## Fabregal wins 2017 ClassicBet Mount Gambier Cup

Robyn Mackellar's star chaser Fabregal won another feature race when she took out the 2017 ClassicBet Mount Gambier Cup run in the State's South East on Sunday 5th March.

The daughter of Fabregas and Allinga Aye Jay had an outstanding 2016 and kicked of 2017 in fine style with a dominant display. After an early battle to find the front Fabregal raced away from her rivals winning by 2 lengths in a slick 29.78 for the 512m journey. Robyn Mackellar was wrapped with her performance on the presentation dais advising that the Mt Gambier Cup was a race that she had tried hard to win in the past and that Fabregal had allowed her to tick this one off the bucket list. Fabregal has now won 34



races from her 58 starts including 18 placings and prizemoney just under \$160,000.

In terrific news for the Mt Gambier GRC, GRSA Chairman Michael Fabbro announced that as of next year the Mount Gambier Cup Series will be increased to Listed status with the first prize increased from \$7,000 to \$15,000 which is reflective of the hard working committee and growing South East region.

## **Cameron Butcher makes it 4 in a row**

Four was the golden number for Cameron Butcher at Angle Park on the 23rd of February. He won four races on the program and his up and coming chaser On Fire won the SA St Leger giving Cameron the last four St Leger Finals.

Starting the punters elect On Fire began nicely to be handy leaving the front straight with Aston Apollo flying out to lead for Troy Murray. Into second, raced the Jan Jones trained Dream A Little, who looked the main challenger on paper to On fire who was in third spot with the Ken Gill trained Windmill Haze moving to fourth. As the field raced down the back straight both Dream A Little and On Fire moved up ominously to Aston Apollo who was kicking on. Into the front straight both favourites cleared out and in a bobbing finish On Fire got the nod from a gallant Dream A Little with Windmill Haze running into third spot. On Fire ran a sizzling 29.75 for the 515m journey.



Cameron has taken out the last four St Leger finals with star chasers Sidney's Shadow, Coorong Kid and last years winner Worm Burner, all going on to be outstanding sprinters.



## 2017 Gawler Produce – final payment due on 7th April

After the second payment was made in January there are still 69 greyhounds eligible for the 2017 Gawler Produce series which is shaping as another exciting series.

The final is guaranteed at \$22,000 which has a \$5,000 bonus if a greyhound can win both the Produce Final in July and the Gawler Cup Final in November later this year.

\$4,990 Heats of the Mixed 3/4/5 Easter Cup will be run over 600m for a \$5,000 Final on Thursday, 13th April.

Nominations close on Monday, 3rd April at 9.00am with GRSA.

#### SA Distance and SA Anniversary Cup heats in April

Feature racing continues at Angle Park next month with the running of the Heats of the SA Distance Championship over 731m and the Bargain Steel Centre SA Anniversary Cup over 515m on Thursday 20th April.

Both finals will be run the following week on Thursday 27th April which are open events worth \$14,500 for the Distance with unplaced and \$13,750 for the Sprint with the winner collecting \$10,000.

The honour role for both events are a who's who of greyhound racing with Zipping Geoff winning the Distance Championship and Coorong Kid taking out the Anniversary Cup last year.

### Booking on line for Saturday morning trials at Angle Park

#### GRSA will introduce the Online Booking process for Saturday morning trials starting on Saturday 1st April 2017.

Bookings will be taken as per normal by phone and online at 12.30pm on the Thursday before. Like Tuesday night these will be timeslots giving participants guaranteed bookings and allowing a smoother process. Trials on Saturday mornings start at 7.00am as normal with 25 minute blocks likely to go to around 10.30am. GRSA will monitor the bookings and attendance and may vary conditions and timeslots as required.

## Booking of Tuesday night trials at Angle Park

Please be advised to encourage participants to use the online booking facility for Tuesday night trials have opened up for bookings an hour earlier than phone bookings. You will therefore, be able to book online from 11.30am on the Monday prior to Tuesday night trials. Being mindful that when booking online you can only book a maximum of 6 trials and then will have to ring the office from 12.30pm to book the remainder. Our GRSA staff is available to provide support and training for those participants who require it, please contact GRSA to organise.

This came into effect from Tuesday 22nd November trial session.

For participants who wish to continue to book via the telephone please ensure you follow the below directions:

- 1. DO NOT phone prior to 12.30pm as NO calls will be placed on hold and your call will not be answered prior to 12.30pm. By calling prior to 12.30pm you are actually inconveniencing yourself as you may be disconnected or directed to another area as the telephone system will not let you que for a long period of time.
- 2. Ensure you know exactly what type and number of trial/s you require.
- 3. No other queries will be answered to ensure a timely manner of answering the calls that are in que for booking trials.
- 4. Please understand that our staff provides you with the best possible and earliest time available so they will not enter into a debate about the reasons why.
- 5. DO NOT book more trials than required. GRSA will be monitoring this situation and if required action may be taken against offenders.

Owners can direct prizemoney to GAP on the Prizemoney Reimbursement forms. GRSA has made this change on the forms where Owners can direct a percentage of prizemoney to GAP.

#### **From the Stewards**

## Participant education – greyhound workshops

We have been really pleased with the feedback that has come from the recent greyhound workshops and the spirit in which this project was received by participants.

This training format remains a condition of Trainer renewals from the middle of this year. 252 licenced Trainers attended 49 workshops.

