CEO'S UPDATE

Government Relations

Most of you will have seen a number of articles recently in the newspapers regarding the impact of the Point of Consumption tax and the consideration being given by the State Government to funding of racing when that has not been the norm since the SA/TAB was sold around the turn of the century. There is a relationship between these two matters which is significant for everyone involved in the industry. The introduction of a Point of Consumption tax impacts racing in two key ways – it restricts the opportunity which may have existed for the codes to increase their charging mechanism for corporate bookmakers and it is also capable of affecting the approach that those providers take in relation to the marketing of SA product. Noting, then, that the tax is new revenue which flows to Government directly from racing, the argument has become overwhelmingly compelling for Government to support racing drawing on those reserves. We will be watching this space keenly in the weeks ahead.

G-Six Racing – 6-Dog Racing

From early May, GRSA will commence a trial of 6-dog racing – similar to the standard UK approach – at its three two-turn track venues [Angle Park, Gawler and Mount Gambier]. This is a prime opportunity for our sport to explore the outcomes which arise from a different presentation of the racing product as well as informing future decisions relating to meeting allocations and racing formats. In conjunction with that trial, we will be running more races at each of the existing weekly meetings [up to the limit of 12] and we will be conducting an extra race meeting each week, resulting in two weekly race meetings at each TAB track in South Australia during the trial period which is currently scheduled through until the end of July. This initiative, which has the support of our major business partner Tabcorp, will help to inform us about the wagering appeal of the G-SIX format and the extent to which this type of racing is suited to particular track designs. The greyhounds will jump from boxes 1, 2, 4, 5, 7 and 8 and carry the corresponding rugs for same, with the reserves remaining as 9 and 10.

There will be no reduction in the stakemoney offering for G-SIX events, meaning that the selected race meetings will have more races against fewer opposition for the same stakes. The format, if adopted across the longer term, would drive overall stakemoney growth of more than \$1 million annually directly into the pockets of our owners and trainers. More information will be released on this in the weeks immediately ahead.

2018 SA Stud Dog of the Year

Kalden Komoto - 32

Owner/Stud Master – Ray Murray

Kalden Komoto was awarded the leading SA Sire for 2018. In 2018 greyhounds sired by Kalden Komoto won 32 races. His best performed progeny was Panhandle Slim which won 9 races including the 2018 Gawler Produce and was sent to the Victorian kennels of Seona Thompson with great success later in the year winning 3 races. Other handy performers included Bell Tyson [5 wins], Vincent Tyson [4 wins] and Mossy Oak [4 wins].

2018 SA Brood Bitch of the Year

Victa Victoria - 69

Owner – Ron & Joan Schadow

Victa Victoria won the Brood Bitch of the Year with 69 winners in 2018. Her winners came from the El Grand Senor litter which produced 9 pups. All pups in this litter raced and 8 of the 9 all won races.

Victa Kylie was brilliant over the short course winning 13 races while both Victa Caleb winning the Champion Puppy and Victa Ashley winning the Gawler Sprit Classic matched it with the best sprinters in SA with great success winning 12 races each. Both Victa Suzie and Victa Polly won 9 races each.

2018 SA Breeder of the Year

Joan Schadow – 202 points

This was the ninth time this award was presented and was to recognize the outstanding Breeder in the State for 2018. This award is decided on a point's basis for SA Bred greyhounds that have won races at Sky Racing meetings during 2018 in SA.

Joan had an outstanding year with her brood bitch's Victa Victoria,

Victa Brooke and Victa Explorer supplying a string of winners for the season. Victa Victoria had 1 litter to El Grand Senor which raced and won in 2018 with winners including [Victa Polly 13 wins, Victa Ashley & Victa Caleb 12 wins each]. Victa Brooke also had 1 litter race by Fabregas which produced many race winners including the brilliant Victa Louise [15 wins] who won the SA St Leger but who's career was shortened due to injury. Victa Explorer also had 1 litter race by El Grand Senor and produced Victa Wink [9 wins] and Victa Ollie [8 wins]

2018 SA Owner/Trainer of the Year (Tier 3)

Cameron Butcher - 61

Again Cameron Butcher was the leading Owner/Trainer of the Year with a total of 61 TAB winners in 2018. Cameron had good success with his greyhounds winning many races but his highlight may have been Abuzz smashing the 515m 1st split record by .03 at Angle Park ping out in a sizzling 4.23. Cameron usually races in partnership with his wife Yvonne and daughter Karen. His winners included Abuzz, On Fire, Time's Right, Uptime Girl, Hope's Beau, Jay's Ace and Aiming.

