CEO'S UPDATE

GRSA will soon release its Annual Report. In looking over the final changes, I couldn't help but reflect on the statement that we make annually. It is much more than a statement....it's an unconditional commitment. It's a fundamental obligation that we have to the broader community, and an obligation that any individual within the sport has towards all other individuals within the sport. It holds welfare up as the central pillar of our model, and signals the position that GRSA must take whenever these principles are offended.

Moreover, the confidence that [objective] external stakeholders direct towards greyhound racing, is not only based on these words, but on our actions. These include our commitment to full rehoming of unraced and retired greyhounds, the introduction of rules to prohibit euthanasia other than in response to injury/illness or behavioural issues, and changes to the Animal Welfare Act 1985 which carry jail terms for serious breaches in this space.

The statement speaks for itself.

ANIMAL WELFARE STATEMENT

GRSA remains unconditionally opposed to the notion that animal cruelty can ever be an acceptable outcome associated with the training of greyhounds. Additionally, the South Australian greyhound racing industry and its participants embrace, as a fundamental obligation, the requirement for full rehoming of unraced and retired greyhounds. GRSA is committed to ensuring that animal welfare considerations are central to decision-making and that a 'zero tolerance' approach will be applied in response to any discovery of welfare-related breaches by registered participants.

Victa Grosso claims well deserved feature win

On October 23 we saw the highlight of the Gawler greyhound racing calendar with the running of the Gawler Gold Cup.

The Nixon's Function Centre was packed and there was a good crowd on course overall for the massive night of racing. The highlight of the night was the Gawler Gold Cup Final which was race eight on the program. Came And Went jumped favourite for trainer Troy Murray who was drawn in box one. Troy was looking to take out back-to-back cups after winning last year with Major Major and he was also looking to win the race for the seventh time. Bosko Stamenkovic also had a strong presence in the race with his two kennel starts Rosie Red and Fire Strike both making the final.

Tony and Lisa Rasmussen had three runners in the final and all three of them were seen as big chances to win the final. Victa Hadyn for Tony Rasmussen was the fastest heat winner and was shooting for a \$9,000 bonus after winning the Gawler Produce final earlier in the year. Instead it was the litter mate Victa Grosso getting up to win the Gold Cup Final. Victa Grosso had a perfect preparation leading up to the final. He set a new personal best time two starts back when he ran 30.66 over the 531 metres on the 13th of October. He was a strong winner in his heat defeating Rosie Red and running a time of 30.76. The lead up meant he was perfectly prepared to win the final on Sunday Night and that's exactly what he did. He didn't lead initially but he weaved a passage through the field to run over the top and run a time of 30.90. Rosie Red ran second for the Stamenkovic kennel and was quite impressive. Victa Hadyn wasn't too far away running third for Tony Rasmussen. This was Tony's second Gawler Cup win after he took out the prestigious race in 2018 with his star chaser Honcho Monelli.

We also saw the running of the 2021 Gawler Sprint Classic Final over the 400 metres. The final appeared to be very even and there was plenty of young talent in the race. Zipping Walter was the winner for trainer Ben Rawlings. He began perfectly from box number four and carved down to the rail to lead all of the way. He ran a time of 22.79 in the process. Talented chaser Patched ran second for Nicole Price and race favourite She's A Hotshot ran third for Troy Murray. Zipping Walter is owned by the Beach Worm Capital syndicate. The large syndicate went out onto the track after the race to take a winning photo and every owner was visibly happy after the race. Ben Rawlings also took out the Gawler Carnival Of Cups trainers award for the night which saw his kennel take home a \$500 voucher courtesy of Gawler Stock Feeds.

Veteran chaser Aston Cade took out the Gawler Gold Cup Consolation for Matthew Payne which was the other feature race on the night. Overall, the night was successful for the club and the inaugural Gawler Carnival Of Cups.

Don't Tell Lies adds another feature win to her resume

Don't Tell Lies added another feature win to her resume leading all the way in the Leigh Rogers final for trainer Lauren Harris on Thursday November 4.

The 2021 SA Oaks winner jumped well from box six and never looked like she would give up her lead cruising to an impressive 30.32 second win. Straight Blaze ran on well to claim second for Darrell Johnstone while Rogue Player held on to third place for Steven Brook in another great edition of the race.

After winning the \$10,000 winner's cheque, Don't Tell Lies now boasts an impressive record with seven wins and two placings from her 18 starts with prizemoney of more than \$43,785.

