# **CEO'S UPDATE**

# Adelaide Cup

The changes that were introduced to this year's Adelaide Cup series – which link a series of feature races across Victoria and SA – appear to have positioned the race perfectly from a national perspective. The Cup now clearly represents a viable alternative to the Million Dollar Chase series for trainers with greyhounds which they believe are more suited to Adelaide's premier race, and for whom the lure of the linked opportunities with other feature and Group races, both here and in Victoria, just adds up to being the right opportunity for them. The outcome on this occasion was a stronger Cup field, which drove greater interest in the race and solid attendance on the night of the final. As history will record, the race itself couldn't have been a better advertisement for the sport.

Whilst a home-ground Cup win to local champion Sennachie would have been the icing on the cake, he still ran a great race in front of a parochial crowd and he will continue to loom as an obvious threat in any of the upcoming Group features that he contests on the eastern seaboard.

# **Industry Panels**

Noting that time is the enemy for most of us, it's important to remember that decisions about the sport in South Australia take guidance from the various industry panels and forums that are part of our local framework. Aside from Member Club meetings, the two prominent panels which have been established to provide a voice to trainers, breeders and owners are the Industry Consultative Group and the Grading Review Panel. # Amazing finish to the 2019 Adelaide Cup

### **ANGLE PARK**

One of the most anticipated races on the National calendar took place on Friday 11th October at Angle Park when the TAB Group 1 Adelaide Cup was run seeing the clash of 8 outstanding sprinters including the best rated greyhound in Australia Sennachie and potentially the fastest greyhound in Australia, Hooked On Scotch.

It was Group 1 racing at its finest with no other race on the night comparing to the excitement and exhilaration the Cup provided when Hooked On Scotch for Jason Thompson produced the run of the year to claim the Adelaide Cup giving the Thompson team their fifth success in the prestigious event.

In front of close to 1,300 people in beautiful weather conditions SA owned and bred Sennachie (box 3) for Victorian trainer Steve White was backed into favouritism on the back of huge local support displacing Hooked On Scotch (box 1) with the TAB prior to the start. Whiskey Riot (box 2) for Anthony Azzopardi was well in the market with many believing he would be able to lead and give the two stars something to catch.

A huge roar erupted from the crowd when the green light was turned on and the stars of the track were set for Group 1 glory. When the lids flew open Whiskey Riot began very fast and charged towards the lead with Sennachie missing the kick slightly, Hooked On Scotch beginning soundly and the surprise packet from out wide, He's For Me (box 8) for Jeff Britton charging forward to challenge for the lead. Out of the front straight and Whiskey Riot led with He's For Me on his outside, Sennachie recovered quickly to be just in behind and then quickly moved to the inside on the back of Whiskey Riot while Hooked On Scotch moved to fourth and a little wide heading to the back straight. Unfortunately there was crowding on the first turn with the remainder of the field put out of business with Spring Bridge for Jason Thompson recovering best to come out after the leaders. Down the back straight, the leaders were motoring with Whiskey Riot setting a blistering pace, Sennachie moved to second and came to the outside to the excitement of the local crowd while He's For Me was being challenged on the outside by Hooked On Scotch who looked to be taking time to wind up. Off the back straight in a sizzling 16.73 and it looked like Whiskey Riot and Sennachie were going to fight it out with Sennachie moving up ominously just prior to turning for home. Hooked On Scotch





moved past He's For Me into third and began to run home stylishly. Midway down the home straight Sennachie got on level terms with Whiskey Riot which kicked strongly as the level of excitement reached fever pitch as they neared the finish line. However, Hooked On Scotch produced an amazing finishing burst to run over the top of the two leaders in a blanket finish. Race Caller Tim Edwards produced a race call that matched the outstanding race, claiming unbelievably that Hooked On Scotch might have got there. Number 1 then showed in first place on the semaphore board leaving Tim and the crowd stunned and amazed as to what they had just witnessed Hooked On Scotch produce. Hooked On Scotch had won by a head from Whiskey Riot with a neck back to Sennachie in one of the closest three way finishes seen in a Group 1 final. The three greyhounds ran out of their skin with Whiskey Riot 29.45 and Sennachie 29.46 running times that would have won on most occasions however, Hooked On Scotch's 29.44 with a sizzling run home of 12.48 was good enough for victory on Friday night. He's For Me ran a bold race in

fourth with Spring Bridge close up in fifth.