2018 TAB Leading Trainer of the Year

Tony Rasmussen – 168

Tony Rasmussen made it a three peat of awards as he was awarded the TAB leading Trainer of the Year for the third year in a row, with a total of 168 winners at TAB meetings in SA during 2018 increasing from his 157 from last year. Tony received great support again from his wife Lisa who again came third in this year's leading trainer award with 114 wins. The Rasmussen family trained an outstanding 282 winners for the year.

2018 SA Syndicate of the Year

"Riff Raff" Syndicate

Manager – Kim Johnstone

This was the twelfth time that this Award was presented to acknowledge an important part of our industry in Syndication. The "Riff Raff" Syndicate which was formed on 14th November 2014 has had a few member changes but currently includes Matthew Payne, Craig D'Antonio and Ken Gill. This was the third year in a row that this Syndicate has won this award. The Syndicate owned 12 greyhounds in 2018 winning 33 races between them. The main performers were Rachel Zane [9 wins], Harvey Specter [7 wins], Eustace Road [4 wins], Waltharius [3 wins] and Deed [7 wins].

2018 SA City Strike Rate

Kirin Corby – 36.05%

This award was based on performances for Angle Park city meetings [City A/City B]. The trainer also must have a minimum of 20 starters for the year. Kirin qualified mainly through the performance of her star sprinter Fabwik who won 16 races from her 24 starts along with exciting youngsters Sennachie [3 from 3] and Tauwitcherie [5 from 7]. During 2018 Kirin trained 31 winners from 86 starters at city meetings, giving her a 36.05% strike rate.

2018 Gawler Trackstar Award

Jack In Black – 45 starts (20/8/4)

Trainer – Des Hockley

Jack In Black had all 45 starts at the Gawler venue over the 400m journey with his best time being 22.69. He made the final of the Gawler Sprint Classic on Gawler Cup final night in November after winning his heat, finishing in 7th position in the final. He won an amazing 44% of his starts at Gawler and was placed in 71% of races showing his wonderful strike rate and consistency during the year.

2018 Run Of The Year

Honcho Monelli (August)

The Run of the Year was the Tony Rasmussen trained Honcho Monelli for his brilliant performance at Angle Park on Thursday 2nd August. He started a warm favourite in a heat of the National Sprint State series and he didn't disappoint his fans. Beginning fairly from box 7 he raced midfield before making his customary move down the back straight where he swooped upon the leaders in a blink of an eye. He raced away in the run home to win by an ever increasing 8.75 lengths in a sizzling 29.42 for the 515m journey. His splits were 4.54 and 16.86 with a powerful run home of 12.56.

Honcho Monelli won this award based on a combination of the public vote and votes from the GOTY Panel.

Eye Got It claims first cup at new track

It was a fantastic night at the Daish Irrigation and Fodder Murray Bridge Cup on March 17th as classy Victorian sprinter 'Eye Got It' trained by Andrew Paraskevas took out the main event in front of a great crowd.

Eye Got It has now had 3 starts at Murray Bridge for 3 wins and has won 21 from 26 starts overall in what is a very impressive record.

It was a great field contesting the final and when the lids lifted it was Penny Worth for Jessica Sharp that took the early lead with a flying start ahead of the rest of the field. Eye Got It then started to hit his stride and approaching the bend crossed to the rail inside of Penny Worth with a terrific burst of acceleration finding the lead, and once he was there a win never looked in doubt. Private Nangar put in a great run for Troy Murray coming from back in the field to claim second place down the straight from Penny Worth who ran on well to hold third place.

It was great to have Brendan and John from the Daish Irrigation & Fodder team on hand to present the award to Andrew and well done to all connections involved.



Shima Breeze makes it two in a row

Greyhound of the Month award for February went to the Tony Rasmussen trained Shima Breeze, who made it back to back awards in the first two months of this year after she had another great month of racing on the big stage.

Shima Breeze started the month off with a strong win at The Meadows in Grade 5 company running a slick 29.89. She was then selected into a heat of the Group



1 Australian Cup, considered one of the hardest races to win on the National calendar. She ran brilliantly to lead for most of the race before being run down in the shadows of the post by Group 1 Melbourne Cup winner, My Redeemer. Her time of 29.78 was quick enough to

have her declared the first reserve for the prestigious event in early March and with a scratching in the event she took her place with Group 1 company.

At the end of the month Shima Breeze's record stood at 31 starts with 15 wins and 12 placings and earnings around \$85,000.

Victa Ashley take ROTM with terrific heat win



The Run of the Month for February was Victa Ashley for trainer Mike Giniotis for his exceptional win in a heat of the SA St Leger at Angle Park on Thursday, 14th February.

He was brilliant in leading throughout and defeating a quality line up in a sizzling 29.55 for the 515m journey.

He won by 3½ lengths with splits of 4.41 and 16.65.

