Big night out at Angle Park

The best greyhounds in the State gathered at Angle Park on the 27th of April with \$10,000 first prize up for grabs in both the Bargain Steel Centre Anniversary Cup Final and the Distance Championship Final.

Both races highlighted the crème of South Australian racing with quick times and exciting racing the order of the night.

A high quality staying event saw local staying star Bogie Bekim look to continue on his winning ways taking on Interstate raider Mick's Angel and darling of the local staying ranks Springvale Bryne.

In light rain Bogie Bekim was sent out the punters elect for inform trainer Ben Rawlings. Shortly after the start Bogie Bekim did what was most thought he would and ran to the front and started to open up a sizeable lead with a lap to go. Springvale Bryne, Hukanui and Chrichton Bale all gave chase, however, as they entered the back straight Bogie Bekim had cleared out and was high rolling in the lead by over 6 lengths. The pack gave chase with Mick's Angel for Victorian trainer Allen Meyer starting to make significant ground from the rear. As they turned for home Bogie Bekim was still going strongly and was able to claim the first prize by over 4½ lengths from Mick's Angel who made terrific ground over the last few hundred metres while Chrichton Bale for Tim Aloisi held on well for third a further 61/2 lengths back.









Bogie Bekim ran a blistering 43.08 for the 731m journey in wet conditions and continues to dominate the local staying ranks while representing SA on the National level in Group 1's.

Bogie Bekim has now won 18 races from 49 starts with 14 placings and prizemoney around \$180,000.

In the Bargain Steel Centre SA Anniversary Cup Final leading local trainer Cameron Butcher made it back to back successes when On Fire was able to lead most of the way and defeat a high quality field. Cameron won last year's Anniversary Cup with super chaser Coorong Kid.

Inform sprinter Striker Klinsman for trainer Tony Rasmussen was looking to make it 5 wins from 5 starts in SA and was sent out the race favourite, however, a wide box and some interference on the first turn put paid to his chances.

On Fire bounced out from box 3 and quickly raced past early leader Tommy's Tune at the winning post on the first occasion and from there he was never really challenged going on to win by 11/2 lengths in a blistering 29.59. Signal Peak for Victorian trainer Jamie Quinlivian continues to race in career best form in running second while On Fire's kennel mate, She's A Looper flashed home to grab third in a great return to somewhere near her best form, only 1 further length away.

On Fire has now won 15 races from 31 starts and 12 placings with prizemoney over \$65,000.



Victa Ollie claims Prelude II

Popular trainer Ron Schadow took out the Breeders Prelude II Final with the classy Victa Ollie at Angle Park on May 4th.

Victa Ollie jumped brilliantly out from box 4 taking the lead by the first bend and from there was never challenged winning by 3 lengths in 30.20 secs ahead of Lonely Cowboy for Carole Scott with Raven Sky finishing in third for Judith Hurley.

Victa Ollie now has 8 wins and 7 placings from 29 starts.



Gun McBain clocks up another record – 150 starts


Iron dog Gun McBain clocked up another achievement when he competed at Angle Park on Wednesday 10th.

The son of Spring Gun and Flame McBain jumped out of the boxes for his 150th start over the 388m journey and for the 59th time he greeted the judge in first place. He has had an outstanding career with 49 placings added to his race wins and prizemoney just over \$150,000.

He is now 4½ years old and there could be more records just around the corner. Gun McBain already holds the Angle Park venue record at 47race wins however if he can achieve three more race wins at a TAB venue he will surpass Major Blaze's national record of 61 TAB race wins in Australia. Major Blaze competed in the early 2000's in Victoria. Gun McBain has returned to the track in great form so there is no reason why he can't continue on his winning ways.

First 4 months of dates released for 2017/2018

The racing dates will continue on the same current program however GRSA is still investigating other opportunities on the racing calendar.

The remainder of the season should be released in the next month along with all feature events for the new season. July 2017 to October 2017 can be seen on pages 32 and 33.

2017 Gawler Breeders Heats on June 11

After the Group 3 Howard Ashton Final next month the Gawler Breeders will be run on Sunday 11th and 18th June for those greyhounds that are SA Bred and eligible for Breeders 2017.

• Nominations will close on Tuesday 11th June with GRSA at 9.00am

Shane McQueen Memorial in early June

The main 600m feature at Angle Park comes up on Thursday 1st June with the running of the \$4,990 heats of the Shane McQueen Memorial.

This series has always been well supported by the Industry with 3 or 4 heats normally run. The Final will be held on Thursday 8th June and will be worth \$8,565.

• Nominations close on Monday 29th May with GRSA at 9.00am.

2017 Group 3 Howard Ashton

The major race for Breeders 2017 is the Group 3 Howard Ashton.

Trainers are reminded that the heats will be run on Wednesday 17th May. These will be followed by the Semi-Finals on May 25th and the \$37,500 Final on June 1st. Total prizemoney for heats and semis will be determined by the number of races run.

The race is for greyhounds that are eligible for Breeders 2017. Greyhounds don't have to have competed in the Preludes to run in the Group 3 Howard Ashton.