Hooked On Scotch's performance after the race and in the subsequent days continues to be spoken about. How a greyhound can run past stars of the track, running blistering time and only really get motoring in the final straight still has industry stalwarts shaking their heads! The son of Barcia Bale and Nicki Fields appears to have an endless amount of potential after claiming a Group 1 victory with only 10 starts to his name.

Hooked On Scotch is owned by Darren and Michael Puleio from Victoria and with Friday nights win he took his career earnings to just under \$110,000 with a record of 6 wins and 3 placings from just 10 starts. With the joint collaboration from GRVIC and both Sandown GRC and the Meadows GRC Hooked On Scotch has also secured a spot in the Group 1 Topgun at the Meadows on Saturday 9th November and the Group 2 Sandown Shootout on Thursday 14th November should connections accept due to winning the Group 1 TAB Adelaide Cup.

# Like mother, like daughter in SA Oaks final

At Angle Park on 19th September, SA owned, bred and trained sprinter Oakvale Beauty took out the 2019 Group 3 Coffex Coffee SA Oaks for Pinnaroo trainer Nathan Wilson replicating the feats of her mother Oakvale Destiny back in 2014

Oakvale Beauty is owned by Nathan and his wife Kerri and is beautifully bred by Kinloch Brae and Oakvale Destiny and she had to stretch every fibre in her body to rail hard in the home straight to claim the \$25,000 winner's cheque by a nose. As the race started Kisses For Cloda which is also owned, bred and trained locally fired out of the boxes to lead for trainer Ben Rawlings who only just took over her training from local racing identity Ray Fewings. Coorong Lucy for Cameron Butcher began well and positioned second while Miss Bellawood for leading Victorian trainer Jeff Britton moved forward nicely to third in the early stages. Oakvale Beauty settled midfield on the rails while race favourites Mepunga Maggie for Jeff Britton began fairly and was back in 4th with Submission bombing the start for Brad Keel and giving the field a huge



head start and she was back with the notoriously slow beginning Dashing Mickey for Gavin Harris.

Into the back straight Kisses For Cloda was moving stylishly in the lead while Oakvale Beauty made good ground to the inside of Coorong Lucy to move to second. Mepunga Maggie also made ground along the rails while Submission had made up many lengths from the rear. Turning for home and Kisses For Cloda was still going strong and rolled away from the rails allowing a run for Oakvale Beauty who was coming home strong. Both Mepunga Maggie and Submission also ran home

hard but was just out of reach of the leaders. As they hit the line Oakvale Beauty stuck her nose out to win by that margin in one of the most exciting finishes to the Oaks in recent history. Oakvale Beauty ran a superb 29.58 for the 515m journey in winning by a nose from a gallant Kisses For Cloda while Mepunga Maggie was a length away in third just ahead of Submission.

The \$25,000 first prize took Oakvale Beauty's prizemoney to just over \$50,000 and the impressive record of 9 wins and 8 placings from her 17 lifetime starts still having never missed a place.

# Pegasus soars to a big win

The BGC Industrial Cleaning Supplies SA Derby final as always showcases some of the best young male chasers in the land with a hot field lining up for the Group 3 feature but it was the Jeff Britton trained Mepunga Pegasus that grew wings over the concluding stages to win the \$25,000 first prize.

As the start was affected race favourite Curt Lee for Victorian trainer Glen Rounds fired out of the boxes as he did last week in the heats however Jasper The Jet for NSW trainer Terry Priest also began smartly on his inside and the two matched their motors to the first turn. Both Mepunga Pegasus and Weblec King for Matt Lanigan began nicely and sat just off the pace making full use of their inside draws while there was trouble back in the field.

Down the back straight and Curt Lee applied the pressure to Jasper The Jet which continued to hold the inside running while both Mepunga Pegasus and Weblec King began to charge home. Off the back straight Curt Lee was able to run to the front however Mepunga Pegasus was quickly on the scene and raced up just prior to the home straight. As they charged to the line Mepunga Pegasus was doing a little bit the better and went on to win in a slick 29.52 from Curt Lee with Weblec King getting home well into third

Mepunga Pegasus now boasts the impressive record of 12 starts for 5 wins and 3 placings and prizemoney past \$42,000.

# 2019 Group 1 TAB Adelaide Cup

As part of SA's Breeders Super Bonus Scheme Bill Wudarczyk who bred Sennachie will receive \$2,500 for running third in the Group 1 final while Weblec King bred by Jane McNichol will receive \$1,000 for making the Group 1 Final.