SA Launching Pad Final

After two fantastic heats we have an outstanding final with the likes of heat winners, Red Rock (29.44) and Bailey Rocks (29.71) doing battle with Alfieri, Fly By Them and Spring Sniper.

This race is for greyhounds that have won 1-4 races and had no more than 28 starts. 2019 Fairthorne Forestry Mount Gambier Cup heats this Sunday

The Mount Gambier Cup carnival kicks off this Sunday with six heats of the 2019 Fairthorne Forestry Mount Gambier Cup along with two heats of The Produce Store Maiden and two heats of the Formula 400 Open series.

On Sunday heats of the Mount Gambier Cup are worth \$1,900 each to be run as races 6 to 11. The Club has drawn together a terrific line up of chasers which include the likes of Murray Bridge Cup consolation winner Nirimba Pirate, highly promising Galactica Athena, slick Angle Park winner Waterloo Monelli, the exciting Pure White Evil, high quality chaser Slingshot Hammer and Horsham Cup finalist Aston It Is, just to name a few.

With only the winners and two fastest second placegetters progressing to the final the racing will be of the highest quality. The box draw will take place on track after the running of the last event.

On Sunday, 31st March the Club will not only feature the \$22,000 Fairthorne Forestry Mount Gambier Cup final it will also feature a \$3,500 consolation of the Cup [which trainers will need to renominate for], the \$2,500 The Produce Store Maiden final, the \$2,500 Formula 400 Final, a \$2,500 The

Tankman 600 Open Feature over 600m along with a \$1,500 Back to Distance Racing stayers event over the 732m. It looks to be a superb two weeks of racing in the South East of the State starting on Sunday.

Pure White Evil shooting for big bonuses at Mount Gambier

GRSA introduced a couple of bonuses to link both the Murray Bridge Cup series and Mount Gambier Cup series this year.

Victorian trainer Andrew Paraskevas is the only trainer with a greyhound still eligible to collect a bonus after his brilliant speedster Eye Got It won the Murray Bridge Cup final last Sunday night. If Pure White Evil can win his heat [race 8] on Sunday and then take out the final, Andrew will collect a \$5,000 trainer bonus for his efforts.

Come On Enzo moves into top 8 for the “SA Easter”

On Monday night Come On Enzo trained by Lauren Harris made a big jump in the standings for the Easter after the son of Fernando Bale and Come On Luann ran a blistering time at headquarters.

He ran 29.61 for the 515m journey elevating him from 17 last week to number 6 this week and putting him right in the mix for our feature match race series over Easter.

The “SA Easter” will be held on Thursday night, 18th April [Easter] at Angle Park. Eligibility for South Australian local greyhounds will be based around the Nationals conditions. They will need to be trained in SA 76 days out of the last 150 prior to the close of nominations. Selection for this series will only be based around winning times at Angle Park. For greyhounds that have run over the 515m at any Angle Park meeting since 1st December, 2018 their fastest winning time will be recognised and put them on the list for selection. Greyhounds will also have an opportunity to trial in an effort to improve their position.

The head to head matches will be decided based on the final listing and nominations. Match 1 will be 1 v 4, Match 2 will be 2 v 3, Match 3 will be 5 v 8 and Match 4 will be 6 v 7. There will be no manual selection from the Grader. The top 4 seeded greyhounds will be rewarded with more prizemoney.

The overall winner of the local Match Race series will be guaranteed a spot in the State of Origin Match race series [SA V Vic] in September so long as it is nominated and eligible to represent SA.

“Easter” match race trialing conditions

Trials will be conducted Thursday 21st March, Thursday 4th April and Thursday 11th April at the Angle Park race meetings over the 515m.

There will be up to eight trials conducted each night, with a maximum of two dogs per trial and a total of 8 greyhounds trialling per night. These trials will be run between races at the discretion of the stewards. Trainers must book these trials with Greyhound Racing SA by 11.00am on the day.

All greyhounds will be eligible to trial, whether on the current list of greyhounds that have broken 30 seconds in winning since 1st December, 2018 at Angle Park to improve their position or haven't won over the 515m from 1st December, 2018. Local eligibility conditions still apply. Each greyhound will only be allowed to trial once in an effort to improve their position or obtain a spot on the list.

SA Distance and SA Anniversary Cup heats this month

Feature racing continues at Angle Park this month with the running of the heats of the SA Distance Championship over 731m and the Bargain Steel Centre SA Anniversary Cup over 515m on Thursday, 28th March.

Both finals will be run the following week on Thursday, 4th April which are open events worth \$14,500 for the Distance with unplaced and \$13,750 for the Sprint with the winner collecting \$10,000. The honour role for both events are a who's who of Greyhound racing with last years winners Ashom Monelli winning the Distance Championship and Cairnlea Jet taking out the Anniversary Cup.