Bogie Bekim dominates with a brilliant April

It was a pretty clear choice for the judges in April with Bogie Bekim dominating their first preferences after some brilliant performances.

Trained by Ben Rawlings the son of Bekim Bale and Bogie Skye had 4 starts for the month with 3 wins and 1 second.

He started the month of with an outstanding win in a heat of the Group 1 Association Cup at Wentworth Park where he ran a brilliant 41.96 and would start one of the favourites in the feature stayers final. Against a top class field Bogie Bekim was brave in defeat running second in the Group 1 showing his class on the national stage. He returned to SA to compete in the SA Distance Championship series where he proved far too strong

for his competition on home soil. He won his heat in 43.11 and then went quicker in the final running a sizzling 43.08 in winning by over 4 lengths.

At the end of the month Bogie Bekim's record stands at 49 starts with 18 wins and 14 placings and earnings around \$180,000.

Striker Klinsman claims award with sizzling win

Run of the month for April was won by Striker Klinsman for trainer Tony Rasmussen for his sizzling performance at Angle Park on the 6th April in a Grade 5 event where he dominated his opposition.

Starting from box 6 he quickly mustered to find the front and from there was never challenged. He blitzed his rivals by almost 12 lengths running a sizzling 29.50 for the 515m journey and showing he will be a big player in the local feature races later this year.



AGRC/Greyhound **Racing SA Greyhound Auction – Major Final**

The Main race series for greyhounds that were purchased through the 2015 Auction will be \$4,590 Heats run on Thursday 8th June.

The \$26,000 Final will be run on Thursday 15th June 2017. Prizemoney for the Main Series Final is \$16,000, \$5,000, \$2,500, unplaced \$500

Nominator bonus payment at \$3,500, \$2,500, \$1,500.

• Nominations close on Monday 5th June with GRSA at 9.00am.

There will be another series to be run in July or August over 515m for \$1,130 heats with a \$5,000. These dates are yet to be confirmed.

Nominator bonus payment for this final is \$400, \$200, \$100.

2017 AGRC/Greyhound Racing **SA Greyhound Auction**

The Greyhound Auction will be held on the 29th October 2017 making it the 4th one since its reintroduction.

The conditions have changed from last year due to breeding numbers and processes.

The main changes are -

- Extension of dates for eligible pups increased to 1st October 16 to 31st June 17
- This will be a Reserve Auction with the vendor to pay commission on Reserve price if passed in to be eligible for the Race Series.

There will be more information in the coming weeks.

- Greyhounds purchased through the auction that are not SA Bred will be allowed the same grading exemptions in regards to Grade 6 and Juvenile races as locally bred greyhounds
- The main race series Heats and Final are scheduled for June 2019. One month before (May) there will be a Wednesday 388m series with Heats and Final for pups sold at the auction. There will also be a Wednesday heats 515m and Final Thursday night 515m held in July the month after the main race series

Stat declaration required for Queensland racing

A reminder to trainers that when nominating to race in Queensland that they accommodate their requirements under their local rule 34A.

This will also be a condition for State heats run in August for the National Distance and Sprint Championships as both National finals are run at Albion Park this year.

LR34A Declaration of trainer

- (1) When nominating a greyhound for a qualifying trial or Event, a trainer must submit a statutory declaration in the form prescribed by Racing Queensland, declaring that the trainer has not participated and will not participate in an act of animal cruelty or any other activities that would be unlawful (declaration of training propriety).
- (2) If a trainer fails to provide the declaration of training propriety without reasonable excuse:
- (a) The trainer must not nominate, or attempt to nominate, the greyhound for any qualifying trial or Event; and
- (b) The greyhound may be declared disqualified from the qualifying trial or Event.

Booking online for Saturday morning trials at Angle Park

GRSA introduced the Online Booking process for Saturday morning trials recently. Bookings will be taken as per normal by phone and online at 12.30pm on the Thursday before. Like Tuesday night these will be timeslots giving participants guaranteed bookings and allowing a smoother process. Trials on Saturday mornings start at 7.00am as normal with 25 minute blocks likely to go to around 10.30am. GRSA will monitor the bookings and attendance and may vary conditions and timeslots as required.

Gawler Empty Out/Preview Area

With the Re-vamped preview/empty out area now completely established, it is important for trainers to know that this is the designated area for emptying your Greyhound. In the past trainers have used the fence lines and under the trees for emptying out, which has resulted in numerous complaints from other users to the Council.

In the past the Council have been reasonable and not issued on the spot infringement notices to those that have not picked up waste. This will now cease to be the case. If an inspector sights trainers emptying their Greyhound and not cleaning up afterwards, infringement notices will be issued. The fines are quite hefty and we would prefer that trainers use the area GRSA has provided to avoid these fines.

Gawler Trials- Completion by 10am Thursday's

With winter on the way a number of trainers are arriving later on a Thursday morning to trial their Greyhound. Please note that trials are to be completed by 10am. This will require trainers to arrive and register by 9:30am at the latest to avoid missing out on the opportunity to trial.

No bookmakers at Angle Park Monday & Wednesday from May 1st

Long serving Bookmaker Peter Damarell who has fielded at Angle Park on Mondays and Wednesdays for many years will reduce his commitment back to Thursday nights only at Angle Park from 1st May 2017.