There were around 1,300 patron's oncourse for the meeting which was slightly down on last year's 1,500 with 1,200 in 2017. Chaser's Restaurant was totally booked out as normal for the Cup with around 500 people enjoying the Chaser's Buffet. There were around 150 children oncourse compared to 180 children last year who enjoyed the "Super Hero" theme night, face painters and family areas provided on the night. The Cash Grab was a big hit again, which saw plenty of patron involvement where 2 partons won between \$1,600 and \$2,000 each.

Our total TAB tote turnover on the meeting was \$252,563 compared to \$355,866 last year and \$231,013 in 2017. The Jackpot provided by TAB performed well for the Cup having a First 4 Jackpot of \$20,000 with the pool reaching \$100,932 compared to \$54,176 last year and \$52,596 in 2017 with a \$10,000 jackpot. Being mindful that money is wagered through many other corporate bookmakers on the night which is calculated separately.

With Curly Seal bookmaking this year his figures were \$23,168 compared to \$17,890 last year and \$8,956 in 2017.

The Adelaide Cup Consolation was won by Seal The Deal for Anthony Azzopardi while the Premier's Cup was won by Five Thirty for Lauren Harris. Also a feature on the night was the SA Country Cup which was won by Better Dream for Ben Rawlings representing the Gawler GRC.

# 2019 Group 3 Gawler Gold Cup Final on November 3rd

The Gawler Gold Cup carnival will be run over three meetings. The carnival will kick off on Friday 25th October with Heats of the Gawler Sprint Classic for open 400m greyhounds. There will be heats of the Gawler Stayers Cup for open 643m greyhounds. Both finals will be worth \$8,000 and \$8,500 respectively and will be run on Gawler Gold Cup night.

On Tuesday, 29th October the \$3,000 Heats for the Group 3 Gawler Gold Cup will be run over the 531m. The meeting will be run as a day meeting with normal Tuesday times.

The Group 3 final will be run on Sunday night, 3rd November worth \$36,000 in prizemoney with the winner to receive \$25,000. Including the Gawler Sprint Classic and Gawler Stayers Cup there will be a Consolation for the Gawler Gold Cup worth \$4,000.

Nominations for the Gawler Sprint and Stayers close with GRSA at 9.00am on Monday, 21st October.

She replicated the feats of her mother which won the SA Oaks in 2014.

At the end of the month Oakvale Beauty's record stood at 17 starts for 9 wins and 8 placings and earnings just over \$50,000 with her never missing a top 3 in her career.



# Road Travelled makes it two awards in a row

The Run of the Month for September was Road Travelled for trainer Steven Brook making it back to back runs of the month awards after he won the award for August.

Road Travelled ran another blistering race this time at Gawler on Friday 13th September where he won by 7.50 lengths in a sensation 30.36 for the 531m journey only .13 outside the long standing track record.





# **Leigh Rogers Grade 6 Feature**

The Leigh Rogers Grade 6 feature will be run over the 515m journey with \$3,510 Heats on Thursday, 31st October and the \$11,435 Final on Thursday, 7th November.

Nominations for the Heats close with GRSA at 9.00am on Monday, 28th October.

GRSA introduced this race onto the feature race calendar two years ago in recognition of former long time Food and Beverage Manager, Leigh Rogers, who lost his battle with a rare form of cancer three years ago. Leigh is the husband of Rachel and father of three young girls and it will be great to see them back oncourse in recognition of Leigh.

# **GAP SA Race Night**

As part of the GAP SA birthday celebrations they will have a race night on Thursday, 24th October featuring a Free For All event worth \$5.545.

Nominations close with GRSA at 9.00am on Monday, 21st October.

There will also be three GAP Parades on the night and we will celebrate the achievements of Jenny Alcorn who has fostered 100 greyhounds.

# Super bonus for SA bred from 1st January 2018

The super-bonus scheme is premised upon 100% dividend to breeders for SA Bred greyhounds. The following updates have been approved for implementation from 1st January 2018. The super bonus will only be paid out to breeders residing in South Australia.

Also featuring on the night will be a Free For All event for greyhounds which competed at Virginia during 2019. This race will be graded on circle form. The race is supported by GOTBA and carries prizemoney of \$5,545.

Nominations close with GRSA at 9.00am on Monday, 11th November.

# Accell Therapy mat to be moved near the kennel house

GRSA will be moving the Accell Therapy mat out of the reception area at Angle Park .and moving it near the Kennel House.

