go on and win by 4 lengths in a solid 35.12 for the 600m journey. Windmill Haze held on strongly for second ahead of Spring Bloom who got the better of Pierce Bale in the run to the line.





The race is named in honour of ex CEO Shane McQueen, who was a terrific greyhound administrator in WA and SA, until his untimely passing in 2003. On the presentation dais it was fantastic to see Shane's family represented by his wife Jane and his three sons who all have growing families of their own. Tony spoke in glowing terms of his association with Shane during his time as CEO, he also thanked the support of his connections who continue to support his training ventures.

First 4 months of dates released for 2018/2019

Pending the introduction of the new Murray Bridge track expected later this year, the dates for the first 4 months of 2018/2019 season from July through to October have been released.

Lower Grade Feature calendar released

The full list of Lower Graded Feature races for the 2018/19 season for the Finals worth \$4,820 have been released and are included in this month's edition of Kennel Capers and also available on the GRSA website.

These dates will be subject to change based on the introduction of Murray Bridge track later this year.



Feature racing dates for Angle Park and Gawler in 2018/2019

We have also just released the Angle Park and Gawler Feature Dates for the 2018/2019 season which is included in Kennel Capers.

This information is also available on the GRSA website at www. grsa.com.au. These dates will be subject to change based on the introduction of the Murray Bridge track later this year, the main changed would be around which days we are racing on.

Futurity payments due this month

Owners of SA Bred greyhounds are reminded that the next batch of Futurity payments are due on Friday, 29th June 2018.

There will be three series' for which payments will need to be made. The payments due are:

Classic 2018 – Final Payment Pups Born July 16 to Dec 16

This payment is for greyhounds for which the first two Sustaining Payments have been made. The Final Payment is \$121 per greyhound.

Breeders 2019 - Second Payment - Pups Born Jan 17 to June 17

This payment is for greyhounds for which the first Sustaining Payment was made last December. The Second Sustaining Payment is \$55 per pup or a Final Payment of \$121 can be made at this stage.

Classic 2019 - First Payment - Pups Born July 17 to Dec 17

Finally the First Payment is due for Classic 2019. All SA Bred greyhounds born in the above period are eligible to make this payment. The First Payment is \$27.50 per pup or a "one-off" Final payment of \$121 can be made at this stage.

To assist all owners of Futurity eligible pups, reminders have been posted this week. It is perhaps a good idea to make the payment as soon as you can, so it doesn't slip your mind and the closing date passes. If you have sold a pup/s we would ask if you can either forward on the information or let Caralyn Fielden know at GRSA and she can follow it up. If you haven't received a reminder and you think you should have, contact us asap.



Honcho Monelli claims monthly awards



The Tony Rasmussen trained Honcho Monelli has made it two awards in the last three months when he was named the Greyhound of the Month for May, after having a terrific month of racing where he won 2 races from 4 starts and 1 placing, highlighted by his Match Race series win at Sandown on Speedstar night.

The son of Mogambo and Jackie Bale kicked of his month with a trial performance at Sandown in a hope to qualify for the

Group 3 Speedstar. Whist running blistering time he could only manage 1st reserve for the series and was drawn into the first consolation of the Speedstar on the night. In that series he won his Match Race in a flying 29.61 and had to wait and see if any other greyhound could surpass his time, they couldn't and he was declared the winner. He then competed in the heats of the Group 1 Harrison Dawson at Sandown and after little luck finished a handy 6th. He came back to SA and continued his flying form in winning against open company in a sizzling 29.65 before finishing the month off with an unlucky second at headquarters where he flashed home late.

At the end of the month Honcho Monelli's record stood at 87 starts with 23 wins and 36 placings and earnings around \$124,000

and continues to be the greyhound to beat when he steps out in local company.

The Run of the Month for May was Honcho Monelli for trainer Tony Rasmussen for his performance at Angle Park on Thursday, 24th May in an open event.

Honcho Monelli settled midfield before powering over the top of a strong line up to win running away over the 515m journey. He won by 31/4 lengths in a blistering 29.65 however his splits of 4.55, 17.10 with a run home of 12.55 were sensational.

Black caps now available from GRSA

Along with the white caps GRSA has now approved that black caps can be worn by participants.

Both black and white caps with GRSA logos are available from GRSA at a cost of \$10.



\$7,000 Stayers Cup in June

The next feature race for the stayers will be Heats of the Stayer's Cup on Thursday, 22nd June over the 731m journey.

The \$7,000 Final will be run on Thursday, 29th June.

AGRC to sponsor the next Low Grade feature heats in June

The next low grade series heats at Angle Park will be run on Thursday, 21st June for SA Bred and/or SA Owned Grade 5 greyhounds over the 515m.

Conditions will be that if sufficient nominations are received to run two heats of SA Bred then those heats will be run. If insufficient nominations then SA Owned greyhounds will also be included with the SA Bred dogs given first preference. The Adelaide Greyhound Racing Club will kindly sponsor this event with added prizemoney and a rug to the winning connections. The final will be worth \$5,340 run on Thursday, 29th June.

*Nominations close on Monday, 18th June at 9.00am with GRSA.

Gawler Produce Stake heats in June

A reminder to all trainers with greyhounds paid up for the Gawler Produce Stake that the heats will be run on Sunday, 24th June. The semis are listed for Sunday, 1st July and the Final will be held on Sunday, 8th July.

The prizemoney breakdowns will be announced after the number of heats are known, however the Final is guaranteed at \$22,000 and Consolation at \$2,700.

Nominations for the heats close on Tuesday, 19th June with GRSA at 9.00am.

The winner of the Final is also eligible for a \$6,000 bonus if it can win the 2018 Gawler Gold Cup later this year. If the winner of the Gawler Produce is SA Bred, there is also a \$1,000 SA Bred Bonus.

Claiming races being conducted

There are specific claiming race conditions for these events, but basically, greyhounds are graded into an event with a claiming price.

Prior to the event, new owners can buy the greyhound before it starts with any prizemoney won being retained by the old owners and then the new owners take the greyhound after the race.

These races provide an opportunity to sell and buy greyhounds that are currently competing. Conditions refer to no more than \$2,500 or \$5,000 claiming prize

The \$4,820 Heats will be run on Thursday 12th July and the Final on Thursday 19th July. Prizemoney for the 2018 Final will be \$10,710 thanks to the increases announced from 1st July.