The race was introduced by GRSA four years ago in recognition of former long-time Food and Beverage Manager, Leigh Rogers, who lost his battle with a rare form of cancer five years ago. It was great to see Leigh's family at the track again this year.



Barbados Express Wins Bothing Gawler Stayers Cup

Sunday 1st November saw the running of the 2021 Bothing Gawler Stayers Cup over the 643 metres.

The race is named after the track record holder for the 643 metre distance which is Bothing. Bothing set the track record all of the way back in 2006 for trainers Bosko Stemenkovic and Christine Costa. She had 30 career starts for 17 wins and 6 placings. She set the track record of 36.81 towards the end of her career. A lot of people believe that the track record for the 643 metre start won't be broken.

We saw a field of eight go around for the Bothing Gawler Stayers Cup. Barbados Express began well from box number four and hit the front in the early stages. The race favourite Run Like Jess lobbed into second place early but he couldn't catch Barbados Express who went onto win by three quarters of a length. She ran a time of 37.60 in the process. Trainer Ben Rawlings took out the Gawler Sprint Championship over the 400 metres the week prior with Zipping Walter and he can now add the Stayers Cup to his trophy cabinet. Barbados Express has been a handy greyhound for the Rawlings kennel and connections. She has now had the 37 career starts for 12 wins and 11 placings. She also managed to take out the Bayroad Queen Stayers cup final at Murray Bridge earlier in the year.

GAP Race Night 24th Anniversary – Thursday 18th November

Next Thursday night at Angle Park the Greyhound Adoption Program will have their 24th Anniversary GAP night.

This meeting will have two GAP parades where retired greyhounds will strut their stuff as they have done in previous years. It's always a good night to highlight the wonderful work GAP, Foster carers and adopters do with the wonderful greyhounds. The feature race on the night will be the GAP 24th Anniversary Feature where the best race on the program will have a rug attached.

National Straight Track Championship rescheduled to 19th December

Racing Queensland advises that The National Straight Track Championship (NSTC) Final has been rescheduled to 19 December 2021 at the Capalaba Greyhound Racing Club. All participating states [GRV, GRNSW, GRSA, and RQ] remain committed to the series.

Interstate qualification will take place at Healesville [GRV], Richmond [GRNSW], and Murray Bridge [GRSA]. All state finals will carry prizemoney of \$5,000 to the winner.

To coincide with these dates GRSA has reprogrammed the heats to Tuesday 30th November with the state final on Tuesday 7th December

Queensland state qualifying heats will commence on 5th December with the state qualifying final on 12th December.

Two greyhounds from each state will qualify for the NSTC Final at Capalaba worth total prizemoney of \$37,500 [\$25,000 to the winner].

Whilst there is currently restricted access to Queensland for some parts of Australia, last Monday the Queensland Government announced that it is aiming to allow fully vaccinated interstate travellers to enter Queensland without the need to quarantine from 17 December 2021.

However, if an interstate trainer is unable to travel to Queensland, the Capalaba Greyhound Racing Club have advised that interstate-based greyhounds are able to be hosted by Club for the purpose of racing in the Final. These arrangements can be made by contacting the Capalaba Club on 07 3390 2772.

Full NSTC series conditions, including eligibility to nominate, are available on the GRSA website.

GOTBA Free For All on Thursday 9th December

The GOTBA will have the wrap up of the year at Angle Park on Thursday 9th December.

As normal there will be a Free For All programmed worth \$5,150 over the 530m for those greyhounds which coursed during the 2021 season. To be graded on circle form.

Group 3 win highlights a big month for Victa Grosso



Greyhound of the Month for October was Victa Grosso for trainer Tony Rasmussen who had a wonderful month of racing which included the heat and final of the Group 3 Gawler Gold Cup in late November.

The son of Fernando Bale and Victa Victoria had four starts for the month with three wins and one second stamping himself as one of the best chasers in the State. He started the month off with a slick 30.66 win in Grade 6 company at Gawler highlighting his liking for the Northern venue. He then beat a quality line up in a heat of the Group 3 Gawler Cup before coming out in a hot final and running a slashing race, where he came from midfield midrace before he rocketed to lead in the final straight for a brilliant win. He closed the month with a strong second in the Gawler Anniversary Cup losing no admirers coming from last in the early stages.

At the end of the month Victa Grosso's record stood at 30 starts for 10 wins and 15 placings and earnings just under \$60,000.

Victa Grosso also claimed the Run of the Month for October for trainer Tony Rasmussen with his win in the final of the Group 3 Gawler Gold Cup over the 531m on Sunday 24th October.

