## CEO'S UPDATE

### The Difference That Change Makes

One of the things that has set SA apart from other states in recent years has been the extent to which our participants are prepared to cope with change. Our state faces a unique combination of challenges – lowest rate of Government funding, shrinking liquidity of UBET pools, Sky scheduling opportunities – which require us to either be responsive and adaptive or to just struggle through. The defining aspect of our local industry is that people seem to understand that that is our equation and that they cope with change better than any other group in racing.

In all, we have a highly consultative model, and the people who contribute to those processes do a better-than-reasonable job of wearing their whole-of-industry 'hats' rather than just seeking to make their own circumstances better. That's not to say, either, that all participants in the industry are involved in every decision, or that everyone will applaud every decision, nor does it mean that the outcomes will always be perfectly representative. What I would suggest, however, is that on matters of racing and operations [in particular] the feedback model is as functional as would be seen anywhere in the country, and it's a credit to those who are putting the effort into making that happen. That part of our model would be the envy of many.

It is commonplace, now, for an emerging issue to go out for general feedback on the industry Facebook site, and for the Industry Consultative Group [ICG] and Member Clubs to be drawn into debate about what strategies could best be implemented to the overall benefit of all South Australian participants. Through the vehicle of those discussions, the sport in SA has seen constant changes to its weekly schedule, to its racing format, its stakemoney model and, more recently, even in relation to track design considerations. Initiatives such as G-SIX [six dog fields] and Wagering Activity Payments [which link stakemoney to wagering revenue] would have taken much longer to implement in many other jurisdictions, if at all.

The same 'industry' spirit has seen a number of trainers going out of their way recently to support the Mt Gambier Club in their hour of need – due to the impact of border closures on Victorian nominations, and is undoubtedly contributing to a recent spike in breeding activity.

With a 'full schedule of racing now in place – which comprises daily racing across the Angle Park, Gawler, Murray Bridge triangle, and [imminently] a return to two weekly meetings at Mt Gambier – there are two simple factors which are placed to take SA to the next level, both of which are about scale. Firstly, as Covid restrictions lift and we continue to grow the local greyhound population it will enable us to fill the weekly meetings around Adelaide to run a mixture of G-SIX and G-EIGHT racing and consistently fill up a 12 race program. The other important factor is the consolidation of national tote pools, in the absence of which we're carrying a flat tyre.

To any extent that we can continue to embrace a culture of change – with decisions based on sound rationale and faithful consultation with industry – we will continue to throw ourselves in the path of opportunity.

# Another major spring win for Murray

## ■ GAWLER

The weather might have been cool for the Gawler Gold Cup on Sunday 25th October but there was plenty of hot racing!

In our premier race meeting of the year, the highlight of the night was the running of the \$26,500 Gawler Gold Cup, run over the 531m journey. In a unique set of events, the field comprised of four runners trained by Ray Murray, and three by his son Troy.

Troy's runner, Major Major from box 2, took the early lead, but Ray's runner Air Marshall (1) quickly railed through to lead, setting the race up for a true father and son battle. Getting away by three lengths down the back straight, Air Marshall was travelling well, but slowly Major Major gathered ground. With the two on level terms, entering the home straight, Major Major finished too strongly for Air Marshall, but then had to contend with a fast finishing Golden Night [3] who flashed home along the rails.

In a tight photo finish, Major Major won by just a head over Golden Night, also trained by Troy, with Air Marshall in third position. Both Major Major and Golden Night are owned by George Kairouz, who hails from NSW, and caps off a great few weeks for Troy and George. The duo took out the prestigious Group 1 Adelaide Cup recently with Golden Night, who also won the Group 3 SA Derby. Last night's win took Major Major's racing record to 20 wins and 9 placings from 36 race starts, and a prizemoney tally of over \$75,000.

Owner George Kairouz said he was "over the moon" with the results, and paid



tribute to his friend Terry Hill, and to Troy for their exceptional efforts. George has been involved in greyhounds for many years, and explained that since meeting Terry back in 1994, he has relied heavily on Terry's advice and judgement when selecting their breeding stock. Racing only greyhounds that he has bred, George said that he felt like a "kid in the lolly shop", being able to have the success of seeing

your own litters win Group events. Under Troy's care, George said that the dog's had gone to another level.

With the Murrys having seven runners between them, it was a taxing time arranging handlers and helpers to get them onto the track and to also catch, and they were grateful for help from family members, owners and other trainers.

## Fly For Trix flies around Angle Park for feature win

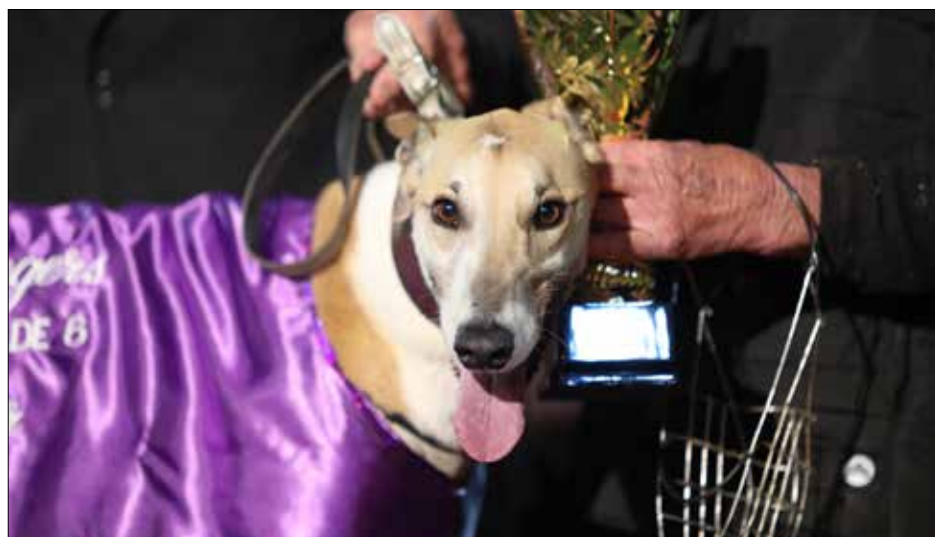
**The fourth running of the Leigh Rogers Grade 6 Feature Final was conducted at Angle Park on November 5th in cold conditions with Fly For Trix for Jane McNicholl making it four wins in a row when he led throughout in dominant fashion to claim the \$6,000 first prize.**