Nominations for the heats close on Monday, 9th July with GRSA at 9.00am.

Oaks and Derby eligibility in 2018

The Group 3 SA Oaks and SA Derby to be run in September this year will be for greyhounds whelped on or after 1st June 2016 (27 months) which has stayed the same as last year.

GRSA has left the eligibility date at 27 months in support of trainers, breeders and owners of young up and coming greyhounds however it is important that this series is supported by our local participants. If the series is not supported with nominations locally and from Interstate then GRSA will have no option but to alter the age restriction to 30 months to ensure sufficient support for these races in 2019. To support these series' GRSA has changed the heats of the Oaks to be run on the same night as the Derby with heats on Thursday 13th September and the Group 3 finals on Thursday 20th September.

2018 National Championships at Sandown in Victoria

The GCA National Championships are just around the corner. The National Finals this year will be held at Sandown in Victoria to be conducted on Friday, 24th August.

Both the National Sprint and National Distance Finals will carry prizemoney of \$75,000 to the winner.

The State series' for SA will be held at Angle Park on Thursday, 2nd August for the Heats with the State Finals on the 9th August.

In an effort to support this series ALL states will be conducting their Finals on the same night to be run within a 2 hour period. It makes for a great promotional concept.


• Nominations this year will close at the normal time with GRSA which will be at 9am on Monday, 30th July

A reminder to all trainers of the clause which requires a greyhound to have been domiciled in South Australia for a period of not less than 76 days out of the 150 days immediately prior to the nomination closing date to be eligible to represent SA. If unsure of a greyhounds status, please contact the GRSA grading staff.

Trainers to receive \$20 from 1st July to replace \$15 unplaced

The existing \$15 unplaced payment that currently applies to a majority of SA greyhound races will be replaced by a new \$20 Trainer Raceday Subsidy (TRS) from 1st July with 100% of that payment being allocated directly to trainers.

For clarity, this payment will be made in addition to the \$60 trainer rebate and will be allocated to unplaced greyhounds under circumstances wherein the \$15 payment would have previously applied. Unplaced payments of more than \$20 will remain the same.



State of Origin Match Race Series in late September

GRSA has introduced an exciting new feature "State of Origin" Match Race series in a lead up to the Group 1 Adelaide Cup on Thursday, 29th September where 4 greyhounds from SA will take on 4 greyhounds from Victoria in one on one racing.

As a lead up to the Group 1 Adelaide Cup we get many Victorian trainers travel across the border to race but mainly trial their greyhounds so their greyhound becomes familiar with the surroundings before competing in the Group 1 heats. This is a great opportunity for SA to introduce a State of Origin Match Race series which will provide promotion, wagering and a terrific opportunity for the local and Interstate greyhounds to have a decent hit out prior to the series.

CONDITIONS OF THE SERIES:

The State of Origin Match Race series between South Australia and Victoria will be held on Thursday, 27th September this year, the week before the Adelaide Cup heats. It will be the week of the AFL Grand Final so we may be able to tap into the SA verses Victoria rivalry particularly if Port Power or Adelaide Crows are in the Grand Final against a Victorian opponent.

Eligibility as to who represents South Australia or Victoria would be based around the Nationals conditions. Greyhounds would need to be trained in either State 76 days out of the last 150 prior to the close of nominations.

GRSA will call for nominations which will close on Friday morning, 23rd September at 9am for the State of Origin Match Race series. The best four greyhounds nominated from SA and Victoria will be selected by the GRSA grader. The Grader will use whatever information he has available to select those greyhounds. The

Graders decision will be final. Those greyhounds not selected from Interstate will be given the opportunity to solo trial or race in another event on the night.

The Grader will rate the four greyhounds from each State in order from 1 to 4 with 1 being the highest rated greyhound. The head to head matches will be decided by the two 1 rated greyhounds competing against each other and then it will be 2 v 2, 3 v 3 and 4 v 4. Prizemoney for each individual match will also reflect 1 to 4 with the 1 rated greyhounds receiving the most amount of money. However the overall winner will still be determined based around the times the greyhounds run so all greyhounds have that opportunity.

PRIZEMONEY:

Winners of match races – 1 v 1 – Winners \$3,750; 2 v 2 – Winner \$3,500 3 v 3 – Winner \$3,250; 4 v 4 – Winner \$3,000

Overall State of Origin winner (based on overall times) \$5,000, second \$2,500, third \$1,000

SCHEDULE & WAGERING:

This race would be race 4 on the program (outside of the Quadrella). It will make up 1 race on the 11 event card of racing. Race 4 will make up a field of the 8 greyhounds with 4 match races to be run around 10 minutes apart (total of 30 minutes).

UBET have advised that they are fully supportive of this concept from a wagering perspective. For tote purposes they will have the full suite of single race betting options and it makes for a perfect fixed odds bet type. Sky Racing has also provided their support around the concept.

Accell Therapy mat now available at Angle Park

The mat is now available in the foyer area of the Angle Park building. It is recommended that a greyhound derives benefit with a 15 to 20 minute session and is generally for recovery from racing or injury.

It will be available during normal office hours to be used [greyhounds racing on that day excluded]. Please ask the Racing Admin staff if you wish to use the mat. GRSA is working towards making this available also during trial sessions.

Trial fees at race meetings

With GRSA allowing for trials under certain conditions at race meetings, on occasions payment of these trials may have been overlooked.

From the 1st April any trainer trialling a greyhound at the race meeting will be required to pay staff as they would at a normal trial session. This will be consistent with all our racing and trialling meetings.

Syndication interest from trainers

Checking off of greyhounds at trials on Tuesdays and Wednesdays

Stewards have advised that the checking off of greyhounds to clear them to race will ONLY be conducted at trials on Tuesday nights and Wednesday nights.

Naming applications

When lodging a Naming Application participants are advised to allow at least two weeks for the name to be approved from Greyhounds Australasia and then for GRSA to process the application and issue a greyhound card and weight card.

Therefore, should you wish to nominate the greyhound GRSA suggests that you lodge the Naming Application three weeks prior to nominating, this will give GA, GRSA and yourself enough time to name the greyhound, issue documentation and then for the trainer to have the greyhound "checked off" on a trial night. This time frame could be further extended if GA requires more name choices.

