CEO'S UPDATE

The attendance of the Premier and various political dignitaries at the Adelaide Cup last week was a welcome show of support for greyhound racing. Organisations such as ours cannot operate in a vacuum. Rather, it's important that we connect with community and invite new people to experience the raceday [or night] experience. This is partly about creating the opportunity for new participation, but also about making mainstream people aware of how our sport operates and the special relationship that exists between trainer and dog. Remaining relevant to the public is a key to a prosperous future for racing.

Just as importantly, and particular so in this unusual year, it's critical that we look internally and take care of each other. Despite the fact that racing is a competitive endeavour, we operate in a community and everyone has a shared interest in making the model work for all participants. As things begin to open up, and Covid restrictions are withdrawn, it would be unrealistic to expect that things will just snap back to normal. On the contrary, the legacy of the Covid experience and the heightened exposure of SA to movements from the eastern seaboard will continue to impact upon people and create general anxiety. In support of our greyhound racing community, there are two simple things you can do to make a difference. Look out for your fellow trainers/handlers and be consciously ready to lend your support. Separately, ignore the nay-sayers and get vaccinated, to protect yourself and others in the sport.

Do It claims first Adelaide Cup at new Angle Park

A terrific crowd of close to 1,700 people (the most in the last 10 years) attended this years edition of the Group 1 TAB Adelaide Cup. Being run on a Friday night during daylight savings, school holidays, beautiful weather and the fastest greyhound in Australia taking part were all reasons South Australians flocked to the home of greyhound racing at Angle Park.

Super star Victorian speedster Aston Rupee for Glen Rounds set the racing world alight two weeks ago when he booked his spot in the Group 1 final by winning the SA V Allstars Match Race Challenge, in doing so he also became the first greyhound to break the 30 second barrier on the newly developed Angle Park circuit running a blistering 29.95 for the 530m journey. Joining him in the final were the 6 winners from last weeks heats and the fastest second placed greyhound making for a much anticipated final.

The Box Draw also created much interest with Aston Rupee drawing box 8 in a star studded line up but that didn't stop the strong support for him backed into odds on, starting a warm favourite at \$1.85.

With patrons being able to get closer to the action with the redevelopment there was a huge roar from the crowd in anticipation of the start as the light turned green and the next Group 1 champion was only 30 seconds away from being known.

Mr. Fix It for Jeff Britton was unlucky not to make the final in his own right however with the unfortunate scratching of Keep It Black he came into box 3 and made full use on dispatch using his brilliant early speed to lead to the first turn. Kennel mate Do It also began well from box 2 to sit just to the inside of Mr. Fix It while Came And Went for Troy Murray showed his sizzling early speed to race up and challenge in third place. These three had broken away from the main field early with Aston Rupee only average away from out wide and was caught off the track as the remainder of the field kicked up on his inside. Out of the front straight and Mr. Fix It lead the group 1 sprinters from Do It and Came And Went, Aston Rupee tried to cross down but copped a big bump losing all winning chance while local star Jack's Well for Cameron Butcher found himself near last while Major Major for Troy Murray, Weblec Blazer for Angela Langton and Spring Lilac for Vadim Roz all tried to find a position closer to the rails.

Down the back straight and Mr. Fix It was flying in the lead with Dot It moving to his outside as the Britton pair opened up a gap from Came And Went. Major Major moved to fourth with Jack's Well sweeping around the outside to make ground quickly. Aston Rupee found himself out of the race but began to make ground in the hope of a late challenge.

Off the back straight and Do It was about to put pay to Mr. Fix It sweeping to the front on the apex of the bend. Came And Went was being strongly challenged by his kennel mate Major Major for third while both were in the sights of Jack's Well who was going through his gears strongly.

Turning for home and Do It had broken away from Mr. Fix It and raced clear for a strong win. Mr. Fix It held on gamely for second 3.25 lengths back while Jack's Well stormed home into third only a length away. Aston Rupee ran a game race into fourth after he was put out of the race early. Do It ran a flying 30.07 for the 530m recording the second fastest time at Angle Park since racing started back at the venue a few months ago.



This is the second Group 1 Adelaide Cup for trainer Jeff Britton who won his first back in 2011 with star sprinter Mepunga Nicky. Jeff and his partner Angela Langton have been strong supporters of SA feature racing for many years however with Covid restrictions and getting greyhounds to SA this year has presented many obstacles for them. With the support of their local friends and owners in particular Neville Loechel and Nathan Wilson this win will take on even greater significance due to the hurdles they have overcome.

Do It by Fernando Bale and Alpha Demeter is owned by Kdt Racing, Managed by Jarrod Sharp and is based in Victoria with Friday nights win taking Do It's career earnings to \$198,935 with a record of 13 wins and 17 placings from 43 starts.

Lashes Monelli breathtaking in Premier's Cup win

Lashes Monelli has arrived in South Australia and made a bang! Winning four out of her 6 starts since coming to the state. The March 19' whelped bitch has shown outstanding chase in all of her starts here, coming from off the speed each time she has won.

And then on Adelaide Cup night, Lashes Monelli was able to claim the states premier staying event (The Premier's Cup), after being sent out as a hot favourite, but trainer Tim Aloisi didn't share that confidence.

"To be honest I'm never confident! I don't care if I've got a \$1.05 favourite, for me when they are expected to win there's a bit of pressure. In saying that, I was happy with where both of mine had drawn. I did think she should win, but it's dog racing and anything can happen!"

The race played out well for Lashes, as she settled back but was able to get a clear run along the fence. Coming for home she stormed past her kennel mate (Run Like Jess), before landing a powerful victory. A win that brought a huge roar from the local crowd, with Tim Edwards calling it perfectly, "The crowd love it!".

It was a keen eye from Tim that ultimately led to her arrival in SA, with Tim having his eyes set on her from very early days.

"I was watching her in Western Australia, number one we liked her as a broadbitch because it's a pretty good line. Seeing her early days hit the line over 500 and then 600, we thought she would run 700. Dave (Hobby) put her in a Galaxy heat and she won that which I wasn't surprised. Over there she probably gets a bit too far back, so after watching her for a bit longer we decided to buy her." Tim said

The outstanding form that Lashes is in, will no doubt attract interest for the big races interstate, but Tim isn't sold on heading for them just yet.



Racing Report

2021 Group 1 TAB Adelaide Cup

As part of the SA's Breeders Super Bonus Scheme Jack's Well bred by Tim Richards, and Spring Lilac bred by Greg Board will receive \$1,000 for making the Group 1 Final.

This year's Adelaide Cup under our Covid Management Plan was allowed to have 2,000 people oncourse. Official figures have 1,700 people attending which included 320 in Chasers Restaurant [maximum], 80 in the track side Garden Bar [maximum] and 300 children which made full use of the kids activities on the night.