Another excellent line up greeted the starter after five terrific Heats were conducted the previous week, however, the punters felt there was only one winning chance with Fly For Trix starting a short priced favourite. As the start was affected the punters were feeling pretty happy with themselves when Fly For Trix pounced on the early lead at the winning post on the first occasion as he drove hard along the inside of Gold Flyer for Lisa Rasmussen which began smartly and challenged for that position. Snakebite Me for Ben Rawlings quickly moved to third as the other runners tried to find their positions in behind.

Entering the back straight and Fly For Trix started to stretch the field, racing away to a 7¼ length win from Gold Flyer who battled on really well to just finish second ahead of Zipping Marshall while Rouge Planet charged into fourth. The winner posted a sizzling 29.45 victory with splits of 4.40 and 16.72 for the 515m journey.

Fly For Trix which is locally bred and owned by Jane now has the imposing record of 12 wins and 3 placings from just 18 starts and career prizemoney just under \$20,000.

Leigh's wife Rachel and three young daughters were on hand to present the winning trophy to Jane McNicholl however, in a touching moment Jane presented the trophy back to the girls as a



memory for them with the race named in their dad's honour.

GRSA introduced this race to the feature race calendar in recognition of the former long time Food and Beverage Manager, who lost his battle with a rare form of

cancer four years ago. Also on hand were more of Leigh's family, friends and work colleagues in support of Leigh with many travelling long distances again to share in tonight's event.

## Brian Johnstone heats

At Angle Park on Wednesday, 11th November we saw the running of four Heats of the 2020 Brian Johnstone [Group 3] series. We had 29 final nominations with the fastest qualifier being Our Boy Wolf for Brenton Prouse running 29.99 in perfect conditions at headquarters.

The results of the Heats were: Heat 1 – Our Boy Wolf [29.99], Heat 2 – Fly For Trix [30.14], Heat 3 – Fly For Fashion [30.04] and Heat 4 – Love And Thunder [30.25].

From these Heats, we come down to two Semi-Finals on Thursday, 19th November with the \$37,500 Group 3 Brian Johnstone Final run on Thursday, 26th November 2020.

## Grading Review Panel meeting

The next Grading Review Panel meeting will be held at GRSA on Monday, 30th November 2020 at 11.30am.

An agenda will be sent to the panel members shortly with grading related items to be discussed at the meeting.

## Boxing for feature finals

GRSA advised previously that the boxing procedure for feature Heats and Finals (ie SA Derby, Mt Gambier Cup etc) will revert back to 2 rows where applicable.

The topic of boxing for all events is currently being considered by Management, however, the direction from SAPOL has not changed in relation to social distancing though it is reasonable to suggest that changes in this space are close.

## Updated trial schedule – effective Monday, 16<sup>th</sup> November

The SA greyhound racing schedule is set to change next week, with several amendments coming into effect from Monday, 16th November.

GRSA has undertaken consultation with participants, including the Industry Consultative Group [ICG], specifically in regards to the trial schedule which will support the revised racing calendar.

Whilst this new trialling schedule [table below] may not suit every participant, there were a number of factors taken into consideration,

including venue availability, resourcing of these sessions and the current number of greyhound's trialling at each track.

GRSA will closely monitor attendance at all trial sessions from next week, to ensure they are being reasonably well supported and are meeting participants needs.

# Award tops off a terrific month of racing



Greyhound of the Month for October was Golden Night for trainer Troy Murray which had four starts for the month, winning three races including the Group 1 TAB Adelaide Cup.

The son of Go Wild Teddy and Hilary started the month off with a brilliant 29.37 win in the Heat of the Adelaide Cup stamping himself as a real contender in the Final. He then ran a brilliant race to chase down Catch The Thief in the

shadows of the post to take out the Group 1 Adelaide Cup giving Troy his second win in the feature, 14 years after Miss Spicy won in 2006. He then went to Gawler for the Group 3 series as the series favourite and didn't disappoint in the Heats running a slick 30.67 and qualifying the fastest. His final run of the month was a gallant second in the Gawler Cup Final where he ran home powerfully to just fail to catch his kennel mate, Major Major in the prestigious northern feature.

At the end of the month Golden Night's record stood at 36 starts for 15 wins and 11 placings and earnings just under \$100,000 making him one of the best sprinters in the State, if not Australia.

**The Run of the Month for October was also Golden Night for trainer Troy Murray with his brilliant win in the Group 1 Adelaide Cup at Angle Park on Friday, 9th October.**

As the start was affected he stayed close on the heels of race favourite Catch The Thief from box 2. Down the back straight Golden Night moved to third as he chased hard and then quickly moved to second off the back straight to chase out after Catch The Thief. The two gun chasers settling down to fight out the Adelaide Cup as they turned for home and it was Golden Night who poked his nose in front right on the line to take the Group 1 feature in a flying 29.55. By winning the Group 1 he also booked his spot in the Group 1 Topgun at the Meadows in November.

