Stewards' Notice

Trackside activities

Movements of registered persons in vicinity of racetracks

Registered persons attending racetracks must only proceed onto the track surface if authorised and under the directions of stewards or other officials of the Controlling Body

For safety and welfare reasons, any registered person attending a racetrack in South Australia, and trackside for races or any trials, must follow the directions of stewards or other officials. The operation of starting boxes, mechanical lures and greyhounds running at speed presents a hazard to people in their vicinity.

BE AWARE -

- Fast moving equipment is used during trials and includes box lids and lures.
- · If you are struck by any equipment or greyhounds, you risk injury.

YOU MUST NOT -

- Proceed onto any racetrack unless allowed to do so by stewards or officials and then only to the location as directed by stewards or officials.
- Walk onto the racetrack in front of, or before, any lure and greyhounds have passed your location and are not returning on a return lap.
- Approach the inside rail of any racetrack under any circumstances.
- Use the (sliding) lure gate of any catching pen gate as a thoroughfare at any time.

To give effect to this notice, stewards and officials will take appropriate and reasonable measures to mitigate any safety risk. If any breach of this notice is found, the lure will be stopped, and the race or trial will end for that event or session.
