What a great night we had on Thursday, 18th April (the night before Good Friday) at Angle Park for the inaugural running of the Eastar Match Race Series and the Easter Cup Final over the 600m.

The top ranked eligible sprinters stepped out in head to head racing for the Eastar Match Race series which again saw "live" innovative coverage from inside the boxes and entering the back straight, along with Easter themed race rugs for the greyhounds and a special win for star sprinter Honcho Monelli in the final match race on the night. Honcho Monelli turned back the clock and ran a blistering 29.52 to claim the inaugural Eastar title for trainer, Tony Rasmussen and owners, Tim Aloisi and Matt Lehmann. Other match race winners were Victa Ashely 29.61 (2nd overall), Bailey Rocks 29.62 [3rd overall] and Cairnlea Ebony 29.70 [5th overall].

Thanks must go to the owners and trainers for supporting the Eastar and also to the Grading Review Panel especially Ben Rawlings who felt after the success of the State of Origin Match Race series last



September it would be nice to get a local series formatted and provided plenty of feedback to ensure the conditions would suit the local scene.

The other main highlight of the night was the win of Waterloo Monelli in the

Easter Cup final over the 600m . Again owned by Tim and Matt and trained by Tony Rasmussen, Waterloo Monelli led throughout to win in fine fashion and make it a night to remember for all concerned.

Bailey Rocks takes out Breeders 2019 Prelude (2) Final

Up and coming sprinter Bailey Rocks took out the second Prelude Final of Breeders 2019 last week at Angle Park showing her other high profile litter mates Sennachie and Red Rock that she can match it with the best when it comes to feature race wins.

Owned by Bill Wudarczyk and Kirin Corby and bred locally by Bill the daughter of Fernando Bale and Rhonda Rocks has been cast in the shadow of her litter mates, however, she stepped out of the shadows with a strong win running down Emerley Zero in the final stages of the Prelude Final. She ran a time of 29.96 for the 515m journey taking her record to 5

Waterloo Monelli tops off great month with award

Greyhound of the Month award for April went to Waterloo Monelli who just edged out Cawbourne Swade and Allinga Val in a tight month of voting.

The son of Fernando Bale and Bingle Monelli started the month of with a good 600m victory at headquarters running a slick 34.78 and setting his sights on the Easter Cup series. He stepped out in the heats and was very impressive in winning when having to work hard to catch the leader, Unmistakable in the shadows of the post, again breaking the 35 seconds barrier. In the Easter Cup final he was well supported and showed very good speed to lead and from there he was in no danger going on to win by over 7 lengths in a flying 34.74.



Monelli's record stood at 67 starts for 17 wins and 29 placings and earnings around \$90,000. At the end of the month he changed kennels from Tony Rasmussen into the care of Troy Murray and looks like he will continue on his winning ways.

The Run of the Month for April was Cawbourne Swade for trainer Lisa Rasmussen for his brilliant win in the Anniversary Cup Final at Angle Park on Thursday, 4th April.

Starting a warm favourite in a star studded line up, the son of Dyna Double One and Cawbourne Abbi, showed good speed to race up on the pace before exploding to the front down the back straight and racing away from his rivals in a sizzling 29.50 for the 515m journey. He won by almost 5 lengths with splits of 4.45 and 16.85.





Racing Report

July Dates released for 2019/2020

Pending the G-SIX trial over the next 3 months we have released the dates for July for the 2019/2020 season. This will be the completion of the 3 month trial period which will provide information in regard to scheduling for the remainder of 2019/2020.

Feature Race dates for 2019/2020 should be released next month.

Mount Gambier to race every Thursday and Sunday

Mount Gambier will now race every Thursday from 2nd May with the introduction of the G-SIX racing.

As a result of this they will now race twice a week during the 3 month trial period on Thursdays and Sundays.

G-SIX racing commences

May 2 kicked off G-SIX racing for a 3 month trial with Angle Park, Gawler and Mount Gambier all racing under these conditions.

G-SIX offers more racing at more meetings, cleaner racing with less interference as there are only 6 greyhounds per event, Stakemoney increases to owners and trainers worth more than \$1,000,000 and a consistent weekly schedule at our venues.

There will be some exceptions to the G-SIX for feature races with specific feature events not under the G-SIX conditions, like the Group 3 Howard Ashton for example.

Participants are encouraged to check the racing calendar for G-SIX events and scheduling and ensure they are aware of the conditions during the 3 month trial.

G-SIX mixing of grades during trial period

During the trial period of G-SIX the mixing of grades will have to slightly change.

For example, normally if we have three Grade 4's and 10 Grade 5's (total 13 dogs) the Grader will grade an 8 dog Grade 5 and a 5 dog mixed 4/5. Under G-SIX conditions the Grader will grade a six dog Grade 5 and a six dog mixed 4/5 with one common reserve.

Gawler to race in the twilight zone on Tuesday 14th May 2019

After GRSA received a request from Racing Queensland to assist with a movement of their race meeting on Tuesday, 14th May 2019, GRSA in conjunction with the Gawler Greyhound Racing Club have moved their normal Tuesday Day Meeting (Sky 1) into the Tuesday Twilight Timeslot (Sky 1).