## Updated cross border direction – Mount Gambier

**The updated Cross-Border Direction (No. 17) has been released and is now in effect. This Direction opens free movement to Victorian residents within 70km of the border (that is, no reason needed), but you still need to have your 7-day COVID tests. You also still need to possess a permit (either the current one or apply for one if you have not done so).**

HOWEVER, the new Direction has been re-written to clarify the position of where you can travel into Victoria. South Australia has effectively quarantined the area 70km both sides of Victoria to cross-border members. If you now travel more than 70km into Victoria, you can no longer cross into South Australia under the cross-border community member status. You can still cross but would need to apply under a different entry status. However, the other options are not suited to a race meeting visit.

What this means is, if you travel into Victoria more than 70km, you cannot rely on your cross-border community member status to then enter SA. The Direction is unclear on what time frame a Victorian cross border member who travels more than 70km into Victoria is not permitted into SA. Please check with police on this, but it is likely you would need a 12-day COVID negative test cycle (effectively, two 7-day negative tests), before you could cross into SA. If you went back into Victoria more than 70km, for any reason, you would need to repeat that process before you entered SA.

Please note it is a requirement for ALL participants to ensure they follow SAPOL direction whether it is being required to isolate for 14 days if a return traveller back into SA or staying within the 70km radius for Mt Gambier.

GRSA does not enforce SAPOL direction, however, we will manage as best we can to ensure our participants are abiding by their direction, if participants do not, it will be SAPOL knocking on their door.

We are hopeful these restrictions continue to ease across the State in the coming weeks.

**With the support of the Adelaide Greyhound Racing Club, Murray Bridge will conduct the SA Bred Summer Oaks and Derby again this year.**

Eligibility will be for SA bred greyhounds whelped on or after 1st July, 2018. The Heats will be run on Friday, 11th December with the Finals on Friday, 18th December.

The conditions are set out below -

\$1,505 Heats 2020 AGRC/Murray Bridge Country Summer Derby – 455m [SA Bred only. For dogs whelped on or after 1st July, 2018. \$4,135 Final on Friday, 18/12/20 sponsored by the AGRC. All grades eligible]

\$1,505 Heats 2020 AGRC/Murray Bridge Country Summer Oaks – 455m [SA Bred only. For dogs whelped on or after 1st July, 2018. \$4,135 Final on Friday, 18/12/20 sponsored by the AGRC. All grades eligible]

## Beanies now available from GRSA

**Approved beanies are now part of the GRSA Dress Code Policy and available for sale from GRSA.**

These beanies are GRSA specific and are the only ones approved. They cost \$10 and are available the GRSA racing office.

## Comments on nominations marked “only”

**A few years ago the Grading Review Panel agreed that some trainers were using the comments box to influence the grading of fields in particular Grade 5 Only for all their greyhounds.**

The panel previously resolved that “Only” would be disregarded over all distances and the grading left to the Grader. [Masters Only or Juvenile Only will be accepted as this is for a specific type of race]

If trainers put “Only or no start or leave me out” then the grader will grade as normal and if a greyhound would be graded into a mixed event based on race wins then he will leave them out based on the trainers request. The more information provided to the Grader allows for him to accommodate those requests.

## Updates from the recent board meeting regarding stakemoney outcomes

Further to recent consultation, the following stakemoney outcomes were resolved at the Board Meeting of October 15:

- The Maiden bonus payment will be restored to \$1,000 from \$500 with effect from November 1, 2020
- The reduction to payments for Group races and other feature events will continue through until 30 June 2021 [in the absence of further context warranting ICG review in the interim] which means that the value of those reductions will flow-through [positively] to the WAP framework
- The date for the cessation of the Group Race Superbonus Scheme will not be brought forward and that initiative will, therefore, continue through until 30 June 2022

Adelaide Cup [515m] - G1 \$12,500, Adelaide Cup 2nd - \$5,000, Adelaide Cup 3rd - \$2,500, Adelaide Cup finalist \$1,000; BGC SA Derby [515m] – G3 \$3,500, BGC SA Derby 2nd – \$1,500, BGC SA Derby 3rd – \$750; Coffex Coffee SA Oaks [515m] – G3 \$3,500, Coffex Coffee SA Oaks 2nd – \$1,500, Coffex Coffee SA Oaks 3rd – \$750; Gawler Gold Cup [531m] - G3 \$5,000; Mount Gambier Cup [512m] – Listed \$2,500; Murray Bridge Cup [455m] – Listed \$2,500; Group 1 victory [Interstate] \$10,000; Group 2 victory [Interstate] \$5,000; Group 3 victory [Interstate] \$2,500.

The super-bonuses for Interstate events will only be applied for series/events that are open entry. Events that are restricted by age or gender are eligible for the bonus. Events that are exclusively open to SA Bred runners or incorporate other restrictions, such as ‘sweepstake’ events, puppy/auction Classics and Maiden series are not eligible for the super-bonus.

**Trainers are reminded for those that book trials for Angle Park and Murray Bridge, staff are directed to accommodate those bookings.** For those trainers who wish to trial without booking, which is fine, they will only fit in if there is space or will be at the end of the bookings.

## Murray Bridge Slipping Track

**The Murray Bridge slipping track can now be used; those participants that registered their interest can pick up their key fobs from GRSA reception.**

Greyhounds graded into 3 categories. Maidens, 1-4 wins & 5 or more wins. Specific grades of greyhounds are not considered except for Maidens. Races–N/P with Pathway Prizemoney. Reserves will be determined by Grader. There will be No Guarding. Refer to “Time Based Grading” published conditions.