The process was undertaken through Racing Queensland as a Registered Training Organisation (RTO) and the only such provider in the country at the time. Recently, RQ's status as an RTO has been revoked following an external audit. GRSA will be issuing Certificates of Attendance (via mail) to all participants involved as opposed to Certificates of Attainment. Whilst that is a disappointing outcome, it does nothing to devalue the worth of the exercise or the fact that the South Australian industry can lay claim to being only the second State to roll-out such a program. GRSA thanks, in particular, Jane McNicholl, Gabrielle Passlow and Renee Colquhoun for the critical role that they played in delivering these sessions.

Going forward, all participants looking to obtain a Trainer's licence will have to undergo similar workshops to show their competencies in caring for and training greyhounds. This will be a condition of their licence and plans are still being finalised in relation to how GRSA rolls out these workshops.

## **Treatment record books**

All Trainers are reminded to ensure that treatment records are completed and kept up to date as per GAR 84A. Official GRSA treatment record books are available from Angle Park at no cost or can be downloaded from the GRSA Website.

Staff from the Animal Welfare Department will continue to inspect these records during all kennel inspections.

The relevant Rule is below:

R84A Treatment records to be kept

(1) The person in charge of a greyhound must keep and retain records detailing all vaccinations, antiparasitics and medical treatments administered to a greyhound from the time the greyhound enters their care until the greyhound leaves their care and for a minimum of two (2) years. Such record of treatment must be produced for inspection when requested by a Steward or a person authorised by the Controlling Body. Any person responsible for a greyhound at the relevant time who fails to comply with any provision of this rule shall be guilty of an offence.

(2) Each record of treatment kept in accordance with this rule must, as a minimum requirement, include the following information:

- a) Name of the greyhound;
- b) Date of administration of the treatment;
- c) Name of the treatment (brand name or active constituent);
- d) Route of administration;
- e) Amount given;
- f) Name and signature of person or persons administering and/or authorising treatment.
- (3) For the purposes of this rule "treatment" includes:
- a) All Controlled Drugs (Schedule 8) administered by a veterinarian;
- b) All Prescription Animal Remedies and Prescription Only Medicines (Schedule 4);
- c) Any injectable substance not already specified in this Rule;
- All Pharmacist Only (Schedule 3) and Pharmacy Only (Schedule 2) medicines;
- e) All veterinary and other substances containing other scheduled and unscheduled prohibited substances.

## **Prohibited substances**

Some participants have recently requested further information in relation to race day treatment, cobalt, arsenic and the treatment and dietary regimes for the greyhounds within their care. The following pages which are readily available releases and information sheets from GA and GRV should provide a fairly comprehensive summary to guide participants on this front.

Most importantly, GRSA will always encourage trainers to always consult with their veterinary surgeon in relation to any products with which they may have concern or queries and always follow manufacturer instructions (and these guidelines) in relation to any treatments, supplements or other dietary intakes.

#### Acknowledgement of swab analysis

GRSA reminds Trainers when having a swab performed, they need to sign the 'Acknowledgement of Swab Analysis' form if they would like the prizemoney paid prior to the swab being tested. If the form is not signed, prizemoney will be held until results have returned negative from the laboratory.

#### **Inquiries and notifications**

**Mr. Tracie Price** – Notice of positive swab – greyhound FLYING FLUTTER was found to have PHENOBARBITONE in a urine sample following an event at Mount Gambier on 1 January 2017. Inquiry to be scheduled at a date to be fixed.

**Mr. Kelvin Stott** – Racing Appeal Tribunal 02/02/17 – GAR 83(2) failed to present the greyhound DOLCE NERO free of any prohibited substances EPHEDRINE, PSEUDOEPHEDRINE, PHENYLPROPANOLAMINE (NOREPHEDRINE) and CATHINE (NORPSEUDOEPHEDRINE) for an event at Gawler on 14 February 2016. Mr. Stott's appeal was dismissed and the penalty of three (3) months disqualification and a fine of \$750 stands.

**Mr. Todd Kelly** – Stewards inquiry 16/02/17 and 20/02/17 – GAR 83(2) failed to present the greyhound IT'S NO MYTH free of any prohibited substances (AMPHETAMINE) for an event at Gawler on 6 October 2016. Mr. Kelly was disqualified for a period of fifteen (15) months and fined \$5,000. In addition, IT'S NO MYTH was disqualified from the race. Mr. Kelly has lodged an appeal.

**Ms. Amanda Darmanin** – Stewards inquiry 19/01/17 – GAR 86(o) – negligence in that she left greyhounds unattended in her trailer following the Mount Gambier race meeting on 22 January 2017. Ms. Darmanin had her licence suspended for a period of one (1) month and fined \$350.

#### **Restrictions on Raceday Treatment to be introduced into the Greyhounds Australasia Rules**

An essential principle of greyhound racing is that greyhounds are to compete free of prohibited substances to ensure a level playing field for all participants.

To assist this, on 1 September 2015, Greyhounds Australasia will introduce restrictions on race day treatment of greyhounds within GAR 83A as follows:

"(1) No person without the permission of the Stewards may administer or cause to be administered any treatment to a greyhound at any time on the day of the meeting until that greyhound is no longer presented for an Event.

(2) The Stewards may order that any greyhound that has been administered a treatment in contravention of sub-rule (1) of this Rule be withdrawn from an Event.

For the purposes of this Rule "treatment" includes:
a) All Controlled Drugs (Schedule 8) administered by a veterinarian;
b) All Prescription Animal Remedies and Prescription Only Medicines (Schedule 4);
c) Any injectable substance not already specified in this Rule;
d) All Pharmacist Only (Schedule 3) and Pharmacy Only (Schedule 2) medicines;
e) All veterinary and other substances containing other scheduled and unscheduled prohibited substances."