This will hopefully encourage trainers to utilise the mat during and outside of normal Admin hours. The mat cannot be used on race days/nights however could be used on trial nights. GRSA will monitor the use of the mat to see if the move has assisted the use and trainers.

# Mount Gambier time grading to be a mix of wins from October

After a request from the Mt Gambier GRC to change the format of their Time Grading events, GRSA has approved the change for their Thursday meetings from specific grades to a mix of race wins.

From their meeting on Thursday, 3rd October and all other Time Graded meetings races will be Maidens, 1-4 wins and 5+ wins which will change from Maiden, Grade 6 and Grade 5.

Races will still be Non Penalty, with normal Time Graded prizemoney.

For Middle Distance (600m) and Distance (732m) racing, the GRSA Grader (using discretion), may choose to construct a field over these distances without regard for the number of wins of the greyhounds nominated, if in the opinion of the Grader the spread of Time Ratings warrants the running of that race.

# Auto-sorting for grading now to start later this month

GRSA advises that the auto sorting of the Order of Preference for Grading purposes is almost ready to go.

For a long period this has been a manual process. This will reduce this part of the process by about 1 hour and will remove some of the discretion of the Grader because it will also incorporate all greyhounds, even those off the Order with a Weighted Points Score [WPS] table.

GRSA has made some changes to the Order of Preference which include -  $\,$ 

- No 5 Qualifying trials will be managed separately outside the automation
- Remove St Leger & Champion Puppy heats reference
- Remove 6 months criteria reference
- Remove Grader giving preference to performances over 400m
- Back to normal No 9 (Placed 2 of last 3 in City) and No 10 (One win from last 3 in City)
- Any reference about Pathway or Time Graded is removed from this file
- Update Track Classifications based on new file for WPS (Weighted Points Score)
- For WPS [Fell is considered as 4th and FTF is next available placing]

The WPS will assist with the selection of those greyhounds not on the Order of Preference so all greyhounds will effectively be sorted into an order for selection.

GRSA has the support from the GRP that when using the automation that if the order of entry by Order of Preference, Race wins or WPS is discovered to be incorrect after fields have been drawn that GRSA will not redraw the race in question (so long as the greyhound is correctly graded). If this did occur then the affected greyhound will get first preference at its next nomination.

Implementation of this process is NOW scheduled for late October again barring any unforeseen delays.

# Weighted point score table

All greyhounds will also have a WPS calculated based upon the WPS table.

There is no age criteria on the start dates when calculating the WPS. The WPS must be calculated on the greyhound's last 5 Race starts. If the greyhound has not competed in 5 Races, the pro-rata WPS will be applied.

### **Pro-rata WPS**

Greyhounds that have not yet competed in five [5] starts are allocated points on a pro-rata or an average over five [5] starts with a weighting of 80% applied to the "pro-rata" points.

To calculate the points of a greyhound that has not competed in five [5] starts:

- divide the greyhound's total points by the amount of starts it has competed in
- 2. multiply the new average by the difference between 5 and the number of actual starts and apply the 80% discount weighting

 add the result to the actual points earned from the greyhound's starts.

Examples for working out the points of greyhounds using this method:

**One Start** = 36 points 36 / 1 = 36;  $36 \times 4 = 144 \times 0.8 = 115$ ; 115 + 36 = 151 points

**Two Starts** = 46 points 46 / 2 = 23;  $23 \times 3 = 69 \times 0.8 = 55$ ; 55 + 46 = 101 points

**Four Starts** = 84 points 84 / 4 = 21; 21 x 1 = 21 x 0.8 = 16; 16 + 84 = 100 points

# Grading changes from grading review panel have started

The main change from the GRP was that when a greyhound comes to SA and has won less than 5 races (1-4 wins) then it will be considered a Grade 6 even if it has won Grade 5 races (Metropolitan Grade 5 races (460m – 590m) in their State, however, will affect Grade 6).

There will be no retrospective grading for greyhounds already in SA with a starting date of the 9th September.

# Transfer of ownership form includes Proof of Purchase

Participants are advised that as from 1st September, 2019 a new Transfer of Ownership Form is to be completed if wanting to seek grading exemptions.

The new Form has a Proof of Purchase section, this requires purchasers to lodge documentation confirming the purchase of the greyhound or if no documentation is available then it is a requirement for the Statutory Declaration to be completed. If a Transfer of Ownership Form is lodged without the completion of this section then NO grading exemptions will be applied to the greyhound. The form is available on our website.