GRSA would like to thank Peter and his staff for all their time and efforts over the years on these days. As mentioned Peter will continue as always on Thursday nights at headquarters.

GRADING REVIEW PANEL

The Grading Review Panel met on Friday 28th April to discuss grading in South Australia from an Agenda provided by submissions and industry consultation.

Following is a summary and recommendations of items discussed:

The panel approved the minutes from the previous GRP meeting held on 11/11/16. The panel reviewed recommendations and implementations from the previous GRP meeting with their recommendations below.

The panel reviewed moving Grade 5 heats and Maiden heats to Mondays allowing for more opportunities for 388m on Wednesday. The panel were comfortable with this move allowing for up to 12 races on APK Monday nights and giving shorter course greyhounds an opportunity on APD Wednesday.

The panel reviewed leaving Grade 6's in future engagements when they have won their 4th Grade 6 or 12th race win. The panel were advised that this only affected two greyhounds in the last 6 months and were comfortable allowing these greyhounds to stay in their engagements.

The panel reviewed maiden's required to do a performance trial prior to racing. The Racing Manager advised that with the introduction of Time Grading and to enhance the Integrity of the industry performance trials for Maidens prior to racing was seen as an important requirement and is still being discussed as a National policy. Some members of the panel believed this would benefit wagering while some felt this may disadvantage some owners. Performance trials are common practice in the gallops and both NSW and WA require their greyhounds to do a trial prior to their first start. The Racing Manager advised by introducing this requirement this could stretch the resources of GRSA. The panel advised they would like more information from NSW and WA in regard to the application of these trials in their states and how this could be managed by GRSA staff however were reasonably open to this being introduced into SA.

The panel held over the Order of Preference review as the focus of today's meeting was mainly regarding the progression of Time Grading & Pathway Racing.

Business Arising

The Racing Manager provided a verbal update to the panel on the progress of the below items.

Additional Split Timing Angle Park – The Racing Manager advised this should be introduced shortly. GRSA was waiting for Brooks Group to be onsite to implement this change however due to the cost of them coming from Interstate it was best to do this when GRSA required a few items to be fixed. This will be changed to have a split at the 731m boxes from the 388m start. This will only record the lead greyhound with the normal split off the back straight still capturing all greyhounds. The panel were comfortable with this timeline.

Grading Review Panel Members – The Racing Manager advised that the 4 current members whose term ends at the end of the year have indicated that they wish to apply for another 2 year term. As per the policy GRSA will advertise to the Industry for industry persons to join the panel and then a decision will be made by GRSA in regard to those applicants potentially replacing those current members.

Pathway Racing

The Racing Manager advised that Pathway racing was introduced in January 2016 and has been reviewed regularly. The panel were asked some general questions in regard to Pathway races below-

- Currently Pathway racing is programmed at Angle Pak Monday (once per month), Gawler Sunday (once per month), Angle Park Wednesday (once per month) with generally one race per grade specifically for greyhounds with no form? The panel were comfortable with this however questioned the need for both Pathway and Time Grading. They did not think they could exist in the same racing calendar.
- We currently allow a maximum of two trainers per race in Pathway Racing. Is this the right balance? The panel were comfortable with this however reiterated if there was a need for both Pathway and Time Grading racing.
- Does GRSA have the eligibility times correct for Pathway greyhounds? The panel believed the Pathway times were far too generous which captured a lot of eligible greyhounds with good race form. The panel believed they needed to be adjusted if Pathway was to continue so it was definitely the greyhounds who struggled to gain a start being eligible. The Racing Manager advised that the Grader already does that by generally running only those races with no form which tends to be one race per grade and distance.
- Is the flattened stake money (Non Penalty) appropriate for these races? The panel were comfortable with this but suggested it monitored.

The panel advised that both Time Grading and Pathway racing wasn't really working separately as they both try and achieve the same thing. There seemed to be more support for moving away from Pathway and concentrating more on bottom up Time Grading. The panel would still like to keep the Pathway brand as it highlights these greyhounds getting a racing opportunity. The Racing Manager advised that the Pathway races have created significant racing opportunities for greyhounds of all abilities and any decisions about these races are of great importance.

Timed Grading

The panel were advised that Time Grading has developed very quickly, with the clear intentions of grouping greyhounds of the same ability with GRSA currently running Time Graded events once a month on APD Wednesday's

(bottom up), once a month on APM Monday night (top down) and Mount Gambier recently introducing Time Grading on their Friday meeting before their Sunday meeting each fortnight (bottom up). Nationally SA leads the way with the Time Grading concept which has garnered support from other States with Tasmania, Queensland and Western Australia all looking to introduce these types of races (using SA criteria) on a trial basis with feedback going towards a potential National framework.