Therefore no "treatment" can be given to a greyhound on race day (i.e. the calendar day from 12:00am or midnight) until it is removed from the racecourse after the completion of that Event with the permission of the stewards pursuant to Rule 42(2) or is scratched with the permission of the stewards.

Where a "treatment" is required to be given daily e.g. oestrous suppression, this can be given after the greyhound has completed its engagement in an Event and left the racecourse.

The officiating Veterinary Surgeon has the permission of Stewards to treat greyhounds on the racecourse as required in conducting their official duties.

Importantly no injectables, controlled drugs (S8), prescription medicines (S4), pharmacist only (S3) or pharmacy only (S2) medicines, or other prohibited substances should be given to greyhounds on race day under any circumstances.

Only normal feeding and supplementation that can be achieved by the greyhound voluntarily eating or drinking can be considered acceptable on the day of racing.

#### Feeding

Great care and vigilance must be taken in the feeding and training of greyhounds to ensure they are free of prohibited substances, including that any prohibited substances are not administered 'accidentally'. It is the responsibility of participants to carefully consider the use of any food to make sure that all greyhounds are free of prohibited substances.

Evidence at past RADB hearings has suggested that the potential for feeding contaminated meat is a real concern and may occur when livestock are treated with medication shortly before death. These animals often end up at the knackery, where the meat is processed as 'unfit for human consumption' and is sold on as pet food. Offal such as liver or kidneys may have increased concentrations of drugs and feeding carries increased risk and should be avoided.

GRV does not support the feeding of 'unfit for human consumption meat' and participants who choose to do so take the risk that prohibited substances may be inadvertently administered.

Participants could consider feeding 'cleaner' meat (i.e. 'human consumption grade', chicken or kangaroo meat) or no meat (using a commercial complete dry food).

It is understood that some participants choose to feed knackery meat (unfit for human consumption), other than a minimum of 72 hours prior to racing. GRV warns, however that some substances (such as anaesthetic agents) are permanently banned prohibited substances and therefore must never be present in a greyhound, including during out-of-competition testing. GRV does not support the feeding of bread or other baked goods containing poppy seeds, as they may result in a positive morphine swab. Morphine is a permanently banned prohibited substance and therefore must never be present in greyhounds (except where therapeutic exemptions exist as per GAR 79A(6).

The feeding of substances containing chocolate, liquids containing tea and/or coffee, various supplements and products from 'health food shops' should also be very carefully considered prior to choosing to administer them to your greyhound.

If something appears too good to be true it often is. From time to time various products are advertised or promoted as being beneficial to the health or potential of racing greyhounds. Irrespective of any of these claims, GRV reiterates previous warnings and information for all participants - to ensure that great care and vigilance is exercised in the preparation of greyhounds for racing. It is the responsibility of participants to carefully consider the use of any product, including health products or additives to make sure that all greyhounds are free of any prohibited substances.

GRV accepts no responsibility for any information conveyed via advertisements appearing in any publication. GRV does not independently ascertain whether any claims made in an advertisement are factual or scientifically based, nor does it make any representation as to the capability, abilities or reputation of any and/ or trainers mentioned in advertisements.

## Veterinary treatment for therapeutic purposes

Participants should ensure their greyhounds are only treated with medications dispensed and prescribed for a particular greyhound, by a registered Veterinarian. Veterinary advice should always be sought to ensure these medications are being used properly and appropriate withholding periods followed to ensure presentation of the greyhound free of a prohibited substance.

Participants appearing before the RADB often seek to rely upon veterinary advice as an excuse, however the fact remains that the participant has the ultimate responsibility; i.e. incorrect veterinary advice does not constitute a shield when a greyhound in presented with a prohibited substance. Participants must ensure that detailed and accurate records of veterinary prescribed treatments.

Prohibited substance withholding guidelines have been produced by Greyhounds Australasia for a number of genuine therapeutic substances and are available on their website (*www.galtd.org.au*). However, over time, available medications develop and change, as do analytical processes to detect these medications. Persons using information from these studies, any other equivalent studies or withholding guidelines provided by veterinarians or pharmaceutical companies, should carefully interpret the information provided and should always regard to the individual characteristics of any greyhound being treated.

The results of any of these studies should only be relied upon as a guide, as excretion studies are very expensive to perform and may involve an inadequate number of greyhounds. Participants must take account of the natural variation between greyhounds and their ability to metabolise and excrete different medications and their breakdown products at different rates. In addition to the period of detection of each medication reported, a 'safety margin' of extra time should be employed.

Elective testing for a specific prohibited substance could also be considered. For information on elective testing kits, go to *fasttrack.grv.org.au/StewardsHearing/ ElectiveSwabKits* or call the GRV Integrity Department on (03) 8329 1152.

#### Human medications

Participants must be vigilant regarding the use of non-veterinary, human and over-thecounter products that can carry an inherent risk of offending under the relevant rules of greyhound racing. In particular, GRV has seen a number of participants which have presented greyhounds with prohibited substances that they have administered to themselves – e.g. cough Iollies, heart medication, anti-inflammatories, illicit drugs, etc.

Many drugs used by humans can stay on their hair or skin and be excreted in sweat, saliva, urine or faeces and find their way into the greyhound's system. If you are on medication, use gloves to mix the greyhound's meal, don't allow your greyhound to lick your skin, don't urinate around the kennels and don't store your medication within your kennelling areas.

#### **General Alerts**

From time to time the GRV Integrity Department releases important information in relation to new policies, guidelines and any other 'Steward' related matters. This information can be found on the FastTrack website under the 'Stewards' tab and then selecting the 'General Alerts' page.