# Transfering greyhounds into SA with Proof of Purchase and grading exemptions

GRSA has considered the scenario of SA owners purchasing greyhounds with the new proof of purchase transfer and choosing not to bring them back to SA but still hoping to get grading exemptions if needed at the time. We have already had a number of greyhounds purchased with this process. Normally GRSA has not had to deal with this scenario as the greyhounds would normally be transferred to a local trainer in SA and race straight away so there has never been a policy in place.

### GRSA has introduced the below policy -

Any greyhounds purchased into SA ownership under the proof of purchase conditions to be trained in SA and seeking grading exemptions need to be in SA to receive grading exemptions before the 1st January 2020. On the 1st or after this date greyhounds have to come back to SA once purchased without any race starts interstate to receive a grading exemption.

Owners are encouraged to contact the GRSA grader to assist with specific grades of greyhounds as required.

# Winning Grade 6 races in order

GRSA reminds trainers to win their grade 6 events in order at a specific venue. For the venues that allow two Grade 6 wins trainers need to win a Grade 6 over one distance and then a Grade 6 over the other distance.

If a greyhound wins a Grade 6 and then a Grade 5 then they will lose their Grade 6 over the other distance at that venue.

# Gawler satisfactory and qualifying trials

A reminder to trainers that Satisfactory trials and Qualifying trials are conducted at Gawler on Thursday mornings weekly.



Participants are able to purchase their very own red vests for \$20 however GRSA will always have some available. These vests look very smart and come up particularly well on Sky Racing promoting SA Racing so with that in mind the long parade coats have been phased out of action with participants required to have a black or navy jumper available to be worn under the vests.

# **Hooked On Scotch stars in State of Origin series**

# ANGLE PARK

The second running of the 2019 TAB State of Origin Match Race series (SA V Victoria) was run on September 26th at Angle Park in front of a huge parochial crowd, this year there was another 4-0 white wash but this time the Big V turned the tables on the Croweaters sweeping the locals in a brilliant night of high speed chasing.

The scene was set in the first match race when SA Owned and Bred Sennachie for trainer Steve White representing Victoria due to domiciliary clauses blistered around the Angle Park loam in a sizzling 29.21 in defeating Crash Bandicoot for Lisa Rasmussen by over 7 lengths after he led throughout. Sennachie dispelled any thought that he was a bit underdone and that he may not be at his best during the Adelaide Cup carnival, considered the best greyhound in Australia Sennachie produced the 9th fastest time recorded at Angle Park and set down the gauntlet to his Victorian and South Australian competitors.

In the second match race Steinbrenner for Victorian trainer Jeff Britton continued his rise on the National scene with a dominant display of chasing when he was able to push hard on the first turn and hold the lead from Alpha Aion for Ben Rawlings. From there Steinbrenner ran good time in the lead clocking a flying 29.42 for the 515m journey in winning by over 6 lengths.

The third heat was full of anticipation with Hooked on Scotch for Victorian trainer Jason Thompson considered the fastest and most exciting chaser in the land matched against highly talented local hope Fly For Fun for Lauren Harris. As they exploded out of the boxes Fly For Fun sizzled early holding out his highly rated counterpart and continued to do so down the back straight.

They were low flying however off the back straight Hooked On Scotch shifted into another gear and raced to the lead. He was .14 off Sennachie's second split time however he was careering away from Fly For Fun as he hit the line in full flight. The large crowd gasped as the clock stopped at 29.2 (something) as the judge went to post the official number. Into the semaphore board it went with Hooked On Scotch officially running 29.19 and claiming top spot by .02 of a second with one match race to go. Hooked On Scotch's last section was brilliant and there were some thoughts of what time he may have run had he began slightly better and not had to course wide around the first turn however most were just amazed at the son of Barcia Bale and Nicky Fields performance.

The final match race was the fourth win for Victoria when SA Owned Spring Bridge for trainer Jason Thompson proved too strong for Canya Chase for Tony Rasmussen. Spring Bridge represented SA last year in finishing second and unusually represented Victoria this year due to domiciliary clauses and showed that he would be a force during the Adelaide Cup series starting next Thursday night. It took some time for him to rail up the inside of Canya Chase off the back straight and from there was too strong in the run to the line stopping the clock in 29.58.

The overall winner of the series was Hooked On Scotch running 29.19 which is the seventh fastest time recorded at Angle Park defeating Sennachie by .02 of a second. Last year there was only .02 separating the top 3 with Nations successful for SA and trainer Tony Rasmussen and it was great to have Nations on hand to lead the combatants onto the track for the 2019 edition. Third overall was Steinbrenner while the best of the South Aussies was Fly For Fun who slipped into fourth with a super 29.57 overall time to his credit.