GRSA believes that Time Grading fairly groups greyhounds of all abilities with no greyhound being considered too slow for racing. However, the Time Grading concept is still in a trial basis and the panel were asked questions on how to improve the conditions -

• Should all races in Time Grading have reserves? The panel understood why certain races have reserves and others do not so that the mixing of greyhounds of the same ability is not compromised however they were mindful that this means on occasions race fields will be affected by scratchings. The panel considered the best way to address this issue, without compromising those greyhounds it was recommended to grade the 9 and 10 greyhounds in order as reserves but then also include them in the next race as a starter. If there was a scratching they would come out of the one race and into the other one. They would be moving into a slightly weaker race for bottom up grading however for top down they would move to a slightly stronger race based on times. The panel considered if the 9 should go in ahead of the 10 like a final however this would be dependent upon the OzChase system and what it would accept. The panel were mindful of the integrity of the selection of these greyhounds.

The Racing Manager was advised to implement as soon as possible when OzChase requirements have been met.

• The panel were advised that for best to worst racing high grade greyhounds were left out if there was not a single race for them (5 or more). The panel understood that the higher graded greyhounds also have a time rating so they should be considered to be mixed with greyhounds of the same time rating regardless of grade. The panel at this stage were mindful of the conditions of mixing Grade 5 greyhounds with higher graded dogs, however, they still required for this to occur. ie a Grade 4 can be mixed with a Grade 5 however a Grade 3 will not unless there is also a Grade 4 greyhound selected.

The Racing Manager was advised to advertise to industry and implement as soon as possible.

 The panel were asked if all greyhounds should be given a Time Rating instead of those who have had 0 to 2 starts being left out? The panel would prefer all greyhounds to gain a start so they decided that a greyhound with 0 starts should be given a rating of 10 as a starting point. At its second start it will have the average of 10 and its first start. At its third start, it will be the average of the 2 lowest ratings, including the base rating of 10. ie if had 12, 12 from 2 starts, it will be 10 + 12 / 2 = 11. The panel considered 10 as a fair starting point however advised that if performance trials were introduced for all first starters then this could be used instead. The Racing Manager was mindful of the integrity of the process if implemented this way. The Racing Manager advised that as soon as the report from OzChase was updated this could be implemented, which the panel agreed.

Time Grading does not include guarding. The panel were asked if guarding was introduced how this would be implemented so it did not compromise the ratings? The panel were vocal about guarding being required especially if Time Grading was to be introduced for more top down racing. The panel advised the impact this would have on trainers and owners. The guarding of greyhounds cannot occur for Time Grading to work so the panel felt it was best to keep trialling under the same conditions. The Strategic Projects Manager advised that he will send the panel every Angle Park Monday and Thursday nights fields as if they were Time Graded so the panel can see the field make up for our better meetings compared to what was drawn under the Order of Preference.

The panel were comfortable with the prizemoney levels and the evenness of racing Time Grading provides. The panel had a preference for Time Grading ahead of Pathway racing and believed the trial should continue in its current form with those changes approved earlier in the Agenda. The panel were advised that Mount Gambier GRC is now running Time Graded meetings to assist greyhounds rather than Pathway.

The Racing Manager advised the panel of other conditions that South Australia and other States are investigating to ensure the Time Grading process is working to accommodate all greyhounds and capture all conditions. Changes to the Time Grading process in the future may consist of?

- giving a Time Rating for a greyhound returning from injury layoff.
- assessing greyhounds going up or down in distance.
- What to do with a greyhound that is a standout greyhound nominated for the event based on rating.
- selecting 'best' dogs for Special Events (Possibly APM).
- seeding of greyhounds for heats.
- protecting young fast dogs (Maiden, Novice (1-4 wins), Open Class, Masters).
- Protections for SA Bred dogs and Grade 6 grades.
- The need for the Order of Preference.
- Rating of tracks (Fast, Normal, Slow) which could affect a greyhounds performance.

The panel understood these changes would allow to drill deeper into getting every greyhound classified fairly on time however understood that at present the current conditions allow for an even grouping of greyhounds.

The Racing Manager advised that Greyhound Racing Victoria are looking at No grades when they trial Aged Prizemoney for their lesser greyhounds and suggested SA could trial a similar thing with their bottom up meetings. These races are Non Penalty anyway and are for Maidens, G6 and G5 only so it would really be just how they are grouped. Maidens would be graded together, 1 – 4 wins would be graded together and then 5 wins and above would be graded together all on time, bottom up. The Racing Manager suggested a Mount Gambier Friday and an Angle Park Wednesday to be trialled which was supported by the panel.

Agenda

Order of Preference

There was one point from the current Order of Preference which refers to performances in the last three months which the Racing Manager recommended to the panel to be changed to the last six months. This would then be consistent with the 6 month trialling and Masters eligibility. This may only affect a couple of greyhounds per month which may have received a run anyway. The panel agreed to make this change to the Order of Preference from the race meeting on 1st June 2017.

