Feature Racing

It's now been confirmed that Sennachie will be coming home for a tilt at his state title, the Group 1 Tabcorp Adelaide Cup, and could even take his place in the State of Origin lead-up match-race series on September 26. The winner of this year's State of Origin will be exempted automatically into the Adelaide Cup final, bypassing the need to qualify through the heats, as well as earning a place in the Group 3 Shootout at Sandown. The winner of the Adelaide Cup, in turn, will automatically qualify for a spot in the G1 Topgun invitational event at The Meadows in November.


In a bit of an odd twist, Sennachie would be deemed a Victorian runner for the State of Origin series – based on having been domiciled in Victoria for the past several months – however, there can be little doubt that victory on his part would be (rightly) claimed and celebrated as a local success. I'm not sure a Victorian in a State-of-Origin event in Adelaide will ever get as much support as is likely to be the case on this occasion.

Hopefully he will deliver to expectation in the coming weeks and reaffirm his place in history alongside other modern local champions including Silver Saul, Satanic Cash, Ernie Bung Arrow and Worm Burner. It's encouraging to see SA breeding head in such a positive direction.

Perth National Championships

The South Australian industry was well-represented at the national Symposium event at the Perth National Championships in late August. Aside from the Rasmussens and Swains, Derek Anderson, Wally Harkins and Judi Hurley all took time out of their busy schedules to take up GRSA's offer of attendance, and Greyhound Clubs Australia also invited Ben Rawlings to the event to speak at the Symposium from the perspective of our younger trainers on the national scene. Whilst we didn't have much success on the track this time around, or off the track for that matter in relation to Ebby Lamar, the event was a great success in terms of bringing together the various people and groups that make up the whole of industry.

The National Championships are scheduled to return to Adelaide in August 2022.

Cawbourne Hunter claims Kings and Queen

Team Rasmussen took out another feature Final at Angle Park on September 6th at Angle Park with Lisa taking the accolades this time after Cawbourne Hunter caused a minor upset and proved too good for his rivals leading throughout in the 2019 Kings And Queens Final.

The son of Swift Fancy and Cawbourne Ottey began brilliantly from out wide in box 7 and shot to the front in the early stages. Race favourites Road Travelled (box 3) for Steven Brook and Canya Chase (box 4) for Tony Rasmussen both began well and pushed forward, however, both found trouble on the first turn affecting their chances and many of their other rivals.

Down the back straight and Cawbourne Hunter was in full flight after avoiding any trouble and opened up a race winning lead. Road Travelled got going again and chased hard along with Canya Chase which got to second and third but the race appeared over. Turning for home Cawbourne Hunter kept his lead, going on to win by 2.5 lengths from Road Travelled who ran a bold race after trouble and Canya Chase back in third after getting home hard. Cawbourne



Hunter ran a slick 29.97 for the 515m journey with splits of 4.44 and 16.79.

Cawbourne Hunter owned by Stuart Dickinson from NSW has now won 8 races with 7 placings from 18 starts with career prizemoney just over \$15,000.

Greyhound Racing SA introduced the Kings and Queens Feature series three


years ago in support of those greyhounds affected by the change to the GCA Age Restricted Classics from 30 months back down to 27 months for this year upcoming SA Oaks and SA Derby series to be run next Thursday night. Based around the support of this series it is likely to continue on the race calendar in its own right for years to come.







Road Travelled takes out both monthly awards



Greyhound of the Month award for August went to Road Travelled for trainer Steven Brook which was undefeated in all four of his starts in August.

The son of Black Magic Opal and Lemon Tree Girl won a Mixed 4/5 event at Angle Park in a flying 29.93 before heading off to Murray Bridge. His next two starts produced two big wins over the 395m, running a slick 22.26 and then a track record performance of 21.90 when he won by almost 4 lengths. He finished the month of in fine style with a sizzling 29.79 win in a heat of the King and Queens at Angle Park.

At the end of the month Road Travelled's record stood at 28 starts for 11 wins and 2 placings and earnings just over \$20,000.

Road Travelled also claimed Run of the Month for August for trainer Steven Brook after he produced a blistering performance at Murray Bridge on Sunday, 22nd August in a Grade 3/4/5 event over the 395m.

He flew around the Bridge in a track record performance of 21.90 after he lead throughout and won by 3.75 lengths.

SA Oaks and SA Derby heats

The Group 3 SA Oaks and SA Derby Heats will be run at Angle Park on Thursday, 12th September for greyhounds whelped on or after 1st June 2017 (27 months).

There are four heats of the Derby, with the first 2 in each heat making the final and 3 heats of the SA Oaks with the first 2 and 2 fastest third placegetters progressing through. Both Group 3 \$35,000 finals will be held on Thursday, 19th September.

'Origin-al' path to Adelaide Cup part of exciting cross-state initiatives

Victorian and South Australian-based trainers will have a new direct path to the Group 1 Adelaide Cup Final under exciting new cross-State initiatives being introduced by Greyhound Racing Victoria (GRV) and Greyhound Racing South Australia (GRSA).

The industry-first initiatives include the winner of GRSA's State of Origin series, to be held at Angle Park on 26th September, being guaranteed a berth in the \$75,000 to-the-winner Adelaide Cup Final on 11th October. The State of Origin series is run along similar lines to Sandown's Speed Star, with four Vic-trained greyhounds clashing with four locals under match race conditions.

The State of Origin series was introduced in 2018 and is sure to create even greater interest among Victorian trainers in its second year with the inclusion of the massive carrot of bypassing the Adelaide Cup Heats.

A guaranteed Adelaide Cup spot isn't the only benefit awaiting the State of Origin winner. In addition to gaining direct entry into the Adelaide Cup Final, the State of Origin victor will also secure a position in the Group 3 Sandown Shootout, the four-sprinter feature to be run on 14th November.

Another innovation will see the winner of the Adelaide Cup receive automatic entry, should connections accept, into the invitation-only Group 1 Topgun at The Meadows, which will be run this year on 9th November. With positions in the Adelaide Cup and Shootout on offer, State of Origin places will be keenly sought after and the winner of Sandown's Speed Star series, to be held on 15th September, will be rewarded with one of the four Victorian spots in the Origin series.