All participants are encouraged to regularly review the GRV's General alerts to ensure they are kept up-to-date with any changes to the rules and the release of further guidance on this and other matters. It should be reiterated that whilst GRV will make every endeavour to ensure that information is disseminated in a timely manner, the onus is on you - the participant - to ensure you are aware of and understand the rules and expectations of participating in our great sport.



#### Additional information for trainers - Cobalt use in greyhounds

Cobalt is a naturally occurring trace element that is normally present in greyhounds at very low levels as a result of normal dietary intake. Cobalt is also present in the structure of vitamin B12 (cyanocobalamin).

On 1 September 2015, Greyhounds Australasia will introduce a urinary threshold for cobalt of 100 ng/mL within GAR 83 (10) (see Warning – Cobalt use in greyhounds)

Trainers are advised to be extremely cautious using products that contain cobalt close to racing as this may inadvertently lead to a rise in urinary cobalt levels. Compliance with GAR 83A Raceday Treatment (see Warning – Raceday treatment) will minimise the risk of inadvertently exceeding the threshold, however a greater withholding period will be required for some substances, particularly injectable products.

This threshold has been determined following a national population survey that measured urinary cobalt levels in 762 greyhounds sampled on race day. The median value was 3.44 ng/mL and 74% of samples were below 10 ng/mL. It has been set at 100 ng/mL to allow for a robust margin of safety with normal amounts of cobalt supplementation through routine nutritional sources.

Trainers are advised that the **administration**, **particularly by injection and on multiple occasions** or at larger 'off-label' doses, or in combination with other cobalt containing products, of certain registered 'supplements' close to racing may result in a level of cobalt in a subsequent sample that exceeds this threshold. Trainers are therefore advised to avoid the use of these supplements close to racing.

While there is generally no medical indication for cobalt supplementation in a healthy greyhound fed a balanced diet, where veterinary advice indicates these supplements are required, they should be given following the labeled advice of the manufacturer and ensure an adequate withholding period is followed prior to racing.

Examples of injectable vitamin supplements that contain cobalt and/or vitamin B12 include: V.A.M., Hemo-15, Hemoplex, Amino-lite 34X, Kynoselen, Tripart, Coforta, Folic Acid and Vitamin B-12, Dynajec and Cophos B. Various parasiticides, drenches and oral haematinics also contain cobalt.

Possession of these registered products is acceptable if appropriately obtained and labeled in accordance with GAR 84(2). Possession of highly concentrated cobalt salts may be considered a breach of GAR 79A(7).

#### Administration study results:

This information is made available to participants, in order to assist them to comply with the rules. The detection times are not withdrawal times and should not be construed as such. There are many relevant factors in relation to any substance that could give rise to unpredictable and prolonged excretion times including:

- An animal's general health status, its physiology, metabolism, hydration status, fitness level, training regime, nutritional and dietary supplementation and concurrent medical treatment.
- Dose rate (i.e. the amount given per kg) a higher dose will take longer to remove from the body system and could be detrimental to the dog's health. Combining similar supplements may also increase the dose rate as each may contain cobalt.
- Treatment duration and frequency (i.e. how long a supplement is given for and how often) a cumulative effect could occur where supplements are given for extended periods, particularly when this is against the directions of the manufacturer ('off-label').
- Route of administration (i.e. orally or by injection) injection of cobalt supplements will lead to much greater levels of cobalt and therefore requires greater withholding periods prior to racing than orally administered cobalt. Oral administration of some highly concentrated products will still lead to a breach of the cobalt threshold and require an adequate withholding period.
- Pharmaceutical preparation (i.e. how much cobalt it contains) different cobalt salts contain different amount of cobalt. The preparations may also have different properties that result in e.g. different rates of absorption.

Careful consideration of the above factors and adequate veterinary advice is important prior to administering cobalt containing substances, particularly by injection. More conservative withdrawal times may need to be implemented.

#### The following admin studies were performed on 6 greyhounds:

#### VAM® Paste

VAM<sup>®</sup> Paste (CEVA) is a commercially available product registered as a supplement (vitamins, amino acids and minerals) paste. The cobalt salt is cobalt sulfate (240  $\mu$ g/mL) and contains cyanocobalamin (150  $\mu$ g/mL). This is equivalent to around 98  $\mu$ g/mL of cobalt. The manufacturer's recommended dose rate in dogs is 0.25-1mL per 10kg bodyweight, twice weekly, administered orally.

**Dose administered:** 1mL/10kg, administered orally on two occasions on alternate days. This is equivalent to a dose rate of  $24 \mu g/kg$  of cobalt sulfate.

**Results:** Cobalt levels detected above the 100 ng/mL threshold (maximum 317 ng/mL) for up to 6 hours after the second dose, but did not return to resting levels for 24 hours. A cumulative effect may occur with this product. A minimum withholding period of 24 hours is suggested.

#### VAM® Injection

VAM<sup>®</sup> Injection (CEVA) is a commercially available product registered as a supplement (vitamins, amino acids and minerals) injection. The cobalt salt is cobalt sulfate (240  $\mu$ g/mL) and contains cyanocobalamin (150  $\mu$ g/mL). This is equivalent to around 98  $\mu$ g/mL of cobalt. The manufacturer's recommended dose rate in dogs is 0.25-1mL per 10kg bodyweight, twice weekly, administered intramuscularly.

**Dose administered:** 1mL/10kg, administered intramuscularly on two occasions on alternate days. This is equivalent to a dose rate of 24  $\mu$ g/kg of cobalt sulfate

*Results:* Cobalt levels detected above the 100 ng/mL threshold (maximum 6523 ng/mL) for up to 48 hours after the second dose, but did not return to resting levels for at least 72 hours. A cumulative effect may occur with this product. A minimum withholding period of 96 hours is suggested.