- Nominations close Tuesday, 24th November at 9.00am.

## 2021 Gawler Produce Stakes

The 2021 Gawler Produce Stakes will be run by GRSA in conjunction with the Gawler Greyhound Racing Club.

Once again we will offer guaranteed Final stakemoney of \$22,000. The estimate for the total series prizemoney is \$40,000, based on this years series. The series is for greyhounds whelped in 2019.

In 2021 we will again be offering additional incentives for trainers to nominate. A bonus will be offered to any greyhound which can win both the Produce Stake and the Gawler Gold Cup.

The jackpot has increased from \$8,000 to \$9,000 as Long Gully Barny missed out on winning the Gawler Gold Cup this year.

The SA Bred bonus will also be continued; should the winner of the Final be SA Bred, there will be a SA Bred bonus of \$1,000 to the owner and \$500 to the breeder.

The series will be in June/July with the Final on Sunday, 4th July 2021. [Pending approval]

GRSA administers the event for the Club, so all payments are to be made to GRSA. The fees are, one-off payment option \$121.00 or the sustaining option of \$33 (first), \$55 (second) and \$88 (Final).

Nomination Forms are available, along with the full list of conditions and the payment schedule.

# Summer here we come!

As summer fast approaches the landscape will continue to dry out, growth from winter and spring rains will create an abundance of fuel for bushfires that may affect you and your dogs.

If you live in, travel through or visit bushfire risk areas it is critical that you recognise the need to have a plan and be prepared.

The risk is real and you should be prepared for the worst at all times. The consequences can be both devastating and terrifying, so why risk it?

**Here are some points to be seriously considered when getting your property ready for summer and help greatly reduce the risk of being adversely affected by a bushfire:**

- Clean out your gutters on sheds and buildings keeping them free from debris such as leaves and bark. Removing branches of trees that are overhanging any of your buildings is advised.
- Create a defensible space around your home by reducing vegetation
- Rake up leaves and removed excess rubbish and debris from around buildings and other structures
- Move flammable objects away from house
- Ensure you have a well-stocked emergency kit
- Place wire 'ember' mesh over wall vents
- Ensure your dogs and cats are identified and registered in case you become separated.

- Ensure your pets' vaccinations are up to date in case they need to be placed in kennels.
- Be sure you can adequately restrain or confine your pets as it may become frightened and distressed.
- Have an appropriate container, vehicle or equipment to transport your animal.

**If you are planning to leave early in the event of a bushfire, consider what items you may need to include in your emergency kit for your pets, suggestions include:**

- Plastic containers for water and food
- Small amounts of pet food
- Suitable bedding
- Pet medication
- Animal documentation such as identification and vaccination certificates
- Update your 5 Min Bushfire Plan – don't have one... make your own 5 Minute Plan today by visiting the CFS website and take all precautions necessary. Follow this link for more details:

Remember to also think of others in the community and alert them to potential hazards and check on them in the event a bushfire occurs.

## Important points to remember on "High Risk Fire Days"

- If you have to leave your home during the day you will need to decide whether to take your animals to a safer place.
- Keep in mind that, if there is a fire, you may not be able to return to your home for some time.
- If you are home, keep your pets inside (where possible).
- Check you have the necessary pet items in your emergency kit if you plan to leave early.
- Have somewhere pre-arranged to accept your animals (if large number are being moved).
- When leaving your home keep all dogs on a lead and confine other animals in cages or suitable carrying devices.
- Cover cages with a woollen blanket to minimise distress and secure all pets in a car or vehicle that provides adequate protection for transportation.

# Happy days at Gawler for Angry Trip

**The Final of the Gawler Stayers Cup was run on the Friday October 30, after the two Heats were run on Gold Cup night.**

The 643m distance race saw Angry Trip from box 1 and Spring Cobra [7] on even terms as they hit the straight the first time around. Spring Cobra was able to get to the front as they swept out of the straight, with Toora Ziggy [2] starting to run into the picture. Spring Cobra was able to establish a three length break over Angry Trip down the back straight, but as the race unfolded, Angry Trip steadily made up ground on the leader. In an exciting run to the line, Angry Trip hit the front with 20 metres to go, winning by just under a length. Spring Cobra was second for Greg Board of Murray Bridge, with Toora Ziggy third for Laurie Cahalan of Grange.

Angry Trip is a red brindle dog, and is owned and trained by Bec Romyn at Two Wells. In an uncommon circumstance, Bec bought the dog after he had been named, but before he had raced. Bec said that he was a bit on the slow side at the start of his races, but she thought he would show promise over the longer journeys. Bec's judgement was spot on, as in 71 starts, Angry Trip has only won twice in races less than 600m, but has won six over 600m and four over 700m.

# Murray Bridge slipping track officially opened

On Saturday, 31st October, the Minister for Recreation, Sport and Racing, Honourable Corey Wingard officially opened the latest facility at the venue, a new slipping (exercise) track. Used for the purpose of training greyhounds, the slipping track was made possible thanks to \$172,500 of funding provided by the Government racing stimulus package announced in June 2019.

The Murray Bridge slipping track is approximately 300 metres long and 4 metres wide with a sand surface similar to an existing slipping track located at Angle Park. The slipping track benefits trainers because it provides them with a shared free galloping facility at the venue to exercise their greyhounds outside of track trial times.

The official opening was undertaken by the Minister for Racing, the Hon Corey Wingard, along with representatives of Adrian Pederick's office, Member for Hammond. Also present were Greyhound Racing SA Chairman, Grantley Stevens, Director Ray Fewings and CEO Matthew Corby.