1. Highest placed Victorian in the September Speed Star (15th September) at Sandown gains automatic entry (if they accept) into SA State Of Origin Race to represent Vic (26th September).

2. Winner of the SA State of Origin Race [SA or VIC greyhound] gains automatic entry (if they accept) into the Group 2 Shootout at Sandown [14th November].

3. Winner of the SA State of Origin (SA or VIC greyhound) (if they accept)will be guaranteed a spot into the Group 1 Adelaide Cup final (11th October) 2 weeks later (Bypasses the Heats).

4. Winner of the Group 1 Adelaide Cup gains automatic entry (if they accept) into the Group 1 Topgun at the Meadows (9th November).

Conditions of the State of Origin series:

The State of Origin Match Race series between South Australia and Victoria will be held on Thursday, 26th September.

Nominations close at 9am on Monday, 23rd September with GRSA.



Eligibility as to who

represents South Australia or Victoria is based around the Nationals conditions. Greyhounds would need to be trained in either State 76 days out of the last 150 prior to the date of the race (26th September).

The best four greyhounds nominated from SA will be selected by the GRSA grader to represent SA. Victoria will already have a qualifier (if nominated) from their highest placed Victorian trained greyhound in their Speedstar series at Sandown on Sunday, 15th September. The other three best greyhounds nominated from Vic will be selected by the GRSA grader to represent Vic.

With the linking of the State Of Origin with the Adelaide Cup if a greyhound has qualified for another series on Adelaide Cup Final night they may be considered ineligible for the State Of Origin.

The Grader will use whatever information he has available to select those greyhounds including liaising with GRV for the Victorian selections. The SA Graders decision will be final. Those greyhounds not selected from Interstate will be given the opportunity to solo trial or race in another event on the night. Reserves will be declared with one from SA and one from Victoria depending on nominations to replace the States representative if scratched. For example the SA reserve will only replace an SA scratching.

The Grader will rate the four greyhounds from each State in order from 1 to 4 with 1 being the highest rated greyhound. The head to head matches will be decided by the two 1 rated greyhounds competing against each other and then it will be $2 \vee 2$, $3 \vee 3$ and $4 \vee 4$. Prizemoney for each individual match will also reflect 1 to 4 with the 1 rated greyhounds receiving the most amount of money. However, the overall winner will still be determined based around the times the greyhounds run so all greyhounds have that opportunity.

PRIZEMONEY:

Winners of match races – 1 v 1 – Winner \$4,750, 2 v 2 – Winner \$4,500, 3 v 3 – Winner \$4,250, 4 v 4 – Winner \$4,000.

Overall State of Origin winner (based on overall times) \$7,500, second \$2,500, third \$1,000.

The winner of the SA State of Origin (SA or VIC greyhound) will be guaranteed a spot (if they accept) into the Group 1 Adelaide Cup final (11th October) 2 weeks later and will be required to by pass the Heats.

2019 SA Country Cup

Below are details of how and where greyhounds can qualify for the \$7,500 SA Country Cup Final, to be run at Angle Park over 515 metres on Adelaide Cup G-SIX Final night Friday, 11th October 2019.

Conditions

• All South Australian Greyhound Racing Clubs outside of Angle Park will conduct heats, or nominate greyhounds from which the Greyhound Racing SA Grading Department will choose two representatives. These meetings are Gawler Provincial 2, Murray Bridge One Turn Provincial 1 or 2 and Mount Gambier Provincial 2. [Performances at Gawler Provincial 1 meetings are not eligible for consideration]

• The event is open to all South Australian greyhounds that are not above Grade 5 at Angle Park (APK City A & APM City B meetings only) over 515 metres at the time of nomination. Winner of each event takes a penalty including the final.

Special Exceptions:

Mount Gambier Club is allowed to include non-South Australian trainers under strict conditions:

- 1. The trainer has had starters at 15 meetings for Mt Gambier in the previous 12 months.
- 2. The trainer can only qualify for one of the clubs.
- 3. The trainer must have trained the greyhound nominated for the previous 3 months.
- Graders' discretion will be used to determine the best nominated.
- The greyhound must be SA trained (except Mount Gambier as above).

- A South Australian trained greyhound is defined as one that has been racing in SA for a period of not less than 3 out of the 6 months immediately prior to the time of nomination.
- The greyhound must have started at least 2 times in the last 12 months at the track it is attempting to represent.
- There will be a maximum of two heats per Club with the winners of each heat qualifying. If there is only one heat conducted then the first two placegetters will qualify. [up to 8 dog heats]
- The two reserves will be determined firstly by a ballot of the second placegetters from all heats. The third placegetters will then be considered by ballot if required. If a heat was not conducted at the track, then that track is not included in the ballot. Should a greyhound be withdrawn prior to the ballot, the next placed greyhound from that Club's heat will be selected.
- Once a greyhound has qualified from a Qualifying Heat, it is not eligible to compete at another track in this series, unless there are insufficient nominations to fill the field.
- Once qualified for the Country Cup Final the greyhound will be ineligible for the Adelaide Cup series or any other race on this Cup Final night.
- Lead up Heats may be up to 8 greyhounds however the Final on Adelaide Cup night will be a G-SIX Final

Super bonus for SA bred greyhounds

The super-bonus scheme is premised upon 100% dividend to breeders for SA Bred greyhounds and will only be paid out to breeders residing in South Australia.

The following is a summary of the bonus by race:

Heats Classic 2019 Prelude (1)

The heats of Classic 2019 Prelude (1) will be run on Monday, 23rd September with the final on Monday, 30th September.

This series is for greyhounds paid up for Classic 2019.

Nominations close Wednesday, 18th September with GRSA at 9.00am.

Grading changes from Grading Review Panel started last monday

The main change from the GRP was that when a greyhound comes to SA and has won less than 5 races (1-4 wins) then it will be considered a Grade 6 even if it has won Grade 5 races (however winning Metropolitan Grade 5 races (460m – 590m) in their State will affect Grade 6).

There will be no retrospective grading for greyhounds already in SA with a starting date of the 9th September. Updated part of the guidelines which includes the changes to Metropolitan distance ranges of tracks.

Grading Of Interstate Greyhounds

Greyhounds owned or trained Interstate will be graded on their current city grade on the track/or tracks from the State in which they are owned or trained.