Notification of training amendment & clearance of greyhounds

Trainers are reminded of their obligation to notify GRSA within 3 working days of a greyhound coming into or leaving their kennel (Rule 105(4)(i)).

This is a requirement for all greyhounds regardless of where bred. We have had a number of trainers recently put in training amendments late the night prior to nominations closing at 9am the following day, this practice can lead to your nomination not being accepted or being unable to nominate online should any issues arise the following morning.

Trainers are also leaving it to the night before nominations close to have greyhounds "checked off". This practice can also lead to your nomination not being accepted or being unable to nominate online should any issues arise.

It is therefore in the trainer's best interest to have lodged with GRSA the training amendment and clearance of the greyhound a number of days prior to wishing to nominate the greyhound. It is not GRSA's responsibility to ensure that the paperwork is processed within ½ hour, which is the amount of time available to have it processed before nominations close at 9am.

Completion of paperwork

Participants are reminded of their obligation to ensure that when lodging paperwork that it is fully completed and payment is made at the time of lodgement.

GRSA is here to assist should you be unsure of how to complete any paperwork however it is not our responsibility to arrange for its completion, nor is it our responsibility to ensure that it is lodged. Therefore, please ensure when lodging any paperwork eg, Transfer of Ownerships, Litter Registrations etc that they are fully completed and paid for (if payment required) and lodged within a timely manner.

Handling greyhounds at the trials while lure in motion

A reminder to participants that when on course for any trial sessions that the lure could be in motion at anytime. Please be mindful of your surroundings and also with your greyhounds ensuring you have full control at all times.



GRADING REVIEW PANEL

The Grading Review Panel met on Friday 25th May to discuss grading in South Australia from an Agenda provided by submissions and industry consultation. Following is a summary and recommendations of items discussed:

The panel approved the minutes from the previous GRP meeting held on 8/12/17. The panel reviewed recommendations and implementations from the previous GRP meeting with their recommendations below.

BUSINESS ARISING

The Racing Manager provided a verbal update to the panel on the progress of the below items.

Time Grading Cut Off Time – The Racing Manager provided examples to the panel regarding a possible cut off rating of 5. Which seemed to be an agreed cut off time however the panel were mindful that this could cost a race going ahead by leaving a greyhound out or even a good quality race of 4,5 & 6 ratings proceeding. The panel were given the example that Victoria are starting to introduce that relates to the greyhounds aged prizemoney value (APM) where a greyhound that has prizemoney more than double the lowest prizemoney greyhound then it would be left out.

After considering all the options the panel agreed to introduce a policy that relates to the time rating. If a greyhound has a rating more than 50% less that the highest rated dog in the individual race then this greyhound would be left out. Maiden events are excluded from this policy. For example if in one race the highest rated dog is 13 and the lowest rated dog is 7 (stays in), 6.25 (not eligible). The Grader will manage this process. To be implemented for meetings from 1st July 2018.

Port Augusta Prizemoney – The Racing Manager advised the panel that whilst Port Augusta is funded differently with the club putting in an amount of prizemoney and GRSA subsidising that the club was supportive of flattened stakemoney. They however would like to see what the structure may look like. The panel agreed that flattening stakemoney would assist the club and participants traveling to and competing at the race meeting. The Racing Manager advised that he will supply the club with a prizemoney structure to be considered in the future.

Subsequent to the meeting the below structure for prizemoney disturbing was advised and approved by the Pt Augusta GRC for implementation on their future programs as programmed by them effective for meetings from the 1st July 2018.

Claiming Races – The Racing Manager advised the panel that since implementation GRSA has only conducted one claiming race [6 dog field]. They have only received 6 claim forms in total from owners and trainers which suggests a lack of support for the concept. The panel advised that greater advertising

leading up to the race and also on the day by way of social media, website, race book etc may encourage support. They believed opening up the conditions from a \$2,500 restriction to some races being \$5,000 may assist. The panel also suggested Maiden events may encourage nominations. The panel also suggested that is a preferential box draw could be introduced it may help nominations. Overall the panel would like the concept to be continued with programming to assist nominations. For implementation for meetings from the 1st July 2018 The RM to consider a preferential box draw for these races and how this may be implemented.

Prizemoney Changes Update – The panel were advised of the recent Media Release sent out by GRSA advising of prizemoney changes to take affect from 1st July 2018 which reflect some of the items proposed at the last GRP meeting in particular the change from the \$15 unplaced payment to a \$20 trainer payment. The panel were appreciative of the changes.

AGENDA

Murray Bridge

The panel were advised of the schedule of racing at Murray Bridge when the facility is completed later this year.

The RM requested feedback from the panel in relation to two options for the grading of the events at Murray Bridge. He questioned whether the first option of grading of the One Turn and Straight Track initially at Murray Bridge would be as if the greyhounds had never competed at that venue as they do if they go to Gawler etc for the first time. This would mean that all greyhounds start at Maiden, Grade 6 or Grade 5. The second option could be where they get a grade based on XXX amount of starts or prizemoney etc which would be similar to the Victorian system of re grading greyhounds based around specific criteria that would separate some Grade 5 to Grade 4 greyhounds only for their first start. The panel were unanimous in their recommendation of every greyhound starting as if they had never competed at the track.

The RM also requested feedback about grading the Angle Park Tuesday at City B prizemoney which may include 388m racing. The panel were of opinion when this meeting commences that greyhounds should carry across their City B Monday grades for 515m or longer races and for the 388m they should carry across their Provincial 2 grades for Wednesday meetings. This aligns itself with the current policy if 388m races were to commence on a Monday night in the short term.

There was some comment as to whether the Tuesday to Thursday Angle Park meetings would be viable as some trainers could not race twice at the venue in the week and preferred the Monday to Thursday option. The RM advised there were some logistical issues with fitting all racing and trialling into the current schedule but all feedback would be considered.

It was agreed by the panel that programming of races at Murray Bridge would be crucial in ensuring the racing opportunities for our greyhound population.

The panel considered the Grade 6 implications for Murray Bridge and other tracks later in the agenda.

Time Grading

With the schedule changing when Murray Bridge is introduced later this year the RM requested feedback in regard to Time Grading meetings. GRSA would suggest maintaining a fortnightly Time Graded meeting at Gawler, Murray Bridge or Angle Park. The panel were provided with a Time Grading Schedule where Angle Park and Gawler have a Time Grading meeting every 8 weeks, Murray Bridge once per month.