Beginning from box four he began well in the feature final however found himself back midfield as they raced into the back straight. Victa Grosso moved to the outside and began to make quick ground as the runners turned for home. He put the accelerator jets on and raced into first place and a breathtaking victory. He won in powerful style recording a slick 30.90 in winning by 1 ½ lengths.

Mount Gambier to race on Monday 27th December

With Christmas Day falling on Saturday 25th December this year all the Metropolitan thoroughbred racing will be scheduled for Sunday 26th December which will mean there is no spot available for our normal Mt Gambier Day meeting.

In liaising with Sky Racing we have been able to move this Day meeting to the Monday 27th December which is still a Public Holiday and provides a great opportunity for the local community to support the club.

2022 Gawler Produce Stakes - nominations close on Friday 26th November

The 2022 Gawler Produce Stakes will be run by GRSA in conjunction with the Gawler Greyhound Racing Club.

Once again we will offer guaranteed Final stakemoney of \$22,000. The estimate for the total series prizemoney is \$40,000, based on this years series. The series is for greyhounds whelped in 2020.

In 2022 we will again be offering additional incentives for trainers to nominate. A bonus will be offered to any greyhound which can win both the Produce Stake and the Gawler Gold Cup.

The jackpot has increased from \$9,000 to \$10,000 as Victa Haydn missed out on winning the Gawler Gold Cup this year after running third.

The SA Bred bonus will also be continued; should the winner of the Final be SA Bred, there will be an SA Bred bonus of \$1,000 to the owner and \$500 to the breeder.

The series will be in June with the Final on Sunday, 26th June 2022. [Pending alterations]

GRSA administers the event for the Club, so all payments are to be made to GRSA. The fees are, one-off payment option \$121.00 or the sustaining option of \$33 [first], \$55 [second] and \$88 [Final].

Nomination Forms are available, along with the full list of conditions and the payment schedule.

GRSA Sky Weekly schedule to change from 1st December 2021

From the start of December, the Sky weekly schedule of greyhound racing in South Australia will change.

The first two Sundays of any month will routinely be scheduled at Murray Bridge with the remaining Sundays being allocated to Gawler. The primary reason for the change is about providing both of those Clubs with an accessible weekly timeslot which helps them to cultivate a strong base of local patronage.

GRSA explored the opportunity that exists to secure a permanent Friday night timeslot on Sky but those plans were curtailed by the existing congestion of meetings in that spot. The model of 'shared Sundays' represented the next best solution for a strategy based on community engagement.

The Murray Bridge region is synonymous with racing, and has been the site of the two most significant infrastructure projects undertaken by SA's thoroughbred and greyhound codes in the past two decades. GRSA expects trainer numbers to continue to grow in the region well into the future, and increasingly so as the traditional [greyhound] training regions to the north of Adelaide experience heightened levels of development. The strategy, as it relates to Murray Bridge, is also partly founded on the fact that the Rural City of Murray Bridge Council is such a proud supporter of local racing opportunities.

The schedule will transition from 1st December 2021, which will allow crowds over the December and Christmas period to enjoy prime-time racing opportunities at each of Gawler, Murray Bridge and Angle Park.

Changes to feature race calendar

With the changes to the scheduling this has presented some programming issues for some of our feature races.

GRSA has had to make some changes and alterations to accommodate the program. Below are some highlighted changes –

- The Murray Bridge Oaks and Derby series will move forward 1 week and will be conducted on Sunday 5th and 12th December. [Maidens are eligible so long as they have raced or qualify trialled]
- The Gawler Golden Maiden will move from late November and early December to Sunday 16th and 23rd January. It has moved due to Gawler Show the week before, a 5 day break with the final proposed on a Friday and the Murray Bridge Oaks and Derby taking this space.
- Murray Bridge Cup heats in March will move from Friday 11th to Monday 14th with the final still on Sunday 20th March.
- Gawler Produce series in June will race on Friday 10th and then Sunday 19th and 26th

All updated calendars for feature races for Angle Park, Gawler and Murray Bridge [Mt Gambier are not affected by the schedule] are available on the GRSA website

Murray Bridge Anniversary Cup on Sunday, 12th December

On Sunday, 12th December the \$4,000 Murray Bridge Anniversary Cup will be run over the 530m. Free For All and Non Penalty.

- Nominations close with GRSA at 9.00am on Wednesday, 8th December.

Murray Bridge Summer Derby and Oaks in December

With the support of the Adelaide Greyhound Racing Club, Murray Bridge will conduct the Country Summer Oaks and Derby this year.