Our first race on this day will start around 3.20pm and finish around 6.20pm. GRSA appreciates the Gawler GRC and other users of the Gawler venue on this day being flexible to assist with this time change. GRSA is happy to assist other States with programming changes where possible to assist those Clubs and Authorities.

Murray Bridge straight track to now start in June 2019

GRSA had intended for the Murray Bridge straight track to commence racing in early May 2019, however, due to more trialling required at the venue to bed down processes and procedures this has been delayed by one month.

GRSA are providing more trialling opportunities on the straight track in the coming weeks before running a Picnic meeting on the 5th June prior to the first meeting.

GRSA will continue the fortnightly Murray Bridge meeting on the one turn track on Wednesdays, however, due to the introduction of G-Six and being responsive to current nomination numbers the Murray Bridge meeting will rotate with Angle Park on this day.

The major race for Breeders 2019 is the Group 3 Howard Ashton. Trainers are reminded that the heats will be run on Thursday, 16th May.

These will be followed by the semi-finals on May 23rd and the \$37,500 final on May 30th. Total prizemoney for heats and semis will be determined by the number of races run.

The race is for greyhounds that are eligible for Breeders 2019. Greyhounds don't have to have competed in the preludes to run in the Group 3 Howard Ashton.

Shane McQueen heats in late May (not G-SIX)

The main 600m feature at Angle Park comes up on Thursday, 30th May with the running of the \$5,240 heats of the Shane McQueen. with three or four heats normally run. The final will be held on Thursday, 6th June and will be worth \$10,710.

Murray Bridge Straight Track Picnic meeting Wednesday 5th June 2019

In preparation for the straight track at Murray Bridge to commence racing on Wednesday, 19th June, GRSA will host a picnic meeting on Wednesday, 5th June.

This will be a day meeting starting at 11.15am with only named and cleared greyhounds invited to be drawn into half fields conducted every 15 - 20 minutes.

Kennelling will be from 10.15am to 10.45am.

Greyhounds will be graded into events as if they had not raced at the venue based on normal grading guidelines. Distances will be 300m and 350m.

Nominations close at 9am on Friday, 31st May and can be done via the ozchase online process or by fax.

Fields will be announced on Friday, 31st May with all nominated greyhounds being selected.

GRSA will pay \$60 per trainer and \$20 for unplaced greyhounds.

For 4 or 3 dog fields GRSA will pay \$175 for first and \$50 for second after scratchings. For 2 or less, GRSA will pay \$125 for first only after scratchings.

2017 AGRC/GRSA greyhound auction – racing dates (not G-SIX)

The Main race series for greyhounds that were purchased through the 2017 Auction will be \$4,820 heats run on Thursday, 6th June. The \$26,000 final will be run on Thursday, 13th June 2019.

There will be another series to be run in July or August over 515m for \$1,130 heats and then the final is worth \$5,000. These dates are yet to be confirmed.

Port Augusta Cup Final at \$5,000

Gawler Produce Stake Heats in June (NOT G-SIX)

A reminder to all trainers with greyhounds paid up for the Gawler Produce Stake that the heats will be run on Friday, 21st June. The semis are listed for Friday, 28th June and the final will be held on Sunday, 7th July.

The prizemoney breakdowns will be announced after the number of heats are known, however the final is guaranteed at \$22,000 and consolation at \$2,700.

Nominations for the heats close on Monday, 17th June with GRSA at 9.00am.

The winner of the final is also eligible for a \$7,000 bonus if it can win the 2019 Gawler Gold Cup later this year. If the winner of the Gawler Produce is SA Bred there is also a \$1,000 SA Bred Bonus.

Black shorts now available from GRSA

After approval from the ICG, black shorts are now part of the GRSA Dress Code Policy and available for sale from GRSA.

These shorts have the GRSA logo embroidered on the back and are the only shorts approved. They cost \$45 and are

available in mens and ladies sizes with orders taken if we do not have your size. Black shorts are to be worn with black socks and black shoes. These shorts can be worn at the discretion of the participant at any time.

New red wet weather jackets to replace old blue jackets

GRSA has purchased new red Jackets for winter to be available as a replacement for the blue Drizeabone Jackets which are now no longer available.

These red jackets are at the tracks and are available for purchase at Angle Park for a cost of \$50. GRSA will take orders as required.

The Stewards have directed that these red Jackets are a replacement for the blue ones and are to be worn only when the Stewards have directed them to be worn (raining). At all other times the "Only At The Dogs" vests are to be worn so that all participants are wearing the same clothing.

With regard to the discontinued blue Jackets, shortly GRSA will offer them to Industry participants. Advice on how to get them will be sent out shortly.

GRSA trialling schedule updated

- Murray Bridge from 6pm Tuesday and 8am Friday. STAT and Qualys once a month to be run at 6.50pm – 7.15pm the same as Angle Park. Upcoming dates will be Tuesday 14/5/19 and 11/6/19.
- Gawler from 7am Monday and 7am Thursday. Thursday has STAT and Qualys every week.
- Angle Park from 6pm Wednesday and 7am Saturday. STAT and Qualys every Wednesday for the corresponding Monday APM meeting (12 days later due to nominations).