Breeders and Classic Futurity Series

GRSA altered the Breeders 2017 Prelude (2) series from a 5 day series to an 8 day series recently after feedback from participants. This was initially changed to 5 days a number of years ago to accommodate greyhounds who wished to compete in the SA Derby and Adelaide Cup however in the 2016/2017 season all of these series were programmed with a 5 day break to assist with the Monday fields and tight programming. The panel agreed to program these races with atleast a 7 day break for young greyhounds whether it is Monday to Monday or Wednesday to Thursday depending on how it could be programmed in the calendar. This would still assist promotion of 515m racing on Monday and free up some Wednesdays for short course racing. The panel believed this was for restricted age races only and for open or cup events they were comfortable with a 5 day break like the Gawler Cup series. The panel however were comfortable if the Gawler Cup was moved to Sunday heats into a Sunday final. The panel enquired what if a trainer nominated a greyhound in between the 7 day break for another race? The panel felt that was the responsibility of the trainer in planning of the greyhound's preparation. The panel considered with the reduction in breeding that whether the Breeders Futurity and Classic Futurity would be merged into one 12 month series instead of two 6 month series. The Racing Manager advised that whilst breeding was a concern at this stage both series would remain however this will be monitored over the next few years.

Interstate Initiatives

The panel considered GRV's consideration of removing all grades and racing on Aged Prizemoney for a trial period which will be tiered over the course of a greyhound's career for their lesser meetings. Like Time Grading the panel were interested in the outcomes of these events however were comfortable to see how this implementation goes in Victoria before considering this type of grading in SA.

The panel also considered a NSW option of trialling 6 dog events. The Racing Manager advised that this trial may take place at Non TAB events in NSW and would be hard to gauge the impact from wagering however would be interesting from an injury rate and race interference perspective. The panel felt that a 6 greyhound per race, race meeting should be considered in SA to give an indication of the impact for racing and wagering etc. The Strategic Projects Manager advised that in a few years time, 6 dog racing may be the normal and it may be worth considering. The panel suggested it could be an opportunity to introduce preferential box draws for inside, middle and outside greyhounds. The Racing Manager advised that at this stage the panel's comments would be noted and further investigation would be needed before any decision was made.

Stakemoney Strategy

The panel were asked about current Base stakes, Feature events, extra races per meeting, extra race meetings, rebates and bonuses. The panel were reasonably comfortable with the returns for racing in SA. They felt that the Metro stake should be around half of Victoria's Metro stake so they believe GRSA is achieving that. They reinforced the need for 500+ racing to continue to increase in stakes when available with the freeze on short course racing to continue. The panel whilst considering stakemoney levels were mindful of the rearing issues and finding homes for greyhounds and considered funds being spend in that direction as well.

General Discussion Points from Correspondence Received

- Christine Costa Pathway and Time Grading submission. The panel were appreciative of the time and effort that Christine had gone to in submitting her correspondence. The panel felt that some of her concerns had already been addressed in the programming of Pathway and Time Grading races and outcomes from todays meeting have addressed Christine's other issues.
- Ben Murphy Scratching of a Maiden greyhound. The panel were appreciative of Ben's correspondence which was in regard to a Victorian trained greyhound winning a Maiden race in Victoria a few days before it was to compete at Mt Gambier. The greyhound was left in resulting in Ben's greyhound missing a start from reserve. The panel were sympathetic to Ben's issue however understood that the FastTrack and OzChase systems do not always talk at the same level. They believed the responsibility lied with the trainer and that the onus was on him to scratch the greyhound.

• GRSA asked for Submissions from Posts on Facebook regarding Time Grading and Pathway Racing. There were three posts and the panel were comfortable that they had addressed any relevant issues.

Late Items

- The panel suggested a reshuffling of Gawler meetings. Rather than the Provincial 1 meeting being on a Tuesday and a Provincial 2 meeting being on a Sunday the panel suggested that Sundays be all Provincial 1 with the Tuesdays reverting back to Provincial 2. The Racing Manager advised that this would be something that would have to be tabled at the ICG however could be worth considering. The panel felt that the better racing and more prizemoney on Sunday nights would give more opportunities to participants to compete and may stimulate better wagering. The Racing Manager advised that he would table at the ICG on Friday 5th May and advise the panel accordingly.
- The Strategic Projects Manager advised that he would make minor changes to the Time Grading table to accommodate some times over distances that seemed to be slightly out of sync with all the other times. The

panel was advised this would be published prior to implementation.

- The panel were advised that at Mt Gambier there has been good success with running 0-3 or 0-4 win 600m along with a mixed 4/5 events over the middle distance which has built up numbers to a point where the club is running two 600m events each meeting. The panel felt programming of these races at other venues could assist numbers.
- The panel were asked to consider the trial venue at Emerley Park and how this could be best utilised by participant's. The panel felt that the track had to be dug up and re-laid with more sand. They also believed a proper timing system was imperative for trialling their greyhounds at the venue. The Racing Manager advised that this item was on the Agenda for the ICG meeting and their feedback would be conveyed.

The panel believed with Time Grading/Pathway racing etc and the direction grading could be taking during this trial period that it was best to meet in 3 months time rather than waiting to the end of the year. The Racing Manager advised this was reasonable and that the GRP would meet again in the next few months.

INTEGRITY

From the Stewards

Licensing time

Licensing time is nearly here. All renewal forms will be posted out the last week of May. GRSA asks for participants to correctly lodge all paperwork as early as possible and allow time for the licenses and new cards to be processed.