Some of the panel had reservations around whether Time Grading would be irrelevant with Murray Bridge coming onto the calendar based around Angle Park and Gawler reducing their meetings. The RM advised that Time Grading is an important part of programming and it should still be able to accommodate those greyhounds of all abilities on the calendar.

The panel were advised if nominations warranted another meeting then the half meeting at Gawler on Wednesday would be reinstated as the first priority. It would be hoped that the schedule can grow to accommodate this. The panel were advised that Murray Bridge offers the opportunity to grow participation and our greyhound numbers. Some of the panel suggested Pathway may be a better option as a couple of races on the program rather than the whole meeting and also that the \$75 unplaced needs to be monitored as to certain trainers seeming to put their greyhounds ion just for the unplaced money.

Members of the panel mentioned about the voting in Florida in regard to greyhound racing and for this to be monitored regarding the outcome. The panel also discussed that there would be 12 kennel bays at Murray Bridge to accommodate a 12 race program and that there was a 1m rise around the circle track. They were advised that older boxes would be used for the 530m and 680m distances due to the amount of use and rotation of boxes from each track. The panel were also advised that whilst not discussing much around Mt Gambier that they provide significant income to the industry based on how they are managed and their wagering returns. The overall discussion was positive around Time Grading and the need for it to continue however the panel would need to see how this plays out when Murray Bridge comes onto the schedule.

Feature Race Names

The panel were asked to consider and support a change to the Feature Race names of the Xmas Sprint held in December and the Stayer's Cup held in June. The RM requested that both Kate's A Scandal and Bayroad Queen should be recognised on these events as both these greyhounds at certain points during their careers were considered the best greyhound in Australia over the Sprint and Distance. The panel unanimously agreed to change these names effective immediately with Bayroad Queen for the Stayer's Cup worth \$7,000 (Heat to Final) and Kate's A Scandal for the Xmas Sprint worth \$7,000 as a FFA event held in December as a good lead into the SA Sprint Championship.

State Of Origin Match Race Series

The RM advised that he had been working around the concept of Match Racing in South Australia and tabled a proposal to the GRSA Board which they have approved. He advised the GRP of the new feature series and welcomes any feedback -

The series would be held on Thursday 27th September, the in between week of the SA Oaks and SA Derby Finals on Thursday 22nd September and the Group 1 Adelaide Cup heats on Thursday 4th October where we normally do not have any feature races programmed. Generally Victorian dogs trial prior to the Adelaide Cup so GRSA wanted to tap into those greyhounds already being here. It was thought that they would be happy to Match Race rather than trial or compete in a field of 8. The prizemoney is around \$3,500 per Match Race and \$5,000 for overall. Four Victorian dogs will compete against four SA dogs.

GRSA has looked at this as being a hit out for those better dogs leading into the Group 1 Adelaide Cup. The RM had spoken to some Victorian trainers who were very positive about the concept along with the some leading local trainers. It would be promoted as State of Origin [SA V Vic] series.

The panel were very supportive of the series and did ask whether this could be an SA and Vic joint series competing in each state. The RM advised that there was little take up from Victoria and it was mainly about tapping into those greyhounds coming to SA in preparation for the Adelaide Cup.

Changing into SA Ownership when the greyhound is racing in SA

The RM advised the panel that we had a situation where a greyhound was competing in SA, was trained Interstate and was High Grade. The ownership changed from Interstate Ownership into SA Ownership and would now be trained in SA. This greyhound was considered a grade 5 at all other tracks however for the track he had raced at his grade remained the same. This was aligned to the Oakvale Destiny grading consideration previously where she was considered to be an interstate greyhound if she was out of the state for more than 3 months. The GRP were comfortable with this ruling and were happy for this to be a guideline however still wanted the Grader to have some discretion over this if he felt it warranted and alteration.

Automated Grading Procedure

The panel were advised that GRSA is currently working on getting the Grading Process/Order of Preference automated. This should reduce the grading of a meeting from a number of hours to around 1 hour. They advised the panel that when this is ready to be implemented they may need to get some approval from the GRP to remove a couple of items from the Order of Preference to ensure an easy transition. These items would not be considered crucial to the process and would allow a smooth transition of work flow. They panel were comfortable with this process and agreed with the benefits. The panel would be updated in regard to the progress of automation.

6 Month Trialling Policy Alteration

The panel were advised that GRSA Stewards recently undertook a benchmarking exercise with other states around field sizes for greyhounds looking to return to racing after not competing for more than six [6] months. The Stewards view is the spirit of the rule about unraced greyhound for more than six [6] months is to ensure the greyhound is fit to race. In an effort to assist participants, the GRSA Trial Policy was amended, to allow greyhounds which have not raced for more than six [6] months to be able to complete a satisfactory trial as a solo trial. This change will take effect as of 1 June 2018. The provisions of GAR72 and GAR77A still apply. The panel noted this change and appreciated the alteration.

SA Oaks & SA Derby Policy

The panel were advised that GRSA received feedback from both the GRP and ICG in regard to the SA Oaks and SA Derby series. After taking all things into consideration the RM recommend and approved by the GRSA Board that GRSA remain at 27 months for both the SA Oaks and SA Derby series for this year. In making this recommendation the RM took into account the intent of these races being for age restricted greyhounds and at 30 months there are many experienced Group performers eligible. Planning for these races in September is already taking place by trainers so to open the age up would be unfair for participants who have been working around the 27 months age based on the National policy and last year's event.

The RM advised that GRSA would need to advertise extensively locally and interstate about the 27 months age restriction and encourage those young up and coming greyhounds to nominate. He advised that the heats of the SA Oaks will be moved onto the same night as the heats of the SA Derby to give every chance of encouraging local and interstate greyhounds to compete in both series.

The RM advised that when confirming the 27 months eligibility for this year's series that it will flagged to participants that if the series is not supported then GRSA will have no option but to extend to 30 months of age for next year's series, giving plenty of notice if a change is required for next year. The panel understood the reasons for staying with 27 months however some panel members believed that moving to 30 months would quarantee the support of the series.