• Please note when trialling at Angle Park a ticket is required. To get a ticket trainers must advise staff by paying or advising if payment is to go onto their account. Staff have been advised that greyhounds cannot trial without a ticket being presented.

Claiming race conditions in a different format

Unfortunately there has been a lack of support for Claiming Races over the last 12 months, however, at the last ICG meeting it was proposed that greyhounds engaged in a race meeting may be considered to be claimed.

Connections will need to advise under similar conditions of the Claiming events but rather than a race for these greyhounds there will be a list in the race book highlighting which greyhounds are up for sale.

Forms are for nominating and claiming a greyhound are available at GRSA and on the website. Please ensure all forms are completed appropriately.

Nomination limits on Port Augusta and GOTBA Coursing

GRSA confirms limits of nominations for both the Non-TAB Port Augusta meetings and GOTBA Coursing events to provide some form of indication on the likely scenario of the meetings proceeding or being cancelled.

This will assist both participants and staff alike. The number of nominations required for a meeting to proceed for Port Augusta is 40 and for GOTBA Coursing it is 30.

As always GRSA will extend nominations if this number is below these cut offs, however, if it is significantly lower, then GRSA will liaise with the clubs in regard to cancelling the meeting straight away if agreed.

Mr. Gary Lane – Stewards inquiry 06/05/19 – GAR 83[2] – Failed to present LENA LAKE free of any prohibited substances (CAFFEINE and its metabolites THEOPHYLLINE, PARAXANTHINE and THEOBROMINE). Mr. Lane pleaded guilty and was disqualified for a period of four [4] months; with two [2] months suspended for 24 months on the condition he does not reoffend under the same Rule to begin midnight 15/05/19. LENA LAKE was disqualified from the event.

The Golden Rules

Since the introduction of cobalt and arsenic thresholds, all participants should be reminded – in their own best interests – that there are a number of Golden Rules that can help them to avoid making any such breaches (for prohibited substances generally) and which should be adhered to as principles of best practice:

- Always consult your vet to seek guidance in relation to any of the products that you are using, any associated risks and other relevant context
- Review the range of any feeds or supplements that you typically purchase and, wherever it is reasonable to do so, replace products containing substances that could contribute to a threshold breach under the rules (eg. cobalt) with alternative products
- Observe the instructions on any products that you use and adhere strictly to those directions (having regard for prescribed amounts, frequency of administration/ application, methodology for administering/applying)
- Ensure a greyhound is never administered any treatment on race day other than as relates to its feeding and drinking requirements (GAR83[A][1] treats this as a specific offence)
- Refrain from the use of injectable treatments (eg. Vitamin B12) to any extent that is practical, including ensuring a greyhound is not administered any injectables the day before an event

Our registered participants have the responsibility to ensure that greyhounds are presented to the track free of any prohibited substances. This information is offered as advice in good faith and should not be relied on as a defence in the event of a breach occurring. Dental Hygiene MAY 2019

It is essential to include dental care and hygiene (mouth, teeth and gums) in the care of your greyhound/s.

If teeth are not maintained, bacteria in the mouth cause a coating called plaque. If left plaque thickens and hardens becoming tartar or calculus. This causes inflammation of the gums often resulting in a condition called gingivitis. Gingivitis and dental disease if not treated, can lead to serious and even life-threatening diseases such as:

- Heart Infections
- Liver Infections
- Sepsis (Blood infection)
- Bone Infections
- Poor appetite
- Weight loss (due to pain of eating)

As this condition is common in the greyhound breed, it can be controlled with ongoing attention. GRSA recommend participants maintain their greyhound's teeth from an early age to maintain a healthy lifestyle.



We have included a **step by step guide** that will get greyhounds used to having their teeth cleaned over time. You will find this process easier when your greyhound is calm and comfortable and offered a special treat at the end of each cleaning session. If at any time a greyhound starts to struggle, **STOP** the process immediately. This process should be a positive experience.

Step 1: Start by gently lifting the sides of your greyhound's mouth, this will get them used to you touching their mouth, teeth and gums.

Step 2: Using a soft cloth wrapped around your finger, gently rub the teeth, working mostly on the outside (this is where the plaque and tartar will be built up the most)

NOTE* Go very gently on the gums


Step 3: Soak a soft toothbrush in warm water (using chicken or beef stock is a great idea to get them to enjoy the taste)
NOTE* stock is not to be used as a cleaning agent. Lift up the side of the mouth and gently start brushing the for 2 – 5 minutes or until your greyhound has had enough



Step 4: Once your greyhound/s are used to the brushing process you can introduce canine toothpaste.

NOTE: Never use human toothpaste! Canine toothpaste can be purchased at your local pet shop.

Step 5: We recommend that you check your greyhound's teeth and gums regularly for any signs of decay.