Eligibility will be for greyhounds whelped on or after 1st July, 2019. The Heats will be now be run on Sunday, 5th December with the Finals on Sunday, 12th December.

The conditions are set out below -

\$1,645 Heats 2021 AGRC/Murray Bridge Country Summer Derby – 455m [For dogs whelped on or after 1st July, 2019. \$5,000 Final on Sunday, 12/12/22 sponsored by the AGRC. All grades eligible]

\$1,645 Heats 2021 AGRC/Murray Bridge Country Summer Oaks – 455m [For bitches whelped on or after 1st July, 2019. \$5,000 Final on Sunday, 12/12/22 sponsored by the AGRC. All grades eligible]

- Nominations for the Heats close at 9am with GRSA on Wednesday, 1st December.

Change to Angle Park Saturday in December

Greyhound Racing SA only has one fortnightly Saturday morning in December which was programmed on Saturday 11th December with no racing on Saturday 25th December due to Christmas Day.

This would give us a 4 week gap until our next Saturday meeting in January. GRSA has liaised with Racing Queensland who advised that they are prepared to swap their fortnightly Townsville meeting with ours for Saturday 18th December which will give SA a 3 week gap before and after our Saturday meetings.

Trials will remain on Sunday 12th December due to staffing at Angle Park and trials will now be on Sunday 19th December due to the race meeting. GRSA will update this to industry closer to the dates.

GRSA appreciates the support in regard to this change from Racing Queensland, the Townsville GRC and Sky Racing.

Christmas set to heat up at Angle Park

Things are expected to heat up at Angle Park during the two weeks leading into Christmas with the introduction of six rich events over the 530m, 595m and 730m distances.

Dubbed the "Festival Of Fire", the series will provide opportunities for the best 48 nominations for the 530m trip, the best 28 nominations over 595m, and the best 8 nominations for a 730m event. Separately, heats and final of a restricted event [0-5 wins], running from Saturday morning to Thursday night, will provide a separate opportunity for that category of runner.

The Festival of Fire series will commence on the racenight of Thursday December 16, continue into the Saturday timeslot and then culminate in 5 finals and a special stayers event carrying a collective purse in excess of \$100,000 the following Thursday night [December 23]. As a new event, the Board has resolved that the top-up amounts for this series will sit outside the Wagering Activity Payments [WAP] model. This means that the majority of the stakemoney for the series will be additional to the guaranteed return that has already been committed to industry through the WAP model.

- Greyhounds must be SA trained.
- Greyhounds must be in South Australia as of midnight 1st November 2021 to be eligible [greyhounds that have not had their first training amendment lodged that are in SA at this time will be eligible]

New local rules

As you know, the new Greyhounds Australasia Rules will go live on 31 January 2022.

I urge everyone to take a look at the new rules and associated resources to understand the changes. There is a bit to take in, with Stewards and the Animal Welfare team available to assist with the transition.

As a consequence of the changes, GRSA will soon release a draft rewrite of the Local Rules. This is necessary to keep them up to date with the new rules and changes to our Industry. I again urge everyone to have a look at the draft when it is released and keep in touch with your ICG representatives during the consultation period.

SA Covid-19 roadmap

At the time of writing, SA now has a COVID-19 roadmap that is in its infancy. At this stage, there is an indication that borders will open on 23 November, with other restrictions to be lifted when we reach a 90% vaccination rate.

But when can we come to SA? When can we stop wearing masks?

You will know from nearly the last two years that not much is what it seems in this area of COVID-19 management. So, it would be presumptuous to assume that borders will fully open on 23 November, or we will lose masks at 90% vaccinated. We all remain hopeful that this will be the case, but it is extremely difficult to predict what will actually occur until the eleventh hour.

GRSA is working towards an approach that will be consistent with the police directions, but allow us to return to a 'COVID-Normal' environment as soon as possible. This includes planning on when we can open our facilities to our friends interstate and how we operate our facilities in a COVID-Safe environment.

Please keep an eye out on our social media for GRSA's implementation of SA's COVID-19 roadmap.

Vaccinations

I say it every month, and this month is no different. Please see your GP for advice on a COVID-19 vaccination.

We are seeing on almost a daily basis a push in the community to fully open up, but only to vaccinated people. While we have no indication that racing or our facilities will be affected by any government direction on vaccinations, looking at interstate jurisdictions, there is a real possibility that, at some stage, we will need to be vaccinated.