Angle Park, Strathalbyn and Gawler mixing of Maiden, Grade 6 and Grade 5 over 500m+

The panel was asked about mixing of Maidens with Grade 6's and Grade 6's with Grade 5's when there is not enough to run a full race of each grade over the 500m + distance. The panel were supportive of this for example if there is 6 Grade 6's and 2 Grade 5's then this could be mixed however if the Grade 6 was in the All Tracks Calendar then this should not be done and a 6 dog race conducted. Also this should only be done if only making up 1 race and not a case of the left over dogs from one race being mixed with greyhounds that do not have sufficient nominations to run 1 race. The panel believed the Grader could manage this process in support of 500+ racing at his discretion effective from 1st July 2018.

Grade 5 Heats (left over greyhounds)

The panel were advised when GRSA conduct Grade 5 Heats this can mean that the higher graded may not get a start. The panel were asked should the left over Grade 5 greyhounds be mixed with the higher graded greyhounds. The panel did not believe this was fair to the left over Grade 5 greyhounds. Unfortunately the high grade would have to miss out if insufficient for 1 race with the Grade 5's being reserves for the heats.

Howard Ashton Heats etc to move to Monday Nights in Support of 515m Racing

The panel were asked to consider moving the likes of Howard Ashton Heats, Prelude Heats, St Leger Heats to Monday nights to assist with the 515+ racing on this night which will also free up the Wednesday meeting for other races. With the calendar of racing likely to change the GRP panel were supportive of this change bearing in mind these heats will generally always have vacant boxes due to the GRP committing to give every greyhound a start where possible. This may change to Tuesday instead of Monday in the future when Murray Bridge comes online.

Grade 6 Guidelines

The panel discussed a number of options regarding the Grade 6 conditions mainly affecting the impending introduction of Murray Bridge and also how that will change the scheduling for other venues. A number of proposals were considered however the panel felt the changes should be around the City B Angle Park meeting which will be run on Tuesday under the current proposed schedule when Murray Bridge is introduced and the opportunities at each track.

It was agreed to remove the APM City B condition to allow greyhounds to win a Grade 5 at that venue like at Gawler or APD which will not affect their Grade 6 at other tracks. This will encourage greyhounds to stay in the pool for Monday night racing and also falls into line when Murray Bridge comes on the schedule. The panel determined that it was important for this to start from meetings graded from 1st July 2018 in support of current Monday night racing.

It was also agreed by the GRP to change the condition regarding winning over the different distance for Non SA Bred greyhounds which falls into line with what SA bred greyhounds can do. The outcome being a Non SA Bred Greyhound can win a Grade 6 400m at Gawler Provincial 1 and then win a Grade 6 531m at Gawler Provincial 1. This will count as 2 of the greyhounds 4 wins.

Bearing in mind for example any greyhound that wins a Grade 6 400m, then wins a Grade 5 400m at the venue and become a Grade 4 will not be eligible for Grade 6's over the other distances which has been in place for a number of years.

The panel discussed the number of eligible wins for both Non SA Bred and SA Bred and decided not to make any further changes. They also considered the implications of Grade 6 when Murray Bridge is on the schedule and decided to just add the track to the existing conditions. The panel determined for this to start from meetings graded from 1st July 2018.

388m Racing on Monday Nights for Noting

The panel were advised of the criteria regarding if 388m racing is required to be run on Monday nights which was sent to the GRP and ICG recently. The panel understood the triggers required however were supportive of the changes to programming encouraging more heats and finals and were hopeful that this would not eventuate in the near future.

Correspondence received from Jan Jones

Licenced trainer Jan Jones tabled correspondence to the GRP in regard high grade greyhounds missing out on gaining a start at a certain meeting and also the way races are selected.

The panel were sympathetic of Jan's correspondence in regard to the higher graded greyhound receiving a start but were mindful under a fair grading system that other greyhounds have to be eligible to be in the same race and if not then the race cannot proceed. They advised that changes made over the years allow for a regrade mainly for these greyhounds that need other high grade dogs to race with them at the same meeting. They believed the grader formats the fields as best as possible based on the programming of listed races and that the balance is generally right. The panel asked the RM to respond and thank her for her correspondence.

Late Items

The panel discussed other items at today's meeting.

The panel discussed the option of closing nominations closer to the race date in the hope that this may give the true number of greyhounds wishing to compete. When GRSA extends to the next day generally they receive 15 to 20 nominations extra so the theory around closing closer to the date would be for Monday's meeting as an example which closes on Wednesday, the trainers with greyhounds racing on Wednesday don't nominate until after they compete so closing on Thursday may mean they nominate. We do risk if we have to extend that we are already 1 day short and also form guides having time to be produced however the panel felt there was merit in this being investigated. Automated grading could assist this process with fields being produced quicker. Victoria is looking at this as an option. Interestingly it was brought up that the gallops seem to be going the other way and releasing fields with a longer gap to the events being conducted.

The panel brought up about the GRSA dress code however this was not considered part of their charter and any queries were passed on to the relevant department.

Licensing update

Licensing is in full swing and all participants requiring new licences have been mailed their renewals. Renewals are now due.

Please ensure your licence is lodged ASAP to ensure timely processing. Important information to note:

- To continue to nominate for race meetings in July, you must renew by Friday 22 June
- Trainers should check with their owners (locally and interstate) to ensure they have renewed or this will restrict nominations
- If you have lodged your paperwork and the payment has been processed, you will have been updated in our system within 24 hours – this means you are licensed (even if you do not have your new ID card yet)
- Participants with outstanding items or issues with individual applications will be contacted directly by the Integrity Department
- New ID cards will be mailed out shortly

Veterinary clearances for greyhounds to nominate

Trainers who wish to nominate a greyhound to race that has been stood down pending receipt of a veterinary certificate of clearance, should ensure the veterinary certificate is forwarded to GRSA at least one business day before nominations close.

This will allow sufficient time for processing. If a veterinary clearance is not received by GRSA in a timely manner, processing will not be guaranteed and the nomination may not be accepted.

Timeliness of scratchings

Trainers are reminded to ensure they are aware of and follow the official scratching times.

Recently, there have been couple of instances were greyhounds could have been declared late scratchings due to the tardiness of trainers – this could result in a veterinary clearance being placed on the greyhound at a further cost to connections or the trainer being fined.

Dress code for participants

Participants are reminded to ensure they comply with all requirements of the GRSA Dress Code Policy when parading greyhounds at race meetings.