The TAB "State of Origin" Match Racing series was a lead up event to the Group 1 TAB Adelaide Cup series and as part of a joint collaboration between GRSA, GRVIC and Victorian Metropolitan clubs, Hooked On Scotch bypassed the heats of the Group 1 Adelaide Cup and took his spot in the final which he also eventually won in great style. He also booked his spot in the Group 2 Shootout at Sandown on 14th November if they accept. The winner of the Adelaide Cup will also gain automatic entry into the Group 1 Topgun at the Meadows on Saturday 9th November if they accept.

GRSA thanks the support of TAB and Sky Racing for their support of this series and also the local trainers and the Victorian trainers who travelled so far to ensure this series was successful.



# **The Golden Rules**

Since the introduction of cobalt and arsenic thresholds, all participants should be reminded – in their own best interests – that there are a number of Golden Rules that can help them to avoid making any such breaches (for prohibited substances generally) and which should be adhered to as principles of best practice:

- Always consult your vet to seek guidance in relation to any of the products that you are using, any associated risks and other relevant context
- Review the range of any feeds or supplements that you typically purchase and, wherever it is reasonable to do so, replace products containing substances that could contribute to a threshold breach under the rules (eg. cobalt) with alternative products
- Observe the instructions on any products that you use and adhere strictly to those directions (having regard for prescribed amounts, frequency of administration/ application, methodology for administering/applying)
- Ensure a greyhound is never administered any treatment on race day other than as relates to its feeding and drinking requirements [GAR83[A][1] treats this as a specific offence]
- Refrain from the use of injectable treatments (eg. Vitamin B12) to any extent that is practical, including ensuring a greyhound is not administered any injectables the day before an event

Our registered participants have the responsibility to ensure that greyhounds are presented to the track free of any prohibited substances. This information is offered as advice in good faith and should not be relied on as a defence in the event of a breach occurring.

# Mount Gambier Kennel House

The Mount Gambier kennel house project has now been completed, with the club conducting the first meeting out of the refurbished building on Thursday 4th October, 2019.

The project was an outstanding success with all works completed on time and with operations continuing to be conducted out of a temporary kennel building, the first time that this has been attempted in South Australia. In all, 13 meetings were conducted under the 'Big Top', allowing participants to continue to race throughout the works.

The finished product is a great result and basically mirrors what has been built at the new \$8.6 million Murray Bridge facility. It brings Mount Gambier into line with all the other kennel buildings in South Australia, that being a modern, clean and practical interior, despite the fact that the building is around 22 years old.

Over the next couple weeks a few tidy up items will need to be completed before the project can be officially signed off, however these works will be done around the race meetings and trial sessions and will have no real impact on participants.

Special mention must be given to Tim Manterfield who has managed the project at a local level and has actually undertaken many of the tasks himself. Without his expertise and skills it would be difficult for GRSA to undertake such a project in a remote area. Tim's attention to detail and desire



to have a quality and long lasting finish has been a big part of why this project has been a success.

Tim was ably assisted by Mount Gambier GRC committee member Noel Perry, who has also given a lot of his time to assist throughout the project. Noel was on site throughout the six weeks period, undertaking any works necessary to keep the project moving along.

Also a big thanks to the many volunteers that contributed to the success of the project, including John Woodland, Barry Shepheard, Ralph Patzel, Kevin Jones, Ken Gillespie, David Peckham, David Lewis, Jason Newman, Bale Newman, Mason Bartlett, Stephen Bartholomew, Lee Bartholomew and Elysia Bartholomew.

# **Angle Park carnival track preparation**

Hooked On Scotch's amazing win in the Adelaide Cup was the culmination of a five week carnival period for GRSA, which included some big feature races, numerous visitors from interstate (trainers and greyhounds) and some exceptional and exciting racing.

One of the often forgotten elements to such an important racing period is the maintenance team that works so hard to present Angle Park at its best [both on and off the track]. The team, including Terry Winder, Brad Beckett, Michael Edwards, Scott Spencer and Steve Muldoon, not only presented a good track, but also a quality venue throughout the five week carnival period.

In regards to the racing surface, the two key drivers for the team are consistency and safety, and over the course of the past five weeks, key data from both areas has been extremely positive. Star greyhounds were able to run some slashing times, including a 29.19 run by Hooked On Scotch (7th fastest of all time) and a 29.21 by Sennachie (10th fastest of all time), but more importantly, they were able to do it on a very consistent and safe track.