Last year there were 1,000 [due to Covid limits], 1,300 patrons in 2019, with 1,500 in 2018 and 1,200 in 2017.

Our total TAB tote turnover on the meeting was \$193,324 compared to \$214,391 last year, in 2019 it was \$252,563, \$355,866 in 2018 and \$231,013 in 2017. With Jackpots now rolling into races the First 4 on the Cup performed very well reaching \$87,828. Last year the Cup had a First 4 jackpot of \$20,000 with the pool reaching \$87,828, compared to \$111,465 last year and \$100,932 in 2019, in 2018 it was \$54,176 and \$52,596 in 2017 with a \$10,000 jackpot. Being mindful that so much money is now wagered through many other corporate bookmakers on the night which is calculated separately.

With Curly Seal bookmaking this year his figures were \$19,065 compared to \$20,686 last year, it was \$23,168 in 2019 and \$17,890 in 2018 and \$8,956 in 2017.

The Adelaide Cup Consolation was won by Aston Cade for Matthew Payne while the Premier's Cup was won by Lashes Monelli for Tim Aloisi who continued on her winning way. Another feature on the night was the SA Country Cup which was won by He's All Purpose for Tim Richards representing the Mount Gambier GRC.

2021 Gawler Cup Carnival kicks off on Monday 15th October

The Gawler Gold Cup carnival will be run over three meetings this year. The Gawler GRC has been in consultation with the Thoroughbreds and Harness Racing in the region and has made a mini carnival with all three codes running their main races for the year around the same time called the "Gawler Carnival of Cups".

Our carnival will kick off on Monday, 18th October with \$3,000 Heats for the Group 3 Gawler Gold Cup over the 531m along with \$1,855 Heats of the Gawler Sprint Classic for open 400m greyhounds.

The Group 3 Gawler Cup Final will be run on Sunday night,

24th October worth \$36,000 in prizemoney with the winner to receive around \$25,000. This night will include the \$8,000 Gawler Sprint Classic Final and there will be a Consolation for the Gawler Gold Cup. To add to this feature night there will be the \$2,565 Heats of the "Bothing" Gawler Stayers Cup for open 643m greyhounds.

The \$8,500 Final of the Bothing Gawler Stayers Cup will be run on Sunday, 31st October along with the \$4,000 Gawler Anniversary Cup over the 531m rounding out the outstanding three meetings of racing.

Nominations for the Gawler Cup Heats and Gawler Sprint Classic Heats close with GRSA at 9.00am on Thursday, 14th October.

Nominations for the Gawler Stayers Cup Heats close with GRSA at 9.00am on Wednesday, 20th October.

Nominations for the Gawler Anniversary Cup close with GRSA at 9.00am on Wednesday, 27th October.

Stayers Cup named in honour of 2006 National Distance Champion - Bothing

The Gawler GRC and GRSA are pleased to advise that the \$8,500 Gawler Stayer's Cup Final to be run on Sunday, 31st October will be named in honour of champion stayer "Bothing".

Bothing was nicely bred being by Carlisle Jack out of Which Wire, owned by Andrew Lee, Brett Smith and Alexander Calabria and trained by Bosco Stamenkovic. In the year of 2006 there was no better stayer in the country after he won the National Distance Championship at Launceston in Tasmania over the 720m where he established a new track record of 42.49 and won by almost 5 lengths. He also currently holds the Gawler 643m track record which he set 15 years ago running an amazing 36.81 and won by almost 18 lengths, with few greyhounds getting close to this mark over the last decade and a half. He won the State Final of the National Distance, he was named SA Staying Greyhound of the Year and showed he could sprint as well, winning a Heat of the SA St Leger before finishing third in the Final. His best time over the 515m at Angle Park was 29.30 while he ran 43.06 over the 731m, he also won at Wentworth Park in 42.72 over the 720m. His career ended with 17 wins and 7 placings from only 30 lifetime starts with earnings around \$82,000 in prizemoney.

Brian Johnstone heats

Following the 2021 Gawler Classic and the Classic 2021 Preludes, attention will swing to the rich Brian Johnstone Series. The Group 3 series is the main event of the Classic 2021 Futurity.

The \$3,700 Heats for the Brian Johnstone will be run on Thursday, 11th November at Angle Park, followed by the \$4,500 Semi- Finals on Thursday, 18th November and the \$37,500 Final on Thursday, 25th November.

Nominations for the Heats close with GRSA at 9.00am on Monday, 8th November.

Came and Went has a September to remember

Greyhound of the Month for September was Came And Went for trainer Troy Murray who scored the most votes after high level performances in September just ahead of Mallee Magic, Don't Tell Lies and Stout Monelli, in one of the tightest months of voting this year.

The son of Barcia Bale and Hillary had five starts for three wins and two seconds with some outstanding performances at Group level. He started the month off with a solid Juvenile win at headquarters before blistering the track to win a Heat of the Group 3 SA Derby in a sizzling 30.36. He started favourite in the Derby Final and was just rundown into second place after a strong showing. He then ran second at headquarters before another brilliant performance to win his Heat of the Group 1 Adelaide Cup defeating a hot line up in 30.33 and book his spot in the big race.

At the end of the month Came And Went's record stood at 20 starts for 8 wins and 11 placings and earnings just over \$34,000.



Spring Lilac wins ROTM with exciting Cup heat win

The Run of the Month for September was Spring Lilac for trainer Vadim Roz at Angle Park in a Heat of the Group 1 Adelaide Cup over the 530m on Thursday, 30th September where she ran the fastest time of any locally trained greyhound at the newly redeveloped Angle Park circuit so far.

Shooting for three wins on the bounce she took on a strong field at Group 1 level. She belied her big odds to roll to the front in a handy 5.25 before racing off the back in 17.65. She was strong in the latter stages coming clear to record a brilliant win in 30.22, qualifying as the fastest greyhound from the Heats for the Group 1 Final.

Leigh Rogers Grade 6 feature

The Leigh Rogers Grade 6 feature will be run over the 530m journey with \$3,260 Heats on Thursday, 28th October and the \$14,275 Final on Thursday, 4th November.

Nominations for the Heats close with GRSA at 9.00am on Monday, 25th October.

GRSA introduced this race onto the feature race calendar four years ago in recognition of former long-time Food and Beverage Manager, Leigh Rogers, who lost his battle with a rare form of cancer five years ago. Leigh is the husband of Rachel and father of three girls who are growing up so fast and it will be great to see them back on course in recognition of Leigh.

Daish Irrigation & Fodder vouchers for Murray Bridge

The Murray Bridge GRC has been able to secure some \$100 vouchers from their sponsor Daish Irrigation & Fodder to be used on Heat and Final series' over the next 12 months.

In the All Tracks calendar these races will be highlighted which is a terrific initiative of the Murray Bridge GRC.