#### Hemo-15® Injection

Hemo-15<sup>®</sup> (Virbac) is a commercially available product registered as a supplement (iron, amino acid and B-vitamin) injection. The cobalt salt is cobalt gluconate (0.7 mg/mL) and contains cyanocobalamin (150  $\mu$ g/mL). This is equivalent to around 99  $\mu$ g/mL of cobalt. The manufacturer's recommended dose rate (in horses) is 1mL per 50kg of bodyweight, administered intravenously.

*Dose administered:* 1mL, administered intravenously, once per day for three days. This is equivalent to a dose rate of 20  $\mu$ g/kg of cobalt gluconate, based on a 35kg dog.

**Results:** Cobalt levels detected above the 100 ng/mL threshold (maximum 1350 ng/mL) for up to 24 hours after the third dose, but did not return to resting levels for 48 hours. A cumulative effect may occur with this product. A minimum withholding period of 48 hours is suggested.

#### GAR 83 (10) Cobalt threshold – Frequently Asked Questions

Q. What is the cobalt threshold?

#### A. The threshold is 100 nanograms per millilitre of urine.

The urinary cobalt threshold has been determined following a national population survey that measured urinary cobalt levels in 762 greyhounds sampled on race day. The median value was 3.44 ng/mL and 74% of samples were below 10 ng/mL. It has been set at 100 ng/mL to allow for a robust margin of safety with normal amounts of cobalt supplementation through routine nutritional sources.

#### Q. What is cobalt?

A. Cobalt is a naturally occurring trace element that is normally present in greyhounds at very low levels as a result of normal dietary intake. Cobalt is present in the structure of vitamin B12 (cyanocobalamin).

Cobalt is an inducer of hypoxia-like responses, which are capable of inducing gene modulation at the hypoxia inducible factor pathway to increase erythropoietin expression and therefore its potential abuse as a blood doping agent in racing must be controlled.

Vitamin B12 is a water-soluble vitamin with a key role in the normal functioning of the brain and nervous system, and for the formation of blood. It is involved in the metabolism of every cell of the body, especially affecting DNA synthesis and regulation, as well as fatty acid synthesis and energy production.

Vitamin B12 and deficiency is not common in dogs. On a feed basis, the Association of American Feed Control Officials (AAFCO, 2007) recommended 22  $\mu$ g of Vitamin B12 per kg of food on a dry matter basis for all classes of dogs i.e. approximately 1  $\mu$ g of cobalt per kg of dry dog food. Therefore feeding of normal commercially available, nutritionally balanced and respected dry foods (kibbles) will not lead to urinary cobalt levels exceeding the threshold.

### Q. Could I breach the threshold with registered vitamin supplements in feed or by injection?

#### A. Yes.

Trainers should be extremely cautious using products that contain cobalt close to racing as this may inadvertently lead to a rise in urinary cobalt levels. Compliance with GAR 83A Raceday Treatment will minimise the risk of inadvertently exceeding the threshold, but a greater withholding period is required for some substances, particularly injectable products.

Administration, particularly by injection and on multiple occasions or at larger 'off-label' doses, or in combination with other cobalt containing products, of certain registered 'supplements' close to racing may result in a level of cobalt in a subsequent sample that exceeds this threshold.

Q. How much Cobalt is in Vitamin B12?



A. Cyanocobalamin is approximately 4.35% Cobalt Hydroxycobalamin is approximately 4.38% Cobalt

For example: 1000  $\mu$ g/mL of Cyanocobalamin equals 43.5  $\mu$ g/mL of Cobalt and 1000  $\mu$ g/mL of Hydroxycobalamin equals 43.8  $\mu$ g/mL of Cobalt.

- Q. How much Cobalt is in various Cobalt salts?
- A. Cobalt Sulphate is approximately 38.02% Cobalt Cobalt Gluconate is approximately 13.21% Cobalt Cobalt Carbonate is approximately 49.55% Cobalt Cobalt Chloride is approximately 45.39% Cobalt

For example: 1000  $\mu$ g/mL of Cobalt Sulphate equals 380.2  $\mu$ g/mL of Cobalt; and 1000  $\mu$ g/mL of Cobalt Gluconate equals 132.1  $\mu$ g/mL of Cobalt; and 1000  $\mu$ g/mL of Cobalt Carbonate equals 495.5  $\mu$ g/mL of Cobalt; and 1000  $\mu$ g/mL of Cobalt Chloride equals 453.9  $\mu$ g/mL of Cobalt.

- Q. Will GRV tell us what our level was from our last swab?
- A. No.

While it could be argued that in publishing results trainers can be more cautious and review their husbandry methods if approaching the threshold thereby reducing the chances of a positive swab, GRV through its Integrity Council decided against publishing its cobalt results. In not publishing the results trainers will be more cautious and are not lulled into a false sense of security if one result returns negative but most importantly do not change their prerace routines to get closer to the threshold and increase the risk of getting a positive swab.

Q. How long will Cobalt swab positive for?

A. As with any substance this depends on a number of factors listed below and veterinary advice is recommended prior to administering any of these products. As a general rule avoid the administration of cobalt by injection within 48 hours of racing and orally after the evening meal prior to race day. However many factors must be considered and some substances will swab positive for more or less time.