Your ICG

GRSA has a unique vehicle for industry to consult with the Controlling Body – the ICG. I urge everyone to use the ICG to raise any issues to enable GRSA to deal with them.

Know. Tell. Protect

If you see or hear anything in our Industry that you think the Controlling Body should be aware of, please consider the Know Tell Protect Initiative. Your contact is limited to a small, key group, and will be treated in confidence. The email is knowtellprotect@grsa.com.au.

For the months of November and December (and beyond), Animal Welfare will be increasing its overt and covert surveillance operations, consistent with the rules of racing and the Animal Welfare Policy 2021, to ensure everyone is complying with the rules of racing and GRSA's policies.

Retirements – GAR 106 & LR 114

Remember, from 1 August 2021, if you retire your greyhound to anyone, or any entity or agency that is not GRSA's GAP SA (or a GAP of another Controlling Body) you must have the greyhound sterilised before it leaves your custody.

When you notify GRSA of the retirement, you must lodge a fully completed GRSA 106R form, together with proof of sterilisation. If you want to apply for the sterilisation contribution scheme, please also lodge a copy of your paid tax invoice.

Thinking of making changes to your kennels?

Some changes to your kennels may need Council approval.

Six important rule changes

The new Greyhounds Australasia National Rules have now been endorsed by the GA Board. The updated rules will come into effect on Monday 31st January 2022.

30 [NP] Similar to WA LR105A	Barking Muzzles prohibited	This is a new provision which, except for a veterinarian using a Barking Muzzle for the sole purpose of examination or treatment, and except in circumstances approved by a Controlling Body, makes it an offence for a person to use a Barking Muzzle on a greyhound.
145[3] [83A[3]]	Treatment prior to an Event	Rule 145[3] uses the terminology used in other racing codes of "clear day" [which the relevant definition in rule 9 defines as "a 24 hour period from 12.00am to 11.59pm"] as opposed to "day prior to the day of an Event" [see existing 83A[3]], so that rule 145[3] reads: "No person without the permission of the Stewards may administer or cause to be administered any injectable substance to a greyhound at any time during the one clear day prior to 12.00am on the day of an Event that it is nominated to compete in."
159[7] [NP]	Offences relating to luring and baiting	This new provision provides that the luring and baiting offences contained in subrules 159[1], [3] and [5] are "absolute liability" offences, such that the references to "live animal", "animal carcass", "part of an animal" and "animal material" refer to the fact of the existence of each of those conditions, whether or not the charged person knew or believed of the applicable condition. Absolute liability offences do not permit a defence of "honest and reasonable mistake of fact" being relied on. Absolute liability for these offences is consistent with a stronger regulatory approach for these extremely serious matters that have the ability to significantly damage the reputation and ongoing longevity of greyhound racing.

127 [69, 69A]	Period of suspension to be imposed for marring or failing to pursue	<p>Rule 127 is a new rule that deals with the period of suspension to be imposed for marring or failing to pursue. The rule reads:</p> <p>"Subject to rule 125 [69B], where, in the opinion of the Stewards, a greyhound is found to have marred or failed to pursue the lure during an Event the Stewards must impose a period of suspension in respect of the greyhound, which is to be recorded as part of the identification record as follows:</p> <p>(a) in the case of a first offence, 28 days at the track where the offence occurred and until the completion of a satisfactory trial; or</p> <p>(b) subject to rule 128[70], in the case of a second offence, 28 days at all tracks and until completion of a satisfactory trial; or</p> <p>(c) in the case of a third or subsequent offence, three months at all tracks and until the completion of two satisfactory trials."</p> <p>This is a substantial change to the marring and failing to pursue penalty structure. Previously, a first offence was a suspension for 28 days [at the track where the offence occurred] and the completion of a satisfactory trial, a second offence a suspension for three months [at all tracks] and the completion of a satisfactory trial, and a third or subsequent offence was 12 months suspension [at all tracks] and until the completion of a satisfactory trial. The new rule proposes that the first offence be a suspension of 28 days at the track where the offence occurred and the completion of a satisfactory trial. A second offence is a suspension of 28 days at all tracks and the completion of a satisfactory trial. The third or subsequent offence is a three months suspension at all tracks and the completion of two satisfactory trials.</p> <p>The rationale behind this amendment is to enable greyhounds a better opportunity to continue racing should the greyhound be a repeat offender under these rules.</p> <p>Failing to pursue by reason of injury [Rule 125 [rule 69B]] will still apply if applicable for the first failing to pursue offence only. The term 'suspension' [in Rule 125 [rule 69B]] has been replaced with the term 'stand-down'.</p> <p>Marring and failing to pursue penalties are no longer dealt with separately, they are now combined. A greyhound's first penalty may be for failing to pursue, its second for marring, and third for failing to pursue, or any combination of the two.</p>
159 [Compare with rule 86B, NP, 86C(4) and 86C(5)]	Offences relating to luring and baiting	<p>There is significant change that has been made to the way in which luring and baiting offences are dealt with in new rule 159 [the main new provision dealing with luring and baiting] compared to existing rule 86B. In relation to that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> all offending under existing rule 86B (1) involving either a live animal, animal carcass or part of animal require a mandatory minimum 10 years disqualification, which penalty can be reduced if there is a finding of a "special circumstance" being in existence. there are now in the new rules to be three tiers of seriousness of offending (respectively dealt with at subrules (1), (3) and (5) of rule 159), which have differing potential consequences in terms of penalty. New Angle Park Track - Early Trends