Angle Park empty out area

A friendly reminder to all trainers and handlers to ensure they pick up after their greyhounds which empty on the grassed hill area at Angle Park during kennelling.

Unregistered persons handling on track

Trainers and owners are reminded of their obligations under GAR 101(2)(a) and (b), which are listed below:

[1] An owner or trainer shall not permit an unlicensed person to-

(a) train, at any place; or

(b) handle on any racecourse,

a greyhound owned by or pursuant to the control of the owner or trainer.

Trialling arrangements for greyhounds unraced for more than six months

Greyhounds returning from six months off from racing can now complete a satisfactory trial solo.

Lodgement of breeding documents

With the removal of fees for breeding documentation I remind participants of the due date for lodgement of documentation under the Rules of Greyhound Racing.

It is imperative that these documents are still lodged on time so GRSA can plan for the future regarding greyhound population.

Notice of Service (within 14 days) Whelping Notice (within 14 days) Litter Registration (within 4 months)

To ensure documents are received by the due dates the following fines have been reviewed and have been increased and will be imposed should documentation be lodged late.

Due date to 4 weeks overdue - \$50 5 weeks to 8 weeks overdue - \$100 9 to 12 weeks overdue - \$150 13 to 16 weeks overdue - \$200 17 plus weeks overdue - \$250

Inquiries and notifications

MY DAD'S DREAM - Review of Stewards Decision 24/05/18 – greyhound MY DAD'S DREAM reported for failing to pursue during an event at Mount Gambier on 20/05/18. An application was lodged for a review. Review of decision found there was insufficient evidence to overturn the Stewards decision. Review was dismissed and the penalty placed on the greyhound stands.

Greyhound Rehoming Obligations resulting in new Local Rules

GRSA has a fundamental responsibility to ensure full rehoming of greyhounds and we have committed to that outcome being delivered. As of 1 May 2018, GRSA will introduce Local Rules ensuring every greyhound in this state has the opportunity to be rehomed. As a result, the only acceptable reasons for euthanising a greyhound in South Australia will be because of serious injury, serious illness, by court order or because of an unsuitable temperament for rehoming (as identified by GAPSA).

In order to accommodate all greyhounds, GAPSA has made significant progress in terms of GAP resourcing, reduced waiting times for foster care and the subsidy for greyhounds on the waiting list beyond six weeks. Testing opportunities have been increased in all parts of the state. Participants have seen these positive changes rolling out for some time. This preparation means that whilst an increase in the number of greyhounds requiring assessment is expected to increase, GRSA is ready to implement the new Rules and be able to ensure all participants are able to comply with the requirements. The impact upon assessment and availability and waiting times will be monitored and resourcing adjusted as required.

GRSA participants should take pride from the fact that our state holds animal welfare at the highest standard and requires, expects and encourages all participants to take responsibility for their greyhounds – during and after racing. Our approach to rehoming is the foundation from which the SA industry can move forward with confidence and respect.

In an effort to provide information about the Local Rules, a number of Frequently Asked Questions have been addressed below:

Q: Why are these Local Rules necessary?

A: GRSA has a fundamental obligation to every greyhound to ensure that it has the opportunity to be rehomed.

Q: What does this mean for me?

A: A majority of industry participants have been doing the right thing and have been rehoming their greyhounds – either through GAP or third parties. If you have been doing this, then it won't affect you.

Q: I have always attempted to rehome my greyhounds with owners or third parties. Can I continue to do this?

A: Absolutely! This is so important and a large number of greyhounds find suitable homes post-racing through the hard work of Trainers and Owners. These numbers contribute to a significant number of rehomed greyhounds.

Q: If my greyhound has been rehomed to a third party, does it need to be GAP assessed?

A: No – we trust Trainers and Owners to ensure they are responsibly rehoming greyhounds to suitable homes. However, we would always encourage the new owner to contact GAP to consider options for obtaining a green collar.

GRSA regularly contacts the new owner of a greyhound which has been retired through a Trainer or Owner as part of its broader tracking requirement. This also gives the opportunity for feedback about the interaction during the rehoming and information about how the greyhound is settling in to their new home.

Q: I am a Trainer. Can I keep my greyhound as a pet myself?

A: Absolutely! The greyhound does not need to be assessed for GAP. Please lodge a Notification of Retirement form within ten [10] working days of the retirement.

Q: I want to retire a female greyhound for breeding. Does she need GAP tested to become a breeding female?

A: No – lodge a Notification of Retirement within ten working days of the retirement. You would then need to apply for a Pink Card which will register her as a breeding female.

Q: What if I have an unraced, unnamed greyhound which will not be suitable for racing? What are my options?

A: The greyhound can be rehomed to a third party. If this is not an option, the greyhound must be assessed by GAP – this will give direction on whether it is suitable to be rehomed by GAP.

Q: What if my greyhound has a serious injury or illness and it needs urgent medical treatment?

A: Your first responsibility is to ensure the greyhound has appropriate veterinary treatment. If in the opinion of the treating Veterinarian that the greyhound injury or illness is so severe that it is in the best interests of the greyhound for it to be euthanised, then this is an acceptable reason. A veterinary certificate of euthanasia (with information detailing the injury or illness) must be provided to GRSA with the prescribed Notification of Euthansed Greyhound form. GRSA will follow-up with the Veterinarian for more information, if necessary.

Q: How long does my greyhound have to stopped racing for before it can be assessed by GAP?

A: A greyhound must have not raced for a period of ten [10] days before being assessed.

Q: My greyhound is aggressive and I know it won't pass GAP. Can I just get it euthanised?

A: No. We all have an obligation as part of the greyhound racing industry to ensure every greyhound is given an opportunity to be rehomed. The greyhound is required to be tested by GAP to assess its suitability for rehoming.

Q: What if my greyhound fails its GAP assessment?

A: The success rate of passing assessments are high. For the small number of greyhounds that fail the testing, GAP staff will provide the Trainer with paperwork detailing the fail. Once in receipt of this paperwork, the Trainer and Owner have the option to euthanise the greyhound without breaching GRSA Rules. A Notification of Euthanased Greyhound form, a Vet Certificate of Euthanasia and the GAP paperwork must be submitted to GRSA within two [2] working days.