It is important to clarify that detection times are not withdrawal times and should not be construed as such. There are many relevant factors in relation to any substance that could give rise to unpredictable and prolonged excretion times including:

- An animal's general health status, its physiology, metabolism, hydration status, fitness level, training regime, nutritional and dietary supplementation and concurrent medical treatment.
- Dose rate (i.e. the amount given per kg) a higher dose will take longer to remove from the body system and could be detrimental to the dog's health. Combining similar supplements may also increase the dose rate as each may contain cobalt.
- Treatment duration and frequency (i.e. how long a supplement is given for and how often) a cumulative effect could occur where supplements are given for extended periods, particularly when this is against the directions of the manufacturer ('off-label').
- Route of administration (i.e. orally or by injection) injection of cobalt supplements will lead to much
  greater levels of cobalt and therefore requires greater withholding periods prior to racing than orally
  administered cobalt. Oral administration of some highly concentrated products will still lead to a breach
  of the cobalt threshold and require an adequate withholding period.



• Pharmaceutical preparation (i.e. how much cobalt it contains) – different cobalt salts contain different amount of cobalt. The preparations may also have different properties that result in e.g. different rates of absorption.

Careful consideration of the above factors and adequate veterinary advice is important prior to administering cobalt containing substances, particularly by injection. More conservative withdrawal times may need to be implemented.

Q. What products have been studied?

#### A. Hemo-15 injection, VAM paste and VAM injection.

#### VAM® Paste

VAM<sup>®</sup> Paste (CEVA) is a commercially available product registered as a supplement (vitamins, amino acids and minerals) paste. The cobalt salt is cobalt sulfate (240  $\mu$ g/mL) and contains cyanocobalamin (150  $\mu$ g/mL). This is equivalent to around 98  $\mu$ g/mL of cobalt. The manufacturer's recommended dose rate in dogs is 0.25-1mL per 10kg bodyweight, twice weekly, administered orally.

**Dose administered:** 1mL/10kg, administered orally on two occasions on alternate days (6 dogs). This is equivalent to a dose rate of 24  $\mu$ g/kg of cobalt sulphate and 15  $\mu$ g/kg of cyanocobalamin or 293  $\mu$ g of cobalt PO to a 30 kg greyhound.

**Results:** Cobalt levels detected above the 100 ng/mL threshold (maximum 317 ng/mL at 4 hours) for up to 6 hours after the second dose, but did not return to resting levels for 24 hours after the second dose. A cumulative effect may occur with this product.

Minimum withholding period: A minimum withholding period of 24 hours is suggested.

#### VAM® Injection

VAM<sup>®</sup> Injection (CEVA) is a commercially available product registered as a supplement (vitamins, amino acids and minerals) injection. The cobalt salt is cobalt sulfate (240  $\mu$ g/mL) and contains cyanocobalamin (150  $\mu$ g/mL). This is equivalent to around 98  $\mu$ g/mL of cobalt. The manufacturer's recommended dose rate in dogs is 0.25-1mL per 10kg bodyweight, twice weekly, administered intramuscularly.

**Dose administered:** 1mL/10kg, administered intramuscularly on two occasions on alternate days (6 dogs). This is equivalent to a dose rate of 24  $\mu$ g/kg of cobalt sulphate and 15  $\mu$ g/kg of cyanocobalamin or 293  $\mu$ g of cobalt IM to a 30 kg greyhound.

**Results:** Cobalt levels detected above the 100 ng/mL threshold (maximum 6523 ng/mL) for up to 48 hours after the second dose, but did not return to resting levels for at least 72 hours after the second dose. A cumulative effect may occur with this product.

Minimum withholding period: A minimum withholding period of 96 hours is suggested.



#### Hemo-15® Injection

Hemo-15<sup>®</sup> (Virbac) is a commercially available product registered as a supplement (iron, amino acid and Bvitamin) injection. The cobalt salt is cobalt gluconate (0.7 mg/mL) and contains cyanocobalamin (150  $\mu$ g/mL). This is equivalent to around 99  $\mu$ g/mL of cobalt. The manufacturer's recommended dose rate (in horses) is 1mL per 50kg of bodyweight, administered intravenously.

**Dose administered:** 1mL, administered intravenously, once per day for three days (6 dogs). This is equivalent to a dose rate of 23  $\mu$ g/kg of cobalt gluconate and 5  $\mu$ g/kg of cyanocobalamin or 99  $\mu$ g of cobalt IV to a 30 kg greyhound.

**Results:** Cobalt levels detected above the 100 ng/mL threshold (maximum 1350 ng/mL) for up to 24 hours after the third dose, but did not return to resting levels for 48 hours after the third dose. A cumulative effect may occur with this product.

*Minimum withholding period:* A minimum withholding period of 48 hours is suggested.

Q. How much Cobalt is in this oral product and how long will it swab for?

A. This depends on a number of factors listed above and the minimum suggested withholding period is only a guideline. Veterinary advice is recommended prior to administering any of these products. A number of products are listed below and give the amount of Cobalt administered to a 30kg greyhound if manufacturer's maximum dosage recommendation is followed.

Q. How much Cobalt is in this injectable product and how long will it swab for?

A. This depends on a number of factors listed above and the minimum suggested withholding period is only a guideline. Veterinary advice is recommended prior to administering any of these products. A number of products are listed below and give the amount of Cobalt administered to a 30kg greyhound if the manufacturer's maximum dosage recommendation is followed. Under the Race Day Treatment rule GAR 83A no injectable substance can be administered on race day.

#### Additional information for trainers - Arsenic threshold to be introduced into the Greyhounds Australasia Rules

Warning to trainers – Arsenic usage in greyhounds

On 1 July 2016, Greyhounds Australasia will introduce a urinary threshold for arsenic of 800 ng/mL within GAR 83 (11) as follows:

"Arsenic at or below a mass concentration of 800 nanograms per millilitre in a sample of urine taken from a greyhound will not breach the provisions of sub rule (1A) or (2) of this rule."