GRSA will be following other States by implementing the tiered licensing system for trainers. The tiering system is essentially a change of name from 'Public' and 'Owner Trainer'. It will allow the Controlling Body more control over new licences. We will 'grand-father' all current trainers into the new tiering system and will ensure no trainer is disadvantaged by what tier they are categorisedunder. Advice will accompany your renewal form for which tier you fall under. If you feel GRSA has placed you in the incorrect category, please contact the licensing department as soon as possible.

A copy of the GRSA tiering policy will be sent with licence renewal letter and via the GRSA website.

Unpaid fines

Please ensure that any outstanding fines are paid or arrangements made for payment plans, as participants who have monies owing may not have their licence renewed.

Please be proactive in contacting the Integrity department to clarify if you think this will affect you.

Registered persons associating with disqualified persons

Stewards take a dim view of anyone found to be contacting a disqualified person, either face-to-face or via social media. Action will be taken against anyone found to be breaching the Rule.

The relevant Rule is below:

R86 Offences

A person (including an official) shall be guilty of an offence if the person -

(ah) being a registered person or person associated with greyhound racing, associates with a disqualified person for the purposes of greyhound racing

Please contact the Stewards department if you require clarification about the Rule.

Timeliness of lodging of Notification of Retirement forms

A reminder to ensure Notification of Retirement forms are completed and lodged with the Controlling Body within certain timeframes. This is not set by GRSA – it is a national requirement.

Paperwork for a retired greyhound must be lodged within ten working days. However, if a greyhound has been humanely euthanised, paperwork must be lodged within two working days.

At the discretion of the Integrity department, extra evidence may be required in the form of a Statutory Declaration or a veterinary report.

Greyhound workshop certificates

Certificates will be mailed with licence renewals to all trainers who successfully completed the workshop.

Inquiries and notifications

Mr. Wayne Verrall – Notice of inquiry – Stewards have opened an inquiry to the bonafides of the ownership and training of the greyhound ROSCO FIELDS. Inquiry to be held 11/05/17.

Mr. Walter Harkins – Stewards inquiry 21/04/17 – GAR 86(o) – misconduct in relation to behaviour at the Angle Park race meetings on 6 and 10 April 2017. Mr. Harkins pleaded guilty and was fined \$250; wholly suspended for a period of 24 months on the condition he does not reoffend under this Rule. GAR 86(f)(i) – improper language towards a Steward at the Angle Park race meeting on 10 April 2017. Mr. Harkins pleaded guilty and was fined \$300; with \$200 suspended for a period of 12 months on the condition he does not reoffend under this Rule.

Mr. Todd Kelly – Racing Appeal Tribunal 09/05/17 – GAR 83(2) failed to present the greyhound IT'S NO MYTH free of any prohibited substances AMPHETAMINE for an event at Gawler on 6 October 2016. Submissions were put forward from both Mr. Kelly and GRSA Stewards. RAT President has reserved his decision until a date to be fixed.

Mr. Stephen Bartholomew – Notice of positive swab – greyhound HARSHLY JUDGED was found to have COBALT in a urine sample following an event at Mount Gambier on 19 February 2017. Inquiry to be scheduled at a date to be fixed.

Mr. Steve Hoffman – Notice of positive swab – greyhound LIKE A TORNADO was found to have COBALT in a urine sample following an event at Angle Park on 12 February 2017. Inquiry to be held 30/05/17.

Cobalt distributions

The cobalt Rule has now been in place for more than 18 months.

The current threshold level is set at 100ng/mL. The GRSA Integrity department have kept statistics since the introduction of the threshold to monitor the distribution of cobalt levels from every sample taken in SA.


Below is a graph to show the where samples have fallen in the current financial year. 92% of all samples taken have returned a cobalt reading of <10ng/mL. Nearly 98% have registered a reading of <25ng/mL.

Trainers are reminded to be mindful of their obligations under the Rules and should use caution when supplementing or treating greyhounds.

New strain of Parvo discovered

In noting that a new strain of canine parvovirus has been discovered in South Australia and Victoria, this is a timely reminder of the need for participants to ensure that the vaccination status of all greyhounds in their care is current and compliant.

The Golden Rules

Avoidance of Prohibited Substance Breaches

In noting that we have seen recent Cobalt and Arsenic threshold breaches, it serves as a timely opportunity for GRSA to remind participants – in their own best interests – that there are a number of Golden Rules that can help them to avoid making any such breaches (for prohibited substances generally) and which should be adhered to as principles of best practice:

- Always consult your vet to seek guidance in relation to any of the products that you are using, any associated risks, and other relevant context
- Review the range of any feeds or supplements that you typically purchase and, wherever it is reasonable to do so, replace products containing substances that could contribute to a threshold breach under the rules (eg. cobalt) with alternative products
- Observe the instructions on any products that you use and adhere strictly to those directions
 (having regard for prescribed amounts, frequency of administration/application, methodology for administering/applying)
- Refrain from the use of injectable treatments (eg. Vitamin B12) to any extent that is practical
- Refrain from any treatment of a greyhound on raceday other than as relates to its feeding and drinking requirements (GAR83(a)(1) treats this as a specific offence)

Our registered participants have the ultimate responsibility to ensure that greyhounds are presented free of prohibited substances. This information is offered as advice in good faith only and should not be relied upon as a defence in the event of a breach being recorded.