Additional teeth cleaning aids:

As well as brushing teeth, there are some other ways to maintain your greyhound's dental hygiene:

- Avoid feeling a wet food diet only. Feeding dry (unsoaked) kibble majority of the time or occasionally will help scrape off tartar and plaque off their teeth.
- Offer dental sticks, chew toys or treat them with raw bones.
 NOTE: Be sure to avoid cooked bones or small bones

Veterinary checks

Although cleaning and brushing process can be done in the comfort of your kennels, we highly recommend you have your greyhound's teeth checked and cleaned every 6 - 12 months by a qualified veterinary surgeon.

Keeping on top of your greyhound/s dental care and hygiene may seem like more time and effort. However, this could save you expensive veterinary bills. Additionally, this may will increase your chances of a quick adoption once your greyhound has finished their racing career, and most importantly keep your greyhound as healthy and happy as possible in all stages of their lives.


Minimise Boredom

Minimise boredom related behaviours for kennel dogs

Dogs that spend majority of their time in kennels may be prone to exhibiting boredom related behaviours. Examples of boredom related behaviours are but not limited to digging, chewing, barking and overall destructive behaviour.

In order to minimise boredom related behaviours greyhounds should be provided with things to do especially in the case of a greyhound chewing. By allowing the greyhound to have something they are allowed to chew and that is reinforcing for them they may be likely to do that rather than chewing things you would prefer them not to. Options for chewable items could include toys and chew treats such as bones. It should be noted that between approximately 16 weeks and six [6] months puppies are teething. Teething toys should be provided to them. The best kind are soft rubber toys that can massage the gums and relieve the pain. These toys can be made more reinforcing by using peanut butter (ensure there is no Xylitol in the ingredient list, cream cheese and gravy amongst other things that make that toy more rewarding to chew than the things you do not want them to chew.



An instinct to dig is very common in canines. The best option if there is a certain area of

a yard you do not want them to dig in is to manage the access they have to those areas. Otherwise it may help to provide a designated digging area that is more rewarding to dig in than other areas. This can be done by burying treats and toys in those areas. Deterrents can also be used in areas that cannot be fenced off. Deterrents could be store bought garden repellents or homemade sprays can be used although they will need to be re-applied regularly to remain effective. Homemade sprays can be anything citrus based or mint based.

In a circumstance when you might have a specific dog that barks excessively it is important to identify the reason why the dog could be barking. There are various reasons why a dog could be barking such as boredom, separation anxiety, general anxiety or fear, harassment by other animals, attention seeking, attempting to initiate play or excitement. In order to rectify the barking behaviour it is important to identify the reason the dog is barking initially.

A dog that is bored could be provided with various toys/food dispensing toys as a way to enrich its environment. A dog suffering from separation anxiety should be trained to spend short periods alone (this will aid in retirement later in life). During these periods chew treats can be provided to make the absence of the person/animal more rewarding. It is important to note that if the dog begins to vocalise you should not return to them unless they are quiet, otherwise they are reinforced by your return and will learn that in order to get your attention they should just vocalise. For a dog that is suffering from general anxiety or fear, the stimulus causing fear/anxiety should be removed if possible or 'counter-conditioning' should be utilised to turn the negative feeling as a result of that stimulus into a positive one. This can be done using praise, food rewards or toy rewards. A dog that is being harassed by other animals should be removed from the situation and housed in a different location if possible. For a greyhound that is trying to initiate play this is fairly normal communication for canines. However if this occurs excessively the behaviour can be interrupted however the greyhound should be rewarded for calm behaviour. If an alternate behaviour is not rewarded likely the behaviour will continue. A similar method would be utilised for a greyhound that is barking out of excitement.

A great way to minimise any of the aforementioned boredom related behaviours is to provide your dog with ways to use the energy they already have (and use to get up to mischief) to play with toys you provide. By providing toys this can minimise chewing, digging and barking as they have an outlet for their energy. Various types of toys can be provided and hardier toys can be provided for dogs that destroy soft toys easily such as rope toys or harder plastic ones. Another way to harness their energy is, instead of feeding them in a normal bowl where they inhale their meal in a short space of time is to provide their meal in a food dispensing toy. By doing this they exert energy and feeding time is a way of mentally stimulating your dog. Greyhounds are often described as 'couch potatoes' so providing them with toys shouldn't interfere with them relaxing for their next race as once they are finished playing they will likely have a nap.

Case Study

Rebecca Mcauley-Fry has had great success with her particularly destructive greyhound Dennis by providing him with an assortment of toys. As she can tell you it has been an ongoing nightmare to provide Dennis with bedding and rugs as he was partial to destroying them.

Since utilising toys[rope toys, plush toys, plastic bottles, food dispensing toys] as a way of enriching his environment he still has his carpet on his bed and has been rugged without destroying it. As a tip, these toys came from Ebay for an affordable price saving money on having to buy new bedding/rugs as regularly.

One toy in particular (slightly more expensive), the Kong Gyro has been used when feeding Dennis. Food dispensing toys are often utilised by owners with domestic dogs that are showing boredom related behaviours such as chewing. By feeding them in a toy wherein they have to figure out how to access the food they typically spend more energy working that out rather than using that energy to destroy items. Food dispensing toys can even be made as simple as poking some holes in a drink bottle.