Trainers are advised to be extremely cautious using products that contain arsenic close to racing as this may inadvertently lead to a rise in urinary arsenic levels. Compliance with GAR 83A Raceday Treatment will minimise the risk of inadvertently exceeding the threshold, however a greater withholding period will be required for some substances, particularly injectable products.

Arsenic is a naturally occurring trace element that is normally present in greyhounds at very low levels as a result of normal dietary intake.

An excessive amount of arsenic has an effect on the cardiovascular system (GAR 1) and therefore is a prohibited substance when present in a sample at concentrations above that which would naturally occur through routine nutritional sources.

This threshold has been determined following a national population survey that measured urinary arsenic levels in 2849 greyhounds sampled on race day. It has been set at a level to allow for normal amounts of arsenic supplementation through routine nutritional sources.

However, trainers are advised that the **administration**, **particularly by injection and on multiple occasions or at larger 'off-label' doses, of certain registered supplements close to racing may result in a level of arsenic in a subsequent sample that exceeds this threshold.** Trainers are therefore advised to avoid the use of these supplements close to racing.

While there is generally no medical indication for arsenic supplementation in a healthy greyhound fed a balanced diet, where veterinary advice indicates these supplements are required, they should be given following the labeled advice of the manufacturer and ensure an adequate withholding period is followed prior to racing.

Examples of registered injectable supplements that contain arsenic include: NV Ferrocyl Injection (Sodium Cacodylate 6.4 mg/mL), NV Jurocyl (Sodium Arsanilate 50 mg/mL), TROY Invigorate As Injection (Sodium Arsanilate 50 mg/mL) and Jurox ARCYL Solution For Injection (Sodium Arsanilate 50 mg/mL).

#### **Nutritional supplements**

Trainers are advised some sea weed based nutritional supplements have been tested by controlling bodies and found to have high concentrations of arsenic and should not be fed close to racing. It is ultimately the responsibility of participants to carefully consider the use of any and all food and additives to make sure that all greyhounds are presented for racing free of any prohibited substance.

#### Administration study results:

This information is made available to participants, in order to assist them to comply with the rules. The detection times are not withdrawal times and should not be construed as such. There are many relevant factors in relation to any substance that could give rise to unpredictable and prolonged excretion times including:

- An animal's general health status, its physiology, metabolism, hydration status, fitness level, training regime, nutritional and dietary supplementation and concurrent medical treatment.
- Dose rate (i.e. the amount given per kg) a higher dose will take longer to remove from the body system and could be detrimental to the dog's health. Combining similar supplements may also increase the dose rate as each may contain arsenic.
- Treatment duration and frequency (i.e. how long a supplement is given for and how often) a cumulative effect could occur where supplements are given for extended periods, particularly when this is against the directions of the manufacturer ('off-label').
- Route of administration (i.e. orally or by injection) injection of arsenic supplements will lead to much greater levels of arsenic and therefore requires greater withholding periods prior to racing than orally administered arsenic. Oral administration of products will still lead to a breach of the arsenic threshold and require an adequate withholding period.
- Pharmaceutical preparation (i.e. how much arsenic it contains) different arsenical compounds contain different amount of arsenic. The preparations may also have different properties that result in e.g. different rates of absorption.

Careful consideration of the above factors and adequate veterinary advice is important prior to administering arsenic containing substances, particularly by injection. More conservative withdrawal times may need to be implemented.

#### The following admin studies were performed on 6 greyhounds:

#### Jurocyl Injection

Jurocyl Injection (CEVA) is a commercially available product registered for use in horses for a dry coat or inappetence. The arsenical compound is sodium arsanilate (50 mg/mL). This is equivalent to around 15.7 mg/mL of arsenic.

**Dose administered intramuscularly:** 1mL administered intramuscularly. This is equivalent to a dose rate of approximately 0.5 mg/kg of arsenic for a 30 kg greyhound.

**Results:** Arsenic levels detected above the 800 ng/mL threshold for up to 48 hours after dosing (maximum over 50,000 ng/mL), but did not return to resting levels for 72 hours. A cumulative effect may occur with this product. A minimum withholding period of 72 hours is suggested following injection.

*Dose administered orally:* 1mL administered orally. This is equivalent to a dose rate of approximately 0.5 mg/kg of arsenic for a 30 kg greyhound.

**Results:** Arsenic levels detected above the 800 ng/mL threshold for up to 48 hours after dosing (maximum 20,000 ng/mL), and returned to resting levels at this time. A cumulative effect may occur with this product. It is not recommended this product be administered orally, but if similar amounts of arsenic are administered orally, a minimum withholding period of 48 hours is suggested.

For further information please contact your state controlling body.

N.B. Reliance on this communication will not be a defence in the event of a breach of the rules. All participants in races do so subject to, and take full responsibility for their compliance with, the rules which contain, amongst other things, provisions relating to prohibited substances, the disqualification of greyhounds that have been found to have received them and the punishment of those who administer them.

## Sookie's Lad finds the winning formula

Worrolong greyhound Sookie's Lad landed his first feature race win in a 57-start career when successful in last Sunday's Formula 400 Sprint (400 metres) at Tara Raceway's Mount Gambier Cup meeting on Sunday 5th March.

Sookie's Lad, who turned four years old earlier this month, settled in a forward spot from box two and after railing through on the home turn finished too well to defeat Ming Men Shen by a neck with a further halflength back to Slipper's Chance.

By Premier Fantasy out of Sookie, a winner of 14 races and a litter sister to the Group-winning Kilty Lad, Sookie's Lad is owned locally by Craig Hicks and trained by his father-in-law Steve Bartholomew.