SA Race Super-bonus

Following is a list of races which are part of the super bonus scheme:

Adelaide Cup [515m] – G1 \$12,500, Adelaide Cup 2nd – \$5,000 – Adelaide Cup 3rd – \$2,500, Adelaide Cup finalist \$1,000; BGC SA Derby [515m] – G3 \$3,500 – BGC SA Derby 2nd – \$1,500 – BGC SA Derby 3rd – \$750; Coffex Coffee SA Oaks [515m] – G3 \$3,500 – Coffex Coffee SA Oaks 2nd – \$1,500 – Coffex Coffee SA Oaks 3rd – \$750; Gawler Gold Cup [531m] – G3 \$5,000; Mount Gambier Cup [512m] – Listed \$2,500; Murray Bridge Cup [455m] – Listed \$2,500; Group 1 victory [Interstate] \$10,000; Group 2 victory [Interstate] \$5,000; Group 3 victory [Interstate] \$2,500.

The super-bonuses for Interstate events will only be applied for series/events that are open entry. Events that are restricted by age or gender are eligible for the bonus. Events that are exclusively open to SA Bred runners or incorporate other restrictions, such as 'sweepstake' events, puppy/auction Classics and Maiden series are not eligible for the super-bonus.

National Straight Track Championship in Queensland reprogrammed in December

The National Straight Track Championship that was postponed due to Covid related issues for travel etc in August has been rescheduled and will be held at Capalaba on Sunday, 12th December –with the winner receiving \$25,000. This is still subject to change, however, things are looking positive.

SA will have two SA dogs represent the State in the series with QLD, NSW, VIC and SA challenging for the title.

Our local Heats are planned for Tuesday, 23rd November with the \$5,000 Final on Tuesday, 30th November. This will allow 12 days until the National Final to organise travel and trialling arrangements. SA eligibility conditions refer to 76 days out of the last 150 days prior to our nominations closing for the Heats.

GRSA have been advised that Capalaba trial every Friday and Monday, with Monday the ideal day to trial in preparation for a Sunday meeting [National Final]. Capalaba have also advised they can accommodate trials on Sunday and Wednesday race meetings. The Capalaba Club are more than happy to accommodate the needs of visiting trainers. It is hoped the series can be run this year.

Mount Gambier to race on Monday 27th December

With Christmas Day falling on Saturday this year all the Metropolitan thoroughbred racing will be scheduled for Sunday, 26th December which will mean there is no spot available for our normal Mount Gambier day meeting.

A super night of racing at Angle Park

It was a big night of racing at Angle Park on September 17th with the SA Oaks and SA Derby finals and it was Don't Tell Lies for trainer Lauren Harris who wrote her name into the record books when she was able to take out the Group 3 Coffex Coffee SA Oaks final.

It was a beautiful spring night at headquarters as the best young females in the state took their place in the prestigious race. Don't Tell Lies was sent out at huge double figure odds as race favourites She's A Hotshot for Troy Murray, Spring Agatha for Greg Board and Zinfandel Nikki for Gavin Harris dominated the market.

As the race started the daughter of Fernando Bale and Quest For Glory showed terrific acceleration to punch through from box 4 and lead to the first turn. She was able to hold out a strong challenge from She's A Hotshot who also began very well. Zinfandel Nikki moved forward quickly and was able to race up near the lead however Spring Agatha was slow out of the machine and landed at the tail of the field. First reserve, Queen Redeem which gained a run from box 1 for Victorian trainer Matthew Marshall (in the care of Lauren Harris) began nicely and sat just off the speed. As they headed to the back straight Don't Tell Lies held the lead with Zinfandel Nikki sweeping around the outside to run to second. She's A Hotshot found some trouble and dropped back to midfield while Queen Redeem pushed through into third along the inside. Off the back straight and Don't Tell Lies looked to breakaway from her challengers however Zinfandel Nikki went with her and closed the gap while Queen Redeem moved into a clear third as they opened up a gap to their rivals. Into the front straight and it was a race in three with Don't Tell Lies kicking strongly, Zinfandel Nikki trying hard and Queen Redeem looking for an inside run however it was Don't Tell Lies' SA Oaks final as she claimed the group 3 success. She won by 1¼ lengths in a slick 30.56 showing plenty of heart in the run to the line defeating Zinfandel Nikki and Queen Redeem back in third in a stirring battle.

The BGC SA Derby final was next and showcased some of the best young male chasers in the state with a terrific field lining up for the Group 3 feature however it was a greyhound having only his 6th lifetime start taking home the \$25,000 first prize.

Mallee Magic for trainer Tony Rasmussen was unwanted in betting as it was his second run back from a 1 month break. He started huge odds and from box 4 was given little chance of challenging and early in the race he looked like he was out of play. Race favourites Came And Went for Troy Murray and Gemtree Maximus for Paul Rehmann, as expected, exploded out of the boxes to challenge for the early lead while Black Cobra for John Sargent and Hiring for Jack Trengove made good ground to sit just off the pace. Mallee Magic found himself worse than midfield and to the inside of runners however prior to the back straight he moved himself to the outside to start to make ground on the leaders while Arby's Roger for Penny Sargent and Deadly Mamba for Tony Rasmussen tried to make ground along the inside. After tight racing and into the back straight and Came And Went shook off the strong challenge of Gemtree Maximus as he tried to pinch a break on his rivals opening up a two length lead. Mallee Magic was starting to get into his work as he closed on the leaders and moved to third while Arby's Roger and Deadly Mamba continued to make ground. Prior to tuning for home Came And Went was coming back to his rivals as they closed in the run to the line. Down the home straight and Came And Went was trying to hang on however sweeping down the outside was



the son of Worm Burner and Bells Are Ringin who raced clear in the shadows of the post for a brilliant win by 1 length running away. Came And Went held on for second along with Gemtree Maximus in third. They ran a flying 30.57 for the 530m journey in another terrific edition of the SA Derby.

WAP payment update for August 2021

The Wagering Activity Payment (WAP) for the month of August 2021 was \$190,000.

It is another very strong result [following on from July 2021] however it does include a much smaller product fee payment than was budgeted. This may be a sign of a softening of wagering revenue that GRSA has been predicting, that would result in reductions to monthly WAPs. GRSA hopes that wagering revenue continues to be strong so that WAPs will continue in this manner.

^ **Prizemoney** includes payments to winners, places and unplaced of all South Australian races. Following feedback from participants in December 2020, additional money for feature races is averaged over the year.

Distribution of WAP Payments between Trainers and Owners

GRSA would like to remind all participants that receive a WAP that the payment is the equivalent of prizemoney.

If you are currently responsible for distributing prizemoney to another party then the same approach applies to WAP payments.

From GRSA's perspective the position in relation to third parties is reflective of OzChase records and is as follows:

- If GRSA have been notified of an ownership split [which is recorded in OzChase] then you DO NOT need to make a payment to owners for the WAP because GRSA will do this automatically; however
- If you ordinarily forward on payments to owners on your own accord, then you DO need to do the same for the WAP. Each remittance will include the name of the dog for which the WAP is being made.