Q: What if GAPSA advises me at the first assessment that the greyhound needs to come back for further assessment?

A: The greyhound must then be presented for reassessment. If a greyhound has failed the first assessment but the GAP assessors/ staff have indicated the greyhound should be represented, this must be done in accordance with the timeframe indicated. GAPSA will provide a realistic timeframe for reassessment.

During this period, GAP will provide information on how to work with the greyhound to prepare it for success at its second assessment.

Q: What are my options when a greyhound fails its second GAP assessment?

A: On the second fail, GAPSA will advise the Trainer in writing of the greyhound's unsuitability to be rehomed through the program. The Trainer and Owner will have the option to euthanise the greyhound on behavioural grounds.

Q: What if I can't get an assessment with GAP? Can I euthanise my greyhound?

A: No – you will be committing a breach of the Rules.

Q: What if I choose to euthanise a healthy greyhound without going through the process as specified?

A: The matter will be referred to GRSA Stewards as you may have breached either Local or National Rules. The matter will likely result in a Stewards inquiry. Strong action has been taken in other states for participants who have failed to comply with similar rules – including disqualification of licenses.

Q: The owners told me to euthanise a fit and healthy greyhound as they don't want to put it through GAP. What do I do?

A: A direction of that nature from the owner does not circumvent the requirement to rehome. The Rules state that the Responsible Person is the person who has the care, custody and control of the greyhound. The Trainer will be required, as well as the Owner, to ensure they comply with the relevant Rules.

Q: I have been asked to provide more information in relation to the euthanasia of a greyhound. Do I have to?

A: The GRSA Integrity department monitors the euthanasia rate and reasons for all registered participants. On occasions, participants will be asked for more information or evidence in relation to reasons for a euthanasia of a greyhound. Sometimes this is asked to be provided in a Statutory declaration. If you have been directed to provide this information and fail to do so, you may be in breach of GRSA Rules and your licensing conditions.

Q: Does GRSA has the right to order an autopsy on a euthanised or deceased greyhound?

A: Stewards can order an autopsy, if they believe it is warranted.

Q: Have the timeframes in relation to the reporting of retirement and euthanasia changed?

A: No – the Controlling Body must be notified within ten (10) working days of a retirement and two (2) working days of a euthanasia.

Q: Where do I find a copy of the new Local Rules in relation to Greyhound Rehoming Obligations?

A: A copy is on the GRSA website under Integrity – Rules and Policies. As of 1 May 2018, an updated Rulebook will be available on the website or at GRSA. Information will also be distributed during kennel inspections.

The Golden Rules

Since the introduction of cobalt and arsenic thresholds, all participants should be reminded – in their own best interests – that there are a number of Golden Rules that can help them to avoid making any such breaches (for prohibited substances generally) and which should be adhered to as principles of best practice:

- Always consult your vet to seek guidance in relation to any of the products that you are using, any associated risks and other relevant context
- Review the range of any feeds or supplements that you typically purchase and, wherever it is reasonable to do so, replace products containing substances that could contribute to a threshold breach under the rules (eg. cobalt) with alternative products
- Observe the instructions on any products that you use and adhere strictly to those directions (having regard for prescribed amounts, frequency of administration/application, methodology for administering/applying)
- Ensure a greyhound is never administered any treatment on race day other than as relates to its feeding and drinking requirements [GAR83[A][1] treats this as a specific offence]
- Refrain from the use of injectable treatments (eg. Vitamin B12) to any extent that is practical, including ensuring a greyhound is not administered any injectables the day before an event

Our registered participants have the responsibility to ensure that greyhounds are presented to the track free of any prohibited substances. This information is offered as advice in good faith and should not be relied on as a defence in the event of a breach occurring.



Latest updates from GAP

As previously advised, GAP have been increasing the number of assessments in the monthly schedule.

We continue to look to increase these further in order to offer a wider variety of times to meet participants varying requirements. The following graph depicts the number of assessments that have been occurring on a monthly basis.



We have also been working on reducing the time between assessment and entry into the program. The following graph shows the average monthly waiting times in weeks.



Increase due to three dogs with specific requirements for which foster care took longer. Excluding these, average waiting time was 7 weeks.

Do you have a small dog?



Do you or someone you know have a small dog that could benefit from some socialisation and company during the day?

GAP SA is looking for small dogs to help with their green collar and first point assessments.

Your dog will be well looked after with plenty of pats and treats throughout the day. They will assist with either green collar assessments for dogs that have been living with foster carers or for greyhounds entering the program.

During assessments, greyhounds will be muzzled, on a leash and handled by an experienced assessor and handlers. All dogs will be walked around together in a secure testing area for approximately 5-10 mins to assess the greyhound's reaction to the small dog. If the greyhound is reacting well we will allow them to approach and sniff the small dog.

We are looking for dogs that are generally social and happy meeting other dogs and ones that walk well on a lead. Sessions are rostered at least a month in advance and are generally around two to four hours in length.


Murray Bridge track update

Finish line is in sight! The Murray Bridge project is well over halfway, and onsite you can really see the whole complex starting to take shape.

The Patron Building is at lock-up stage and contractors have started the final fit out of kitchen, bar, office and wet areas. The elevated view of both tracks from the patron building will be spectacular upon completion.

The Kennel House building cladding has almost been completed and the internal fit out is about to commence. The first batch of racing kennels have been received by GRSA and we are eagerly awaiting completion of the Kennel House to place the new kennels inside ready for racing.

Much of the works over the past month have focused on completing the civil works around the complex. This has included the completion of all the external stormwater and detention basins and the mounding of excavated fill and limestone spoil in areas around



the southern part of the property.

Lure rail contractors will be back on site next month to start the completion of the lure rail. The sand has been ordered from GRSA's supplier and we are expecting that it will be placed on the track at some point in August.

Everything is on track for racing to commence some point later in the year and the project is still running on budget.

By Barcia Bale, Mayhem Magic is out of Blue Mayhem, a winner of 12 races and \$23,000 in prizemoney and a litter sister to White Spyro [22 wins and \$60,000], Davis' first Tara Raceway winner in July 2016.

Davis, accompanied on Sunday by his wife Christine, commenced making occasional visits to the Mount Gambier track back in 2016 and rarely makes the five-hour trip home without a winner.