Purchasing Of Interstate Greyhounds

Greyhounds purchased from Interstate into 100% South Australian Ownership which are currently higher than a Grade 5 Interstate (over any distance) on a Metropolitan track will initially be graded into Grade 5 events, provided that the Transfer of Ownership together with the proof of purchase is lodged with GRSA prior to close of nominations. There will be no retrospective grading once the Transfer of Ownership has been approved.

Grade 6 Eligibility

Non- SA Bred greyhounds from Interstate that have won five or more races at any track are not eligible for Grade 6, however, if a greyhound has won a Metropolitan Grade 5 or above between [460m – 590m] they are not eligible.

SA Bred greyhounds that have been trained Interstate and are transferred back to an SA trainer, will revert to their eligible grade at each track in SA, however, if they have won a Grade 5 or above event at any Metropolitan meeting (460m – 590m) they will be ineligible for Grade 6 events.

Auto sorting for grading delayed for a few weeks

GRSA advises that they have been in the process of auto sorting the Order of Preference for Grading purposes. For a long period this has been a manual process. This will reduce this part of the process by about 1 hour and will remove some of the discretion of the Grader because it will also incorporate all greyhounds, even those off the Order with a Weighted Points Score [WPS] table.

GRSA has made some changes to the Order of Preference which include -

- No 5 Qualifying trials will be managed separately outside the automation
- Remove St Leger & Champion Puppy heats reference
- Remove 6 months criteria reference

- Remove Grader giving preference to performances over 400m
- Back to normal No 9 (Placed 2 of last 3 in City) and No 10 (One win from last 3 in City)
- Any reference about Pathway or Time Graded is removed from this file
- Update Track Classifications based on new file for WPS (Weighted Points Score)
- For WPS (Fell is considered as 4th and FTF is next available placing)

The WPS will assist with the selection of those greyhounds not on the Order of Preference so all greyhounds will effectively be sorted into an order for selection. GRSA has the support from the GRP that when using the automation that if the order of entry by Order of Preference, Race wins or WPS is discovered to be incorrect after fields have been drawn that GRSA will NOT redraw the race in question (so long as the greyhound is correctly graded). If this did occur then the affected greyhound will get first preference at its next nomination.

Implementation of this process is NOW scheduled for late September again barring any unforeseen delays.

Weighted point score table

All greyhounds will also have a WPS calculated based upon the WPS table. There is no age criteria on the start dates when calculating the WPS. The WPS must be calculated on the greyhound's last 5 Race starts. If the greyhound has not competed in 5 Races, the pro-rata WPS will be applied.

Pro-rata WPS

Greyhounds that have not yet competed in five (5) starts are allocated points on a pro-rata or an average over five (5) starts with a weighting of 80% applied to the "pro-rata" points.

To calculate the points of a greyhound that has not competed in five [5] starts:

- 1. divide the greyhound's total points by the amount of starts it has competed in
- 2. multiply the new average by the difference between 5 and the number of actual starts and apply the 80% discount weighting
- 3. add the result to the actual points earned from the greyhound's starts.

Examples for working out the points of greyhounds using this method:

One Start = 36 points 36 / 1 = 36; 36 x 4 = 144 x 0.8 = 115; 115 + 36 = 151 points **Two Starts** = 46 points 46 / 2 = 23; 23 x 3 = 69 x 0.8 = 55; 55 + 46 = 101 points **Four Starts** = 84 points 84 / 4 = 21; 21 x 1 = 21 x 0.8 = 16; 16 + 84 = 100 points

Comments on nominations marked "only"

Previously the Grading Review Panel agreed that some trainers were using the comments box to influence the grading of fields in particular Grade 5 Only for all their greyhounds. The panel previously resolved that "Only" would be disregarded over all distances and the grading left to the Grader.

If trainers put "Only or no start or leave me out" then the grader will grade as normal and if a greyhound would be graded into a mixed event based on race wins then he will leave them out based on the trainers request..

Masters Grade 5 Races

Previously the GRP approved Time Standards for Grade 5 Masters Events at different tracks over different distances.

When a greyhound breaks the Time Standard they will be ineligible for a Grade 5 Masters Event at that distance and track (Prov1, City A etc). They will have to have two unplaced runs at the track and distance in other races before being re-considered for a Grade 5 Masters event at that venue over that distance. Mixed Masters events are not considered under this criteria.

Mount Gambier Time Grading to be a mix of wins from October

After a request from the Mt Gambier GRC to change the format of their Time Grading events, GRSA has approved the change for their Thursday meetings from specific grades to a mix of race wins.

From their meeting on Thursday, 3rd October and all other Time Graded meetings races will be Maidens, 1-4 wins and 5+ wins which will change from Maiden, Grade 6 and Grade 5.

Races will still be Non Penalty, with normal Time Graded prizemoney.

For Middle Distance (600m) and Distance (732m) racing, the GRSA Grader (using discretion), may choose to construct a field over these distances without regard for the number of wins of the greyhounds nominated, if in the opinion of the Grader the spread of Time Ratings warrants the running of that race.

G-SIX and G-EIGHT

In August GRSA identified some potential for the G-SIX format to be modified to combine the G-SIX and G-EIGHT (8 dog field) formats at selected meetings with a view to maximising the balance and flow of nominations across the weekly Sky schedule supported by Tabcorp.

GRSA is now working on a Hybrid approach. Under the new framework, the more traditional G-EIGHT format will operate across the four legs of the Quadrella (typically the best four races on the card) for selected meetings, with the remainder of the meeting being graded as G-SIX. This is for Angle Park, Gawler and Mt Gambier. Additionally, the heats and finals of all feature events or specifically identified races, as advised by the Racing Department, will run under the G-EIGHT (or 'full field') format and may or may not be used in the Quadrella.

No satisfactory trials at Mount Gambier while new kennel house being built

The Mt Gambier GRC have advised GRSA that there will be NO satisfactory trials on race days at Mount Gambier during the kennel house renovation due to the added pressures over the next 6 weeks.

An option may be to conduct a satisfactory trial on Tuesday, however, this would have to be considered on a case by case basis by the clubs availability.