The new Angle Park track has been up and running for a number of months now and it's a good opportunity to begin to look at some early trends.

It should be noted however that the sample size is still relatively small, so any data that is analysed may not indicate a long-term trend.

The main purpose of the subtle redesign of Angle Park was to improve animal welfare, by reducing interference and creating a circuit which reduces the forces on the greyhounds (mostly due to the introduction of transition turns).

The initial analysis of major injuries has shown a really pleasing decline compare to the historical average over the past five years.

When comparing the months of September and October with the same period in previous years, major injuries on the new track were down by 62.9% this year.

Whilst this level of improvement may not continue into the future, it certainly is very promising at this stage.

The other objective in improving animal welfare outcomes is the reduction in race interference, which is a difficult area to measure.

Anecdotal evidence from GRSA Stewards and participants indicates that collisions and interference have certainly reduced around the new track.

Feedback suggests that greyhounds have been able to transition into the first bend more cleanly and are able to hold their position when running on the banked turns of the track.

There has been some discussion about the characteristics of the track and how dogs race generally, notably [a] the difficulties in winning from wide boxes, and [b] that the track suits railing greyhounds.

An analysis of winning box percentages from the new track compared to the old circuit, shows that the winning box distribution is relatively similar to the previous track, which clearly favoured Box 1 runners over the two main racing distances.

Obviously there will always be favouring of inside boxes, as they generally have the shortest path to the finish line and winning box distribution at most 2-turn tracks like Angle Park will demonstrate this advantage.

There is also been some commentary about the alignment of the starts, particularly the 342m start.

Initial consultation with industry in 2020 regarding the short course start for Angle Park, indicated a preference for the 342m start to be as similar to the Murray Bridge 530m start as possible.



As such, the alignment of the boxes uses the same methodology as the Murray Bridge 530m start, which aligns Box 1 to the running line, 1-metre off the rail, at the tangent point of the first turn.

GRSA is open to the prospect of a realignment of starts, particularly the 342m start, to establish if a rotated alignment [pointing the boxes more to the rail] could have a better outcome for winning box percentages. However, for the moment, we intend to keep things as they are and continue monitoring outcomes as our base of data grows.

Obviously the consequences on interference and injuries would need to be considered as part of this debate, given the initial positive injury reduction.

In the interim, management has agreed to undertake a full analysis of the data in the new year, including seeking feedback from various industry groups.

Murray Bridge Outdoor Patron Area Project

Designs for the Murray Bridge outdoor patron area have been finalised, with drawings and engineering considerations being refined in preparation for submission to Council.

This exciting new project will increase capacity at Murray Bridge significantly and allow for a genuine outdoor space which can be used by participants and patrons alike.

Ideally this project will commence early in 2022, depending progress of the approvals process and the availability of contractors to undertake the construction at that time.



Mount Gambier Patron Building Project

We are currently having drawings developed for the Mount Gambier patron building redevelopment project.

Once completed, GRSA will undertake consultation with the Mount Gambier Committee to refine the design, which will then be presented to the Club members for feedback.

Our current expectation is that it will be possible to complete the project is on track to be completed by the middle of 2022.

Local participants should take comfort in the fact that GRSA intends to race throughout the construction period, with temporary facilities for patrons and operational areas in place to allow racing to continue.

SafeChase Lure at Gawler

It was GRSA's intention to commence using the SafeChase Lure at Gawler in November, however some minor issues relating to the lure units at both Angle Park and Murray Bridge have seen a delay to this plan.

Management is hoping that these issues can be resolved in the coming weeks and is optimistic that the SafeChase Lure can be an operation at Gawler at some point early in the new year.