Example to help participants understand the WAP they receive

It is not uncommon for GRSA to receive requests for more information in relation to how the WAP is calculated for their particular dog(s). The example below is provided to assist in the general understanding of the calculation.

Assumptions:

In this example, assume the owner/trainer received \$1,000 in prizemoney for any/all races for the month.

In this example the total prizemoney (paid to all participant) is **\$700,000** (excluding WAP).

In this example, the total WAP is **\$50,000**.

In this example, the owner/trainer would receive a WAP of **\$71.43**, calculated as:

$$\text{\$1,000} \div \text{\$700,000} \times \text{\$50,000} = \text{\$71.43}$$

Participants should note that:

- WAP is not payable for any prizemoney received in relation to feature races [where total stakes are above \$5,000];
- Trainers' fees and other bonus payments are not included in the calculation of the share of the WAP; and
- It is a requirement that a greyhound has to have raced and received prizemoney during a month to be eligible to receive the WAP payment for that month.

A lovely day in Adelaide provided excellent conditions for the greyhounds, participants and patrons alike on a wonderful night of racing. Many patrons were on course to see boom Victorian sprinter Aston Rupee, trained by Glen Rounds and owned by proud South Aussie Ray Borda and whether he could break the magical 30 second barrier and the large crowd were not disappointed! With the win, Aston Rupee won through to the TAB Adelaide Cup on Friday October 8th.

New and updated rules and policies

The last couple of months have seen the roll out of new and updated rules and policies that regulate the sport. I will summarise some here.

Greyhounds Australasia Rules

The re-written Greyhounds Australasia Rules will come into effect on 31 January 2022. It is important to familiarise yourself with the new rules before then. In coming weeks and months, GRSA will provide information on key points of the new rules, as well as material to assist in your transition. If you have any questions, please contact GRSA.

Local Regulatory Rules

Local Rule 114 was amended at sub-rule [1A], with respect to rehoming, that the offence includes a registered person who retires a greyhound to themselves, in circumstances where they are aware, or ought to be aware, that the greyhound will be, or is likely to be, euthanised or exist under conditions that are to its detriment.

To coincide with the new Greyhounds Australasia Rules, GRSA will soon release a draft of the re-written Local Regulatory Rules. The local rules need updating to bring them up to modern standards of drafting as well as reflect changes to the sport, as they relate to South Australia.

Animal Welfare Policy 2021

The updated Animal Welfare Policy 2021 is in force. Key changes are –

- Making it clear that the policy relates to all greyhounds in the custody or control of a registered person, including retired greyhounds.
- Newly constructed kennels must comply with local council regulations. Existing kennels may comply with the law as it was in force at the time of construction, unless the kennels are substantially renovated or subject to an order by GRSA (e.g. non-compliance notice).
- Any registered person who intends to euthanise a greyhound on behavioural grounds must notify GRSA no less than 10 business days of that intention, in the form described under the policy.
- Reportable diseases list.
- Kennels need to be located upon land where there is a permanently occupied dwelling (occupied by a registered person).

Animal Welfare – Notification of Behaviour Policy

This policy prescribes what greyhound behaviours that must be reported to GRSA at the time they occur; e.g., attacks, harassment, chasing people or other owned animals; or your greyhound goes missing. This information will be used in any, subsequent, GAP SA First Point Assessments.

GAP SA – First Point Assessment Policy

This policy makes clear the GAP SA First Point Assessment process and introduces a new tier to that process – the Rehoming Assessment Panel. The Panel will review any 'pass-pending' results to guide the process with respect to retirement.

Intensive Learning Program

GRSA commenced a trial of a program for retiring and retired greyhounds who are identified in need of extra training to get them ready for life in their forever homes.

The program will trial a number of training methods and processes to identify the best for implementation, after the trial. Placement on the program is, presently, where GRSA identifies a greyhound as a candidate (including via the GAP SA Rehoming Assessment Panel).

Educational Material

You will see that the Animal Welfare Policy 2021, like its predecessor has rules that must be followed.

However, the 2021 policy also moves away from only a rules-based policy to an educational one as well. You will see in coming weeks and months the roll out of a number of resources to assist both those who are experienced in the sport as well as newcomers. Whilst some material might tell you what you already know, the intent of them is to provide a go-to place for anyone wanting to learn or refresh their knowledge.

COVID-19

Venue Restrictions

At the time of writing, the Adelaide Cup 2021 was held under a COVID-Management Plan. A Management Plan is different to a COVID-Safe Plan, where a venue expects to exceed 1000 people. Normally, we operate under a COVID-Safe Plan (less than 1000). This is always liable to change, but at the moment, some of our restrictions are – density ½ to ¾ depending what venue you attend; masks inside shared indoor public areas; and, seated eating and drinking. Please also be guided by Stewards when you are racing and trialling as to any other requirements. Please remember to contact trace check-in upon entry.

Stewarding and Licensing

Cross-Border

Any registered person from interstate [and inside their cross-border corridor] needs to also declare upon nomination that they are complying with the SAPOL cross border direction in force at the time. This is to assist GRSA to plan for events and to protect the SA community, consistent with the SA Health and SAPOL requirements.

Vaccinations

Remember to consider vaccination. Whilst there are no immediate plans for SA to mandate vaccinations in racing, one only needs to look to interstate to see that this appears to be the trend. It may be only a matter of time before vaccinations are mandated in SA. Please consider getting in early to avoid any last-minute rush [whenever that will be]. Consult with your GP for advice on the best options for you.

GAP kennelling fee payment process change

Please note that as of 1st August 2021 the GAP kennelling payment process has changed for a trial period of three months.

The changes are as follows:

Instead of making a weekly payment of \$33 per dog, the new kennelling fee will be a flat amount of \$50 per dog, irrespective of the time period the greyhound will spend at the GAP kennels.

Participants who would like their greyhounds placed in the GAP kennels will be requested to pay the \$50 at the time when the placement form is filled in and the \$60 placement fee is paid.

This means that for greyhounds that are to be kennelled with GAP an upfront payment of \$110 will be requested. After that, participants will not need to make any additional payments for their dogs in the GAP kennels. Noting that prior to foster care dogs spend an average of 4 weeks in kennels, this change is expected to generate a saving of \$82 per dog for participants.