New transfer of ownership form includes proof of purchase

Participants are advised that as from 1st September, 2019 a new Transfer of Ownership Form is to be completed if wanting to seek grading exemptions.

The new Form has a Proof of Purchase section, this requires purchasers to lodge documentation confirming the purchase of the greyhound or if no documentation is available then it is a requirement for the Statutory Declaration to be completed. If a Transfer of Ownership Form is lodged without the completion of this section then NO grading exemptions will be applied to the greyhound. The form is available on our website.

Trialling at Murray Bridge at race meetings

For trials at Race meetings when available [less than 12 races] at Murray Bridge when it is a One turn meeting we will only have the One turn trials available in between kennelling and the first race. Similar for the Straight track, it will only be Straight track trials.

Process around late scratchings Social media use for illness and injury

Stewards wish to remind trainers of their expectations where a greyhound is a late withdrawal after the appointed scratching time.

The Stewards may direct the following:

- That the greyhound is brought to the race track for an examination by the On-Track Veterinarian; or
- That the greyhound be taken to a Veterinarian for an examination (generally, in the case of illness)

The point of this examination is to receive confirmation of the actual injury or illness - not to clear the greyhound to race once it is recovered. Stewards continue to receive written advice the greyhound is fit to race, which is frustrating to all parties and may result in delays in getting your greyhound cleared and back to the track until the required paperwork is submitted.

Stewards monitor reasons for withdrawals, particularly around certain kennels with a high or regular rate of scratching greyhounds. A penalty can be issued if in the opinion of the Stewards, the greyhound has been withdrawn for a reason they believe in their opinion is unacceptable. These penalties are generally increased where a reserve has missed out on a run.

The relevant Rules are below:

R23 Withdrawal after box draw

- [1] The trainer, or in their absence the owner of a greyhound, or other authorised person, shall;
 - (a) on the day of an Event prior to the appointed scratching time, or where the appointed scratching time is other than the day of the Event then prior to that time, examine such greyhound to ensure that it is free of injury, illness or not in season; and
 - [b] make application to withdraw the greyhound pursuant to sub-rule [2] if any injury, illness or seasonal condition that will prevent the greyhound from competing is apparent before the appointed scratching time. [amended - 01.01.11]
- [2] The owner or trainer or other authorised person shall apply to the Controlling Body or Stewards, to withdraw a greyhound from an Event. The Stewards may, having been satisfied the application is for an acceptable reason, authorise the withdrawal.
- [3] The Stewards may require that a greyhound withdrawn be examined at a designated time and place.

Inquiries and notifications

All reports from Stewards inquiries and appeal decisions can be found at www.grsa.com.au under the Integrity banner.

GRSA Stewards are mindful of the important role social media has in our modern lives, particularly around the sharing of information on key greyhound issues.

Participants should be aware even greyhound 'interest' sites (including about rehomed greyhounds) are monitored by individuals and groups with strong views against our industry. Comments or views made by registered persons can be taken out of context, creating unnecessary interest or angst for our industry.

It is expected that use of social media accounts is conducted in an appropriate and reasonable manner. All participants are urged to be aware of their obligations in relation to the Rules of Racing and GRSA's Social Media Policy in the GRSA Human Resources Policy and Procedure Participant Handbook. A copy of this can be found on the GRSA website.

Stewards will take a strong stance on comments which they deem to be malicious, false, improper or detrimental to our industry.

This month, Animal Welfare will be targeting yards during kennel inspections

A yard is defined as an external mesh enclosure and may include housing containing a sleeping area.

Housing must provide protection from the weather (wind, rain, sun and extreme climate), and must be provided in or attached to puppy and rearing yards, and any day/spelling yards that house greyhounds for extended periods of time.

All housing areas must be provided with a weatherproof sleeping area containing raised beds to insulate greyhounds from the ground. Appropriate warm, clean, vermin resistant bedding must be provided and maintained. All bedding must be cleaned regularly and kept dry. It is a requirement that all dogs (regardless of age or status) are provided with raised beds and bedding at all times.

Fencing must be maintained in an escape-proof condition. Any broken mesh or protruding wire should be repaired or replaced, and all yards must be maintained free of holes, grass seeds and weeds that may cause injury to greyhounds housed therein.

The Golden Rules

Since the introduction of cobalt and arsenic thresholds, all participants should be reminded – in their own best interests – that there are a number of Golden Rules that can help them to avoid making any such breaches (for prohibited substances generally) and which should be adhered to as principles of best practice:

- Always consult your vet to seek guidance in relation to any of the products that you are using, any associated risks and other relevant context
- Review the range of any feeds or supplements that you typically purchase and, wherever it is reasonable to do so, replace products containing substances that could contribute to a threshold breach under the rules [eg. cobalt] with alternative products
- Observe the instructions on any products that you use and adhere strictly to those directions (having regard for prescribed amounts, frequency of administration/ application, methodology for administering/applying)
- Ensure a greyhound is never administered any treatment on race day other than as relates to its feeding and drinking requirements (GAR83[A][1] treats this as a specific offence)
- Refrain from the use of injectable treatments (eg. Vitamin B12) to any extent that is practical, including ensuring a greyhound is not administered any injectables the day before an event

Our registered participants have the responsibility to ensure that greyhounds are presented to the track free of any prohibited substances. This information is offered as advice in good faith and should not be relied on as a defence in the event of a breach occurring.

Mount Gambier kennel house update

The Mount Gambier Kennel House project is at the halfway point, with works progressing well onsite. Demolition and construction work have been completed, with wall vinyl and the epoxy flooring coating having been finished in the past week.

The next stage of the project is to re-clad the interior walls of the kennel house before the internal security fencing and gates are constructed in the main kennel area. The final aspect will be the relocation of the stainlesssteel kennels from the temporary marquee to the newly refurbished building.

The last meeting conducted in the temporary marque with be on Sunday, 29th September. The team will need to work hard in the following three days to ensure the meeting on Thursday, 3rd October can be conducted out of the main kennel house.



Track works undertaken at Angle Park and Gawler

This past week has seen the Maintenance team undertake track works on both the Angle Park and Gawler racing surfaces.

At Angle Park a grader has re-established the track cambers, ensuring consistency around the entire length of the turns. Following the grade, the Maintenance team has conducted a medium depth harrow, before compacting the surface with a heavy roller and applying irrigation.