In fact, 2019 has been a really positive period for track preparation at Angle Park. The relatively young team has worked together really well and applied some new thinking on how the track should be prepared on a weekly and daily basis. The end result is a substantially lower injury rate, a reduction in water use and a track that is presented and races extremely consistently for a race meetings and trial sessions.



There is often a tendency to provide feedback only when things differ from what is considered the 'norm', however it is rare to be proactive in providing genuinely positive feedback. So credit where credit is due, the Angle Park track was great during the big feature event nights and has been very well presented over the past six months, long may it continue.




# Latest updates from GAP


As previously advised, GAP have been increasing the number of assessments in the monthly schedule.

# Keen One claims emotional win at Tara Raceway

Emotions ran high at Tara Raceway on Sunday October 13th after Keen One's powerful finishing burst in the Laser Electrical Maiden Stake (400 metres) resulted in him running down tearaway leader Frankie to win by three-quarters of a length in a smart 23.28 seconds.

On track to witness the greyhound's first win at his fifth start, after three previous minor placings, was an emotional Tarpeena owner Malcolm Keenan and his wife Nuran – Keen One racing in the name of JK the Great, in memory of Keenan's son John.

The win was also Keenan's first in six years, a dog called Bahama Sixty One, who he raced in partnership with local greyhound man Ralph Patzel, winning a 512 metre maiden at Tara Raceway in 30.95 seconds.

And it was Patzel who actually picked out Keen One as a pup from an October 2017 litter by Dyna Villa out of Precious Prize, a winner of three races up the straight at Healesville.

"We went over Bendigo way to select a couple of pups from the litter and left them there to be reared and then got Dita [Mitchell] to take over their training after breaking-in," Keenan said.

"Zeenat, our other one, will have her fourth start in a maiden over 400 metres at Tara Raceway on Sunday while Keen One will step up to a grade six event."

For Mitchell, also of Tarpeena, last Sunday was a good way to celebrate her birthday after Keen One's win and then Galloping Flash who made it two in a row with a two length win over Cee

# A winning run

Racing at Gawler greyhounds on Friday afternoon, local owner and trainer John Cunningham landed another winner, taking his recent tally to three wins.

In the 400m Maiden event, John had McAlpine engaged, starting from box 5. Down the back straight, reserve runner Hopey Girl from box 8, showed early dash to take a two length lead over Punk Star Rocks (2), with McAlpine close behind. Approaching the back turn, McAlpine increased the tempo, and drew level as they passed the 643m boxes. McAlpine continued the run, to be two lengths clear at the finishing line, in a fair time for a maiden of 23.16 secs. Red Aramis (1), which had been travelling midfield, also accelerated down the back straight and with a good run on the rails, finished second for Don Turner of Lewiston, with Punk Star Rocks in third spot for Paul Fagan of Calomba.

McAlpine was having its second run for trainer John Cunningham, who races the white and brindle dog in partnership with long time mate, Andy Peden, formerly of Whyalla and now living in Queensland. The pair raced the dog's mother, Mrs Bubbles, with great success and they decided to breed this first litter with her. A second pup from the litter, Cardhu Too, had won at Gawler on the previous Tuesday, and there is a third unraced pup as well. John also had success at the previous Friday meeting, with Dusty Divot, who is from In A Bottle, a litter sister of Mrs Bubbles.

John has now trained three winners the last two weeks, a feat he has not previously accomplished. He has achieved much success as an owner, but most have come under either the care of Andy

Peden or Matthew Payne. John thought that it was an extremely long time since he had trained any winner, but the records show that he trained his last winner in 2012, not as long ago as he had imagined.

First involved in 1985, John now has a small team of four racing dogs and two pups at his Gawler Belt kennel. John said that "you can't not enjoy the feeling of winning," but he derives the most satisfaction from the complete circle of selecting the sire, whelping and rearing the litter, together with the education, racing and the eventual adoption phase.

# ANGLE PARK QUALIFYING TRIALS ON WEDNESDAY NIGHTS

Under the new schedule Angle Park Qualifying Trials will be run weekly on Wednesday night, for the corresponding Monday APM meeting (12 days later due to nominations). With 388m racing now available on Monday nights trainers can qualify for all distances.

Nominations close with GRSA at 12.30pm on the Wednesday of the meeting.

### SINGLE TRIALS

A reminder to trainers that single trials can be booked with two greyhounds however you need to advise when booking of your intention to do this. If you wish to put three or more into this trial then a field trial will have to be booked.