"Projects like this one are about helping



the racing industry build the infrastructure needed to create a viable, long-term business model which will support South Australian jobs well into the future." Corey Wingard explained about the project.

"Racing is an important contributor to our

state's economy, not only in the major centres but also across regional towns and communities." Continued Mr Wingard.

This facility will further support the local participants and the greyhound racing industry in the Murray Bridge region.

## Reminder - Hot Weather Policy review

**The GRSA Hot Weather Policy was reviewed in March at an Industry Consultative Group Meeting. Some important changes have been made:**

- 1] Early kennelling will be implemented if the temperature is expected to reach or exceed 35 degrees at kennelling time. Participants will be advised via text message.
- 2] Trainers will no longer be required to provide a Veterinary Certificate confirming that a greyhound suffers from heat stress to have a greyhound included on the Heat Stress Register.
- 3] Early kennelling will not be provided for day meetings. It will apply to twilight and night meetings only.

Please consult Stewards if you require clarification.

## Kennel House whiteboards

**White boards have been placed at prominent positions inside the kennel houses at Angle Park, Gawler and Murray Bridge. Stewards will make note on these boards of all greyhounds required to undergo a post-race Veterinary examination.**

Participants responsible for each greyhound are asked to seek clearance from Stewards (in the Stewards Room) prior to leaving the race meeting. Please do not ask kennel house staff. Failure to obtain clearance from Stewards may result in you having to return to the track if required.

## Welfare compliance – kennel inspections

**Our Animal Welfare Officers continue to conduct kennel inspections to monitor compliance under the Rules of Greyhound Racing.**

The inspections are an important and necessary part of the compliance process and your cooperation is always appreciated. If you find yourself in a situation where you have a question about your obligations, or simply want to check if your process is acceptable, please call the Animal Welfare Team at Angle Park. Our team can give you guidance on your operation and can assist with suggestions on best practice.

## Bullying

**Racing – like any endeavour that attracts passionate people – has its fair share of rivalry and friendly banter.**

This is part of the atmosphere of the sport. Where it becomes unacceptable is when the banter gets personal and intended to cause insult or stress to another person. The test is simple: "Would I like that to happen to me?" If you are put in a position where you feel that you are the recipient of unwelcome behaviour, please contact me for a confidential discussion about your situation and options to move forward. The Rules of Greyhound Racing are wide and cover situations that include unwelcome behaviour. Examples of this type of unwanted behaviour are social media posts and comments, either from a known user or a 'troll', that are insulting, offensive, abusive or defamatory. Being behind a keyboard or a phone in the comfort of one's home does not make them immune from a moral obligation to be respectful, and also the terms and conditions of the various social media platforms, as well as our own Rules of Greyhound Racing, criminal and defamation law. Please remember that comments can affect – and hurt – the recipient of the comment.

## Integrity Hearings Panel

**This year has seen the Integrity Hearings Panel (IHP) conduct hearings for breaches of the Rules of Greyhound Racing that are deemed 'serious offences'.**

Stewards remain the arbiters of racing and non-serious offences. If you have any questions about the operations of the IHP or Stewards' Inquiries, please contact me. On a more general note, it does not need me to tell you that greyhound racing is heavily regulated. You can find the rules and policies on the GRSA web page. For more assistance, please contact me.

## Covid-19 response

**By now, you are used to the usual social distancing practices we have had for most of this year.**

Again, may I thank you all for your commendable efforts to help do our bit to combat the pandemic. It's only through folk like you that the process works. # Projects Update

## Angle Park Re-Design Finalised

**The redevelopment of the Angle Park racing track will proceed as planned in early 2021, after the Industry Consultative Group (ICG) this week endorsed the final design.**