At Gawler the task is a little more difficult, as it has neither an inner or outer concrete plinth. This results in far more sand migration to the rail and over time this builds up underneath the rail closing the distance between the rail and the track surface.

As such, a grader is required to move a lot more sand from the inside of the track and then spread it onto the outside of the surface. Following this, an excavator needs to enter the track infield and remove the build up of sand inside the rail, to allow water to drain off the track properly.

At the conclusion of these civil works, the



Maintenance team will conduct a medium depth harrow, before compacting the surface with a heavy roller and applying irrigation (as per the process at Angle Park).

The weather gods have smiled upon us, so the Maintenance team is extremely confident in their ability to return the tracks to a 'normal' state quite quickly. It is anticipated that times for the meetings at Angle Park [Thursday night] and Gawler [Friday twilight] will only be slightly impacted.

Angle Park preview area

GRSA will trial an enclosed pre-race preview area at Angle Park in the coming weeks. The trial comes after several incidents over the past year where greyhounds have broken away from their handlers during the lure preview and gone after the lure.

The final location and size of the preview area will be determined once feedback has been received from both participants and Stewards. The new area will be in operation from the meeting Thursday 12th September.




Latest updates from GAP

40 years on and Bob's still training winners at Tara Raceway

MOUNT GAMBIER

It's been something of a rough ride for Coleraine trainer Bob Wombwell and his greyhound Banjo Bonito over the past 18 months.

Wombwell purchased the son of Banjo Boy and proven producer Rustic Reeta back in March last year, won a race with him two months later at Tara Raceway, but after a couple of training setbacks it had been a case of the 36 kilogram dog going into the JB Irrigation Stake (400 m) on Sunday, 1st September without a win in 18 months.

The race was also Banjo Bonito's first in close to three months, his trainer hoping for a turnaround in fortunes but certainly not holding out high hopes for his \$12 chance which was jumping from box four.

But the striking looking white and black dog quickly settled into third spot behind Coco Suzy and Oh Spolly before taking a rails run turning for home, finishing the race off well to gain victory in what was a desperately tight finish, over Oh Spolly and Flash Jackie.

Finally, Banjo Bonito's fortunes had turned around, his win adding to Wombwell's

three earlier in the year at Tara Raceway with Fire Eyes and three at Warrnambool with Coffey Road.

His association with greyhound racing in Mount Gambier goes back close to 40 years and the South East Greyhound Racing Club's track at Glenburnie where his first winner had been on Saturday, November 8, 1980 with Dynamic Tarmel who won a maiden event over 289 metres.

"Dynamic Tarmel was by Dynamic Dean out of Silver Tarmel who was actually my foundation brood bitch, the line continuing through to the present day with Fire Eyes [Spring Gun x Coleraine Flame] winning at Tara Raceway," Wombwell said.

Silver Tarmel was a daughter of the imported sire Hurst Wickham (Maryville Hi x Rocco Lynne), the fastest first-round winner of the 1971 English Derby and later, quite remarkably, one of close to 80 imported greyhounds that stood at stud in Australia during the 1970s.

For all the winners Wombwell has been associated with over the journey, a couple hold special memories for him – Chief Wallaby and Brandini Joe.

"Chief Wallaby was one of my line, being by Chief Dingaan out of Dynamic Crystal, and winning plenty of races including 680 metre events at Warrnambool while Brandini Joe (Tangaloa x Brandini Lass) won a heat of a Ballarat Cup."

Meanwhile, Banjo Bonito will line up from box one in Sunday's Winningformula.net. au Stake (400 m) which is the second of four heats of a grade five series – his longtime trainer no doubt hoping that he can continue to make up for lost time.

The Final of the 2019 Gawler Classic, an event for SA bred greyhounds whelped in the second half of 2017, was conducted on Friday, 6th September.

With two Heats being run the previous week, the field for the Final over 531m looked pretty even on paper, with plenty of possible outcomes. Stiff Upper Lip [7] and Miss Takiri (5) got away on equal terms to lead, but on leaving the home straight, Emerley Hummer (8) swept past, opening up a three length gap over Miss Takiri. Heading to the back turn, Miss Takiri gradually wore down the leader, and entering the home straight, drew away to win by nearly two lengths. One of the heat winners, Double By Design [4], and Balboa Fury [3] both ran on from well back to grab the minor placings. Second placed Double By Design is trained by Sharyn Gray of Lewiston, and Balboa Fury who finished third, is trained by Tony Hinrichsen of Monarto South

Miss Takiri is trained at Lewiston by Ben Rawlings for owner Gino Grgurovic. Gino and his wife Di, were very pleased with the win, and it had a special meaning, as they

had bred the litter that contained Miss Takiri. "Feisty" was bred by Gino from his former racer Miss Woods, who was successful over the longer journeys. He had been waiting for the right stud dog, and felt that SA champion Worm Burner was the right choice. His judgement looks spot on, as Miss Takiri is a model of consistency, having now won five races with five placings from a career of eleven starts. Miss Takiri is one of nine pups in the litter, with all of them having raced, and two contesting Group races in Victoria. Di said she had been confident of a good run today as the blue female has been racing well, but got into trouble at the start of last week's Heat,

nearly coming down on her nose.

Gino has been a trainer in his own right since 1986, but due to recent working commitments, he sought out a trainer, selecting Ben for his SA based dogs. The Grgurovic's have now bought a property at Lewiston with the intention of breeding and rearing, and Gino is still thinking whether he wants to get back into the training game. Di said that she really enjoys the experience of rearing their own litter, through to racing, and knowing each dog's strengths and character. They were grateful for the excellent rearing of the litter by Lester Harris and Ray Fewings.

ANGLE PARK QUALIFYING TRIALS ON WEDNESDAY NIGHTS

Under the new schedule Angle Park Qualifying Trials will be run weekly on Wednesday night, for the corresponding Monday APM meeting (12 days later due to nominations). With 388m racing now available on Monday nights trainers can qualify for all distances.

Nominations close with GRSA at 12.30pm on the Wednesday of the meeting.

SINGLE TRIALS

A reminder to trainers that single trials can be booked with two greyhounds however you need to advise when booking of your intention to do this. If you wish to put three or more into this trial then a field trial will have to be booked.