G-SIX racing is an exciting, innovative trial of 6-dog racing at selected South Australian tracks

How is G-SIX racing different to the current format?

The format of G-SIX racing only differs in that the standard field size reduces from 8 to 6 dogs.

How does the box draw work?

G-SIX racing will adopt a standard approach to drawing six dog fields with vacancies in the 3 and 6 boxes. The runners will still wear the rug colours which traditionally correlate to their box draw – ie 1, 2, 4, 5, 7 and 8. The reserves will carry the standard rug colours of 9 and 10.

Why G-Six?

It is important for racing and sport generally to explore innovative ways to present itself. As the controlling body, we need to look for new approaches to appeal to and engage with our wagering audience.

When does G-SIX start?

G-SIX will commence May 2 for a 3-month trial period.

Where will G-SIX run?

Angle Park, Gawler and Mount Gambier. The dual tracks at the new Murray Bridge venue will continue with the traditional 8 dog format.

What are the advantages of G-SIX?

- More races run at more race meetings
- Cleaner racing with less interference
- Stakemoney increases to SA trainers and owners, worth more than \$1,000,000 annually
- The introduction of a new Thursday timeslot at Mount Gambier to enable consistent weekly scheduling at both Murray Bridge and Mount Gambier

How does G-SIX affect the current racing schedule?

The racing schedule will expand to accommodate two weekly meetings at each of its TAB venues. The introduction of G-SIX will signal the introduction of a consistent Thursday afternoon timeslot at Mount Gambier and enable racing at Murray Bridge each Wednesday. The commencement of G-SIX racing will coincide with the introduction of straight-track racing at Murray Bridge.

How will G-SIX racing affect the 3rd place dividend for wagering?

No 3rd place dividend will apply to G-SIX racing as is the normal practice for 6-dog fields. It follows that place dividends for 1st and 2nd will be relatively inflated as a result.

Will all races at the selected venues run in G-SIX format?

Yes, with the exception of a handful of specified feature events held during the 3-month trial including:

- Breeders 2019 Prelude (2)
- Bayroad Queen Stayers Cup
- AGRC/GRSA Auction (388m)
- Howard Ashton
- Shane McQueen

- AGRC/GRSA Auction (515m)
- Champion Puppy

NOTES OF INDUSTRY CONSULTATIVE GROUP (ICG) MEETING

HELD IN THE BOARDROOM OF GREYHOUND RACING SA LIMITED, 55 CARDIGAN STREET, ANGLE PARK ON WEDNESDAY 20 MARCH 2019 AT 1.00PM

ATTENDEES: Grantley Stevens (Chairman), Michael Fabbro, Judi Hurley, Peter Damarell, Lisa Rasmussen, Ryan Tugwell, Sean Donnelly, Tony Hinrichsen, Gavin Harris, Matthew Corby, Shaun Mathieson, Scott Wuchatsch, Lisa Michalanney, Matthew Watson, Katalin Orosz, Chris Luong, Sheriden Milam (Notes Secretary)

The meeting commenced at 1.06pm.

1 APOLOGIES

Tony Hinrichson, Ray Fewings, Grahame Marshall and Paul Preiss were noted as apologies.

2 NOTES FROM PREVIOUS MEETING

3 BUSINESS ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MEETING

3.1 Syndication

The Chairman provided a brief update. Following this the Chairman requested the "sub-committee" of Shaun Mathieson, Chris Luong, Gavin Harris and Sean Donnelly continue to work towards implementing a system. The panel questioned whether a list of potential owners has been collated. Management advised we do have names of interested parties. Management advised we had requested further specific detail from Sandown and were not yet at a level to implement but were not far off. It was advised that it was Sandown's intention to share information and roll out across all clubs. The panel suggested within the next 3 months it would be expected to see more substance from Sandown and the need to get the system right prior to rolling out. The panel noted the prices for pups may have to be reconsidered noting the service fees have increased in turn inflating pup prices.

Action: The sub-committee of Shaun Mathieson, Chris Luong, Gavin Harris and Sean Donnelly to work towards implementing a syndication system.

3.2 Sky Racing Schedule

Management advised they were reasonably comfortable with the current schedule, in particular trialing. The panel suggested moving Angle Park trials to Tuesday night, Gawler to Wednesday and Murray Bridge on Friday. The panel suggested preparation between Friday and Sunday at Murray Bridge would be limited. Some Members were comfortable with Angle Park trials on Wednesday and Saturday. The panel requested a night trailing session at Gawler. The information provided will be taken as feedback for Management to consider changes to the current trialing schedule.

Action: Management to consider feedback for possible changes to the current trialing schedule.

3.3 Puppy Racing at 14 Months of Age

Management advised there had been no further progression at National level.

3.4 Stayer's Events

Management provided context around how the Racing Manager manages the distance calendar and distributed information relating to future programming. They were advised he is monitoring the interstate stayers events to ensure opportunities are not missed for local stayers. The panel suggested more varied conditions with restricted wins, excluding metro for example over the 600m+ races. It was requested no races overlap Sandown Cup heats.