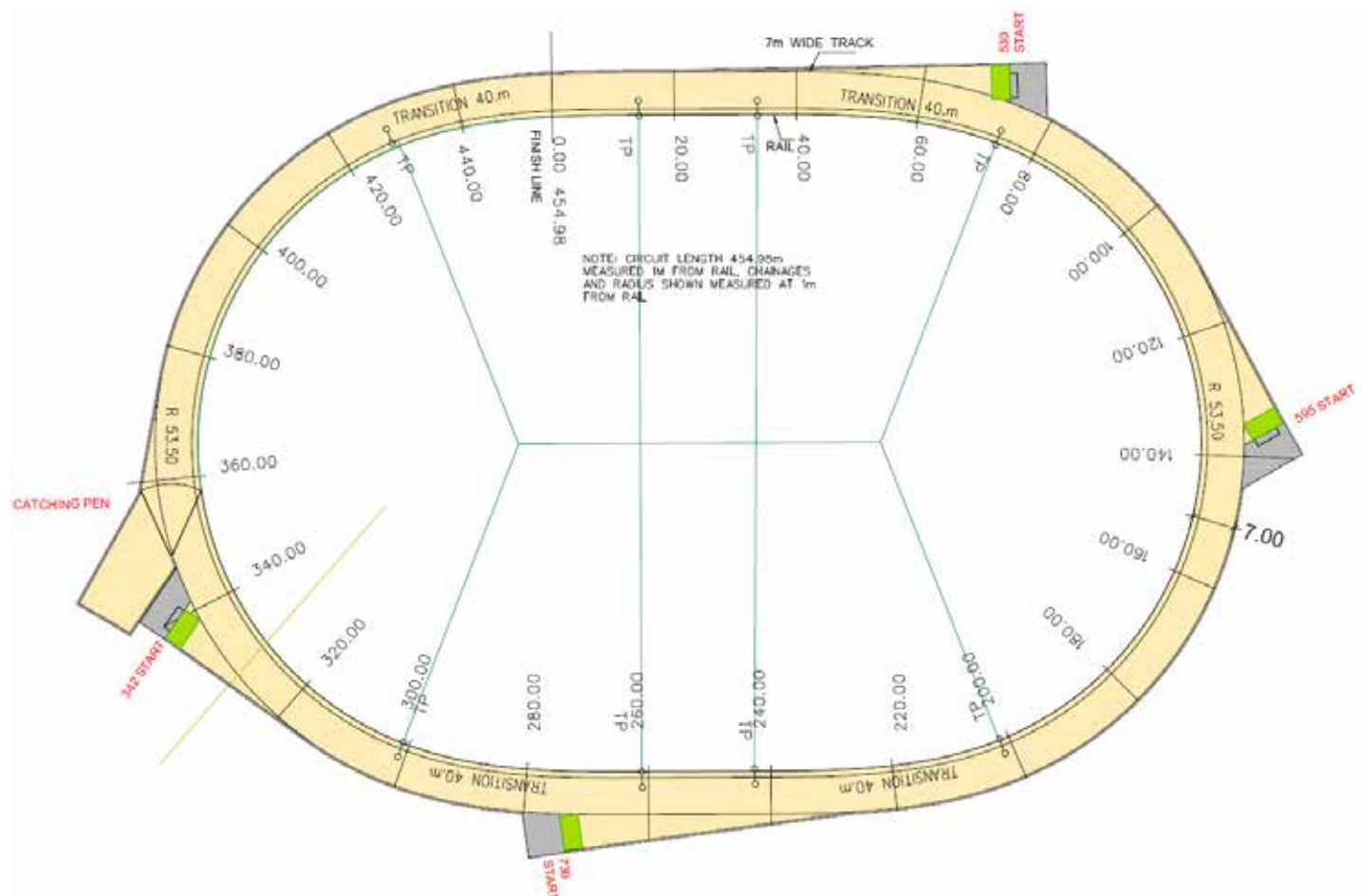
Discussions regarding the rebuild and redesign of the track have occurred over the past 18 months, with the Adelaide Greyhound Racing Club (AGRC) taking a key role in the consultation process.

Throughout this process, the AGRC were consistent in their view that the changes to the existing track design should be limited.

On that basis, the general shape of the track has remained much the same as the existing track, apart from the inclusion of the following elements:

1. Inclusion of transition turns
2. A raising of the track camber to 10%
3. Realignment of starting positions
4. Changing the short-course start from 388m to 342m

In recent weeks, more broad industry consultation has occurred regarding the positioning of the short-course race start, including some in depth discussions with the ICG.

Ultimately the ICG believed that the location of the existing catching pen has worked very well, therefore the 342m start immediately after the catching pen would be their preferred option.

One change that has generated some discussion amongst participants is the realignment of the main racing start from the current 515m start to a longer 530m.

The 15 metre extension to this start is to provide a straighter line exit from the boxes, which will minimise the migration of greyhounds shortly after the start towards the rail.

This change will result in the start being more consistent with the main racing distance at other metropolitan to turn tracks around the country (refer image below of the Meadows 525m start in Victoria).

There has also been some commentary that the newly designed track contains no straights, which is a view that is somewhat

perpetuated by a lack of understanding of transition turns.

As the photo of the Meadows demonstrates, whilst the rail is only truly straight for a short period (approximately 25 metres), the curvature of the rail in the transitions are very minor, which still leaves a substantial straight.

The next part of the process is to finalise tender documentation, prior to going out to tender for the major component of the development, that being the civil works contract.

As previously advised, the lure system will utilise the new Steriline remote/battery technology, which is in operation on the Murray Bridge straight track and has now been successfully tested on circle tracks in Victoria and Queensland.

GRSA will also take the redevelopment project as an opportunity to look into other infrastructure changes, such as constructing wash bays near the catching pen and an asphalt tractor turn around.

The project is still on track to commence in early 2021, with a likely construction period of 3-4 months.



## Black caps now available from GRSA

Along with the white caps GRSA has now approved that black caps can be worn by participants.

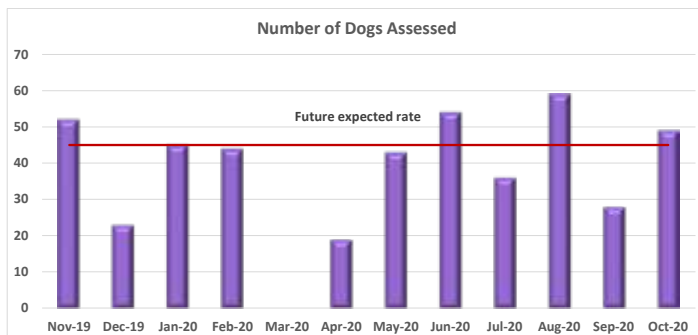

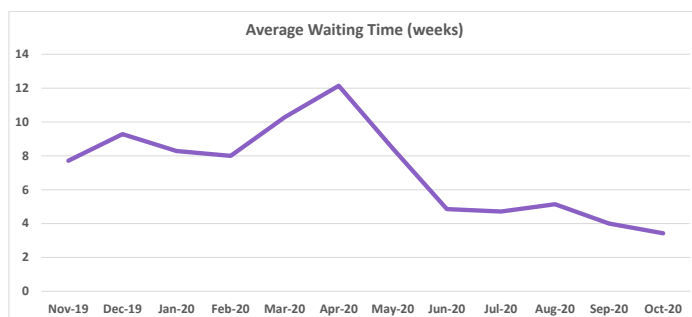
## Latest updates from GAP

# Triple-doubles at Tara Raceway

## ■ MOUNT GAMBIER

**Tarpeena trainer Dita Mitchell landed her first double at Tara Raceway this year when Sidney's Star and Bob Square Pants were successful on November 5th.**

Both wins were over the short-course distance of 277m with Bob Square Pants bringing up his first win since May when turning in a big run to win the Metal Worx Stake Masters Race.