These Golden Rules will appear in the Integrity section of future Kennel Capers editions on an ongoing basis as a reminder for participants of this responsibility.

Easter success

The Gawler Greyhound Club staged its first running of the Easter Sprint on 16th April over the 531m distance on a balmy night.

When the lids went up in the mixed Grade 4/5 event, Halo Haze from box 3 showed the way, from Ruff State (4) and Marlow Brown (7). Down the back straight, it was a close battle between those three runners, with Allen Portland (6) sneaking up behind them on the rails.

Around the home turn, Allen Portland gained the upper hand on the inside and went to the front, withstanding a strong finish from Marlow Brown, to win by less than a length in the time of 31.05 secs. Marlow Brown is trained at Angaston by Paula Hearnden and third was fast finishing Cut Loose Max (8), for Con Haagmans of Marrabel.

Scott Feltus trains Allen Portland for the Highercombe Hacks, a syndicate of golfers from the Highercombe Golf Club and managed by Justin Kuhar. The syndicate made contact with Scott Feltus through friends and a work syndicate and they now race 4 greyhounds with Scott Feltus. With a wide draw in the race, Scott Feltus was not overly optimistic about his charge's chances, as Allen Portland prefers an inside run, but once the greyhound did find the rails, off he went.

Scott Feltus' father Ken Feltus was a trainer in harness racing, but Scott Feltus didn't follow that path as he found

Shotgun Doll set to fire in feature final

■ MOUNT GAMBIER

Heathmere greyhound Shotgun Doll, a smart winner of the third of four Allestree Holiday Units Feature Grade Five (400 metres) heats at Tara Raceway last weekend, looks one of the hardest to beat in Sunday's \$2100 final.

Trained by Garry Marshman, Shotgun Doll raced into the final with an all-the-way win from the six, defeating Goldie's Run by two lengths in a smart 23.19 seconds.

By Collision out of Flaming Doll, the brindle bitch – a winner of seven races on Victorian provincial tracks – should be improved by the run as she was having her first race start in more than a month and her first look under racing conditions at Tara Raceway.

With the first two from each heat through to the final, Goldie's Run, trained at Compton by Tracie Price, should also be able to find a bit as he had been coming off a couple of 600 metre runs and was having his first race start over the short course.

For Marshman, his association with the "Doll" greyhounds goes back to the early 2000s and a brindle bitch called Hot Doll who won eight races on Victorian provincial tracks.

The heats kicked off with Fascinated and Monster Deeds, owned and trained at Koroit by Garry Anders, going stride for stride for much of the race, before the former finished the stronger in the home straight to score by three-quarters of a length in 23.41 seconds.

Fascinated is owned and trained at Penshurst by John Cameron who lined up the lightly-framed 24 kilogram bitch in the short-course series on the back of two 650 metre runs at Warrnambool and one at the local track over 600 metres.

This was Fascinated's first 400 metre win and her fifth overall at Tara Raceway with Cameron saying that a couple of very easy weeks after the three middle-distance runs seemed to pay off.

Hamilton trainer Tony Harding continues to do well with Saint Elite, a giveaway greyhound he took over owning and training at the beginning of last month and has not missed a place in his four starts for Harding, he was still a \$13 chance when lining up from box two in the second heat.

Saint Elite settled in third spot before railing through off the back and finishing too well for a 3½ length win in 23.57 seconds over the Dean Fennell trained Ramified.

Fastest heat winner was the Nicole Stanley trained Bluestone who led all the way from box four to defeat Baz's Moment and bring up his second win at the track in 23.10 seconds. By Kalden Komoto, who won five races in WA before a further 27 at Angle Park, Gawler and Strathalbyn,

out of eight-race WA winner Frantic Fusion, Bluestone was purchased from Adelaide early this year by a local 20-member syndicate that is managed by Deb Hicks.

Sunday's final is hard to assess with an even looking field but after Tuesday's box draw when Shotgun Doll came up with the one it's hard to pick against her, especially as she boasts a record from the inside of one win and two minor placings from four starts.

And with Fascinated likely to move out from box two, she should have plenty of room to move while, out wide, Monster Deeds doesn't look badly drawn in box eight considering his record of two wins and four minor placings from nine starts wearing the pink rug.

The final is set for a 2:49pm start on Sunday 14th May.

ANGLE PARK QUALIFYING TRIALS – NOW WEEKLY

Angle Park Qualifying Trials will now be run weekly on Tuesday night, for the corresponding Monday APM meeting and the Wednesday APD meeting. Trainers must be specific on their nominations about which day they are trialling for and what distance. (ie Wed 388m, Mon 515, Mon 600m etc).

Tuesday Angle Park Qualifying dates are:

May 23rd (for APM meeting on 29th May – not for APD Wednesday on 31st May due to Time Grading)
May 30th (for APM meeting on 5th June – for APD Wednesday on 7th June)

June 6th (for APM meeting on 12th June – for APD Wednesday on 14th June)

June 13th (not for APM meeting on 19th June due to Time Grading – for APD Wednesday on 21st June)

Nominations close with GRSA at 12.30pm on the Tuesday of the meeting.