Participants will be advised well in advance of when this transition is likely to commence.

WAP payment update for September 2021

The Wagering Activity Payment (WAP) for the month of September 2021 amounted to \$276,000. It is the third very strong monthly result in a row. Whether wagering revenue continues to hold as the eastern states emerge from COVID lockdowns will be borne out in time. GRSA hopes that wagering revenue continues to be strong so that WAPs will continue in this manner.

Distribution of WAP Payments between Trainers and Owners

GRSA would like to remind all participants that receive a WAP that the payment is the equivalent of prizemoney.

If you are currently responsible for distributing prizemoney to another party then the same approach applies to WAP payments.

From GRSA's perspective the position in relation to third parties is reflective of OzChase records and is as follows:

- If GRSA have been notified of an ownership split [which is recorded in OzChase] then you DO NOT need to make a payment to owners for the WAP because GRSA will do this automatically; however
- If you ordinarily forward on payments to owners on your own accord, then you DO need to do the same for the WAP. Each remittance will include the name of the dog for which the WAP is being made.

Example to help participants understand the WAP they receive

It is not uncommon for GRSA to receive requests for more information in relation to how the WAP is calculated for their particular dogs(s). The example below is provided to assist in the general understanding of the calculation.

Assumptions:

In this example, assume the owner/trainer received **\$1,000** in prizemoney for any/all races for the month.

In this the total prizemoney (paid to all participant) is **\$700,000**.

In this example, the total WAP is **\$50,000**.

In this example, the owner/trainer would receive a WAP of **\$71.43**, calculated as:

$$\text{\$1,000} \div \text{\$700,000} \times \text{\$50,000} = \text{\$71.43}$$

Participants should note that:

- WAP is not payable for any prizemoney received in relation to feature races [where total stakes are above \$5,000];
- Trainers' fees and other bonus payments are not included in the calculation of the share of the WAP; and
- It is a requirement that a greyhound has to have raced and received prizemoney during a month to be eligible to receive the WAP payment for that month.

We will also be setting up a designated 'patting zone' at the breezeway during these events where we will have signage and directions for the kids on how to wait and pat a greyhound after the race, if the trainer is happy to oblige. We would ask our trainers that if they can, if a child is waiting at the patting zone, please stop and let them pat your greyhound after a race (understanding not if your greyhound is being swabbed or isn't suitable). The more we can have children meet the racing greyhounds and trainers and build a connection, the better!

GAP kennelling fee payment process change

Please note that as of 1st August 2021 the GAP kennelling payment process has changed for a trial period of three months.

The changes are as follows:

Instead of making a weekly payment of \$33 per dog, the new kennelling fee will be a flat amount of \$50 per dog, irrespective of the time period the greyhound will spend at the GAP kennels.

Participants who would like their greyhounds placed in the GAP kennels will be requested to pay the \$50 at the time when the placement form is filled in and the \$60 placement fee is paid.

This means that for greyhounds that are to be kennelled with GAP an upfront payment of \$110 will be requested. After that, participants will not need to make any additional payments for their dogs in the GAP kennels. Noting that prior to foster care dogs spend an average of 4 weeks in kennels, this change is expected to generate a saving of \$82 per dog for participants.






Latest updates from GAP

QUALIFYING AND SATISFACTORY TRIALS

Angle Park qualifying and satisfactory trials are held every Tuesday night between 6.50pm and 7.15pm. Qualifying will be for the following Monday (drawn Thursday) meetings. Nominations close at 12.30pm on the Tuesday (for online nominations 11.59pm Monday).

Gawler qualifying and satisfactory trials are held every Friday morning from 7am. Qualifying will be for the Sunday meeting (drawn the following week).

Nominations close at 12.30pm on the Thursday.

Murray Bridge qualifying and satisfactory trials are held every Wednesday night between 6.50pm and 7.15pm. Qualifying will be for the following Friday (drawn Tuesday). Nominations close at 12.30pm on Wednesday (for online nominations 11.59pm Tuesday).

ANGLE PARK

SINGLE TRIALS

A reminder to trainers that single trials can be booked with two greyhounds however you need to advise when booking of your intention to do this. If you wish to put three or more into this trial then a field trial will have to be booked.

BOOKING NUMBER FOR TRIALS

Participants wishing to book trials are required to ring 8243 7172, this phone line will only be used for trial bookings and will queue participants. By having this one number with participants queuing makes this process to be a more efficient way of booking trials.