- Nominations close on Monday, 25th March with GRSA at 9.00am.

2019 Gawler Produce – final payment due on 5th April

After the second payment was made in February there are still 86 greyhounds eligible for the 2019 Gawler Produce series which is terrific for the Club and is shaping as another exciting series.

The final is guaranteed at \$22,000 which has a \$7,000 bonus if a greyhound can win both the Produce final in July and the Gawler Gold Cup final in November later this year.

The racing dates for this series will be heats on Friday, 21st June 2019, semi-finals on Friday, 28th June 2019 and the final on Sunday, 7th July 2019.

600m Easter Cup heats coming up on April 11

The \$5,240 heats of the Mixed 3/4/5 Easter Cup will be run over 600m for a \$7,000 final on Thursday, 18th April.

Easter features at Gawler on Easter Monday

Easter racing comes to Gawler next month with both the Gawler Future Stars final and Gawler Easter Sprint programmed on Monday, 22nd April.

The Gawler Future Stars will be conducted as heats for SA Bred greyhounds whelped in 2017 on Friday, 12th April over the 531m with a \$4,000 final on Easter Monday. Also on Easter Monday will be the Gawler Easter Sprint for Grade 4 and Grade 5 greyhounds over the 531m worth \$3,000. It's going to be a terrific night of racing on the Monday night over the Easter break.

- Nominations for the Gawler Future Stars heats close at 9.00am on Monday, 8th April.

Claiming race conditions in a different format

Unfortunately there has been a lack of support for Claiming Races over the last 12 months however at the last ICG meeting it was proposed that greyhounds engaged in a race meeting may be considered to be claimed.

Connections will need to advise under similar conditions of the Claiming events but rather than a race for these greyhounds there will be a list in the race book highlighting which greyhounds can be claimed.

GRSA has finalised the conditions and paperwork is now available at GRSA and on the website. Connections will now have that option available to them for their greyhound to be claimed with it listed in the race book. Please ensure all forms are completed.

Black shorts now available from GRSA

After approval from the ICG, black shorts are now part of the GRSA Dress Code Policy and available for sale from GRSA.

These shorts have the GRSA logo embroidered on the back and are the only ones approved. They cost \$45 and are available in mens and ladies sizes with orders taken if we do not have your size. Black shorts are to be worn with black socks and black shoes. These shorts can be worn at the discretion of the participant at any time.

Repairs to gutters on Angle Road by council have started

GRSA was advised that the City of Port Adelaide Enfield Council have commenced road works from 25/2/19 to 25/3/19 to repair curbs and gutters.

As a result there will be road works on Adelaide Road which will likely affect participants, staff and patrons accessing the Angle Park venue.

Disputes between trainers and owners

The Integrity Department often gets asked to get involved in ownership, abandonment or financial issues between owners and trainers.

Whilst GRSA would like to be able to assist, as these matters are normally civil in nature, it is not for the Controlling Body or the Stewards to get involved with. GRSA's advice for aggrieved parties is to always seek legal advice in these instances.

However, industry should be aware that for many years GRSA has made available a document called a 'Greyhound Service Agreement'. Essentially, it's a template for trainers to adapt to their own circumstances before entering into arrangements with owners. A disclaimer is also listed on the website. This information is available on the GRSA website under 'Industry' then 'Forms'.

Outstanding fines to be paid before licensing time

A number of participants with outstanding fines have recently been advised in writing to finalise these matters.

Given that GRSA is preparing for licensing time, participants are reminded if they have failed to pay fines and do not address the matter, they may be listed as a defaulter or will not be permitted to renew their licences until they become financial.

Mobile phones in kennel house

GRSA wishes to remind participants of their obligations in regards to communication devices.

Mobile phones must be switched off and in no circumstances are to be used while on track, in the kennel house or at any time while handling greyhounds.

The relevant Rule is listed below:

R44 Prohibited use of communication devices

Unless the Controlling Body determines otherwise, an owner, trainer or attendant shall not use in any way, or have turned on, a mobile telephone, mobile communication device or any unauthorised device whilst parading, handling or acting as a catcher of a greyhound or whilst participating in a presentation ceremony or while present in the kennel building or parade area.

Angle Park slipping track use

In the last edition, it was noted the usage of the Angle Park slipping track was being reviewed.

An updated policy relating to the use of the facility is included in

this issue. Users should further note that GRSA is in the process of cancelling a number of old/inactive keys. If you inadvertently are inconvenienced by an access key that no longer works, please attend GRSA reception to arrange a replacement.