3.5 Wet Weather Jackets Update

The Group noted the update.

3.6 ICG Panel Members Update

It was noted the Members of Company were still in the process of determining who the replacement will be for Melissa Trowbridge. Members of the panel expressed concern that the Members did not accept Christine Costa's nomination. The CEO advised that the decision was for the Member clubs and suggested those concerns be taken back through that avenue.

3.7 Murray Bridge Straight Track Update

Management advised that testing of the new lure is continuing and refinement is required. It is currently tested on the circle track however issues will be less prevalent on the straight track. It was anticipated that trialing on straight track would commence on 12 April. Management questioned the Group regarding their preference to the trialling schedule ie trialing on both tracks, alternating between circle and straight track noting they were unable to trial on the straight at night. It was noted the group's preference was for half hour segments alternating between tracks. The panel questioned Management as to what the mix of meetings will look like. Management suggested it will be based on demand and noted the challenges in preparing two tracks and the inability to hold meetings on the straight at night outside of daylight savings and the challenges with administration of grading. Management questioned the group whether they believed the refurbished 680m boxes should be installed. There are some concerns with the potential lack of use considering struggling for nominations at 530m currently. It was noted that the IGC supported the notion that a 680m start at Murray Bridge is somewhat optimistic.

3.8 SA Owned – Victorian Upgrade Rules

The Group were in favour of owners being required to provided proof of purchase via Statutory Declaration to receive grading benefits.

Action: Management to update paperwork to include proof of purchase condition on transfer of ownership.

3.9 Stakemoney Strategy – February Board Meeting

The Chairman advised as a Board priority, they would be considering stakemoney options through the budgeting process and Industry could expect an announcement in the next couple of months.

3.10 Registry of Mentors

The Group noted the update.

Action: For a registry of mentors to be established and maintained which allows GRSA to act as a conduit between those trainers and would-be participants, subject to (discreet) internal scrutiny of mentor credentials.

3.11 Claiming Races – Alternate Strategy

It was noted that greyhounds that could be claimed in a meeting would be promoted through website, social media and racebook and the concept would be persisted with in the short term. The panel noted the success of claiming races at harness and suggested its popularity was due to the benefit of downgrades. It was suggested introducing downgrade and a maximum claiming price to increase interest. Management advised they would take this feedback on board and provide concise information regarding workings of the system.

Action: The RM to take this feedback on board and provide concise information regarding workings of the system.

3.12 Black Shorts Update

Management advised black shorts are now available for purchase and noted that the selected design was the only one that would be

allowed to be worn and must be worn with black ankle socks and black enclosed shoes.

3.13 Injuries Which Fall Outside of TIRS

Management provided an update on policy and noted that there is a right to appeal for injuries not specified in the schedule attached to the policy. It was also noted a policy change where an on course veterinarian directs a dog to the clinic, the greyhound is not requiring surgery under TIRS then the trainer will entitled to a rebate provided at a flat fee. Communication will be provided to industry in regards to this.

Action: Management to provided communication to industry in regards to this policy update.

3.14 Retirement Rule for Greyhounds (GAP)

The CEO clarified and reiterated management's stance on the retirement rule noting any changes would not reduce the waiting list. He noted an alternative rule can't be introduced without detriment to participants and the only solution is to reduce the current waiting list by increasing the number of foster carers. He noted this was the absolute priority for Management. The panel requested an increase to assessment in Murray Bridge to which Management advised this would be possible coinciding with Mobilong socialisation days. The panel requested the ability to be put on a waiting list for the next available assessment day for those that miss out on booking in to assessment days. The CEO questioned whether there were any persons retired from industry that would be interested in foster care. Management advised they do make contact with those who do not renew their licences. It was suggested that GRSA should be working with clubs and ICG to compile a list of names of retired participants who may be interested in foster care with GRSA providing some incentive to those people.

Action: Management to put participants on a waiting list for the next available assessment day for those that miss out on booking in to assessment days.

Action: Management to work with clubs and ICG to compile a list of names of retired participants who may be interested in foster care with Management to provide some incentive to those people.

3.15 Pannus and Prohibiting Breeding

Management advised this will be a standing item for next meeting.

3.16 300m Boxes at Gawler

The Group agreed for Management to look into the reintroduction of 330m boxes however with priority given to longer distances.

3.17 Organisational Chart to Member Clubs Update

The Group noted the update.

4 AGENDA ITEMS

4.1 G-Six Proposal – Six Dog Fields

The CEO provided an update and suggested it was the appropriate time to trial this proposal. He noted the positives of the proposal including increased racing, increased turnover, increases to stakemoney and more optimal use of tracks. He noted the complicated process that does not lend itself to consultation therefore a trial process will be undertaken. He suggested Management would face challenges with participants including dispelling myths however they will only benefit participants in the long term. The panel expressed concern that feature events would not retain 8 dog fields. The CEO indicated that a number of feature races would still run as 8 dog fields and that those races would be communicated to industry.

4.2 GRSA Loan Trailer

this idea and did not see it as necessary or of benefit.