Coming out last in a 277 metres event doesn't usually end well but the 35½ kilograms dog barged his way through the pack to take the lead turning for home before holding out Azumi Spirit for a three-quarters of a length win in 16.64 seconds.

The Masters events over the short-course have come along at the right time for the sparingly-raced Bob Square Pants who didn't hit the track until he was three years old. In the ensuing two years he has raced only another 25 times, all told having now won six races.

From an experience and age point of view Sidney's Star certainly held the edge in the Progreyhoundtips.com Maiden Stake, the 277 metres event being graded youngest-up. Having her 18th start, but her first for Mitchell, the daughter of Fabregas x Sidney's Shadow led all the way to defeat Bungaloo Sarah by two lengths in 16.52 seconds.

And the all the way win of \$21 chance Errington in the Gambier Vets Mixed Stake (512 m) was the start of a big day for Meningie trainer Tim Richards who finished with a treble after Gold Burner and Almighty Stripe were also successful.

Gold Burner scored an easy all the way win in the Produce Store Stake (400 m), the son of Worm Burner x Molly Be Nimble defeating kennelmate Contrail by five lengths in 23.26 seconds while 400 metre track record holder Almighty Stripe experienced little difficulty in finding the front in the Klaassens Contractors Mixed Stake and strode away to his third straight win at the track and distance.

If you don't have access to an air conditioner in your kennel areas or minimal shade in your outdoor areas, here are some simple and cost-effective ways that you can keep your dogs well hydrated and cool and comfortable this summer.

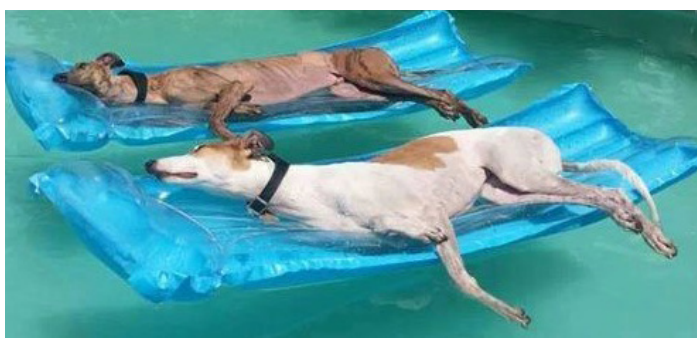
## SHADE

It is very important that your greyhound has access to a cool shady area if left outside, we would always encourage to supply your dogs with air-conditioning if possible. Alternatively, shade cloth is an easy way to provide your dogs with much needed shade during extreme weather conditions.



## PADDLING POOLS

Greyhounds are more susceptible to the hot weather than other dogs, to avoid any serious heat related issues a wading pool is a great idea to keep your dog's cool in the hotter months. Greyhounds LOVE water! You can purchase these pools from Bunnings or Kmart for around \$20



## ICE BLOCKS / ICE IN WATER BOWLS

Ice in water bowls and ice blocks are another great idea to keep dogs cool. You can add a bit of food to your ice blocks, they are very easy to make and very effective.



## FANS AND MISTERS AND MIST FANS

A fan should be an absolute must when it comes to summer in indoor kennel areas. Better yet, why not make it a mist fan! Although these can be on the more expensive side these are a perfect idea for your indoor kennels.



## COOLING VESTS AND WET TOWELS

Ice vests are another great way to keep your dog cool in both indoor and outdoor situations and also when travelling around.



**ALWAYS REMEMBER – If it's too hot for you, it is too hot for your greyhounds!**

## EXERCISING AND TRAINING DOGS IN HOT WEATHER

In hot weather always be mindful of when you want to train or exercise your greyhounds. Avoid the hottest parts of the day, the best times are early morning and later on the evening.

ALWAYS check the ground/ pavement / asphalt temperature. If its too hot for you it will be too hot for your dog! Greyhounds foot pads are just like our feet and can be severely damaged if made to walk on a very hot ground.



# TRIALS

## QUALIFYING AND SATISFACTORY TRIALS

Angle Park qualifying and satisfactory trials are held every Tuesday night between 6.50pm and 7.15pm. Qualifying will be for the following Monday or Tuesday (drawn Thursday) meetings. Nominations close at 12.30pm on the Tuesday.

Gawler qualifying and satisfactory trials are held every Friday morning from 7am. Qualifying will be for the Sunday meeting (drawn the following week). Nominations close at 12.30pm on the Thursday.

Murray Bridge qualifying and satisfactory trials are held on a monthly basis at a Wednesday night session for one turn track only. Qualifying will be for the following Friday (drawn Tuesday). The next session will be Wednesday, 9th December. Nominations close at 12.30pm on the Tuesday prior.

## ANGLE PARK

### SINGLE TRIALS

A reminder to trainers that single trials can be booked with two greyhounds however you need to advise when booking of your intention to do this. If you wish to put three or more into this trial then a field trial will have to be booked.

### BOOKING NUMBER FOR TRIALS

Participants wishing to book trials are required to ring 8243 7172, this phone line will only be used for trial bookings and will queue participants. By having this one number with participants queuing makes this process to be a more efficient way of booking trials.

There will be NO trials accepted through the normal administration number. To be fair to everyone GRSA will only accept bookings using the new number or alternatively logon to [trialbooker.com](http://trialbooker.com), create an account and book your own trials.