The win made this year's cup day even more special for Bartholomew, president of the Mount Gambier Greyhound Racing Club, who handled Tara Topar, the inaugural cup winner in 1981, and has not missed a cup meeting in the ensuing 36 years.

And while Sookie's Lad has now won 10 races and recorded 26 minor placings his trainer recalls that the

black dog's racing career back in July 2015 looked to be all but over after only 23 starts.

"He suffered a nasty foot injury at the end of a 400 metre race and was off the scene for six months," he said.

"It actually required two bouts of surgery and to be honest at the time we doubted whether he would ever race again as the foot developed a deformed appearance.

"We were keen to persevere, though, as Sookie's Lad had always shown potential and was a keen chaser. Not the fastest greyhound we had at the time but a pleasure to have in the kennels."

And as a testament to the dog's fortitude – and connections' patience – he won upon returning to racing at the beginning of 2016 with a further four wins to follow prior to last Sunday's cup-day success.

The Formula 400 was first run in 2015 when Tom Cryer's Cryer's Fred was successful, while last year's event was won by the Dean Fennell trained Cerrone.

#### ANGLE PARK QUALIFYING TRIALS - NOW WEEKLY

Angle Park Qualifying Trials will now be run weekly on Tuesday night, for the corresponding Monday APM meeting and the Wednesday APD meeting.

Trainers must be specific on their nominations about which day they are trialling for and what distance. (ie Wed 388m, Mon 515, Mon 600m etc).

#### Tuesday Angle Park Qualifying dates are:

March 28th (No Qualys for APM meeting on 3rd April – for APD Wednesday on 5th April)

April 4th (for APM meeting on 10th April – for APD Wednesday on 12th April)

April 11th (for APM meeting on 17th April – for APD Wednesday on 19th April)

April 18th (for APM meeting on 24th April – No Qualys for APD Wednesday on 26th April)

#### Nominations close with GRSA at 12.30pm on the Tuesday of the meeting.

#### NOMINATING ONLINE FOR QUALIFYING TRIALS

For Angle Park, Gawler and Strathalbyn qualifying trials the nominations must be lodged with GRSA by 12.30pm on the day of the meeting. To nominate online however you can only do this up until 11.59pm the day before. Due to a system security policy you cannot nominate on the day for these trials online. Please contact our staff if you have any issues with these nominations prior to them closing.

#### SINGLE TRIALS

A reminder to trainers that single trials can be booked with two greyhounds however you need to advise when booking of your intention to do this. If you wish to put three or more into this trial then a field trial will have to be booked.

#### BOOKING NUMBER FOR TRIALS

Participants wishing to book trials are required to ring 8243 7172, this phone line will only be used for trial bookings and will queue participants. By having this one number with participants queuing makes this process to be a more efficient way of booking trials.

The following lists the order in which greyhounds will be selected in the event if more than 8 greyhounds nominated.

- 1. Reserves at the Meeting that do not obtain starts.
- 2. Trainers that have greyhounds engaged and are located in an area affected by track closures.
- 3. Trainers that have greyhounds engaged.
- 4. Satisfactory trials.
- 5. Other greyhounds.

#### **PROCEDURE/CRITERIA**

- For Monday nights trainer to contact GRSA between 10.00am and 11.00am on the Monday to nominate. Should the Monday be a public holiday bookings are to be made between 8am and 9am on the scratching line.
- 2. For Angle Park Wednesday, Gawler Tuesday & Friday trainer to contact GRSA between 4.00pm and 4.30pm on the day before.
- 3. For Gawler Sunday trainer to contact GRSA between 8.00am and 9.00am on the scratching line to nominate.
- 4. Other than reserve greyhounds Trainers will be restricted to trialling one (1) greyhound unless nominations determine otherwise.
- 5. Stewards allot the Box for the Greyhound.
- 6. Trials will be 515m & 531m in distance as first preference. Other distances considered depending on nominations.
- 7. Greyhounds currently under suspension or not cleared to race are not eligible to be nominated (these trials are conducted as if they are at a race meeting so all greyhounds need to be eligible at nomination time).
- 8. Greyhound registration certificate or cards must be produced at kennelling time.

9. Trainers with other greyhounds engaged can utilize the extra kennel space until such time they are ready to leave OR trainers with no other greyhounds will be free to leave following their trial.

If there are 12 races at Angle Park or Gawler there will be NO trials.

The Vet Clinic at these meetings cannot be used to accommodate any greyhounds to allow for extra trialling greyhounds. This policy has been introduced so that participants book in under the policy. The Vet Clinic needs to be available for the Vet and Stewards at race meetings

#### **EXCEPTIONS TO THIS POLICY-**

- Thursday nights are kept available for the option for Interstate greyhounds to solo trial in a lead up to our Group races and also local greyhound's trialling for Group racing interstate.
- Local greyhounds will be allowed to solo trial in a lead up to a feature race upon request and they will take one of the eight kennels available for trialling ahead of the policy and sit separately to the 4 dog trials. Feature races are considered to be – Adelaide Cup, Gawler Cup, Oaks, Derby, Howard Ashton, Brian Johnstone, SA Sprint, SA Distance Championship, SA Anniversary Cup, SA Country Cup, National Finals & any Group race Interstate.
- Local greyhounds will be allowed to trial on a race night, where they are in preparation for a feature event and nominated for a meeting and the race does not stand up. This will include all distances and also take precedence over the policy.
- If a greyhound qualifies for a feature final and requires a trial in between this will be conducted as a solo trial and sit separately to the 2 four dog trials.

It is extremely important that trainers book in to trial at these race meetings. If unable to book in at these times then please contact GRSA where permission may be given to accept a booking outside of these times.