Dog registrations

GRSA has been advised by Dogs and Cats Online (DACO) which now is the centralised council dog registration, that the mailout of renewals will be sent out at the end of June.

Deletion of Local Rule

A Stewards notice in relation to the deletion of a Local Rule follows these pages. Please read for further information.

Track tidy at Virginia

The Virginia Club has asked GRSA to remind all users of their grounds and straight track to ensure they are picking up after their greyhounds.

There have been instances recently where many hours have been spent by volunteers picking up dog faeces. Users are reminded CCTV footage is recording 24 hours at the venue so do not risk your membership and access to the track by not adhering to the rules of use.

Inquiries and notifications

MUCHACHOS – Review of Stewards Decision 21/02/19 – greyhound MUCHACHOS reported for failing to pursue during an event at Angle Park on 14/02/19. An application was lodged for a review. Review of decision found it could not be established the greyhound had failed to pursue however, it tired over the concluding stages. Application for review was upheld and the penalty removed from MUCHACHOS' record.

Mr. Gary Lane – Notice of positive sample – greyhound LENA LAKE was found to have CAFFEINE and its metabolites THEOPHYLLINE, PARAXANTHINE and THEOBROMINE in a urine sample following an event at Mount Gambier on 9 December 2018. Inquiry to be scheduled at a date to be fixed.

Angle Park Slipping Track Rules of Use Policy

Please note: The Slipping Track is under 24 hour recorded CCTV surveillance.

1. Any direction or instruction given by a Greyhound Racing SA staff member must be adhered to immediately.
2. Upon request at GRSA Reception, GRSA registered trainers will be issued with a keyfob which will provide access into the trainers carpark to use the Slipping Track. Trainers must show a current GRSA ID card at the time of request.
3. Lost keyfobs will incur a \$20 replacement fee
4. The keyfob is to be used exclusively by each participant and must not be transferred. Any violation of this rule will result in the trainer losing their right to track access.
5. Please respect your fellow participants and keep usage time to a minimum.
6. The slipping track can only be used between the hours of sunrise and sunset as listed at <https://www.timeanddate.com/sun/australia/adelaide>
7. The slipping track will be closed during trial and race meetings listed below:
 - Mondays from 4pm
 - Wednesdays from 4pm
 - Thursdays from 4pm
 - Saturdays from 7am until 10am
8. Greyhounds must be emptied before entering the track in the designated area located on the south side of the trainers carpark.
9. Trainers will be responsible for cleaning up after their greyhounds at all times, violation of this rule will result in immediate cancellation of usage rights.
10. Trainers are able to use GRSA approved drag lures in accordance with the GRSA Approved Lure Policy. Please exercise caution to ensure the sprinkler system is not damaged during the operation of any lure.
11. The provisions of GAR 86B apply in relation to prohibiting the use of any live animal, animal carcass or part of an animal to entice, excite or encourage a greyhound.
12. Any violation of these rules at any time will result in that participant losing their keyfob permanently.
13. GRSA reserves the right to alter or amend this policy at any time.

STEWARDS NOTICE Deletion of Local Rule – Consecutive Day Racing

20 March 2019

GRSA Stewards recently considered the impact of a historical Local Rule being removed from the Rulebook. LR 63[3] prevented greyhounds from competing in an event on consecutive days in South Australia with the exception of greyhounds qualified for semi-finals, finals and two-day coursing meetings.

A national Rule now captures the spirit of this important animal welfare commitment and there are no specific local circumstances for a need for the Local Rule to remain in place.

As a result, GRSA will delete LR 63[3]. This change will take effect as of 1 April 2019.

Trainers are reminded the onus is on them to ensure greyhounds that make it through to semi-finals and finals, will need to manage other nominations to ensure they are not engaged to race on consecutive days. A penalty may be imposed in instances where nominations do not comply with the Rule.

The Golden Rules

Since the introduction of cobalt and arsenic thresholds, all participants should be reminded – in their own best interests – that there are a number of Golden Rules that can help them to avoid making any such breaches (for prohibited substances generally) and which should be adhered to as principles of best practice:

- Always consult your vet to seek guidance in relation to any of the products that you are using, any associated risks and other relevant context
- Review the range of any feeds or supplements that you typically purchase and, wherever it is reasonable to do so, replace products containing substances that could contribute to a threshold breach under the rules (eg. cobalt) with alternative products
- Observe the instructions on any products that you use and adhere strictly to those directions (having regard for prescribed amounts, frequency of administration/ application, methodology for administering/applying)
- Ensure a greyhound is never administered any treatment on race day other than as relates to its feeding and drinking requirements [GAR83(A)](1) treats this as a specific offence)
- Refrain from the use of injectable treatments (eg. Vitamin B12) to any extent that is practical, including ensuring a greyhound is not administered any injectables the day before an event

Our registered participants have the responsibility to ensure that greyhounds are presented to the track free of any prohibited substances. This information is offered as advice in good faith and should not be relied on as a defence in the event of a breach occurring.