NOMINATING ONLINE FOR QUALIFYING TRIALS

For Angle Park, Gawler and Strathalbyn qualifying trials the nominations must be lodged with GRSA by 12.30pm on the day of the meeting. To nominate online however you can only do this up until 11.59pm the day before. Due to a system security policy you cannot nominate on the day for these trials online. Please contact our staff if you have any issues with these nominations prior to them closing.

SINGLE TRIALS

A reminder to trainers that single trials can be booked with two greyhounds however you need to advise when booking of your intention to do this. If you wish to put three or more into this trial then a field trial will have to be booked.

BOOKING NUMBER FOR TRIALS

Participants wishing to book trials are required to ring 8243 7172, this phone line will only be used for trial bookings and will queue participants. By having this one number with participants queuing makes this process to be a more efficient way of booking trials.

There will be NO trials accepted through the normal administration number. To be fair to everyone GRSA will only accept bookings using the new number.

POLICY FOR TRIALS IN PLACE

Remember trials will only be taken from -

POLICY FOR TRIALLING AT ANGLE PARK AND GAWLER BEFORE THE RACE MEETING

RACE MEETING TRIAL POLICY

Angle Park Monday & Wednesday along with Gawler Tuesday, Friday and Sunday.

Two fields from the boxes with a maximum of four (4) greyhounds will be conducted immediately following the completion of the kennelling procedure for the Race Meeting.

The following lists the order in which greyhounds will be selected in the event if more than 8 greyhounds nominated.

- 1. Reserves at the Meeting that do not obtain starts.
- 2. Trainers that have greyhounds engaged and are located in an area affected by track closures.
- 3. Trainers that have greyhounds engaged.
- 4. Satisfactory trials.
- 5. Other greyhounds.

PROCEDURE/CRITERIA

- For Monday nights trainer to contact GRSA between 10.00am and 11.00am on the Monday to nominate. Should the Monday be a public holiday bookings are to be made between 8am and 9am on the scratching line.
- 2. For Angle Park Wednesday, Gawler Tuesday & Friday trainer to contact GRSA between 4.00pm and 4.30pm on the day before.
- 3. For Gawler Sunday trainer to contact GRSA between 8.00am and 9.00am on the scratching line to nominate.
- 4. Other than reserve greyhounds Trainers will be restricted to trialling one (1) greyhound unless nominations determine otherwise.
- 5. Stewards allot the Box for the Greyhound.
- 6. Trials will be 515m & 531m in distance as first preference. Other distances considered depending on nominations.
- 7. Greyhounds currently under suspension or not cleared to race are not eligible to be nominated (these trials are conducted as if they are at a race meeting so all greyhounds need to be eligible at nomination time).
- 8. Greyhound registration certificate or cards must be produced at kennelling time.
- Trainers with other greyhounds engaged can utilize the extra kennel space until such time they are ready to leave

OR trainers with no other greyhounds will be free to leave following their trial.

If there are 12 races at Angle Park or Gawler there will be NO trials.

The Vet Clinic at these meetings cannot be used to accommodate any greyhounds to allow for extra trialling greyhounds. This policy has been introduced so that participants book in under the policy. The Vet Clinic needs to be available for the Vet and Stewards at race meetings

EXCEPTIONS TO THIS POLICY-

- Thursday nights are kept available for the option for Interstate greyhounds to solo trial in a lead up to our Group races and also local greyhound's trialling for Group racing interstate.
- Local greyhounds will be allowed to solo trial in a lead up to a feature race upon request and they will take one of the eight kennels available for trialling ahead of the policy and sit separately to the 4 dog trials. Feature races are considered to be – Adelaide Cup, Gawler Cup, Oaks, Derby, Howard Ashton, Brian Johnstone, SA Sprint, SA Distance Championship, SA Anniversary Cup, SA Country Cup, National Finals & any Group race Interstate.
- Local greyhounds will be allowed to trial on a race night, where they are in preparation for a feature event and nominated for a meeting and the race does not stand up. This will include all distances and also take precedence over the policy.
- If a greyhound qualifies for a feature final and requires a trial in between this will be conducted as a solo trial and sit separately to the 2 four dog trials.

It is extremely important that trainers book in to trial at these race meetings. If unable to book in at these times then please contact GRSA where permission may be given to accept a booking outside of these times.

GAWLER

QUALIFYING TRIALS AT GAWLER

Qualifying trials are held every Wednesday for the corresponding Tuesday.

MURRAY BRIDGE

Trials are held on SUNDAY MORNINGS, from 9am to 10.30 am. Bookings MUST be sent via Telephone to Kay Burns 0437 497 554 or Bob Harris 0410 668 682 or email to burnsron1@bigpond.com. If there are no bookings there will be no trials.

MOUNT GAMBIER

The Mt Gambier GRC committee advises that satisfactory trials can be run in the summer months under the criteria below.

- 1. On race days when there are less than 12 races.
- On race days with 12 races when the temperature is 30 degrees or less trial can be run before the first race but greyhounds must leave the track straight after the trial to head back to their home kennel.
- 3. On a Saturday trial session when stewards are available.