### **BOOKING NUMBER FOR TRIALS**

Participants wishing to book trials are required to ring 8243 7172, this phone line will only be used for trial bookings and will queue participants. By having this one number with participants queuing makes this process to be a more efficient way of booking trials.

There will be NO trials accepted through the normal administration number. To be fair to everyone GRSA will only accept bookings using the new number or alternatively logon to trialbooker.com, create an account and book your own trials.

# POLICY FOR TRIALLING AT ANGLE PARK, GAWLER AND MURRAY BRIDGE BEFORE THE RACE MEETING

### **Policy Background**

This policy is to detail the procedure for trainers seeking greyhounds to trial before race meetings. This policy is effective from 2 May 2019.

### **Race Meeting Trial Policy**

This policy is in place for the following race meetings:

Angle Park Monday, Gawler Tuesday and Friday, Murray Bridge Wednesday and Sunday.

Two fields from the boxes with a maximum of four (4) greyhounds will be conducted immediately following the completion of the kennelling procedure for the race meeting.

The following lists the order in which greyhounds will be selected in the event if more than eight (8) greyhounds are nominated:

- 1. Reserves at the meeting that do not obtain a start
- 2. Trainers that have greyhounds engaged and are located more than 100km in distance from the track
- 3. Satisfactory trials

### Procedure/criteria

- 1. For Angle Park Monday night, the trainer is to contact GRSA by midday on Monday to nominate. Should the
  - Monday be a public holiday bookings are to be made between 8am and 9am on the scratching number.
- 2. For Gawler Tuesday & Friday, the trainer is to contact GRSA by 4.30pm the day before.
- 3. For Murray Bridge Wednesday, the trainer is to contact
  - GRSA by 4.30pm the day before. For Murray Bridge Sunday, the trainer is to contact the scratching number on Sunday between 8am and 9am.
- 4. Other than reserve greyhounds, trainers will be restricted to trialling one (1) greyhound unless nominations determine otherwise.
- 5. Stewards will allocate the box for the greyhound.
- 6. Trials will be 515m, 530m & 531m in distance as first preference. Other distances considered depending on nominations.
- 7. Greyhounds currently under suspension are ineligible to trial unless they are undertaking a satisfactory trial to be cleared.
- 8. Greyhound registration cards must be produced at kennelling time.
- Trainers with other greyhounds engaged can utilise the extra kennel space until such time they are ready to leave.
  - Trainers with no other greyhounds engaged will be permitted to leave with Stewards permission.
- 10. In the case of race at Murray Bridge, trials will only be available on the track that is prepared to race that day i.e. Sunday meeting on the u-shaped track, trials will be on the u-shaped track only.

Please note: If there are 12 races at Angle Park, Gawler or Murray Bridge there will be NO trials.

The Angle Park Vet Clinic and/or swab kennels cannot be used to accommodate any additional greyhounds due to operational requirements of the Clinic and Stewards.

It is vital that trainers nominate to trial at these race meetings. If you are unable to nominate at these times, please contact GRSA as soon as possible as permission may be given at GRSA's discretion to accept bookings outside these times.

# **Exceptions to this policy**

Thursday nights are kept available for interstate greyhounds to solo trial in a lead-up to SA Group races as well as local greyhound's trialling for Group racing interstate.

Upon request, local greyhounds will be allowed to solo trial in a lead-up to a feature race and they will take one of the eight (8) kennels available for trialling greyhounds ahead of the policy and sit separate to the four (4) dog trials. Races considered to be a feature are: Adelaide Cup, Gawler Cup, Oaks, Derby, Howard Ashton, Brian Johnstone, SA Sprint, SA Distance Championship, SA Anniversary Cup, SA Country Cup, National Finals and any interstate Group race

Local greyhounds will be permitted to trial on a race night, where they are in preparation for a feature event, nominated for a meeting and the race does not stand up. This will include all distances and also take precedence over the policy. If a greyhound qualifies for a feature final and requires a trial in between, this will be conducted as a solo trial and will sit separately to the four (4) dog trials.

# **SA BRED WINNERS**

The pool of money has been increased from \$30,000 to \$45,000 per month. These winners all receive a \$225 base payment with \$75 to the Owner & \$150 to the Breeder. Then a monthly payment to the Owner & Breeder will be determined by the number of SA Bred wins at all Sky Racing meetings in South Australia for the month based on 33.3% to the Owner and 66.7% to the breeder.