Projects Update

Murray Bridge Straight Track Racing

Steriline Racing have recently provided representatives of Greyhound Australia (GA) a full working demonstration of the prototype battery/remote lure system.

The successful test on both tracks confirmed the suitability of the technology for racing. This piece of equipment is the last remaining element to be finalised prior to the commencement of trialling and racing on the new Murray Bridge straight track.

GRSA will now progress to full trials on the straight track with the view of commencing racing on the straight track on Wednesday 8th May, 2019. This timeframe will be subject to Steriline Racing providing a full production model of the lure in the coming weeks. On that basis, the expected schedule on the straight track is as follows:

- Friday 12th April – Commencement of straight track trialling (Friday mornings only)
- Wednesday 1st May – Picnic meeting on straight track
- Wednesday 8th May – First official race meeting on new straight track



Murray Bridge Additional Work

A number of smaller projects are underway or are in planning for Murray Bridge.

These are either projects that fell outside of the original scope of works, or changes to completed infrastructure to assist in logistics/operations. These projects include:

- Additional gates at various points to improve logistics
- Replace temporary fencing along straight with permanent fencing
- Shade sails for the preview and empty out areas
- Additional vehicle shed
- Additional water tank for water security
- Fibre optic cabling to enable connection to the NBN
- Padding to catching pens
- Straight track lure exit fencing
- Water tap near the finish line for greyhounds post-race

Angle Park Lure System

Significant man hours have been spent over the past month investigating and improving aspects of the Angle Park lure system to ensure ongoing reliability. This has included various consultants and experts visiting the track and making recommendations on how to address certain issues such as cable vibration/whip, lure slippage and drive system alignment.

The result of these changes have the system running well at this point in time and the issues seem to have been resolved. Staff responsible are fully aware of the acute need to maintain their preventative maintenance program and inspection schedules, with management ensuring additional oversight to guarantee processes are being followed.

Angle Park HD TV Upgrade

Participants may have noticed improved vision quality at Chaser's restaurant over the past few weeks.

Following the conversion of the Sky Racing signal to high definition (HD), GRSA contractors have replaced old analog modulators with HD equivalents to ensure the system is broadcasting the improved quality vision on course.

Angle Park Track Investigations

GRSA has commenced a process to fully investigate all aspects of the current Angle Park track.

This will include the current construction method, dilapidation of existing infrastructure and the overall design of the circuit. These investigations will focus heavily on how the existing track design compares to modern design standards and research undertaken by the industry over the past few years to establish minimum design requirements.

The exercise will also provide a thorough analysis of injury outcomes at Angle Park over the past 3 years, then compare them to all tracks in SA, Victoria and New South Wales. This will give a sense of where Angle Park sits from a greyhound safety perspective and what can be done to improve the design. A good example of design changes benefitting injury outcomes can be drawn from the changes to the Mount Gambier track camber in mid-2018. These changes have resulted in a 38% drop in major injuries at the track since the works were completed.

The intention of these investigations is to establish if as part of any lure system upgrade, GRSA should consider design changes to Angle Park as part of a broader refurbishment project.



Mount Gambier Kennel House

Investigations are continuing into the refurbishment and redesign of the Mount Gambier kennel house.

The project, which will be co-funded by both the MGGRC and GRSA, will involve removal of the old brick/concrete kennels and replacing them with the stainless steel free standing kennels that are currently in place at Angle Park and Murray Bridge.

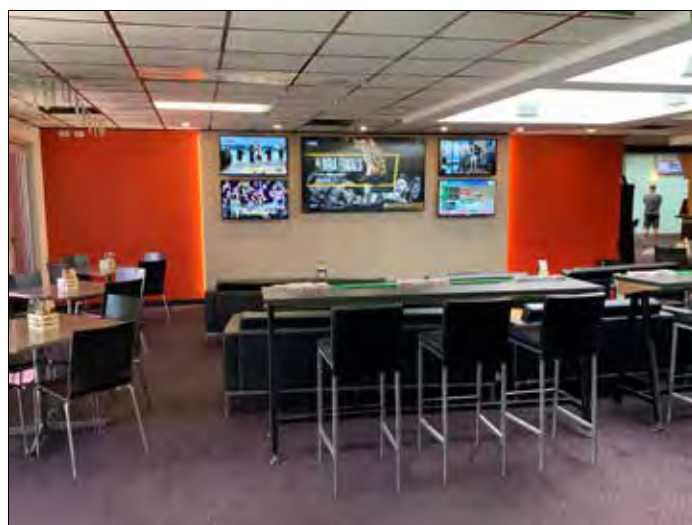
The Mount Gambier Club have prioritised this work at the facility and approached GRSA in late 2018 to ensure the project remained one of significance for industry. It is expected that the GRSA Board will decide at their next meeting the process and the extent of the works to be undertaken on the kennel house at the club.