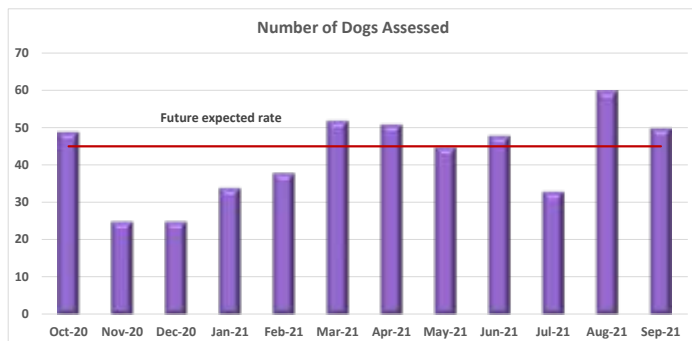

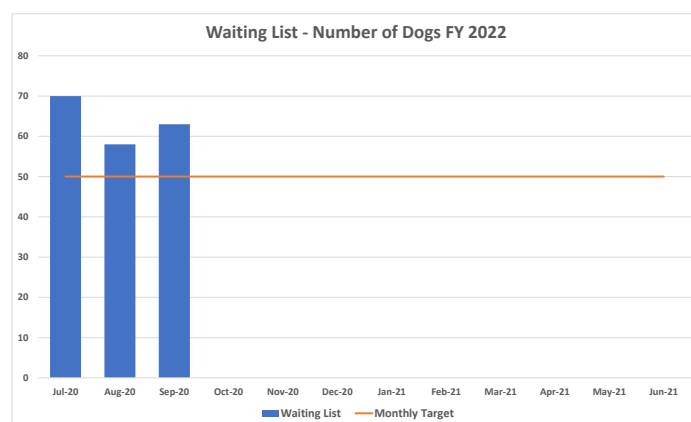
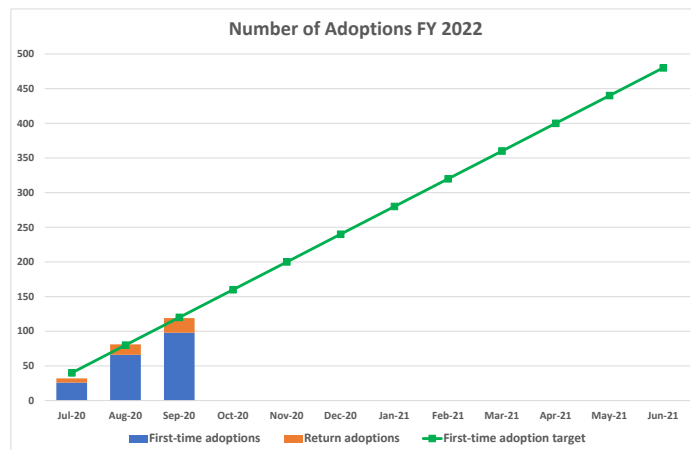
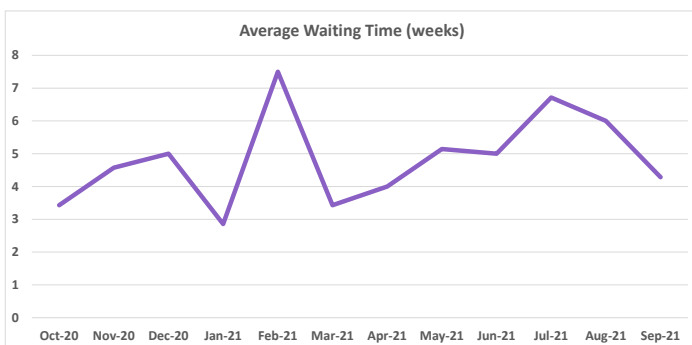
Latest updates from GAP

Nominations were strong for the event and there was a healthy crowd on course. The club were greeted with a perfect sunny morning weather wise, and the first round of the Waterloo Cup kicked off at 9:00.

Greyhounds were eliminated as each round progressed. The 2021 Waterloo Cup managed to attract a field of eleven runners which allowed for three rounds of events. The Steven Coates trained Mepunga Harry was eliminated in the first round which came as a shock to many since he had been one of the most consistent greyhounds at coursing all year. Stress The Point for Nicole Price qualified for the final and would compete against Archie Vella trained by Steve Coates. It was only Stress The Point's second visit to the track and he progressed through each round really nicely. He defeated Archie Vella by three lengths in the final and he ran a time of 15.36. Nicole was obviously thrilled with the win since Stress The Point had only had his first look at the track a



few weeks prior. He is a very talented greyhound who has shown plenty of ability over the first eleven months of his career.

The 2021 GOTBA Oaks attracted a field of ten runners which allowed for three rounds to be run. Zipping Sheba made the final for trainer Bec Romyn and would compete up against Porsha for trainer Tina Cattermole. Zipping Sheba showed plenty of closing strength down the straight to take out the final by four lengths. She ran a time of 15.65 in the process. Zipping Sheba is owned by Cameron Forshaw who is a regular volunteer at Virginia Coursing. He helps the club out with numerous jobs on race days and he was visibly ecstatic when his greyhound took out the Oaks final.

The 2021 GOTBA derby attracted a field of 8 runners which allowed for two rounds to be run. Bec Romyn managed to get her second runner in a final. She had Two Jabs in the final against Vinnie Rumbling for Rolland Parry. Vinnie Rumbling has been doing majority of his racing at the Murray Bridge straight track which really helped him progress throughout the morning. He was too good in the final. He defeated a gallant Two Jabs by two lengths and ran a time of 15.33 which was the quickest time out of all the finals. Both Rolland Parry and Bec Romyn are strong supporters of Virginia coursing when it comes to nominating their greyhounds throughout the year. It was great to see both trainers rewarded with finals victories on the day.

Peckham chalks up another milestone

A big effort from Midnight Bandit to win the Exchange Printers (1-3 wins) Grade 6 final (400 metres) on Sunday, 10th October which resulted in Allendale East trainer David Peckham bringing up his 100th winner this year at Tara Raceway.

Midnight Bandit, a son of Collision x Midnight Starlet, was relentless in his pursuit of the lure after an ordinary getaway from box eight. But a strong finish along the rails in the home straight saw him edge out his litter brother (and kennelmate) Midnight Blast to win by a neck in 23.42 seconds.

And in the last race, the Bartholomew Pick 6 Mixed Stake (400 m), the Peckham-trained Out Of Gas led all the way to bring up win number 101 when defeating Aston Dijon by 1¾ lengths in a best of day 23.01 seconds.

Fittingly, both winners are owned by the Nineofus Syndicate, the involvement of some of its members, including manager Ross Schurgott, going back to a time when Peckham was training for their Viking Syndicate.

In what was his third successive year of more than 100 winners, Peckham so far in 2021 has trained four winners on four separate occasions, 12 trebles and 13 doubles.

QUALIFYING AND SATISFACTORY TRIALS

Angle Park qualifying and satisfactory trials are held every Tuesday night between 6.50pm and 7.15pm. Qualifying will be for the following Monday (drawn Thursday) meetings. Nominations close at 12.30pm on the Tuesday (for online nominations 11.59pm Monday).

Gawler qualifying and satisfactory trials are held every Friday morning from 7am. Qualifying will be for the Sunday meeting (drawn the following week).