In August 2016 he was at Tara Raceway with Hot Genetics who, despite having whelped a litter to Talk's Cheap some 16 months earlier, won a Masters race over 400 metres in 23.49 seconds.

Six months later one of those pups was at Tara Raceway – Last Outlaw, who later that year was crowned the 2017 Victorian Coursing Greyhound of the Year, winning over 400 metres and upstaging his dam Hot Genetics who had run second in the previous race.

Also performing well for Sonia Davis is Last Outlaw's litter sister Envy Heist, trained by Dailly and a winner of 13 races and close to \$100,000 in prizemoney.

Speaking after the maiden win, Malcolm and Christine Davis said any success they achieve is a direct result of the effort put in by their son Craig and his wife Sonia, who are based at Murrabit, a small river town in northern Victoria.

"They ensure there's continuity by generally breeding three litters a year and rearing something like 20 youngsters at any one time although some of the pups are sent to Queensland to be reared," Malcolm Davis said.

And while various trainers are ultimately used, a couple of pups that will find their way to Altona Green will be from a mating of Spud Regis and Buckle Up Mauve, a litter sister to Buckle Up Wes, 2014 Australian Cup winner and Tasmania's highest-ever stakemoney earner.

QUALIFYING TRIALS - NOW WEEKLY

Angle Park Qualifying Trials are run weekly on Tuesday night, for the corresponding Monday APM meeting and the Wednesday APD meeting. Trainers must be specific on their nominations about which day they are trialling for and what distance. (ie Wed 388m, Mon 515, Mon 600m etc)

Tuesday Angle Park Qualifying dates are:

June 19th (for APM Monday meeting on 25th June – no APD Wednesday meeting on 27th June due to Time Grading meeting)

June 26th (for APM Monday meeting on 2nd July – for APD Wednesday meeting on 4th July)

July 3rd (for APM Monday meeting on 9th July – for APD Wednesday meeting on 11th July)

July 10th (for APM Monday meeting on 16th July – for APD Wednesday meeting on 18th July)

July 17th (for APM Monday meeting on 23rd July – no APD Wednesday meeting on 25th July due to Time Grading meeting)

Nominations close with GRSA at 12.30pm on the Tuesday of the meeting.

NOMINATING ONLINE FOR QUALIFYING TRIALS

For Angle Park, Gawler and Strathalbyn qualifying trials the nominations must be lodged with GRSA by 12.30pm on the day of the meeting. To nominate online however you can only do this up until 11.59pm the day before. Due to a system security policy you cannot nominate on the day for these trials online. Please contact our staff if you have any issues with these nominations prior to them closing.

SINGLE TRIALS

A reminder to trainers that single trials can be booked with two greyhounds however you need to advise when booking of your intention to do this. If you wish to put three or more into this trial then a field trial will have to be booked.

BOOKING NUMBER FOR TRIALS

Participants wishing to book trials are required to ring 8243 7172, this phone line will only be used for trial bookings and will queue participants. By having this one number with participants queuing makes this process to be a more efficient way of booking trials.

There will be NO trials accepted through the normal administration number. To be fair to everyone GRSA will only accept bookings using the new number.

POLICY FOR TRIALS IN PLACE

RACE MEETING TRIAL POLICY

Angle Park Monday & Wednesday along with Gawler Tuesday, Friday and Sunday.

Two fields from the boxes with a maximum of four (4) greyhounds will be conducted immediately following the completion of the kennelling procedure for the Race Meeting.

The following lists the order in which greyhounds will be selected in the event if more than 8 greyhounds nominated.

- 1. Reserves at the Meeting that do not obtain starts.
- 2. Trainers that have greyhounds engaged and are located in an area affected by track closures.
- Trainers that have greyhounds engaged.
- 4. Satisfactory trials.
- 5. Other greyhounds.

PROCEDURE/CRITERIA

- 1. For Monday nights trainer to contact GRSA between 10.00am and 11.00am on the Monday to nominate. Should the Monday be a public holiday bookings are to be made between 8am and 9am on the scratching line.
- 2. For Angle Park Wednesday, Gawler Tuesday & Friday trainer to contact GRSA between 4.00pm and 4.30pm on the day before.
- 3. For Gawler Sunday trainer to contact GRSA between 8.00am and 9.00am on the scratching line to nominate.
- 4. Other than reserve greyhounds Trainers will be restricted to trialling one (1) greyhound unless nominations determine otherwise.
- 5. Stewards allot the Box for the Greyhound.
- 6. Trials will be 515m & 531m in distance as first preference. Other distances considered depending on nominations.
- Greyhounds currently under suspension or not cleared to race are not eligible to be nominated (these trials are conducted as if they are at a race meeting so all greyhounds need to be eligible at nomination time).
- 8. Greyhound registration certificate or cards must be produced at kennelling time.

Trainers with other greyhounds engaged can utilize the extra kennel space until such time they are ready to leave OR trainers with no other greyhounds will be free to leave following their trial.

If there are 12 races at Angle Park or Gawler there will be NO trials.

The Vet Clinic at these meetings cannot be used to accommodate any greyhounds to allow for extra trialling greyhounds. This policy has been introduced so that participants book in under the policy. The Vet Clinic needs to be available for the Vet and Stewards at race meetings

EXCEPTIONS TO THIS POLICY-

- Thursday nights are kept available for the option for Interstate greyhounds to solo trial in a lead up to our Group races and also local greyhound's trialling for Group racing interstate.
- Local greyhounds will be allowed to solo trial in a lead up to a feature race upon request and they will take one of the eight kennels available for trialling ahead of the policy and sit separately to the 4 dog trials. Feature races are considered to be – Adelaide Cup, Gawler Cup, Oaks, Derby, Howard Ashton, Brian Johnstone, SA Sprint, SA Distance Championship, SA Anniversary Cup, SA Country Cup, National Finals & any Group race Interstate.
- Local greyhounds will be allowed to trial on a race night, where they are in preparation for a feature event and nominated for a meeting and the race does not stand up. This will include all distances and also take precedence over the policy.
- If a greyhound qualifies for a feature final and requires a trial in between this will be conducted as a solo trial and sit separately to the 2 four dog trials.

It is extremely important that trainers book in to trial at these race meetings. If unable to book in at these times then please contact GRSA where permission may be given to accept a booking outside of these times. .

Qualifying trials are held every Wednesday for the corresponding Tuesday.