McQueen's Tavern TAB Upgrade

The acquisition of Tattsbet (UBET) by Tabcorp has resulted in some exciting benefits for the industry.

Not only has there been an increased TAB signage presence at SA tracks, Tabcorp is also investing in the venues themselves. This week the McQueen's Tavern TAB underwent a significant upgrade to the general layout and screen placement, all aimed at improving the customer experience.

It is hoped the changes will result in greater patronage and more money going through the TAB, bar and kitchen. I'd encourage participants to take a look at the changes over a meal and a beer.



Black caps now available from GRSA

Along with the white caps GRSA has now approved that black caps can be worn by participants.

Both black and white caps with GRSA logos are available from GRSA at a cost of \$10.

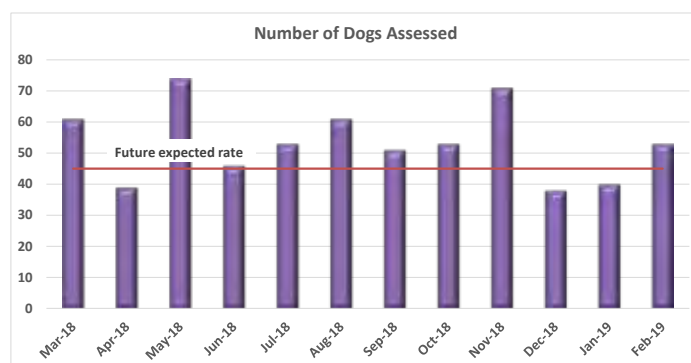

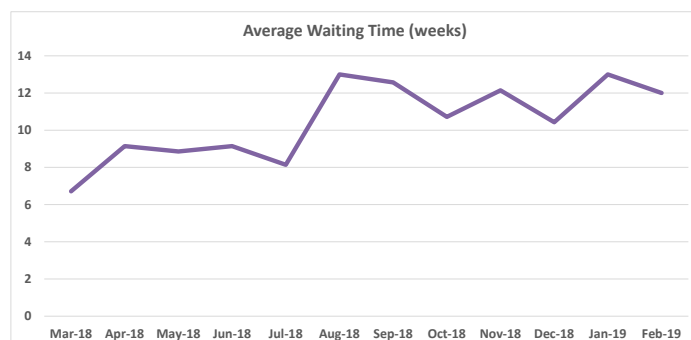
Latest updates from GAP

"Garry and Janel live in some pretty hilly country so his greyhounds are trained on walking machines," McKenna said. "However, after about three months with Zipping Melody he was unable to get her to adapt to the walking machine so he asked me if I wanted to have a go with her.

"As it turned out, I have been able to get her going on my walking machine but really the main reason for her coming down here was as a brood bitch, my wife Carolyn and I are looking to breed a litter with her."

Zipping Melody is by Fernando Bale out of Cho Chang, a winner of 11 races and \$25,000 in stakemoney.

With the likes of Head Honcho, Lion Hearted, Worm Burner, On Fire and last years winner Victa Louise some of the biggest names in greyhound racing on the list, Premier Double's performance suggests he has a very bright future on the track.

Owned and Bred locally by Kirin Corby the Dyna Double One x Irish Keepsake flyer drew box 1 in the feature final and as the start was affected began well to sit just off the pace. Shima Mart for Tony Rasmussen exploded out of the boxes to lead clearly with Jack Get Back for Ken Trowbridge, Victa Caleb for Mike Giniotis and Shimando out wide for Tony Rasmussen all pushing forward to the first turn. With some crowding on the first turn Shima Mart skipped away from his rivals entering the back straight while Premier Double pushed through to second on the inside while Shimando made ground around the outside to third. Both Victa



Ashley avoided trouble for Mike Giniotis and made ground close to the rails while Red Rock was pratted wide but began to chase hard. Off the back straight Shima Mart was full of running and going strongly with Premier Double holding down second ahead of Shimando and Victa Ashley with Red Rock beginning to motor home. Turning for home Shima Mart was beginning to shorten stride with Premier Double charging home and as they hit the line Premier Double was doing a little the better on the outside to win by a neck in a

sizzling 29.62 for the 515m journey. Shima Mart was brave after making all the running while Red Rock was an eye catcher into third along with Love Made Me for Troy Murray who also ran home strongly from a mile back into fourth.