BOOKING NUMBER FOR TRIALS

Participants wishing to book trials are required to ring 8243 7172, this phone line will only be used for trial bookings and will queue participants. By having this one number with participants queuing makes this process to be a more efficient way of booking trials.

There will be NO trials accepted through the normal administration number. To be fair to everyone GRSA will only accept bookings using the new number or alternatively logon to trialbooker.com, create an account and book your own trials.

POLICY FOR TRIALLING AT ANGLE PARK, GAWLER AND MURRAY BRIDGE BEFORE THE RACE MEETING

Policy Background

This policy is to detail the procedure for trainers seeking greyhounds to trial before race meetings. This policy is effective from 2 May 2019.

Race Meeting Trial Policy

This policy is in place for the following race meetings:

Angle Park Monday, Gawler Tuesday and Friday, Murray Bridge Wednesday and Sunday.

Two fields from the boxes with a maximum of four (4) greyhounds will be conducted immediately following the completion of the kennelling procedure for the race meeting.

The following lists the order in which greyhounds will be selected in the event if more than eight (8) greyhounds are nominated:

1. Reserves at the meeting that do not obtain a start

2. Trainers that have greyhounds engaged and are located more than 100km in distance from the track

3. Satisfactory trials

Procedure/criteria

1. For Angle Park Monday night, the trainer is to contact GRSA by midday on Monday to nominate. Should the

Monday be a public holiday bookings are to be made between 8am and 9am on the scratching number.

- 2. For Gawler Tuesday & Friday, the trainer is to contact GRSA by 4.30pm the day before.
- 3. For Murray Bridge Wednesday, the trainer is to contact

GRSA by 4.30pm the day before. For Murray Bridge Sunday, the trainer is to contact the scratching number on Sunday between 8am and 9am.

- 4. Other than reserve greyhounds, trainers will be restricted to trialling one (1) greyhound unless nominations determine otherwise.
- 5. Stewards will allocate the box for the greyhound.
- 6. Trials will be 515m, 530m & 531m in distance as first preference. Other distances considered depending on nominations.
- 7. Greyhounds currently under suspension are ineligible to trial unless they are undertaking a satisfactory trial to be cleared.
- 8. Greyhound registration cards must be produced at kennelling time.
- Trainers with other greyhounds engaged can utilise the extra kennel space until such time they are ready to leave.
 Trainers with no other greyhounds engaged will be permitted to leave with Stewards permission.
- 10. In the case of race at Murray Bridge, trials will only be available on the track that is prepared to race that day i.e. Sunday meeting on the u-shaped track, trials will be on the u-shaped track only.

Please note: If there are 12 races at Angle Park, Gawler or Murray Bridge there will be NO trials.

The Angle Park Vet Clinic and/or swab kennels cannot be used to accommodate any additional greyhounds due to operational requirements of the Clinic and Stewards.

It is vital that trainers nominate to trial at these race meetings. If you are unable to nominate at these times, please contact GRSA as soon as possible as permission may be given at GRSA's discretion to accept bookings outside these times.

Exceptions to this policy

Thursday nights are kept available for interstate greyhounds to solo trial in a lead-up to SA Group races as well as local greyhound's trialling for Group racing interstate.

Upon request, local greyhounds will be allowed to solo trial in a lead-up to a feature race and they will take one of the eight (8) kennels available for trialling greyhounds ahead of the policy and sit separate to the four (4) dog trials. Races considered to be a feature are: Adelaide Cup, Gawler Cup, Oaks, Derby, Howard Ashton, Brian Johnstone, SA Sprint, SA Distance Championship, SA Anniversary Cup, SA Country Cup, National Finals and any interstate Group race

Local greyhounds will be permitted to trial on a race night, where they are in preparation for a feature event, nominated for a meeting and the race does not stand up. This will include all distances and also take precedence over the policy. If a greyhound qualifies for a feature final and requires a trial in between, this will be conducted as a solo trial and will sit separately to the four (4) dog trials.





BRED UPDATE SA

SA BRED WINNERS

The pool of money has been increased from \$30,000 to \$45,000 per month. These winners all receive a \$225 base payment with \$75 to the Owner & \$150 to the Breeder. Then a monthly payment to the Owner & Breeder will be determined by the number of SA Bred wins at all Sky Racing meetings in South Australia for the month based on 33.3% to the Owner and 66.7% to the breeder.



NOTES OF INDUSTRY CONSULTATIVE GROUP (ICG) MEETING

HELD IN THE BOARDROOM OF GREYHOUND RACING SA LIMITED, 55 CARDIGAN STREET, ANGLE PARK ON FRIDAY 12 JULY 2019 AT 10.00AM

ATTENDEES: Grantley Stevens [Chairman], Ray Fewings, Tony Hinrichsen, Judi Hurley, Peter Damarell, Lisa Rasmussen, Ryan Tugwell, Sean Donnelly, Gavin Harris, Christine Costa, Matthew Corby, Lisa Michalanney, Katalin Orosz, Sheriden Milam (Notes Secretary)

Tim McGrath and Tanya Johnston were introduced to the group to provide some background in relation to the newly formed Integrity and Welfare Committee and Integrity Hearings Panel. Tim spoke to the group and identified his views around the charter of the two new bodies, noting [within the context of the latter] his intention for Inquiry processes to be conducted respectfully and fairly with the broader interests of the industry at front of mind.

Tim left the meeting at 10.15am.

Tanya Johnston spoke to her background in thoroughbred racing, and her experience of greyhounds through [pet] ownership, and expressed her understanding of the extent to which passion drives the sport. By the same token, she suggested that the general public lacks for a level of awareness and understanding, having regard for which there is a genuine need for GRSA to convey its positive stories and be proactive in its messaging.

The meeting formally commenced at 10.20am.

1 APOLOGIES

Michael Fabbro, Grahame Marshall, Paul Preiss and Shaun Mathieson were noted as apologies.

2 NOTES FROM PREVIOUS MEETING

3 BUSINESS ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MEETING

3.1 Syndication

Members of the panel spoke to their understanding of the current status of the syndication project being driven by Sandown, and noted that all parties are waiting for the relevant information to be finalised and published. They suggested that it was time to start identifying a group of trainers interested in syndication and to look at forming a panel to select syndicate greyhounds. Existing entities such as Punters HQ and T Sols were noted as stakeholders of potential relevance within that process.