## POLICY FOR TRIALLING AT ANGLE PARK, GAWLER AND MURRAY BRIDGE BEFORE THE RACE MEETING

### Policy Background

This policy is to detail the procedure for trainers seeking greyhounds to trial before race meetings. This policy is effective from 2 May 2019.

### Race Meeting Trial Policy

This policy is in place for the following race meetings:

Angle Park Monday, Gawler Wednesday and Sunday, Murray Bridge Tuesday and Friday.

Two fields from the boxes with a maximum of four (4) greyhounds. Trials may be conducted at any time during the race meeting from immediately after kenneling until after the last race, at Stewards' discretion.

The following lists the order in which greyhounds will be selected in the event if more than eight (8) greyhounds are nominated:

1. Reserves at the meeting that do not obtain a start
2. Trainers that have greyhounds engaged and are located more than 100km in distance from the track
3. Satisfactory trials

### Procedure/criteria

1. For Angle Park Monday night, the trainer is to contact GRSA between 9am and 10am on Monday to nominate. Should the Monday be a public holiday bookings are to be made between 8am and 9am on the scratching number.
2. For Murray Bridge Tuesday & Friday, the trainer is to contact GRSA between 3pm and 4pm the day before.
3. For Gawler Wednesday, the trainer is to contact GRSA between 3pm and 4pm the day before. For Gawler Sunday, the trainer is to contact the scratching number on Sunday between 8am and 9am.
4. Other than reserve greyhounds, trainers will be restricted to trialling one (1) greyhound unless nominations determine otherwise.
5. Stewards will allocate the box for the greyhound.
6. Trials will be 515m, 530m & 531m in distance as first preference. Other distances considered depending on nominations.
7. Greyhounds currently under suspension are ineligible to trial unless they are undertaking a satisfactory trial to be cleared.
8. Greyhound registration cards must be produced at kennelling time.
9. Trainers with other greyhounds engaged can utilise the extra kennel space until such time they are ready to leave. Trainers with no other greyhounds engaged will be permitted to leave with Stewards permission.
10. In the case of race at Murray Bridge, trials will only be available on the track that is prepared to race that day i.e. Sunday meeting on the u-shaped track, trials will be on the u-shaped track only.

Please note: If there are 12 races at Angle Park, Gawler or Murray Bridge there will be NO trials.

The Angle Park Vet Clinic and/or swab kennels cannot be used to accommodate any additional greyhounds due to operational requirements of the Clinic and Stewards.

It is vital that trainers nominate to trial at these race meetings. If you are unable to nominate at these times, please contact GRSA as soon as possible as permission may be given at GRSA's discretion to accept bookings outside these times.



## Exceptions to this policy

Thursday nights are kept available for interstate greyhounds to solo trial in a lead-up to SA Group races as well as local greyhound's trialling for Group racing interstate.

Upon request, local greyhounds will be allowed to solo trial in a lead-up to a feature race and they will take one of the eight (8) kennels available for trialling greyhounds ahead of the policy and sit separate to the four (4) dog trials. Races considered to be a feature are: Adelaide Cup, Gawler Cup, Oaks, Derby, Howard Ashton, Brian Johnstone, SA Sprint, SA Distance Championship, SA Anniversary Cup, SA Country Cup, National Finals and any interstate Group race

Local greyhounds will be permitted to trial on a race night, where they are in preparation for a feature event, nominated for a meeting and the race does not stand up. This will include all distances and also take precedence over the policy. If a greyhound qualifies for a feature final and requires a trial in between, this will be conducted as a solo trial and will sit separately to the four (4) dog trials.

## MOUNT GAMBIER SATISFACTORY TRIALS

Trainers are advised of a change to the booking of Satisfactory Trials at Mt. Gambier. Mt Gambier hold trials on Tuesday and Saturday mornings with Satisfactory trials ONLY being conducted on Tuesdays and need to be booked with Barry Shephard from the Club on 0419 824 512.

At Race meetings Satisfactory trials can be done when less than 12 races. When there are 12 races these can be considered, however, the trainer will not be able to kennel and must take their greyhounds home straight after the trial. These race day trials will also need to be booked through Barry at the Club. GRSA administration staff will NOT accept these bookings and trainers will be directed to contact Barry Shephard.

# WAP updates for participants

**Greyhound Racing SA Limited (GRSA) wishes to advise participants that the Wagering Activity Payment (WAP) for the month of September 2020 was \$143,000.**

The total amount paid to participants for the year to date now totals \$705,000. This is a great result and is substantially above our budget estimates. It is noteworthy that the WAP payments have been reducing each month. GRSA's expectation is that as wagering activity tapers off [especially after Christmas] that WAP payments will more closely equate to \$50,000 per month. One of the significant benefits of the WAP model is that in good months [as we have had so far this year] that GRSA can return more money to participants; and do so sooner.

The table below is provided for the benefit of those participants wishing to better understand the computation of the WAP.

As noted previously, the results are much better than GRSA's budget estimates and the expectation is that future levels above the base will be more modest.

## Distribution between Trainers and Owners

GRSA would like to remind all participants that receive a WAP that the payment is the equivalent of prizemoney. If you are currently responsible for distributing prizemoney to another party then the same approach applies to WAP payments.

From GRSA's perspective the position in relation to third parties is reflective of OzChase records and is as follows:

- If GRSA have been notified of an ownership split [which is recorded in OzChase] then you DO NOT need to make a payment to owners for the WAP because GRSA will do this automatically; however
- If you ordinarily forward on payments to owners on your own accord, then you DO need to do the same for the WAP. Each remittance will include the name of the dog for which the WAP is being made.