There will be NO trials accepted through the normal administration number. To be fair to everyone GRSA will only accept bookings using the new number or alternatively logon to trialbooker.com, create an account and book your own trials.

POLICY FOR TRIALLING AT ANGLE PARK, GAWLER AND MURRAY BRIDGE BEFORE THE RACE MEETING

Policy Background

This policy is to detail the procedure for trainers seeking greyhounds to trial before race meetings. This policy is effective from 2 May 2019.

Race Meeting Trial Policy

This policy is in place for the following race meetings:

Angle Park Monday, Gawler Wednesday and Sunday, Murray Bridge Tuesday and Friday.

Two fields from the boxes with a maximum of four (4) greyhounds. Trials may be conducted at any time during the race meeting from immediately after kennelling until after the last race, at Stewards' discretion.

The following lists the order in which greyhounds will be selected in the event if more than eight (8) greyhounds are nominated:

1. Reserves at the meeting that do not obtain a start
2. Trainers that have greyhounds engaged and are located more than 100km in distance from the track
3. Satisfactory trials

Procedure/criteria

1. For Angle Park Monday night, the trainer is to contact GRSA between 9am and 10am on Monday to nominate. Should the Monday be a public holiday bookings are to be made between 8am and 9am on the scratching number.
2. For Murray Bridge Tuesday & Friday, the trainer is to contact GRSA between 3pm and 4pm the day before. Should any of these times fall on a public holiday bookings are to be made during scratching times.
3. For Gawler Wednesday, the trainer is to contact GRSA between 3pm and 4pm the day before. Should any of these times fall on a public holiday bookings are to be made during scratching times. For Gawler Sunday, the trainer is to contact the scratching number on Sunday between 8am and 9am.
4. Other than reserve greyhounds, trainers will be restricted to trialling one (1) greyhound unless nominations determine otherwise.
5. Stewards will allocate the box for the greyhound.
6. Trials will be 515m, 530m & 531m in distance as first preference. Other distances considered depending on nominations.
7. Greyhounds currently under suspension are ineligible to trial unless they are undertaking a satisfactory trial to be cleared.
8. Greyhound registration cards must be produced at kennelling time.
9. Trainers with other greyhounds engaged can utilise the extra kennel space until such time they are ready to leave. Trainers with no other greyhounds engaged will be permitted to leave with Stewards permission.
10. In the case of race at Murray Bridge, trials will only be available on the track that is prepared to race that day i.e. Friday meeting on the u-shaped track, trials will be on the u-shaped track only.

Please note: If there are 12 races at Angle Park, Gawler or Murray Bridge there will be NO trials.

The Angle Park Vet Clinic and/or swab kennels cannot be used to accommodate any additional greyhounds due to operational requirements of the Clinic and Stewards.

It is vital that trainers nominate to trial at these race meetings. If you are unable to nominate at these times, please contact GRSA as soon as possible as permission may be given at GRSA's discretion to accept bookings outside these times.

Exceptions to this policy

Thursday nights are kept available for interstate greyhounds to solo trial in a lead-up to SA Group races as well as local greyhound's trialling for Group racing interstate.

Upon request, local greyhounds will be allowed to solo trial in a lead-up to a feature race and they will take one of the eight (8) kennels available for trialling greyhounds ahead of the policy and sit separate to the four (4) dog trials. Races considered to be a feature are: Adelaide Cup, Gawler Cup, Oaks, Derby, Howard Ashton, Brian Johnstone, SA Sprint, SA Distance Championship, SA Anniversary Cup, SA Country Cup, National Finals and any interstate Group race

Local greyhounds will be permitted to trial on a race night, where they are in preparation for a feature event, nominated for a meeting and the race does not stand up. This will include all distances and also take precedence over the policy. If a greyhound qualifies for a feature final and requires a trial in between, this will be conducted as a solo trial and will sit separately to the four (4) dog trials.

MOUNT GAMBIER SATISFACTORY TRIALS

Trainers are advised of a change to the booking of Satisfactory Trials at Mt. Gambier. Mt Gambier hold trials on Tuesday and Saturday mornings with Satisfactory trials ONLY being conducted on Tuesdays and need to be booked with Barry Shephard from the Club on 0419 824 512.

At Race meetings Satisfactory trials can be done when less than 12 races. When there are 12 races these can be considered, however, the trainer will not be able to kennel and must take their greyhounds home straight after the trial. These race day trials will also need to be booked through Barry at the Club. GRSA administration staff will NOT accept these bookings and trainers will be directed to contact Barry Shephard.