Members commented positively on the flexibility and convenience of the Spolly's model, noting that they had seen promotion of the Spolly's model encouraging the purchase of greyhound shares as gifts for friends or family.

The Chairman noted the importance of GRSA having confidence in the legal underpinning of the proposed framework and that there still appeared to be some ground to cover in that regard. The CEO observed that the drivers of the project would be conscious of the expectation that is being created and the need for progress to occur prior to the national industry coming together in Perth for the Nationals in August.

Having regard for the Chairman's comments, the CEO queried whether there were enough elements in place under the emerging framework to, at least, commence some of the tactical planning to ensure that South Australia is in a progressed position when a final strategy is rolled out.

Members provided the meeting with some context regarding an existing horseracing syndication operation in Queensland. The Chairman asked Members to pass on information about that model on to the Racing Manager in support of this ongoing process.

The group discussed potential candidates for a preliminary discussion in relation to the South Australian approach, with suggestions including Lisa Rasmussen, Gavin Harris, Sean Donnelly, Christine Costa, Tim Aloisi and Petar Jovanovic to form the initial panel. Members suggested the need, ultimately, for an information booth to be available on race nights to disseminate information regarding syndication. Members suggested Vaun Gray as a potential candidate to assist with selection of dogs, based on his depth of knowledge in this area.

Action: The RM to coordinate a process by email with the ICG to select an initial syndication panel to help develop the conceptual model in SA, including how trainers and greyhounds would be incorporated into that model

Action: The RM to follow up with Members for background material relating to the horseracing syndicate that was discussed at this meeting

3.2 Sky Racing Schedule

The CEO provided a brief update in relation to requests from the Clubs to seek later starts for the Gawler Friday meeting and the Murray Bridge Sunday meeting. Members suggested the benefit of Tuesday night trials, so that greyhounds could have the opportunity to recover in time to trial on the Saturday morning, if they chose to do so. It was noted that Members had raised this at a previous meeting and that it had received a fairly neutral response from other ICG members, as opposed to having been rejected.

The CEO suggested polling industry via industry Facebook page to gauge broader industry views, and their supporting reasons. Some members flagged their concern that by switching the timing of the Tuesday and Wednesday trial sessions at Murray Bridge and Gawler might fix a perceived problem for northern participants, but to the detriment of 'southern' trainers who would then have to deal with a split of 2 and 5 days respectively. Noting that to be the case, the CEO expressed the view that polling matters for which there is an inherently regional bias would not be in everyone's broader interests.

Members suggested that it would be ideal for Monday night nominations to close after the mid-week trial session at Angle Park. The Chairman queried whether a shift of that close of nominations time to Thursday morning might achieve such an outcome, in response to which Members suggested that it would. Members suggested the potential benefit of a Wednesday night trial session at Gawler in the event that the Angle Park trial session was pushed back to Tuesday night.

After further discussion the group resolved that (simultaneous) trialling on Tuesday night at Angle Park and Murray Bridge, with Gawler on a Wednesday night would arguably present as the optimal model, subject to GRSA being able to resolve staffing issues.

Members separately noted their concern regarding the lack of nominations at Murray Bridge for racing over the 530m distance.

Action: For Management to present a paper to the Board which explores the feasibility of the optimal weekly schedule of trialing, having regard for the feedback from the ICG discussion at this meeting

3.3 ICG Panel Members Update

(40)

The Chairman welcomed Christine Costa to the group.

3.4 Murray Bridge Straight Track Update

The group noted the commencement of straight track racing at Murray Bridge being scheduled for Wednesday July 24. The CEO noted the scale of work that was occurring in background to ensure readiness. The IM advised that there had been 41 trials at Murray Bridge that morning, of which half had been on the straight track. The CEO pointed to the upcoming national straight track championships as an important driver of the need to get the straight track operational by a sufficiently early date.

3.5 SA Owned – Proof of Purchase

Members queried whether any opportunities exist to easily obtain access to a Justice of the Peace to assist the signing of any proofs of purchase.

Action: Management to identify whether it has any Justices of the Peace within GRSA's raceday ranks that would be happy to be named as being available to assist with the witnessing of documentation to confirm SA ownership.

3.6 Stakemoney Strategy – June Board Meeting

The CEO noted the recent stakemoney announcement and indicated his hope that this would positively impact industry confidence. Members questioned whether there would also be an increase for Coursing in conjunction with that announcement. The CEO advised that Coursing had not been included in the most recent round of increases, but he indicated that Management remains supportive of that club running 4-dog [as opposed to 8-dog] stakes as a response to low nomination levels.

3.7 Registry of Mentors

The Chairman noted the list that had been provided and sought feedback in relation to same. The CEO questioned the group as to whether any obvious names were missing and encouraged the group to pass on any names which it felt had been left off. The group agreed that Management should write to the list of mentors to seek their willingness, availability and any conditions in relation to mentoring should they become an appropriate match for a new or inexperienced participant seeking that support. The availability of mentors should then be promoted appropriately by GRSA.

Action: Lisa Rasmussen to be included on the list of potential mentors

Action: The RM to write to the list of proposed mentors to seek willingness, availability and terms of potential mentors

Action: GRSA to communicate the availability of mentoring services for awareness

3.8 Claiming Races – Alternate Strategy

The group noted the update and agreed that the Claiming Race concept lacks sufficient industry support to warrant ongoing effort.

3.9 Injuries Outside of TIRS

Members advised of having been charged \$400 vet fee for a particular greyhound at the Murray Bridge vet clinic due to the timing of the visit falling outside regular operating hours. He asked how the TIRS might cover such situations. The CEO spoke to the potential risk of structuring rebates to accommodate different market rates. The IM committed to speaking with that practitioner to seek a more partner-oriented approach.

Action: The IM to speak with the Murray Bridge vet clinic seeking support in relation to cost and availability in return for more reliable patronage of its service

3.10 Retirement Rule for Greyhound (GAP) (LR)

The GAP Manager noted that there had been little response to the request for 'leads', in the form of lapsed participants/ trainers, to become foster carers. Members suggested that GAP should be looking to contact owners who have recently had a greyhound pass away, as well as previous adopters looking for company for their existing greyhound.