On the dais a very happy Troy Murray paid tribute to the efforts of owner Kirin Corby who bred and reared Premier Double. Premier Double has now won 9 races from his 18 starts and 5 placings with career prizemoney around \$18,000.

ANGLE PARK QUALIFYING TRIALS ON WEDNESDAY NIGHTS

Under the new schedule Angle Park Qualifying Trials will be run weekly on Wednesday night, for the corresponding Monday APM meeting (12 days later due to nominations). With 388m racing now available on Monday nights trainers can qualify for all distances.

Nominations close with GRSA at 12.30pm on the Wednesday of the meeting.

SINGLE TRIALS

A reminder to trainers that single trials can be booked with two greyhounds however you need to advise when booking of your intention to do this. If you wish to put three or more into this trial then a field trial will have to be booked.

BOOKING NUMBER FOR TRIALS

Participants wishing to book trials are required to ring 8243 7172, this phone line will only be used for trial bookings and will queue participants. By having this one number with participants queuing makes this process to be a more efficient way of booking trials.

There will be NO trials accepted through the normal administration number. To be fair to everyone GRSA will only accept bookings using the new number or alternatively logon to trialbooker.com, create an account and book your own trials.

POLICY FOR TRIALLING AT ANGLE PARK AND GAWLER BEFORE THE RACE MEETING

RACE MEETING TRIAL POLICY

Angle Park Monday along with Gawler Tuesday and Friday.

Two fields from the boxes with a maximum of four (4) greyhounds will be conducted immediately following the completion of the kennelling procedure for the Race Meeting.

The following lists the order in which greyhounds will be selected in the event if more than 8 greyhounds nominated.

1. Reserves at the Meeting that do not obtain starts.
2. Trainers that have greyhounds engaged and are located in an area affected by track closures.
3. Trainers that have greyhounds engaged.
4. Satisfactory trials.
5. Other greyhounds.

PROCEDURE/CRITERIA

1. For Monday nights trainer to contact GRSA between 10.00am and 11.00am on the Monday to nominate. Should the Monday be a public holiday bookings are to be made between 8am and 9am on the scratching line.
2. For Gawler Tuesday & Friday trainer to contact GRSA between 4.00pm and 4.30pm on the day before.
3. Other than reserve greyhounds Trainers will be restricted to trialling one (1) greyhound unless nominations determine otherwise.
4. Stewards allot the Box for the Greyhound.
5. Trials will be 515m & 531m in distance as first preference. Other distances considered depending on nominations.
6. Greyhounds currently under suspension or not cleared to race are not eligible to be nominated (these trials are conducted as if they are at a race meeting so all greyhounds need to be eligible at nomination time).
7. Greyhound registration certificate or cards must be produced at kennelling time.
8. Trainers with other greyhounds engaged can utilize the extra kennel space until such time they are ready to leave OR trainers with no other greyhounds will be free to leave following their trial.

If there are 12 races at Angle Park or Gawler there will be NO trials.

The Vet Clinic at these meetings cannot be used to accommodate any greyhounds to allow for extra trialling greyhounds. This policy has been introduced so that participants book in under the policy. The Vet Clinic needs to be available for the Vet and Stewards at race meetings

EXCEPTIONS TO THIS POLICY-

- Thursday nights are kept available for the option for Interstate greyhounds to solo trial in a lead up to our Group races and also local greyhound's trialling for Group racing interstate.
- Local greyhounds will be allowed to solo trial in a lead up to a feature race upon request and they will take one of the eight kennels available for trialling ahead of the policy and sit separately to the 4 dog trials. Feature races are considered to be – Adelaide Cup, Gawler Cup, Oaks, Derby, Howard Ashton, Brian Johnstone, SA Sprint, SA Distance Championship, SA Anniversary Cup, SA Country Cup, National Finals & any Group race Interstate.
- Local greyhounds will be allowed to trial on a race night, where they are in preparation for a feature event and nominated for a meeting and the race does not stand up. This will include all distances and also take precedence over the policy.
- If a greyhound qualifies for a feature final and requires a trial in between this will be conducted as a solo trial and sit separately to the 2 four dog trials.

It is extremely important that trainers book in to trial at these race meetings. If unable to book in at these times then please contact GRSA where permission may be given to accept a booking outside of these times.

MOUNT GAMBIER

The Mt Gambier GRC committee advises that satisfactory trials can be run in the summer months under the criteria below.

1. On race days when there are less than 12 races.
2. On race days with 12 races when the temperature is 30 degrees or less trial can be run before the first race but greyhounds must leave the track straight after the trial to head back to their home kennel.
3. On a Saturday trial session when stewards are available.

These trials will have to be booked in with GRSA in consultation with the Mt Gambier GRC.