Nominations close at 12.30pm on the Thursday.

Murray Bridge qualifying and satisfactory trials are held every Wednesday night between 6.50pm and 7.15pm. Qualifying will be for the following Friday (drawn Tuesday). Nominations close at 12.30pm on Wednesday (for online nominations 11.59pm Tuesday).

SINGLE TRIALS

A reminder to trainers that single trials can be booked with two greyhounds however you need to advise when booking of your intention to do this. If you wish to put three or more into this trial then a field trial will have to be booked.

BOOKING NUMBER FOR TRIALS

Participants wishing to book trials are required to ring 8243 7172, this phone line will only be used for trial bookings and will queue participants. By having this one number with participants queuing makes this process to be a more efficient way of booking trials.

There will be NO trials accepted through the normal administration number. To be fair to everyone GRSA will only accept bookings using the new number or alternatively logon to trialbooker.com, create an account and book your own trials.

POLICY FOR TRIALLING AT ANGLE PARK, GAWLER AND MURRAY BRIDGE BEFORE THE RACE MEETING

Policy Background

This policy is to detail the procedure for trainers seeking greyhounds to trial before race meetings. This policy is effective from 2 May 2019.

Race Meeting Trial Policy

This policy is in place for the following race meetings:

Angle Park Monday, Gawler Wednesday and Sunday, Murray Bridge Tuesday and Friday.

Two fields from the boxes with a maximum of four (4) greyhounds. Trials may be conducted at any time during the race meeting from immediately after kenneling until after the last race, at Stewards' discretion.

The following lists the order in which greyhounds will be selected in the event if more than eight (8) greyhounds are nominated:

1. Reserves at the meeting that do not obtain a start
2. Trainers that have greyhounds engaged and are located more than 100km in distance from the track
3. Satisfactory trials

Procedure/criteria

1. For Angle Park Monday night, the trainer is to contact GRSA between 9am and 10am on Monday to nominate. Should the Monday be a public holiday bookings are to be made between 8am and 9am on the scratching number.
2. For Murray Bridge Tuesday & Friday, the trainer is to contact GRSA between 3pm and 4pm the day before. Should any of these times fall on a public holiday bookings are to be made during scratching times.
3. For Gawler Wednesday, the trainer is to contact GRSA between 3pm and 4pm the day before. Should any of these times fall on a public holiday bookings are to be made during scratching times. For Gawler Sunday, the trainer is to contact the scratching number on Sunday between 8am and 9am.
4. Other than reserve greyhounds, trainers will be restricted to trialling one (1) greyhound unless nominations determine otherwise.
5. Stewards will allocate the box for the greyhound.
6. Trials will be 515m, 530m & 531m in distance as first preference. Other distances considered depending on nominations.
7. Greyhounds currently under suspension are ineligible to trial unless they are undertaking a satisfactory trial to be cleared.
8. Greyhound registration cards must be produced at kennelling time.
9. Trainers with other greyhounds engaged can utilise the extra kennel space until such time they are ready to leave. Trainers with no other greyhounds engaged will be permitted to leave with Stewards permission.
10. In the case of race at Murray Bridge, trials will only be available on the track that is prepared to race that day i.e. Friday meeting on the u-shaped track, trials will be on the u-shaped track only.

Please note: If there are 12 races at Angle Park, Gawler or Murray Bridge there will be NO trials.

The Angle Park Vet Clinic and/or swab kennels cannot be used to accommodate any additional greyhounds due to operational requirements of the Clinic and Stewards.

It is vital that trainers nominate to trial at these race meetings. If you are unable to nominate at these times, please contact GRSA as soon as possible as permission may be given at GRSA's discretion to accept bookings outside these times.

Exceptions to this policy

Thursday nights are kept available for interstate greyhounds to solo trial in a lead-up to SA Group races as well as local greyhound's trialling for Group racing interstate.

Upon request, local greyhounds will be allowed to solo trial in a lead-up to a feature race and they will take one of the eight (8) kennels available for trialling greyhounds ahead of the policy and sit separate to the four (4) dog trials. Races considered to be a feature are: Adelaide Cup, Gawler Cup, Oaks, Derby, Howard Ashton, Brian Johnstone, SA Sprint, SA Distance Championship, SA Anniversary Cup, SA Country Cup, National Finals and any interstate Group race

Local greyhounds will be permitted to trial on a race night, where they are in preparation for a feature event, nominated for a meeting and the race does not stand up. This will include all distances and also take precedence over the policy. If a greyhound qualifies for a feature final and requires a trial in between, this will be conducted as a solo trial and will sit separately to the four (4) dog trials.

MOUNT GAMBIER SATISFACTORY TRIALS

Trainers are advised of a change to the booking of Satisfactory Trials at Mt. Gambier. Mt Gambier hold trials on Tuesday and Saturday mornings with Satisfactory trials ONLY being conducted on Tuesdays and need to be booked with Barry Shephard from the Club on 0419 824 512.

At Race meetings Satisfactory trials can be done when less than 12 races. When there are 12 races these can be considered, however, the trainer will not be able to kennel and must take their greyhounds home straight after the trial. These race day trials will also need to be booked through Barry at the Club. GRSA administration staff will NOT accept these bookings and trainers will be directed to contact Barry Shephard.

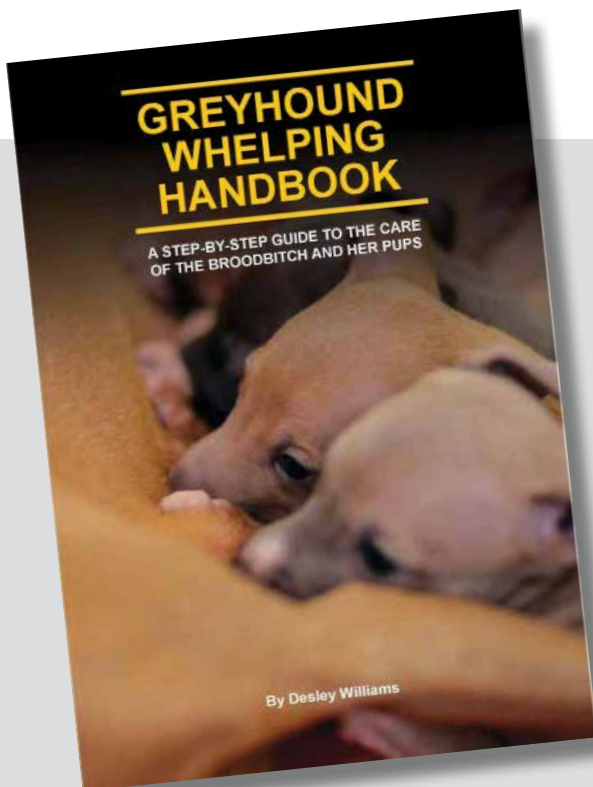

NOTES OF INDUSTRY CONSULTATIVE GROUP (ICG) MEETING

HELD IN THE BOARDROOM OF GRSA, 55 CARDIGAN STREET, ANGLE PARK ON FRIDAY 10 SEPTEMBER 2021 AT 10.00AM

ATTENDEES: Grantley Stevens (Chairman), Petar Jovanovic, Jason Newman (via Zoom), Christine Costa (via Zoom), Lisa Rasmussen (via Zoom), Gavin Harris, Ryan Tugwell (via Zoom), Matthew Corby, David Lewis, Des Jonas (via Zoom), Shaun Mathieson, Derek Kordick, Scott Wuchatsch (via Zoom), Ben Kavenagh (via Zoom), Sheriden Milam (Notes Secretary)

The meeting commenced at 10.12am.