4.3 GRSA Shelter Plan – Hot Weather/Fires etc

Management provided an update on the formalised policy. The panel suggested transporting to the track in hot weather could cause more stress. The Group agreed to limiting the policy to natural disasters and not including hot weather.

4.4 Industry Awards

The CEO suggested it would be beneficial to have structure/strategy around nominations and it was Management's intention to work with the ICG to provide nominations within categories to be able to refer to at the end of the year. Management committed to providing a list of potential award candidates to the next meeting as a starting point for discussion.

Action: Management to provide a list of potential award candidates to the next ICG meeting.

5. OTHER BUSINESS

5.1 Submission Received from Gavin Harris & Judi Hurley

Management provided background and updated the Group around maintenance of Angle Park infrastructure. Members of the panel highlighted the issues with the lure to which Management suggested all issues have been unrelated. Members of the panel expressed the view that the Maintenance Manager should be present at all race meetings. Members further noted the accuracy of the timer is imperative to trainers and timing faults during trial sessions has been an issue. Management noted the proposals before the Board regarding infrastructure upgrades and discussed the extent to which they may be undertaken. They noted it was Management's highest priority and that they would be working towards rectifying faults. Management advised catching pen pads have been installed at Angle Park and Murray Bridge and the light on back straight at Angle Park is being replaced.

Members of the panel noted the need to increase sand in the matting in starting boxes to which Management advised Maintenance have been directed to increase sand and maintain consistency across tracks. The Chairman noted the Group's concern about removing cash payments and advised GRSA's legal responsibility outweighs those concerns.

Panel members advised that the TAB app was not recording Murray Bridge replays. Management will follow this up TAB.

Action: The SPM and RM to follow up with the TAB regarding race replays for Murray Bridge.

The panel questioned a rumour that Chasers would be closed on trial nights. The CEO advised that this would not be the case.

The panel noted concerns regarding roller derby running during trial/ racing nights causing obstructions to vet clinic and items blocking fire exits. The CEO noted the financial benefit roller derby provide to GRSA however advised Management would look into both racing and roller derby schedules and take in to account feedback and seek to address concerns.

Action: Management to look into both racing and roller derby schedules and take in to account feedback to address industry concerns.

The panel noted their sadness at the closing of Port Augusta. The Chairman noted the great job that Ivan and Kathy Broadbridge had done over many years however he advised there had been no interest from any other parties to continue racing there.

The meeting closed at 3.25pm.




Latest updates from GAP




Our greyhounds spent a day at Rundle Place

Fortunes turn for poultry pair at Tara

MOUNT GAMBIER

No, the headline shouldn't read paltry pair because as the story goes it was John Burow who had decided to give the dishlickers away and use his two greyhound runs in his Penshurst backyard for chooks and ducks.

That never happened, of course, Burow not really your poultry farmer type. He did compromise, though, purchasing a couple of four-month-old pups for the yards and calling them Chooks and Ducks.

The first purchase, bred at Dennington by Ray Drew, was a May 2017 black bitch by Banjo Boy out of Maisy Mac, a winner of nine Victorian provincial races and boasting Zambora Brockie – 31 wins and \$540,000 in stakemoney – as a litter brother.

But Burow soon realised that he would need another pup of similar age to rear with his \$2000 purchase, opting for an SA-bred daughter of Fabregas and Kaos Chloe which West Richmond breeder Adam Burda was advertising for \$800.

The Maisy Mac pup [Chooks] made her debut as United Lass at Tara Raceway last Sunday in the Laser Electrical Maiden Stake [400 metres], matching motors early with Shock Horror before running out a 1½ length winner in 23.75 seconds.

And it was a pretty fair effort considering she was having her first run in a field, Burow quick to hand out plenty of credit to Portland trainer Nifty Lenehan who had helped out prior to her last start.

Ducks, who now races as Miss Adelaide and opened her winning account back in February at Tara Raceway over 400 metres, also raced last Sunday and showed marked

An owner and trainer who has recently transitioned from the show dog world, produced a winner at Gawler on Friday afternoon.

That win came in race 4, a 400m event for Grade 6 greyhounds, which saw Penny Change from box 3 take the early lead. However, half way down the back straight, Rotor Blade, one of the reserve runners, starting from box 2, zipped through along the rails to take up the running, clearing the field by a couple of lengths. However, breaking from the pack, Got My Way [8] put in a challenge and took the lead on the home turn, to win comfortably by 2½ lengths in the time of 23.30 secs. Penny Change was second for Kim Johnstone of Two Wells, with Rotor Blade third placed for Michaela Pidgeon of Owen.

The winning owner/trainer was Daniella Madalinski, who works as the Practice Manager at the Angle Park Vet Clinic. Daniella loves all sighthound breeds, and has been previously involved with Borzois and Italian greyhounds, competing in the Show Dog circuit. Through her work, Daniella has developed a love for greyhounds, and obtained her trainer's licence in December 2018.