The CEO expressed his view that retired participants would have been a likely target, however that did not seem to be how things were playing out. The positive reduction in the waiting list was noted. The CEO spoke about the improvements being delivered within the context of the prison programs, including shorter foster times and green collar readiness.

3.11 Pannus – Prohibiting Breeding

The IM noted ongoing discussion with Dr Karamatic and the fact that she is still awaiting further information. The CEO queried whether the industry needs to prohibit breeding with pannusaffected greyhounds. General discussion ensued and it was agreed that such an approach would not eliminate carriers of the disease.

3.12 300m Boxes at Gawler

The CEO noted that, whilst the Board has approved the installation of 300m boxes at Gawler, this would only be undertaken with confidence in the fact that nominations for other meetings would not be unduly affected. Members asked for puppy education boxes to be installed as a standard at all TAB tracks, a view which was supported by the group.

.Action: Puppy education boxes to be installed at both Gawler and Murray Bridge – Angle Park puppy boxes to be secured to the ground.

3.13 G-SIX Update

The Chairman provided an update and noted that the strategy was doing sufficiently well to cover additional stakemoney. Members questioned whether data was being kept on numbers of dogs not receiving start and those that receive a start the following week. The CEO advised that this would ignore the fact that those trainers had an opportunity to compete at Murray Bridge on the Wednesday. He advised that the schedule could not be structured around trainers choosing not to travel across the three 'inner' Clubs.

The CEO advised that Management is working closely with Tabcorp to get the model right and maximise wagering outcomes to the benefit of industry. He identified that an update would be conveyed to industry once agreement had been reached about how the trial of the reduced field format should move forward.

3.14 Industry Awards

The CEO requested that any further names should be emailed to him for consideration. He suggested that Management should routinely be consulting with the ICG for recommendations in the lead-up to the GOTY awards event in addition to seeking other nominations from industry for the award for conspicuous contribution to industry.

Members proposed that Tony Hinrichsen should be added to the list provided, having regard for his efforts at Strathalbyn and, more recently, at Murray Bridge. Further to discussion, the CEO committed to ensuring that the list would be reconciled against previous recipients to ensure no duplication of previous winners.

Action: The RM to seek feedback from the ICG each year

regarding potential candidates for the industry contribution award in addition to an open request to industry for nominations

Action: Tony Hinrichsen to be added to the list of potential candidates at the suggestion of Members

Action: The RM to review the list presented and remove any previous winners

3.15 TAB App For Murray Bridge

Members noted the addition of geofencing at Angle Park, with regard to which Tabcorp will now pay wagering commissions to the industry for bets placed on-course on a digital device. The group discussed that initiative and agreed that it needed to be communicated to industry via the industry Facebook page and Kennel Capers.

Action: For Marketing Manager to communicate the introduction of on-course digital commissions with clear instructions for industry awareness

3.16 Roller Derby and Racing Schedule

The CEO noted ongoing discussion with the Angle Park vet clinic to relocate to the front of the building, and also pointed to the underlying value – in terms of community engagement – which comes from having activities such as roller-derby and the model train show at the venue.

The group indicated that roller derby is more of an inconvenience than a critical problem, however Management was asked to explore whether the rink markings could be relocated slightly to the east of the undercover area, towards McQueens Tavern. The group further requested the removal of bags that currently block some pathways and suggested that a storage solution may be required.

Action: For the Hospitality Manager and Strategic Projects Manager to explore a 'shifting' of the rink linemarking towards the Tavern, and the introduction of storage (or some other effective solution) to deal with bags and equipment associated with that user group

4 AGENDA ITEMS

4.1 National Symposium – Perth, August 2019

The CEO advised GRSA would be supportive of assisting two participants to attend symposium. Members suggested national finalist may be an option.

Action: Management to advertise the opportunity for up to two participants to attend the symposium aspect of the Nationals on Facebook, seeking applications for same.

4.2 Murray Bridge – Six Month Switch

The group noted the update.

4.3 Cash Handling

The group noted the update.

4.4 Integrity and Welfare Committee & Integrity Hearings Panel

This item was covered prior to commencement of meeting.

5. OTHER BUSINESS

Members questioned why the Mount Gambier Club had been required to make a contribution to the upgrade of its kennelhouse facilities. The Chairman noted that many other projects have benefitted from co-contribution and that reinvestment in one's own facilities should be a standing objective for any Club that is able to do so.

Members questioned why Maiden winners can't be allowed to

beat the grader. The CEO noted the obvious problem that exists with the term 'Maiden', however he also acknowledged that the concept was not without merit and is typically a goal for trainers placing their greyhounds.

The CEO welcomed suggestions from the group to be put to the Grading Review Panel, but committed to having that Panel discuss the issue regardless.

Action: The Grading Review Panel to explore the opportunity to implement an approach which allows Maiden winners to 'beat the grader'

Members raised a concern regarding trialing prior to the first race at a meeting. It was indicated that they could understand the lack of availability of kennels since the introduction of G-SIX – typically resulting in 12 races – but felt that the recently introduced 100km rule was not in the spirit of supporting participation. Members indicated that they had recently been a reserve and couldn't trial prior to the meeting because they hadn't needed to travel 100km to get to the meeting.

The IM noted that the change had been introduced to prevent some people from abusing the trial booking system. The CEO committed to revisiting the issue with Management.

Action: Management to review the approach to raceday trials, specifically within the context of the 100km rule

Members noted a concern with the removal of trial fees as related to smaller trainers who might be unable to easily afford Club membership to obtain free trials. Members noted that, despite the positive implications of this change, there are a handful of things that the Clubs and GRSA are still working through to refine the implementation. The group acknowledged that the change should ultimately deliver a benefit for all trainers.

Members expressed the view that a number of Pathway dogs lacked sufficient ability to satisfy an acceptable minimum standard and were really just going around for the payment. They argued that this amounted to a potential reputational risk for the industry. Members suggested that a standard should be introduced and that Management should be reviewing his claim for substance.

Action: Integrity Manager to investigate the welfare risk of trainers nominating for Pathways events with under-performing or injured runners to obtain the minimum payment