- 1 APOLOGIES: Judy Hurley, Ray Fewings
- 2 NOTES FROM PREVIOUS MEETING
- 3 BUSINESS ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MEETING

3.1 Updates from Minutes

The Group noted the update.

3.2 Pink Card Delays

The Group noted the update. Management urged the need for breeders to ensure they have secured Pink Card approvals well in advance of a planned mating to lessen the impact of any delays.

Action: For Management to continue to convey to breeders, through Kennel Capers, the importance of securing Pink Card approvals in advance of planned matings

3.3 The Phoenix Event in Melbourne

The Group noted the update.

3.4 GAP Captiva as Ambulance

The Group noted the update. The project is in progress, with options being explored.

3.5 Virginia Road

The Group noted the update. The CEO noted the need for a permanent solution and this will be actioned as a priority.

Action: For Management to explore, with priority, a permanent solution for sealing the Virginia Road

3.6 Fencing at Gawler 531m start

The CEO questioned the Group as to whether the temporary solution previously used was suitable. The Group agreed that the white picket fencing type was a suitable solution and this should be trialled.

Action: For Management to implement a trial of erecting the temporary white-picket fencing on all racedays as a possible permanent solution for creating separation between the 531m starting boxes and raceday patrons

3.7 Alternative To Car-Park Shade Sails

Lisa Rasmussen raised the topic of compulsory air conditioning in trailers. The CEO noted prohibitive costs associated with mandating this, however the Group agreed that air-conditioning should be mandated with a suggested introduction of January 1, 2024, with enclosed vans constituting an exception to that policy.

Action: For the RCM to draft the policy which mandates the use of air-conditioning in trailers from January 1, 2024, noting that vans would constitute an exception to that policy

3.8 Direct/Indirect Responsibility – LR(SA)114

The Group noted the update.

3.9 Animal Welfare Policy

The CEO requested any feedback on draft policy to be provided to RCM within three [3] weeks of the date of this meeting. RCM highlighted that the objective of the policy is as much about education as it is about enforcement. It has also been worded in such a way that it encompasses participants at all levels of experience and has some flexibility for behaviours which faithfully reflect the spirit of the policy.

3.10 Local Rule – Mandatory De-Sexing

The Group noted the update.

4 AGENDA ITEMS

4.1 Sky Weekly Schedule

There was discussion around proposed schedule options, noting the Board's intent to maximise community connections, participation and wagering. The CEO questioned the group on their thoughts regarding the proposal. Christine Costa suggested that consideration should be given to some City A racing at regional Clubs. The CEO noted that suggestion and advised this would be considered as part of wider strategies around prizemoney and participant payments.

Scott Wuchatsch noted that the Clubs have competing views and that this forum doesn't necessarily allow all Clubs to contribute their specific perspective. Shaun Mathieson noted the limited number of night racing opportunities which doesn't allow for all tracks to hold a night meeting. The CEO suggested that, of the three models under consideration, there was a strong sense of resistance for Angle Park moving from Monday night and questioned if there was merit in involving the wider industry in the consultation process.

The Chairman suggested that two representatives from each Club could be presented with options for discussion. Gavin Harris indicated that two representatives was foreseeably too narrow and might not be indicative of general participant views. Gavin Harris noted his view that the majority opinion from within the industry would be in support of to split Sundays between Gawler and Murray Bridge with a 'two on, two off' approach.

Discussion ensued around the merit of providing opportunities to race at all venues for all participants. Shaun Mathieson questioned how participation from the Mt Gambier region might be impacted by the scheduling of Murray Bridge on a Sunday night. Jason Newman suggested that it would be difficult to gauge that impact until it was in place.

The Chairman suggested options to move forward were leave it in Board's hand or to explore how the issue might be canvassed with a broader segment of trainers. Gavin Harris suggested that, if the Gawler Club is supportive of the suggested schedule of 'shared' Sundays, then further involvement from participants wouldn't be warranted. The Chairman resolved that discussion will be held with Gawler Club, subject to which a broader consultation may be necessary. Scott Wuchatsch suggested that the ICG may need to consider having all areas/Clubs represented on the panel within the context of future changes.

Action: The Chair and CEO to hold discussion with Gawler Club and representatives to seek a response to the proposal of 'shared' Sundays with the potential need for broader consultation beyond that.

Action: For Management to consider the introduction of some City A racing at regional tracks as part of the next stakemoney and industry distributions discussion

4.2 GA Rules – Live-Baiting and Synthetics

The Chairman advised that following GA and GRSA Board discussion a national approach to ban all use of any type of animal product will be implemented by early 2022. Scott Wuchatsch requested feedback from the group on alternate options for lures.

4.3 Stakemoney – Away Fee and Freezing Short-Course

The CEO noted the emerging need for a review of the stakemoney model to effectively take stock of the changes of recent years. The panel noted that a panel of Club principals will imminently meet to discuss the changes to the Away payment beyond the re-commencement of racing at Angle Park.

4.4 Breeding Activity

Gavin Harris suggested there was a natural ceiling on local breeding activity due to the limitations with rearing opportunities and permit restrictions. The group was supportive of continuing with current breeding process and review panel.

4.5 Straight Track Final [National Championships]

The group provided their support for the proposal. Notwithstanding, Lisa Rasmussen suggested that, with a National series, her opinion would be to choose either the straight or sprint option and she would not be inclined to consider entering the same dog in both. Shaun Mathieson noted differences in prizemoney between the two series which is to be explored.

Action: For the Racing Manager to discuss the approach to stakemoney for the national straight track series with other stakeholders having regard for the current discrepancy between that and the other 'national' series

4.6 Raceday Culture

Petar Jovanovic suggested no evidence of cultural issues at Angle Park but identified that trainers often remained in cars for race meetings at Gawler and Murray Bridge. The Chairman suggested that Management would be open to hearing solutions from the Member Clubs.