She was impressed with the progeny of Irish sire Kinloch Brae, liking their look and temperament, so Daniella has made that a criteria when selecting her racing stock, which includes Got My Way. The black dog was purchased locally dog by Daniella when it was 14 months old and has now won three races and had five placings from twelve career starts. Based at Freeling, Daniella currently has four racing dogs in her care in SA, three in Queensland and four pups. She has made the judgement that it is best to breed your own stock and has therefore acquired three breeding females and she is looking forward to whelping the first litter, due in June.

TRIALS ANGLE PARK

ANGLE PARK QUALIFYING TRIALS ON WEDNESDAY NIGHTS

Under the new schedule Angle Park Qualifying Trials will be run weekly on Wednesday night, for the corresponding Monday APM meeting (12 days later due to nominations). With 388m racing now available on Monday nights trainers can qualify for all distances.

Nominations close with GRSA at 12.30pm on the Wednesday of the meeting.

SINGLE TRIALS

A reminder to trainers that single trials can be booked with two greyhounds however you need to advise when booking of your intention to do this. If you wish to put three or more into this trial then a field trial will have to be booked.

BOOKING NUMBER FOR TRIALS

Participants wishing to book trials are required to ring 8243 7172, this phone line will only be used for trial bookings and will queue participants. By having this one number with participants queuing makes this process to be a more efficient way of booking trials.

There will be NO trials accepted through the normal administration number. To be fair to everyone GRSA will only accept bookings using the new number or alternatively logon to trialbooker.com, create an account and book your own trials.

POLICY FOR TRIALLING AT ANGLE PARK AND GAWLER BEFORE THE RACE MEETING

Policy Background

This policy is to detail the procedure for trainers seeking greyhounds to trial before race meetings. This policy is effective from 2 May 2019.

Race Meeting Trial Policy

This policy is in place for the following race meetings:

Angle Park Monday, Gawler Tuesday and Friday, Murray Bridge Wednesday and Sunday.

Two fields from the boxes with a maximum of four (4) greyhounds will be conducted immediately following the completion of the kennelling procedure for the race meeting.

The following lists the order in which greyhounds will be selected in the event if more than eight (8) greyhounds are nominated:

1. Reserves at the meeting that do not obtain a start

2. Trainers that have greyhounds engaged and are located more than 100km in distance from the track

3. Satisfactory trials

Procedure/criteria

1. For Angle Park Monday night, the trainer is to contact GRSA by midday on Monday to nominate. Should the

Monday be a public holiday bookings are to be made between 8am and 9am on the scratching number.

- 2. For Gawler Tuesday & Friday, the trainer is to contact GRSA by 4.30pm the day before.
- 3. For Murray Bridge Wednesday, the trainer is to contact

GRSA by 4.30pm the day before. For Murray Bridge Sunday, the trainer is to contact the scratching number on Sunday between 8am and 9am.

- 4. Other than reserve greyhounds, trainers will be restricted to trialling one (1) greyhound unless nominations determine otherwise.
- 5. Stewards will allocate the box for the greyhound.
- 6. Trials will be 515m, 530m & 531m in distance as first preference. Other distances considered depending on nominations.
- 7. Greyhounds currently under suspension are ineligible to trial unless they are undertaking a satisfactory trial to be cleared.
- 8. Greyhound registration cards must be produced at kennelling time.
- Trainers with other greyhounds engaged can utilise the extra kennel space until such time they are ready to leave.
 Trainers with no other greyhounds engaged will be

permitted to leave with Stewards permission.

Please note: If there are 12 races at Angle Park, Gawler or Murray Bridge there will be NO trials.

The Angle Park Vet Clinic and/or swab kennels cannot be used to accommodate any additional greyhounds due to operational requirements of the Clinic and Stewards.

It is vital that trainers nominate to trial at these race meetings. If you are unable to nominate at these times, please contact GRSA as soon as possible as permission may be given at GRSA's discretion to accept bookings outside these times.

Exceptions to this policy

Thursday nights are kept available for interstate greyhounds to solo trial in a lead-up to SA Group races as well as local greyhound's trialling for Group racing interstate.

Upon request, local greyhounds will be allowed to solo trial in a lead-up to a feature race and they will take one of the eight (8) kennels available for trialling greyhounds ahead of the policy and sit separate to the four (4) dog trials. Races considered to be a feature are: Adelaide Cup, Gawler Cup, Oaks, Derby, Howard Ashton, Brian Johnstone, SA Sprint, SA Distance Championship, SA Anniversary Cup, SA Country Cup, National Finals and any interstate Group race

Local greyhounds will be permitted to trial on a race night, where they are in preparation for a feature event, nominated for a meeting and the race does not stand up. This will include all distances and also take precedence over the policy. If a greyhound qualifies for a feature final and requires a trial in between, this will be conducted as a solo trial and will sit separately to the four (4) dog trials.

MOUNT GAMBIER

The Mount Gambier Greyhound Racing Club will conduct satisfactory trials under the criteria below:

- 1. On race days only when there are less than 12 races scheduled
- 2. These trials must be booked with GRSA by 4.30pm the day before a mid-week meeting and 4pm on the Friday prior if a Sunday meeting.

GRSA reserves the right to alter or amend this policy at any time.