4.7 1st Point Assessment – Notification of Behaviour Policy

Kat Orosz detailed the draft policies that have been developed. She requested that ideally any incidents prior to assessment are reported to GAP to ensure a complete history of the dog is recorded. Derek Kordick clarified that any report of previous incidents to GAP will be taken in to account in the first point assessment. He noted that participants need to be educated to ensure behavioural incidents are reported at the time of their occurrence. Jason Newman questioned whether any punitive action might apply to those that do not disclose incidents. Derek Kordick advised that a failure to report would limit GAP's options at first point assessment.

Action: For the GAP Manager to ensure that the existence and operation of the notification of behaviour policy is an item in Kennel Capers on an ongoing (intermittent) basis

4.8 Guarding

Shaun Mathieson faithfully elevated topic of guarding owners to ICG however expressed his belief that such an approach would compromise grading. Petar Jovanovic and Gavin Harris indicated their support for current grading methods. Christine Costa suggested guarding owners opened grading to manipulation. The group agreed to make no changes.

4.9 SafeChase Lure

Gavin Harris suggested that the general consensus of industry is that there are no major issues with the use of the new lure at Angle Park. Ryan Tugwell questioned whether the volume of lure could be increased, suggesting the outside boxes couldn't hear as well as the inside boxes. Scott Wuchatsch advised that there is currently no [mechanical] volume control but that the opportunity exists to increase the volume via plug in sound or additional rubber squeakers, which he was happy to consider if required.

Jason Newman questioned whether the fluoro yellow rail at Angle Park could be applied to all tracks as standard. Scott Wuchatsch noted the shift in colour scheme at Angle Park and the potential to roll that

approach out across all other tracks.

The group agreed to add an additional squeaker on the lure in first instance while investigating mechanical sound options. Christine Costa raised concern with finishing on with the new lure. Gavin Harris suggested in his opinion the new lure was safer than the old lure, and more streamlined from a finish-on perspective. Management committed to monitoring any potential issues. The group will continue to provide feedback on any further issues or comments relating to the Angle Park redevelopment through to Management.

Gavin Harris noted the need for timing for trials, 342m screens. Scott Wuchatsch advised he had spoken to Brook regarding this and that this would shortly be addressed with investment in new cameras.

It was further noted there was a software issue with 530m trial results not displayed/printing. Scott Wuchatsch noted recent discussion within Management, wherein it had been resolved that GRSA would publish all Clubs' trial results in one central [online] place.

Action: Management to implement new splits and continue to resolve any current issues with trial data outputs with a separate plan to provide all Club trial results in one centralised [online] place.

Action: For the SPM to add a squeaker to the new lure at Angle Park in lieu of investigations into a mechanical solution on the lure for noise generation.

4.10 Empty Out Yards at Clubs

The group were supportive of the inclusion of additional emptying out yards at all tracks. Scott Wuchatsch suggested utilising slipping track at Angle Park with individual gates and curtains at southern end of carpark where grassed area is.

Action: SWU to investigate options for emptying out yards at Angle Park and report back to group.

4.11 GCA Delegates

Shaun Mathieson and Barry Stewart to continue for another year as GCA delegate. Shaun noted his concern with some discussions held at meetings, and the potential for him to be conflicted as a Manager of the Controlling Body, particularly in relation to debunking activist activity. The Chairman noted the need for consistent messaging and general caution at the national level in relation to public representation of the sport.

4.12 Management of Gastro and Participant Impacts

Des Jonas provided update to tests taken at Angle Park and Gawler in the preceding week. The Chairman requested a cautionary message/alert be distributed immediately. Discussion was held regarding the merit of making subsidy payments to those affected by virus. The group felt that a subsidy framework may present challenges, however it was agreed that this should be a topic on the next ICG agenda.

Action: MM to ensure messaging re gastro/virus be circulated to industry immediately

Action: Management to present subsidy model to Group at next meeting.

5. OTHER BUSINESS

5.1 Ryan Tugwell questioned whether consideration of Grade 7 for younger dogs would be possible. Shaun Mathieson advised he could include on next Grading Review Panel agenda for discussion. Jason Newman noted Mt Gambier running similar races [0-2 time graded] and questioned minimum numbers. Shaun Mathieson advised that the minimum number of runners is 5 dogs for normal graded events, and 4 dogs for staying events, however this could be amended under extenuating circumstances.

Action: RM to include possibility of Grade 7 on next GRP agenda

5.2 Jason Newman questioned the 1kg weight variation penalty and whether there was any appetite for a scale of variation noting differences in the size of racing dogs. Des Jonas noted discussions occurred with rules rewrite, but a scaled approach was considered too difficult, on which basis there had been no appetite to change the national rule.

5.3 Christine Costa questioned where older dogs sat amongst the mandatory desexing rules. Derek Kordick clarified the rule, noting ages for exemptions. Christine Costa questioned reimbursement of dental costs. Derek Kordick advised this is progressing and will be implemented as soon as possible. Christine Costa noted success she had with trialling different types of bones to maintain teeth health of dogs. It was requested this information be provided to the RCM to disseminate.

5.4 Derek Kordick provided information regarding GAP pilot program, being in its infancy, however having the potential to provide an additional arm to GAP. Christine Costa thanked the team for assisting with a particular dog and initial successes.

5.5 Petar Jovanovic requested the reintroduction of the buffet at Angle Park. The Chairman asked for Management to investigate possibilities.

Action: For the HM to explore the opportunity that exists to re-introduce the Thursday night buffet at Angle Park for future presentation to the Board

5.6 Petar Jovanovic suggested trials published have names of dogs and split times. Currently the trial sheet just provides just the trial number and the splits. The SPM advised that this is the minimum mandatory information that GRSA is required to report from trials and that no intention currently exists for trialing dogs to be named.

5.7 Petar Jovanovic suggested introduction of performance trials. Shaun Mathieson noted that this issue has been discussed previously with the result that the cost video operators and stewards made this cost-prohibitive.

5.8 Christine Costa raised mandatory Covid-19 vaccinations. The CEO noted item is currently on Board's agenda. The Chairman noted his attendance at a recent group meeting with the Premier wherein he advised that more information would be provided on the issue of compulsory vaccination and/or vaccine passports within the coming 8 weeks.

5.9 Straight track racing prizemoney increase – consider only 350m not 300m, to include in upcoming discussions.

Action: For Management to consider the elevation of stakemoney for 350m straight track racing as part of the next stakemoney and industry distributions discussion

6. LATE ITEMS

6.1 Shaun Mathieson questioned the group regarding their tolerance for extended kenneling so that a more extensive vet check could occur. Gavin Harris suggested focusing on hocks. Scott Wuchatsch suggested the possibility of targeted vet checks for those trainers who suspect injuries. Shaun Mathieson noted that a 12 race schedule already extends time of the race meeting, and that this should be a consideration. Des Jonas suggested that time might also be made available following kenneling for vet checks to occur.

Action: For Management to speak with vets to explore benefits and options in relation to a longer kennelling period and/or an earlier period of opening for more intense examination of specific runners.

The meeting closed at 1.14pm.
